NOTES

PENN STATE SERIES HISTORY

The Panthers and Nittany Lions will be meeting for the 83rd time in series history and just the third time at PSU since 1985. Penn State has won the last four and holds the overall series lead at 59-22-1.

ITS BEEN AWHILE

The Panthers have not traveled to University Park in over 20 years, dating all the way back to 1985, where they dropped a pair of games to the Nittany Lions 4-2 and 6-4 (10). The last time the Panthers won a true road game at Penn State was in 1983, by a score of 9-4.

NITTANY LIONS vs. BIG EAST

The Nittany Lions have played their fair share of Big East games this season, currently holding a 3-3 mark against the conference. PSU lost to St. John's 15-6 at the inaugural Big East/Big Ten Challenge while defeating Seton Hall, 6-1. Penn State and Rutgers split a four-game series played March 13-15 in Boca Raton, Fla.

COMMON OPPONENTS

Akron, Saint Joseph's and Ohio State are all common opponents thus far this season between the two clubs. Penn State has been able to go 3-2 through five games while Pitt has tallied a 4-1 record with their only loss coming against an Ohio State team that the Lions previously dropped two of three to at home, March 27-29.

SNOW DAY

Pitt's scheduled game against the Nittany Lions at Penn State was postponed due to weather conditions. The game marked the fifth this season the Panthers have had to either cancel or postpone due to weather. The non-conference contest with PSU has been rescheduled for Tuesday, April 14th at 6:35 p.m. in University Park, Pa.

OHIO SERIES HISTORY

The Panthers will meet the Bobcats for the 24th time in series history and second time this season on Wednesday, April 15th. Ohio holds an 18-5 edge over Pitt and has won the last three games in the series, including a 9-8 win back on March 4th.

ITS A WALK OFF

The Panthers and Bobcats battled through until the end, with Ohio winning for the third straight time in the series, 9-8, March 4th. Pitt rallied in the seventh and eighth innings, scoring three and four runs respectively to knot the game at eight apiece.

The game seemed destined for extra innings after the first two batters of the Ohio ninth made outs, but Gauntlett Eldemire sent a two-out, 1-0 pitch over the centerfield wall to give the Bobcats the 9-8 win.

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

The Panthers and Cardinals needed extra innings to settle two of the three games in its series this past weekend. Those two games, which happened to be a double header, marked the first time in Pitt history that the Panthers had both games of a double header come down to extra innings. Unfortunately, the Panthers dropped both games by one run, 1-0 and 3-2.

EXTRA INNINGS

The Panthers lead the Big East Conference in extra innings games this season with six. Only seven of the 12 teams in the Big East have played at least one extra innings game in 2009. Pitt is 14-17 under head coach Joe Jordano spanning back to the 1999 season and is 2-4 so far this year.

600 WINS LATER

Head Coach Joe Jordano picked up his 600th career win following Pitt's 6-4 win over Duquesne on April 1st. Jordano picked up his 300th win at Pitt in the final game of the 2008 season and currently has accumulated 317 wins while wearing the Panther Blue and Gold. The 2004 Big East Coach of the Year currently sits in second place on the all-time coaching wins list in Pitt history, trailing only Bobby Lewis, who tallied 413 wins in a 35-year career.

BIG EAST HONOR ROLL

After batting .412 (7-for-17) and slugging 1.118 over five games last week, Chris Sedon was named to the Big East Conference Weekly

Honor Roll. Sedon's honor marked the second time this season the Panthers have had a player featured among the Big East's weekly elite.

The junior second baseman and leadoff hitter for the Panthers tallied 12 RBI, three doubles, three home runs and stole four bases over the course of the week, helping Pitt to a 4-1 record and a 2-1 series win over Notre Dame.

WASTING NO TIME

The Panthers reached the 17-win mark in their 24th game this season, the second fastest in head coach Joe Jordano's tenure. In 2002, Pitt registered their 17th win in their 25th game while in 2003 and 2004, the Panthers reached the 17-win mark in just 19 games, going 15-4 in both seasons.

WE'RE GOING STREAKING

Leadoff hitter Chris Sedon started the season with an eight-game hitting streak before being shutout by Miami on March 11th. He went back to work the following game, embarking on a nine-game hitting streak which was snapped in a rain-shortened 7-4 win over Youngstown State.

HOME RUN DERBY

The Panthers have totaled 34 home runs through 30 games this season, ranking them third in the Big East Conference, right on the trail of West Virginia (38) and Louisville (38). Twelve different Panthers have hit at least one home run this season, led by Chris Sedon's 10. Joe Leonard, Frank Mercurio and Cory Brownsten each have four while Matt Litzinger, Morgan Kielty, Nathan Hood and John Schultz each have two.

SEASON SWEEP

The Panthers made it three in a row over Akron this season with their 17-5 thrashing on March 31. Pitt followed up an 8-5 win over Akron at the Papa John's Classic with a 14-13 shootout win at Lee Jackson Field in Akron, Ohio on March 24th. Chris Sedon batted .538 (7-for-13), jacking three home runs and tallying 12 RBI against the Zips, including a grand slam in the second inning of the March 24th contest.

TRIPLE CROWN

Junior transfer Chris Sedon has been nearly perfect through his first 24 games in a Panther uniform. The starting second baseman and lead-off hitter for Pitt leads the team in nearly every offensive category, including batting average (.382), RBI (34) and home runs (10).

this season. The speedy second baseman leads the Panthers in stolen bases and is tied atop the Big East standings with 15. Sedon has been caught just three times this season.

DUQUESNE RECAP

Wednesday's 6-4 win for Pitt marked the 80th meeting between the Panthers and Dukes. The Panthers took an early 1-0 lead off a **Danny Lopez** solo home run in the second and never looked back, increasing their overall series lead to 58-21-1, having won nine of the last 13 meetings. Pitt won both games last year, edging the Dukes 9-8 at Duquesne and overcoming a 5-1 deficit to drop their cross-town rival 17-6 in a game held at PNC Park. Pitt and Duquesne will meet once more this season, May 6th, at PNC Park once again.

NINE LIVES, NINE WINS

After pitching four and two-thirds innings in relief against Youngstown State, pitcher **Josh Smith** became the ninth different Panther to record a win on the year. Smith joined the party a day after **Joe Leonard**, the primary third baseman for Pitt, picked up a win at Akron on March 24th after tossing two innings of no-hit ball.

Corey Baker leads the team with four wins on the year and is followed by **Kevin Dooley** with three and **Matt Iannazzo**, **Ryan Dunford** and **Smith** with two each. Leonard is joined by **Ricky Breymier**, **David Kaye** and **Nate Reed** with one apiece.

BIG EAST HONORS BAKER

Sophomore right-hander **Corey Baker** was named the Big East Conference Pitcher of the Week for the period ending March 23rd for his performance in the Panthers' 5-0 win over Cincinnati on Saturday, March 21.

Baker (3-0) picked up his team-leading third win of the season, throwing a complete-game six hitter. The New York City native struck out five Bearcat batters while walking just one.

OPENING WEEKEND

The Panthers took two of three games from the University of Cincinnati in the opening weekend of Big East play, March 20-22. Pitt put up a season-high 18 runs on 23 hits in the first game, led by home runs from **Chris Sedon**, **Frank Mercurio** and **Cory Brownsten**.

Corey Baker's complete-game six-hit shutout clinched the series for Pitt. Mercurio reached out and touched 'em all for his third home run of the season and second in as many games, finishing the day 3-for-4 at the plate.

The Bearcats offense awoke on Sunday, jumping out to an early 4-0 lead before Pitt answered with a four-run third to knot the game. UC, however, continued to find its groove, tacking on five more runs over the ensuing five innings to steal the 9-5 win going away.

YOUNG GUNS

Chris Sedon, **Frank Mercurio** and **Cory Brownsten** all homered in their first game at Trees Field in a Panther uniform. Sedon's fifth home run of the season was a solo shot in the second. Mercurio's solo shot in the bottom of the fifth was part of a four-run spree that put Pitt up 8-2. Brownsten's sixth-inning, two-run bomb helped cap a four-run inning which put the Panthers ahead 12-4.

ON THE REBOUND

After starting the season 1-3, the Panthers have climbed above the .500 mark and now stand at 17-10 overall. A 7-2 record over a 10-day span in Florida had put the Panthers in the top half of the Big East standings heading into the first weekend of conference play.

TOP THIS

Junior **Chris Sedon** put on quite a performance over the Panthers' nine games in Florida. The leadoff second baseman hit .463 for the trip, hitting safely in eight of nine games, including multiple hits in six games. He tallied 10 RBI, two doubles, one triple and two home runs, helping Pitt to a 7-2 mark during its trip down south.

For the season, Sedon has recorded a hit in 12 of 13 games, including nine games with at least two hits. Four times this season he has tallied at least three hits, including a season-high of four in an 8-5 win over Akron on March 8.

TAKIN CARE OF BUSINESS

The Panthers competed in the Papa John's Classic for the third straight season, posting a 7-2 record in 10 days of action in the Sunshine State.

Head Coach **Joe Jordano** enters his 12th season at front man for the Panthers. Jordano, the 2004 Big East Coach of the Year, has guided the Panthers to nearly 30 wins per season.

Pitt won its first four games in Florida before falling to No. 6 Miami, 11-6, in Miami. The Panthers' only other loss came against Ohio State, ranked 30th at the time.

Pitt ended its trip with a three-game winning streak, including its third extra innings game of the season, a 3-2 win over North Dakota State on Sunday, March 15.

St. Bonaventure (W, 12-8, 11 inn.)

The Panthers played their second extra innings game of the season in the first game at the Papa John's Classic against St. Bonaventure in West Palm Beach, Fla. A one-out triple with the bases loaded by **Kevan Smith** proved to be the difference as the Panthers would hold on for the 12-8 win over the Bonnies, pushing their series record to 5-0 all-time.

Akron (W, 8-5)

Junior second baseman **Chris Sedon** paved the way for the Panthers' 8-5 win of Akron on day two of the Papa John's Classic. Sedon tallied three singles and a triple, going 4-for-5 at the plate with four RBI while scoring twice. **Corey Baker** picked up the win, throwing seven innings, allowing three earned runs while striking out six.

St. Joseph's (W, 17-5)

The Pittsburgh offense was in full effect in its 17-5 win over St. Joe's, its third win in as many days in Florida. Seven Panthers recorded multi-hit performances at the plate, led by **Danny Lopez** who went a perfect 5-for-5 with a game-high six RBI on the day. Six Panthers finished with at least one RBI while **Matt Iannazzo** picked up the win, throwing seven innings, striking out eight while walking just two batters.

SIU-Edwardsville (W, 6-0)

In a gem of a performance, **David Kaye** threw a complete-game two hitter with seven strikeouts to give Pitt its fourth win in a row. Facing just four batters more than the minimum in the Panthers' 6-0 win over SIU-Edwardsville, Kaye picked up his first win of the season behind strong support from **Joe Leonard** and **Danny Lopez** who each tallied two RBI on the day.

Miami (L, 11-6)

After going up 6-0 through three and a half innings on the No. 6 team in the country, the Panthers fell to Miami 11-6. **Joe Leonard** led Pitt at the plate, going 3-for-5 with a home run against the Hurricanes, who remained unbeaten against the Panthers in the all-time series (3-0).

Ohio State (L, 20-3)

The Panthers continued to score early on, going up 2-0 on the 30th-ranked Buckeyes in their fifth game of the Papa John's Classic. Unfortunately for Pitt, Ohio State's Alex Wimmers turned up the heat after giving up two runs in the first inning, striking out 15 Panther batters and giving up just one run over the final eight innings. **Chris Sedon** continued his stellar play at the classic, going 3-for-4 with a home run while scoring two of Pitt's three runs on the day.

Long Island (W, 12-2)

Pitt got back on the winning track with a 12-2 win over Long Island University. **Corey Baker** picked up his second win of the trip, throwing six and a third innings, striking out five while allowing just two earned runs. After a slow offensive start, Pitt poured it on with 10 runs in the seventh and eighth innings. **John Schultz**, **Joe Leonard** and **Cory Brownsten** all had at least two RBI and four Panthers enjoyed multi-hit performances from the plate in the win.

North Dakota State (W, 3-2, 11 inn.)

Danny Lopez's game winning single in the bottom of the 11th inning gave Pitt its second win in a row, 3-2 over North Dakota State in the third extra inning game of the season. **Ryan Dunford** picked up his first win of the season, entering the game in the top of the 11th inning and shutting down the Bison in order.

UMBC (W, 12-8)

The Panthers won the first game played between the two schools, 12-8, on their final day in Florida. **Kevin Dooley** evened his season record

to 1-1, throwing three and two thirds innings, striking out three while yielding two earned runs. **Chris Sedon** and **Matt Litzinger** both went 3-for-4 at the plate. Sedon and Danny Lopez drove in a game-high three RBI each while Sedon jacked his second home run of the trip in the winning effort.



Chris Sedon leads the Panthers in nearly every offensive category and is ranked among the Big East Conference's top-five. Sedon is the latest Panther to be honored by the Big East, garnering honor roll accolades for the period ending March 30th.

WHEN NINE ISN'T ENOUGH

Pitt opened up the 2009 season with an extra innings game against Bradley. The Panthers battled to put two up in the bottom of the ninth, but fell in the 10th as the Braves were able to manufacture the winning run while holding off Pitt for the 9-8 win.

The last time the Panthers opened the season with an extra innings game was 18 years ago in the 1991 opener, losing 7-6 in 13 innings to a Mercyhurst team led by current Pitt head coach **Joe Jordano**.

THE LONGEST WEEKEND

The Panthers' opening weekend continued to grow longer on day two of the Service Academies Spring Classic, when rain delayed Pitt's scheduled contest against Navy for nearly four hours before a postponement was called. Through one inning of play, the Panthers and Midshipmen were tied at 1-1.

DOUBLE TIME

With the rain delay hindering its scheduled game against Navy on Feb. 21, Pitt was forced to play a doubleheader in the opening weekend of a season for the third time in the past five years. The Panthers beat Air Force, 10-9, while falling to Navy, 3-1, in the second game on Sunday, Feb. 22. The previous two opening weekend doubleheaders in 2005 and 2006 were also split.

BACK IN THE SADDLE

Redshirt sophomore **Kevan Smith** saw his first baseball action in three years as he recorded six putouts in a 3-1 loss to Navy on Feb. 22. Smith made the transition to baseball after spending his first two years at Pitt as a quarterback with the football team.

BIG WIN FOR ROOK

Freshman lefty **Matt Iannazzo** picked up Pitt's first win of the 2009 season during the opening weekend of play against the Air Force Academy. Iannazzo threw five innings, giving up five hits while recording six strikeouts in the 10-9 win over AFA on Feb. 22.

TRIPLE J

Head Coach **Joe Jordano** enters his 12th season as Pitt's head coach where he is averaging just under 30 wins per season. In the 2008 season finale on May 14, Jordano collected his 300th win as a Panther, defeating Cleveland State 4-2. Jordano currently ranks second on Pitt's all-time wins list, bolstering a 301-273-2 record. In 2009, Jordano and the Panthers look to bounce back and make a return trip to not only the Big East Tournament, but the championship game, where they last played in 2005.

OUT OF THE GATES
