# PRESEASON NOTES

- The **Marty Wilson** era begins at Pepperdine, as the long-time assistant takes over as a full-time head coach for the first time. He was an assistant for 21 years, including nine for the Waves (the last three as associate head coach).
- But, this isn't the first time that Wilson has been in charge on the Pepperdine sideline. He was the interim head coach for the final 13 games of the 1995-96 season (which included an upset win over a Steve Nash-led Santa Clara team in the first round of the WCC Tournament). And, during the 2010-11 season, he took over for the Waves' road game at Gonzaga when Tom Asbury was dealing with a family emergency.
- Wilson is one of six former Pepperdine student-athletes currently serving as a head coach of one of the Waves' athletic programs.
- Wilson is the Waves' most active coach on Twitter. He can be followed at @MartyWilson4.
- The Waves made a big step forward last season in their efforts to restore the program to its past levels of success. Their 12 victories were the most since the 2004-05 season. They reached the 10-win mark for the first time since 2007-08. Pepperdine's five WCC wins equalled the most amount of conference wins over the previous five seasons. At 4-3, the Waves earned their first winning record in home WCC games since 2005.
- Pepperdine's 2011-12 team took a significant hit when senior guard **Lorne Jackson** underwent surgery on July 18 to repair a torn anterior cruciate ligament in his right knee. Jackson is expected to redshirt this season and finish his career in 2012-13.
- Jackson would have been the team's top returning scorer at 13.2 points per game. He was one of the WCC's most improved players over the last few years, as he averaged 6.6 ppg as a freshman and 8.1 as a sophomore. During WCC games in 2011, he averaged 16.6 points, third-best in the conference, and he earned All-WCC honorable mention notice. When he returns, he'll need just 111 points to become Pepperdine's 37th player to reach the 1,000-point milestone.
- With Jackson, the Waves would return 53.4% of their scoring (1,222/2,289), 55.9% of their rebounding (583/1,043), 66.2% of their assists (270/408), 43.3% of their blocked shots (42/97), 62.7% of their steals (121/193) and 59.8% of the minutes played (3,977/6,650).
- Without Jackson, those figures drop to 34.4% of the scoring (787/2,289), 46.7% of the rebounding (487/1,043), 42.6% of the assists (174/408), 38.1% of the blocked shots (37/97), 35.8% of the steals (69/193) and 46.2% of the minutes played (3,075/6,650).
- Of the five players that started the most season, four return (including Jackson). A total of 10 letterwinners are back (the third straight season Pepperdine has had double-digits in returnees).
- After Jackson, Pepperdine's most experienced returning player (and leading returning scorer) is senior forward **Taylor Darby**. He's played in all 96 games the past three seasons and has started 82. He's finished ninth, ninth and 14th in the WCC in rebounding the past three seasons. In 2010-11, he posted a career-high 7.7 points per game to go with 5.5 rebounds per game. Darby was a team co-captain last season.
- Both Darby and senior center **Corbin Moore** have appeared in 96 games the past three years and should break into the Waves' all-time top 10 this season for games played.
- Senior guard/forward **Dane Suttle Jr.** ranks ninth all-time at Pepperdine with a career three-point field goal percentage of 37.9%.
- Pepperdine's three freshmen each come in with impressive accolades. **Jordan Baker** was a Parade All-American third teamer and the Gatorade state player of the year in Arizona after averaging 27.3 ppg. **Ramon Eaton**, who has been compared to Lamar Odom, was ranked among the nation's top five recruits by Hoop Scoop prior to entering high school and was a Long Beach Press-Telegram Best in the West third teamer. **Manny Ochenje** was once rated as the top recruit in the state of Illinois and is Hoop Scoop's #124 overall player.
- The Waves have four foreign-born players: **Moriba De Freitas** (Trinidad), **Jan Maehlen** (Germany), Ochenje (Nigeria) and **Nikolas Skouen** (Norway). Skouen was playing with the Norwegian National Team this summer before arriving at Pepperdine.
- Pepperdine's academic performance has improved tremendously the past several years. In 2010-11, four Waves made the NABC Honors Court, three were WCC All-Academic first teamers and four were Pepperdine Scholar-Athletes.

# SEASON OUTLOOK

It's a season of change for the Pepperdine men's basketball team, starting right at the top as **Marty Wilson** takes over the program's reins in 2011-12.

The Pepperdine alum and long-time assistant coach joined Tom Asbury's staff as its associate head coach more than three years ago with the intention that he would become head coach when Asbury decided to retire. His apprenticeship over, Wilson is ready to help continue the Waves' upward trend that began following Asbury's return. Progress has been steady, as last season's team posted 12 victories, the program's most since 2004-05.

For the third straight year, Pepperdine will have returning players numbering in double-digits. But change will come on the floor as well, as new scorers will need to emerge to replace a lot of points that won't be available to the Waves in 2011-12.

Two of the top 20 scorers in Pepperdine history, Mychel Thompson (graduation) and Keion Bell (transfer) aren't back, and the Waves suffered a major blow when their top returning scorer and All-WCC honorable mention selection, senior guard **Lorne Jackson** (Simi Valley, Calif./Simi Valley HS), suffered a knee injury during the summer that caused him to have surgery and is likely to force him to redshirt the upcoming season.

Without Jackson, the Waves that are back account for only a little more than a third of last year's scoring. In Wilson's mind, that just means more opportunities for his veterans to take another step forward and for his young players to prove themselves.

"With or without Lorne, it's going to be an adjustment for all of our guys," he said. "We want to give them the freedom and the opportunity to make plays, as long as it's within the confines of our offense and our philosophy. I expect us to score more in the paint, whether it's our bigs or our guards. We have to have a better balance so that we don't have to rely on our perimeter like we have in the past."

The on-court philosophy won't change entirely from what the Waves have done in the past, but Wilson will look to put his own stamp on the program.

"We want to pick up the tempo," said Wilson, who hired associate head coach **Mark Amaral** and assistant coach **Bryant Moore** during the offseason while fourth-year assistant **Damin Lopez** remains on staff. "I think we'll have enough depth at each position where we can play a

number of guys and hopefully go deep into our bench. But we have to take care of the ball if we want to play fast. I'm not a big fan of playing fast when you're turning the ball over.

"We'll run some of the same things offensively, with some new variations and wrinkles. I'm a big believer in some of the stuff we ran with Coach Asbury because it has been successful. But it's not just what you run, it's how you run it. The sticking point is running things sharp, moving the ball, hitting the open man."

That begins at point guard, where the Waves have plenty of options. Last year's starter was 6-foot-3 junior **Joshua Lowery** (Phoenix, Ariz./Desert Vista HS). He was backed up by 6-foot-2 junior **Caleb Willis**, and new to the mix is heralded 6-foot-4 freshman **Jordan Baker** (Tempe, Ariz./Tempe HS).

Lowery increased his output from 1.8 points and 0.7 assists as a freshman to 5.6 points and 2.8 assists as a sophomore, and those numbers may be expected to increase again this season. Willis hasn't played as much in a reserve role, but could see his minutes rise. Baker earned Parade All-American third team honors (the only WCC recruit to earn a spot on the first three teams) and was Arizona's Gatorade State Player of the Year after averaging 27.3 points as a senior.

"Josh is a veteran who played valuable minutes last year," Wilson said. "I expect a lot more out of him in terms of production and leadership. Hopefully we can challenge Caleb to do more and to give him more opportunities. I hope with both of those guys sharing time, it will allow us to blend Jordan in where he can grow without having to be thrown to the wolves. But eventually, he will play a lot as a freshman."

Lowery or Baker could also see time on the wing, where the Waves also boast a veteran in 6-foot-6 senior **Dane Suttle Jr.** (Los Angeles, Calif./Westchester HS/Summit College Prep), a promising youngster in 6-foot-7 sophomore **Hector Harold** (Pasadena, Calif./Northfield Mount Hermon School) and two exciting newcomers in 6-foot-8 freshman **Ramon Eaton** (Sacramento, Calif./Sheldon HS) and 6-foot-4 sophomore **Nikolas Skouen** (Bergen, Norway/Pratt CC).

Suttle was having an outstanding showing during non-conference play as a sophomore but an ankle injury diminished his play as the WCC season began. He spent last year still trying to get back to his old self, but he's an

outstanding three-point shooter whose career percentage of 37.9% ranks ninth all-time at Pepperdine. Harold didn't see much playing time as a freshman, but Wilson rates him highly.

Eaton was one of the top prep players in Northern California last season and was one of six finalists for the area player of the year by the Sacramento Bee. Skouen made 75 three-pointers for Pratt Community College last year and this summer he played for the Norwegian National Team.

"Our main thing is to be consistent from the outside," Wilson said. "These guys need to be able to consistently knock down shots. I'm excited about Niko because that's his trademark. That's what he does well. Dane's made a lot of three-pointers in his career and we need a big senior year out of him. Guys like Hector and Ramon bring something totally different. They're a little bigger, a little more athletic, and they have the ability to create shots for themselves."

Pepperdine's frontcourt begins with a pair of returning starters, 6-foot-8 senior forward **Taylor Darby** (San Marcos, Calif./Mission Hills HS) and 6-foot-10 senior center **Corbin Moore** (Cypress, Calif./Los Alamitos HS). Both have played in all 96 games the past three years, with Darby starting 82 and Moore starting 49.

Darby has been one of the WCC's top rebounders the past three years (ranking ninth, ninth and 14th while posting a career average of 5.9). He increased his scoring output to 7.7 points per game as a junior. With Jackson out, that makes Darby the team's top returning scorer.

Moore also improved his scoring average to 4.5 points last season, and he's averaged 3.9 rebounds for his career.

"Corbin and Taylor have played quite a few minutes the last three years and we'll lean on them heavily to step up even more," Wilson said. "We'll challenge them to score more, and need them to have the confidence to score more. They'll also be given responsibilities as leaders. We need a physical presence down low. We need to be tougher physically, and that starts on the front line, and it starts with those two veterans."

They'll have help, however, including sophomore center **Jan Maehlen** (Tucson, Ariz./Ironwood Ridge HS). The 7-footer has continued to improve his conditioning and has slimmed down more than 50 pounds since first enrolling at Pepperdine. He didn't play a great deal as a freshman but that could change as he develops.

Also, the Waves brought in a pair of new big men in 6-foot-9 **Manny Ochenje** (Abuja, Nigeria/Brehm Prep) and 6-foot-9 **Moriba De Freitas** (Bon Air Gardens, Trinidad/Williston State JC). Ochenje was one of the top recruits in the state of Illinois, while De Freitas showed his muscle at a junior college in North Dakota the last two years and was once a member of Trinidad's U-17 National Team.

"I'm excited about the progression by Jan," Wilson said. "As his body has changed for the better, he's getting more and more confident in his ability. Watching him in the spring, and hearing reports about how he did this summer, I think he's going to be able to showcase what he's capable of. The biggest challenge for Moriba and Manny is the physical side of things because they're not the biggest, strongest guys, but what they lack in strength they make up for in quickness and athleticism, and they will create opportunities on their athleticism alone."

Two walk-ons return as well, senior guards **Richard Branning** (Menlo Park, Calif./Menlo-Atherton HS) and **Don Martin** (Gladstone, Mo./Oak Park HS), and a third one joins the team in sophomore guard **Dominic Redix** (Apple Valley, Calif./Granite Hills HS).

The roster of 16 — 10 returners and six newcomers — has Wilson looking forward to his first season in charge.

"We have a lot of returners and we have a great feel of what they're capable of doing," he said. "They know what we expect of them. But what we don't know yet is how they're going to adjust to the changes that we're going to make, offensively and defensively. That's an unknown. So it's hard to say what our expectations are right now. I expect all of our players to work hard and to want to do more, to strive to have better seasons than they had the last three years. If they're consistently buying into that philosophy, we're going to be okay."

# HEAD COACH MARTY WILSON BIO

After 21 seasons as an assistant coach, including nine at Pepperdine, Marty Wilson was elevated to the position of head coach of the Waves following the 2010-11 season.

Wilson has compiled an impressive record in Malibu as a student-athlete (1985-89), an assistant coach (1991-96, which included a brief stint as the interim head coach) and as the associate head coach the past three seasons (2009-11).

"I am honored and privileged to be standing here and be named the new head basketball coach at Pepperdine University. I am very thankful to be in this position," said Wilson at his introductory press conference on March 11, 2011. "I want to talk about my vision of building our basketball program back up. It's important for me to build on the foundation that Coach (Tom) Asbury laid when he came back. I have a motto of what he did before, because I lived it. I sat in all the meetings, I was one of those assistants, so I understand the commitment, I understand the desire, I understand the process that we will have to take. And that's a mindset. Our staff is going to focus on the process. We're not just going to focus on trying to win games. We're in the process of building a basketball program. That's very important. We're going to do it the right way."

Excluding interim coaches, Wilson is the 12th men's basketball head coach in Pepperdine history.

During his first six seasons on the Waves' staff, which followed his graduation in 1989, Wilson helped Pepperdine to a 106-72 (.596) record. He began as the restricted-earnings coach before being elevated to full-time status for the 1994-95 season.

With Wilson on the bench, Pepperdine earned bids to the NCAA Tournament in 1991, 1992 and 1994 and made the NIT in 1993. The Waves also won West Coast Conference regular-season titles in 1991, 1992 and 1993 and WCC Tournament titles in 1991, 1992 and 1994.

Following Tom Asbury's departure for Kansas State after the 1993-94 season, Wilson remained on the staff under new head coach Tony Fuller. When Fuller resigned midway through the 1995-96 season, Wilson took over on an interim basis at the age of 28 and directed the Waves to a 3-10 record down the stretch. Most notably, that included an upset of a Steve Nash-led Santa Clara team in the first round of the WCC Tournament.

Wilson left Malibu but stayed in Southern California for the next several years, spending two seasons (1996-97 and 1997-98) as an assistant coach at San Diego, where he was also the recruiting coordinator under head coach Brad Holland.

He spent the next six seasons (1999-2004) at UC Santa Barbara, and was the top assistant for Bob Williams as the Gauchos averaged 18 wins a season during his last three years there. UCSB won the Big West Conference's West Division in 1999, captured the Big West Tournament title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2002 and won the Big West regular-season title and made an appearance in the NIT in 2003.

Prior to his return to Pepperdine, Wilson was an assistant for four seasons (2005-08) at Utah under head coaches Ray Giaconetti and Jim Boylen. During his first season, the Utes went 29-6, won the Mountain West Conference's regular-season title, advanced to the NCAA Tournament's Sweet Sixteen and finished the year ranked 18th nationally by the Associated Press.

He was hired back at Pepperdine in February 2008 as the associate head coach with the intention that he would eventually move into the head coaching position once Asbury retired.

As a player with the Waves, Wilson ended his career in fifth place on the all-time assists list with 342 (he still ranks ninth). Under head coach Jim Harrick, Wilson was a backup point guard in 1984-85 and 1985-86, and the Waves advanced to the NCAA Tournament both seasons. A back injury sidelined Wilson for the entire 1986-87 campaign, but he took over as the starting point guard in 1987-88. Unfortunately, he suffered a season-ending knee injury in the 17th game of the season, though the Waves still advanced to the NIT.

Asbury took over as head coach in 1988-89, and Wilson's extensive rehabilitation paid off as he returned to the starting lineup as a senior and led the Waves to a 20-13 record and the second round of the NIT. The Waves posted a record of 97-58 (.626) during his five seasons as a student-athlete.

Wilson graduated from Pepperdine in 1989 with a bachelor's degree in communications. In the year between his graduation and his return to Pepperdine as an assistant coach, Wilson tried out for the Continental Basketball Association and was an assistant coach at Simi Valley High School.

A native of Pacoima, Calif., Wilson was a prep standout at Simi Valley High School. He was named the Marmonte League's Most Valuable Player as a 1983-84 senior. One of his teammates was future NBA standout Don MacLean.

Wilson once ran a free basketball camp in his hometown for around 100 under-privileged kids each summer.

His actual first name is Lamar (Marty was a childhood nickname given to him by a sister). He and his wife, Mayra, have a daughter, Jessica, and a son, Jalon.

# MARTY WILSON QUOTES

**(on the prospects for his first team)** "It's hard to say right now, mid-summer. We haven't been on the court yet with the five new guys we have coming in, but we have a lot of returners and we have a great feel on what they're capable of doing. They know what we expect of them. But what we don't know yet is how they're going to adjust to the changes that we're going to make, offensively and defensively. That's an unknown. So it's hard to say what our expectations are right now. I expect all of our players to work hard and to want to do more, to strive to have better seasons than they had the last three years. If they're consistently buying into that philosophy, we're going to be okay."

**(on making offensive changes)** "We want to pick up the tempo. We want to make teams adjust to us. I think we'll have enough depth at each position where we can play a number of guys and hopefully go deep into our bench. But we have to take care of the ball if we want to play fast. I'm not a big fan of playing fast when you're turning the ball over. We'll run some of the same things offensively, with some new variations and wrinkles. I'm a big believer in some of the stuff we ran with Coach Asbury because it has been successful. But it's not what you run, it's how you run it. The sticking point is running things sharp, moving the ball, hitting the open man. That's the major thing offensively."

**(on making defensive changes)** "Defensively, we have to have more individual pride. We will hold guys accountable for defending whoever it is that they're guarding. If help is needed, help will be there. But the better we can defend one-on-one, the better our team defense is going to be. The other thing is that we're going to be physically and mentally tougher. That's going to be ingrained in every part of our workouts, our lifting and our conditioning. That's going to be part of our makeup."

**(on losing Lorne Jackson, who is likely to redshirt 2011-12 with a knee injury)** "I'm sad that Lorne has to go through an injury like this for the second time since he's been here. That's the tough part, seeing him go through the emotions of it again. For us as a team it's a loss and a big setback to have your leading returning scorer go down. But as I told Lorne and as I told the staff and the team, we're not going to use it as an excuse. It's an opportunity for some of our other players. Some of our young guys that haven't played as much will need to step up and make an impact."

**(on the point guard position)** "I see Josh (Lowery), Caleb (Willis) and Jordan (Baker) all sharing time at the point. Josh is a veteran who played valuable minutes last year. I expect a lot more out of him in terms of production and leadership. Hopefully we can challenge Caleb to do more and give him more opportunities. I hope with both of those guys sharing time, it will allow us to blend Jordan in where he can grow without having to be thrown to the wolves. But eventually, he will play a lot as a freshman. We might also look for the opportunity to put Josh on the wing, and put him in places to score since Lorne is out."

**(on the wings)** "With Dane (Suttle Jr.), Hector (Harold), Niko (Skouen) and Ramon (Eaton), we're pretty solid with those four guys. If Josh (Lowery) moves over, that's another guy who can do well there and compete at that spot. Our main thing is to be consistent

from the outside. These guys need to be able to consistently knock down shots. I'm excited about Niko because that's his trademark. That's what he does well. All those other guys bring something totally different. They're a little bigger, a little more athletic, and all of them have the ability to create shots for themselves."

**(on the frontcourt)** "Corbin (Moore) and Taylor (Darby) have played quite a few minutes the last three years and we'll lean on them heavily to step up even more. We'll challenge them to score more, and need them to have the confidence to score more. They'll also be given responsibilities as leaders. We need a physical presence down low. We want to give them the freedom and the opportunity to make plays, as long as it's within the confines of our offense and our philosophy. It doesn't matter what year they are, everyone's capable of good games and big games. We have guys I consider unselfish scorers, who can have a big night, but the next night he's unselfish and helping someone else get their points. It's hard to say who's going to be doing the scoring, but I think our biggest thing will be making sure we get more in the paint, which will open up opportunities for our guards."

**(on the anticipation of his first season as head coach)** "I'm excited. I know a lot of coaches who have not gotten this opportunity. I'm excited about August and September, unwinding from recruiting and getting back to coaching. That's the exciting part. Every assistant coach has always thought about what they would do if they were the head coach. I don't have to say that anymore. Still, I don't have all the answers and I'm going to lean on my staff. I still talk to Coach Asbury all the time. I'm going to lean on Coach Harrick and spend time with him."

**(on the new-look WCC)** "It's going to be tough. Gonzaga has done such an unbelievable job and I have such great respect for Mark Few. I have great respect for Saint Mary's and Randy Bennett, for where he started to where he's at now. The league has gotten better since I've been back, and now you throw BYU into the mix. I spent four years at Utah and coached against Dave Rose teams. He's a very good coach and has very good players. I have great respect for all of the coaches in our league. I'm looking forward to mixing it up with the X's and O's and philosophies in going against them."
