ARMY FALLS, 2-0, TO NO. 16 VIRGINIA IN FIRST ROUND OF NCAA TOURNAMENT

The 2008 Patriot League Women's Soccer Champion Army Black Knights fell to No. 16 Virginia, 2-0, in the first round of the NCAA Women's College Cup at the Cavaliers' Klockner Stadium on Nov. 14. The loss marked the final game for Army Head Coach Gene Ventriglia, who is retiring.

The Black Knights' Second-Team All-Patriot League goalkeeper Alex Lostetter made six saves and allowed the two goals in the loss, as Army (12-6-3) was outshot 22-1 by the Cavaliers.

Winning the Patriot League title sent Army to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history, and gave outgoing Ventriglia a chance to coach in the Tournament in his last season with the Black Knights.

"This was my last game," said Ventriglia. "I thought I would be sad, but I am not. I have coached for 24 years and it was a great journey. I am so proud of this team and how they played tonight. They fought hard like a typical Army team."

With the loss, the Patriot League is now 2-12 in the NCAA Tournament, and 0-3 against ACC teams in the Tournament. The last Patriot League team to win an NCAA Tournament game was the 2006 Navy squad that had a scoreless tie with William and Mary, and advanced 5-4 on penalty kicks to the second round. The Mids lost to North Carolina, 4-0, in the second round.

PATRIOT LEAGUE WOMEN'S SOCCER CoSIDA SELECTIONS

The Patriot League had three women's soccer student-athletes named to the 2008 *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-America Teams. Army's Elizabeth Betterbed and Sarah Goss and Navy's Lizzie Barnes were all selected CoSIDA/ESPN the Magazine First-Team Academic All-Americans. This was the second Academic All-American selection for both Goss and Barnes, and the first for Betterbed.

DERVARICS, MOELLER NAMED TO NSCAA ALL-REGION TEAMS

Bucknell forward Jennifer Dervarics and Navy defender Shelly Moeller were named Second-Team Mid-Atlantic Region honorees. Dervarics is the 2008 Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year and led the League in goals and points, while Moeller is the 2008 Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year. Moeller helped anchor a Navy defense that went 5-0-2 in Patriot League play this season.

RECORD-SETTING CAREER

Navy's Lizzie Barnes ended her career atop the Patriot League career goals-against average list at 0.68 and is fourth all-time in career shutouts with 28. The senior also helped Navy finish in the top-15 nationally in goals-against average (#12, 0.605), shutout percentage (#12, 0.591) and save percentage (#8, 0.865) this season.

BARNES NAMED TO LOWE'S ALL-SENIOR ALL-AMERICA TEAM

Navy senior goalkeeper Lizzie Barnes, a finalist for the 2008 Women's Soccer Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, was named to the First-Team All-Senior All-America Team. The All-Senior All-America Team is based on the cumulative results of NCAA Division I coaches and national media and fan balloting for the award, which honors the attributes of senior student-athletes in the classroom, community, character and competition.

Joining Barnes on the All-Senior All-America First Team are: 2008 Women's Soccer Lowe's Senior CLASS Award winner Kerri Hanks of Notre Dame; Yael Averbuch of North Carolina; Jenae Gibbens of California State University, Fullerton and Brittany Bock of Notre Dame.

Barnes previously won the 2008 Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year and Goalkeeper of the Year awards.



AMERICAN The Eagles ended their season with an overall record of 5-10-4 and 2-2-3 in Patriot League play. American's Friederike Engel and Olivia Hedsitsian earned All-League designations and will return next season.



ARMY The Black Knights earned their first NCAA Tournament berth, but lost to No. 16 Virginia, 2-0, in the first round. The Black Knights bid adieu to longtime Head Coach Gene Ventriglia, who retired at the end of the season.



BUCKNELL The Bison ended their season at 11-6-3 after tying Army in the Patriot League Tournament, with the Black Knights advancing 5-4 on penalty kicks. Senior forward Jennifer Dervarics led the League in points and goals, and was named Offensive Player of the Year for her performance this season.



COLGATE Colgate fell 1-0 to Navy in overtime in the Patriot League Tournament semifinals, ending their season with a 7-11-1 overall record. Six Raiders were named to the All-League Team this season.



HOLY CROSS The Crusaders ended their season on a good note, beating Lafayette 4-0 in their final home game. Holy Cross ended the season 4-14-1 overall and 2-4-1 in Patriot League action. Freshman Katherine Donnelly was named Rookie of the Year.



LAFAYETTE The Leopards finished the season 2-14-2 overall and 0-7-0 in Patriot League play.



LEHIGH Lehigh finished the regular season 6-10-1 overall and 2-5-0 in the Patriot League. The Mountain Hawks upset Army 2-0 in their final regular season game.



NAVY Navy lost a 1-0 heartbreaker to archrival Army in the Patriot League Championship match. Senior Lizzie Barnes was named both Goalkeeper and Scholar-Athlete of the Year, while junior Shelly Moeller took home Defensive Player of the Year honors. The Mids finished their season 15-4-3 overall.

PATRIOT LEAGUE TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURE/SELECTION SEEDING

Patriot League Tie-Breaking Procedure/ Selection Seeding

Non-League contests completed before the Monday prior to the Championship will be included in the tie-breaker formula, if necessary. Any non-League contest played on or after the Monday prior to the Championship will not be included in the tie-breaker formula.

a. In the case of a two-way between teams in the final standings for regular season League play, the following process will be used until all ties are broken and the seeding process is completed (ties will be broken in rank order beginning with the highest seed):

i. Head-to-head competition - the higher seed will go to the team that has won the most League contests played against the other team involved in the tie (in the sport of volleyball, both matches and individual games will be considered).

ii. If a tie still exists, a comparison of records will be made between the tied institutions starting at the highest possible seed and continuing through the lowest seed, if necessary.

iii. Sport specific tie-breaking procedure, if any (see Sport Specific regulations).

iv. Comparison of records versus out-of-League common opponents.

v. Coin flip.

b. In the case of multiple ties (more than two teams tied for the same spot), the following process will be used: Note: The entire process for multiple-team ties must be completed. The Patriot League does not revert back to the two-way tie formula once the multiple-team tie has been resolved.

i. Records between the tied teams will be evaluated to determine if one team won more contests against the other tied institutions (in the sport of volleyball, both matches and individual games will be considered).

ii. If a tie still exists, a comparison of records will be conducted for each team starting with the highest seed not involved in the tie and continuing through the lowest seed, if necessary.

iii. Sport specific tie-breaking procedure, if any (see Sport Specific regulations).

iv. Comparison of records versus out-of-League common opponents.

v. Coin flip (two teams) or draw (multiple teams).
