SEASON OUTLOOK

MALIBU, Calif. – As **Marty Wilson** begins his second year as the head coach of the Pepperdine men's basketball program, he thinks about the things he'd like to enjoy in 2012-13 – a few more wins, a few less injuries and a lot more sleep.

"As a first-year coach I had so many things going on in my head last season: staff, players, plays, wins, losses, everything," explains Wilson, who begins his 16th season in Malibu as either a coach or a student-athlete. "You wake up at 3 in the morning and you're thinking about all of those things. I think one of the main benefits about being in my second year is I'll be able to manage those things better, and with the help of my staff, I'll be able to delegate more. The first year taught me how to adjust better to different situations."

Improved depth and skill from the top to the bottom of the Waves' roster should help Wilson avoid some of those sleepless nights, as long as Pepperdine can avoid being plagued by injuries. The squad lost four players for the year due to various ailments last season, including senior guard **Lorne Jackson** (Simi Valley, Calif./Simi Valley HS), who would have been the team's top returning scorer. All that contributed to the Waves' 10-19 record and seventh-place finish in the West Coast Conference.

Though Pepperdine had a little more turnover than usual in the offseason, with nine players departing from last season's team (five via graduation), Wilson and his staff brought in six new student-athletes and he believes the amount of quality on this year's roster will help the Waves continue their steps back toward prominence.

"We are bringing in young guys who are the kind of players, athletes and young men that we want to represent Pepperdine," Wilson said. "They're going to help us build something special. We are heading in the right direction."

From the moment he moved into the top job, Wilson preached toughness and defense to the Waves, and it paid off as Pepperdine allowed just 65.9 points per game last season, a huge improvement over the previous year and the program's best mark in more than a decade. The Waves finished in the top half of the WCC in scoring defense, field goal percentage defense and three-point field goal percentage defense. The Waves also had a rebound margin of +3.1, their best figure in nearly 20 seasons.

But after two of the top scorers in the program's departed after the 2010-11 season, followed by the loss of Jackson to injury, the Waves struggled to make baskets at times and ended up averaging 59.3 points per contest. With Jackson back in the fold, plus other emerging veterans and the addition of newcomers that know how to score, Wilson believes this season will be different on the offensive end.

"Our offense has to be, and will be, better," said Wilson, who is assisted by **Mark Amaral**, **Bryant Moore** and **Jason Hart**. "Part of it is that we have more skill, and more guys who can do things offensively. But we have to become more aggressive. We want to score more in transition. I think we have more players who will allow

us to do these things.

"But, we still have to hang our hat on our defense. We still have to be tough and physical."

The Waves will be perimeter-driven, with Jackson joining sophomore guard **Jordan Baker** (Tempe, Ariz./Tempe HS) and senior guard **Caleb Willis** (Stockbridge, Ga./Stockbridge HS) to provide a nice veteran nucleus on the outside.

"I feel really good about going into battle with these three guys," Wilson said. "With Lorne and Caleb being seniors, I've been challenging them quite a bit to be our leaders. I feel really good about our guard play this year, whereas it was a big question mark last year."

When Jackson was last seen excelling for the Waves, he was earning All-WCC honorable mention notice after averaging 13.2 points and 2.9 assists during his 2010-11 junior season. He suffered a knee injury during summer 2011, however, and it was decided that he would redshirt last season. He heads into his fifth year at Pepperdine needing just 111 points to become the school's 37th player to reach the 1,000-point milestone.

"Lorne is the most experienced guy that we have," Wilson said. "He's worked hard this summer to get in shape. He understands what we're doing on the floor and we need him to articulate that to everyone else because he's one of our point guards, he's a fifth-year senior, he's a captain, he's a leader."

Baker improved immensely over the course of his freshman season. He averaged 9.0 points overall, best among returning players, but was particularly impressive during WCC play when he averaged 11.3 points (19th overall and fourth among freshmen). Baker scored 26 points in a game against San Francisco, the most by any Wave last season.

"Jordan has definitely matured," Wilson said. "I've seen it in our workouts, I've seen it in our lifting and conditioning, and I've seen it in his communication with his teammates. Physically, he's gotten bigger and stronger. People are going to know who he is now. They're going to come after him a little bit more. He has to be mentally tough to overcome that, and I think he will. The sky is the limit for Jordan. He's talented, he's athletic, he can shoot, score, pass and defend. I think he's in for a very good season."

After being used sparingly his first two seasons, Willis was one of the biggest beneficiaries of Jackson's absence from the court. Willis did a little bit of everything last year, averaging 6.1 points, 3.7 rebounds and a team-best 3.7 assists. He became the first Wave to record 100 assists in a season since 2007 and his 107 were the most by any player since 2005. In the WCC, he ranked fourth in assist-turnover ratio (1.9) and sixth in assists.

"Caleb's going to play a lot again," Wilson said. "He's a big, strong guy. He benefitted a lot last year, going from eight minutes to 30 minutes a game. That's a big leap and something we didn't expect,

but it happened. Ultimately, he is the glue to our team. He is the one who will hold our team together because of his toughness and willingness to do the dirty work. He is willing to be the one to set a hard screen, take a charge or block out a big guy. I know exactly what I'm getting from Caleb every night."

The Waves had long been trying to establish a quality post game, and they finally made it happen last season with Taylor Darby (12.3 points and 6.0 rebounds) and Corbin Moore (10.4 points and 8.6 rebounds) emerging as the team's top two scorers. But both Darby and Moore graduated, leaving the Waves a bit of a mystery in the middle once again.

The top candidates to plug that hole are redshirt sophomore **Jan Maehlen** (Tucson, Ariz./Ironwood Ridge HS), redshirt junior **Moriba De Freitas** (Bon Air Gardens, Trinidad/Williston State JC) and sophomore **Manny Ochenje** (Abuja, Nigeria/Brehm Prep). The first two redshirted last season due to injury and Ochenje showed promise in limited playing time as a freshman.

Maehlen, a 7-foot, 300-pound center, broke a hand in the pre-season last year, then returned to play in three games only to suffer a season-ending groin injury. De Freitas, who is 6-foot-9 and 220 pounds, never got on the floor last season, his first at Pepperdine, due to a knee injury. The 6-foot-9, 205-pound Ochenje averaged 2.0 points and 1.8 rebounds in 20 games.

"The 'five' is our question mark," Wilson said. "Jan didn't play a lot as a freshman and had to sit out last year. Moriba hasn't played one minute of Division I basketball. Manny didn't play a whole lot this past year as a freshman.

"The good thing is that we have three guys who are all different. Physically, athletically and skill-wise, they're different players. Depending on what we are running and who we are playing, as well as their production, will dictate who gets the minutes.

"Jan made the commitment to stay here this summer and work out and change his body. He looks good now and he feels good about himself. If he keeps doing what he's doing, he's going to have a good year for us. Moriba is a very good shot blocker who's good at defending ball screens. Manny has gotten bigger and stronger, and now his biggest challenge is just understanding the pace of the game and the plays we're running. He has the ability, quickness, athleticism and work ethic that makes you want to play him."

Another option might have been 6-foot-9 **Brendan Lane** (Rocklin, Calif./Rocklin HS/UCLA), who graduated from UCLA in three years and is eligible immediately after transferring. But the coaches will honor his request to redshirt this season while he begins work in Pepperdine's master's program for applied finance, and so it's likely that Lane will take to the floor for his final season of college basketball in 2013-14. He shot 50% or better from the field each of his three seasons with the Bruins and had career averages of 2.5 points and 2.2 rebounds in 11.4 minutes.

"I've always been a believer that we are going to do what's best

for a kid as well as the program," Wilson said. "It's more important to build a program than just a team. Brendan will help us the following year. He wants to learn our system, see what we do every day, and adjust to Pepperdine. He's a veteran guy, one who has been through the battles at UCLA. He's been coached well and challenged physically and mentally. That's a big bonus for us to have every day at practice this year and the following year in real games."

A trio of newcomers are looking to earn playing time at forward and it's possible that at a starter will emerge from this group. Six-foot-six junior **Malte Kramer** (Frieburg, Germany/Cuesta College) was one of the top junior college players in the state last season and scored 1,092 points at Cuesta, fourth all-time in the program's history. Freshmen **Stacy Davis** (Laveen, Ariz./Fairfax HS) and **Jett Raines** (Coppell, Texas/Coppell HS) each had impressive prep careers, with the 6-foot-6 Davis earning all-state honors three times and the 6-foot-7 Raines being named the North's MVP at the Texas High School Coaches Association All-Star Game.

"Malte is the most disciplined guy I have been around, both on and off the floor," Wilson said. "His ability to shoot the ball from outside, his knowledge of the game, his experience is huge for this team. He will allow us to play differently from last year because he can space the floor and stretch things out.

"Stacy is probably more ready than any of our other freshmen, and will have the opportunity to play a lot because of his high skill level and physicality. I think he's going to have a really good career here. Jett's name fits him. When he's on the court, he runs as hard as anyone. He's a relentless runner and a great offensive rebounder. He's like a magnet for tip-dunks. I think he could be one of Pepperdine's best-ever defenders."

Two wing players include junior guard **Nikolas Skouen** (Bergen, Norway/Pratt CC) and freshman guard **Atif Russell** (Katy, Texas/Seven Lakes HS). Skouen made a team-high 33 three-pointers last season, his first at Pepperdine, and that's a figure that Wilson believes will increase now that Skouen has a full year under his belt. Russell set a school record with 143 three-pointers at Seven Lakes High School and scored more than 1,000 career points.

"Niko works as hard as any kid that I've ever been around," Wilson said. "He's always in the gym shooting. He's had a year to learn our system and what's expected of him. He's got to learn to play through a mistake, because we get the most out of him when he's playing free and in rhythm. If he makes that leap, he's going to have a good year, and we need him to because we need guys out there who can shoot the ball, and that's what he does.

"As he gets bigger and stronger and continues to learn, anything's possible for Atif. He can step out and hit shots. He can be a great defender. He's very competitive."

The Waves also have a new walk-on that's hoping to help at the point guard position, freshman **Austin Mills** (Beverly Hills, Calif./Beverly Hills HS).

PRESEASON NOTES

- This will be the 75th season of Pepperdine basketball.
- This will be the 40th season that Pepperdine has called Firestone Fieldhouse home.
- A little more luck that leads to an injury-free season would be helpful for the Waves. Four Pepperdine players suffered season-ending injuries over the course of the year.
- The Waves should get a huge lift with the return of senior guard **Lorne Jackson**. He would have been the team's top returning scorer last year after averaging 13.2 points as a 2010-11 junior, leading to All-WCC honorable mention honors. He suffered a torn ACL in his right knee last summer and redshirted last season. Jackson needs just 111 points to become Pepperdine's 37th player to reach the 1,000-point milestone.
- **Lorne Jackson's** previous numbers aren't included, but Pepperdine's six returning players that saw action last season account for 36% of last year's points (621/1,719), 28% of the rebounds (267/943), 55% of the assists (197/358), 21% of the blocked shots (18/85), 55% of the steals (74/135) and 40% of the minutes played (2,320/5,825).
- Leading the returners is sophomore **Jordan Baker**, who averaged 9.0 points per game and is the top scorer back. He had a very impressive rookie season, particularly after the start of conference play. After scoring in double-figures just once in the first 11 games, Baker hit double-digits each of the first seven WCC contests and 10 in all. He averaged 11.3 points in league play (19th overall and fourth among freshmen) and scored 26 points against San Francisco, most by any Wave last season.
- Senior **Caleb Willis** exploded onto the scene during his junior season. After limited playing time his first two years, Willis surpassed his 2010-11 scoring total after just four games, and his two-year total after 12 games. He did a little of everything, averaging 6.1 points, 3.7 rebounds and a team-best 3.7 assists. He became the first Wave to record 100 assists in a season since 2007 and his 107 were the most by any player since 2005. In the WCC, he ranked fourth in assist-turnover ratio (1.9) and sixth in assists.
- This is the first time in a while that Pepperdine's roster has had significant turnover (nine players departed from last year's team, five via graduation). In each of the last three seasons, the Waves had returning players that measured in the double-digits. This year only seven players in all are back from last year's team.
- Senior **Brendan Lane** graduated from UCLA in three years and transferred to Pepperdine. He shot better than 50% from the field each of his three seasons and had career averages of 2.5 points and 2.2 rebounds in 11.4 minutes for the Bruins.
- **Marty Wilson** preached defense to his squad, and it paid off in his first season. The Waves allowed 65.9 points per game, which was the program's seventh-best mark in the last 50 years. They allowed 74.0 points per game the previous season, an improvement of more than eight points per game. For an entire season, Pepperdine hadn't held opponents below 70 points since 2000-01. The Waves finished in the top half of the WCC in scoring defense (third), field goal percentage defense (.428, fourth) and three-point field goal percentage defense (.343, fourth).
- The Waves showed substantial improvement in the area of rebounding for the second straight season. The Waves' rebound margin of +2.1 in 2010-11 was the team's best since 1993-94, and last season Pepperdine raised that figure to +3.1. The Waves' 36.4 rebounds per game were their most since 2004-05 and the 33.2 rebounds allowed were the fewest given up since 1998-99.
- The Waves have five foreign-born players: **Moriba De Freitas** (Trinidad), **Malte Kramer** (Germany), **Jan Maehlen** (Germany), **Manny Ochenje** (Nigeria) and **Nikolas Skouen** (Norway).
- **Marty Wilson**, now in his second full season as head coach, is one of five former Pepperdine student-athletes currently serving as a head coach of one of the Waves' athletic programs (that number will go back up to six in 2013-14 when Terry Schroeder returns as water polo coach).
- Wilson is the Waves' most active coach on Twitter. He can be followed at @MartyWilson4.
- The Waves added Southern California native, Syracuse great and NBA veteran **Jason Hart** to their coaching staff during the offseason. Hart graduated from Syracuse in 2000 and left as the school's all-time leader in steals and second in assists. He was picked in the second round of the 2000 NBA Draft and enjoyed a nine-year career in the NBA. Last year, he was the head coach at Taft High School in Woodland Hills, Calif.
- Pepperdine has had a player in the NBA in 35 of the last 36 seasons. A streak of 34 consecutive years ended in 2010-11, but **Mychel Thompson** made the Cleveland Cavaliers as an undrafted free agent last year and appeared in five games, hopefully starting a new streak. He played on the New York Knicks' summer league team.
- Another Pepperdine alum who played in the NBA, **Yakhouba Diawara**, became the second Wave to play in the Olympics in the sport of men's basketball. He saw action in three games for his native France at the 2012 Olympics, helping the squad to the quarterfinals. **Marcos Leite** appeared in three Olympics for Brazil.

HEAD COACH MARTY WILSON BIO

Marty Wilson begins his second season as the head coach of the Pepperdine men's basketball team in 2012-13, and he is set on helping the program return to the triumphant days that he previously enjoyed as a player and assistant coach with the program.

After 21 seasons as an assistant coach, including nine at Pepperdine, Marty Wilson was elevated to the position of head coach of the Waves following the 2010-11 season. Wilson has compiled an impressive record in Malibu, beginning as a student-athlete (1985-89) and continuing as an assistant coach (1991-96, which included a brief stint as the interim head coach) and as the associate head coach for three seasons (2009-11).

The Waves went 10-19 in his first season. Including his time as interim coach, his overall record is 13-29 in two seasons at Pepperdine.

"I am honored and privileged to be standing here and be named the new head basketball coach at Pepperdine University. I am very thankful to be in this position," said Wilson at his introductory press conference on March 11, 2011. "I want to talk about my vision of building our basketball program back up. It's important for me to build on the foundation that Coach (Tom) Asbury laid when he came back. I know what worked here before, because I lived it. I sat in all the meetings, I was one of those assistants, so I understand the commitment, I understand the desire, I understand the process that we will have to take. And that's a mindset. Our staff is going to focus on the process. We're not just going to focus on trying to win games. We're in the process of building a basketball program. That's very important. We're going to do it the right way."

Excluding interim coaches, Wilson is the 12th men's basketball head coach in Pepperdine history.

During his first six seasons on the Waves' staff, which followed his graduation in 1989, Wilson helped Pepperdine to a 106-72 (.596) record. He began as the restricted-earnings coach before being elevated to full-time status for the 1994-95 season.

With Wilson on the bench, Pepperdine earned bids to the NCAA Tournament in 1991, 1992 and 1994 and made the NIT in 1993. The Waves also won West Coast Conference regular-season titles in 1991, 1992 and 1993 and WCC Tournament titles in 1991, 1992 and 1994.

Following Tom Asbury's departure for Kansas State after the 1993-94 season, Wilson remained on the staff under new head coach Tony Fuller. When Fuller resigned midway through the 1995-96 season, Wilson took over on an interim basis at the age of 28 and directed the Waves to a 3-10 record down the stretch. Most notably, that included an upset of a Steve Nash-led Santa Clara team in the first round of the WCC Tournament.

Wilson left Malibu but stayed in Southern California for the next

several years, spending two seasons (1996-97 and 1997-98) as an assistant coach at San Diego, where he was also the recruiting coordinator under head coach Brad Holland.

He spent the next six seasons (1999-2004) at UC Santa Barbara, and was the top assistant for Bob Williams as the Gauchos averaged 18 wins a season during his last three years there. UCSB won the Big West Conference's West Division in 1999, captured the Big West Tournament title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2002 and won the Big West regular-season title and made an appearance in the NIT in 2003.

Prior to his return to Pepperdine, Wilson was an assistant for four seasons (2005-08) at Utah under head coaches Ray Giacoletti and Jim Boylen. During his first season, the Utes went 29-6, won the Mountain West Conference's regular-season title, advanced to the NCAA Tournament's Sweet Sixteen and finished the year ranked 18th nationally by the Associated Press.

He was hired back at Pepperdine in February 2008 as the associate head coach with the intention that he would eventually move into the head coaching position once Asbury retired.

As a player with the Waves, Wilson ended his career in fifth place on the all-time assists list with 342 (he still ranks ninth). Under head coach Jim Harrick, Wilson was a backup point guard in 1984-85 and 1985-86, and the Waves advanced to the NCAA Tournament both seasons. A back injury sidelined Wilson for the entire 1986-87 campaign, but he took over as the starting point guard in 1987-88. Unfortunately, he suffered a season-ending knee injury in the 17th game of the season, though the Waves still advanced to the NIT.

Asbury took over as head coach in 1988-89, and Wilson's extensive rehabilitation paid off as he returned to the starting lineup as a senior and led the Waves to a 20-13 record and the second round of the NIT. The Waves posted a record of 97-58 (.626) during his five seasons as a student-athlete.

Wilson graduated from Pepperdine in 1989 with a bachelor's degree in communications. In the year between his graduation and his return to Pepperdine as an assistant coach, Wilson tried out for the Continental Basketball Association and was an assistant coach at Simi Valley High School.

A native of Pacoima, Calif., Wilson was a prep standout at Simi Valley High School. He was named the Marmonte League's Most Valuable Player as a 1983-84 senior. One of his teammates was future UCLA and NBA standout Don MacLean.

Wilson once ran a free basketball camp in his hometown for around 100 under-privileged kids each summer.

His actual first name is Lamar (Marty was a childhood nickname given to him by a sister). He and his wife, Mayra, have a daughter, Jessica, and a son, Jalon.
