Series: The two schools meet for the second time this season as Pitt claimed a 69-60 contest on Jan. 14 at the Petersen Events Center. Pitt is 31-39 all-time vs. Georgetown. Pitt and Georgetown met in last year's Big East Championship Final with the Hoyas claiming a 65-42 win.

No. 7 seed Pitt (25-9) advances to the Big East Championship Final for the third consecutive season and seventh time in eight years as it will meet No. 1 seed Georgetown (27-4). Tonight's contest is slated for 9 p.m. ET.

The contest is a rematch of last year's Big East Championship Final as Georgetown claimed a 65-42 win on March 10, 2007. Pitt defeated Georgetown 69-60 in the team's head-to-head matchup on January 14.

The contest will be broadcast nationally on ESPN. Dan Shulman (play-by-play) and Len Elmore (analysis) will make the call, Doris Burke will handle sideline reports while Bo Garrett will produce.

Pitt has now advanced to the Big East Championship Final in six of the last seven seasons.

Jamie Dixon has guided Pitt to the title game in four of his five seasons as head coach. Dixon owns a 10-4 record in Big East Championship games.

Riding a five-game win streak along with claiming six wins in its last seven contests, Pitt enters the Big East Championship Final after defeating two consecutive nationally ranked teams in No. 25 Marquette (68-61) in Friday's Semifinal and No. 12 Louisville 76-69 in overtime in Thursday's Big East Quarterfinal. With his 22 points, Sam Young led Pitt to a 35-22 halftime lead and held off a late Marquette rally. Young paced Pitt with his sixth career and fourth double-double of the season with game-highs of 21 points and 12 rebounds against Louisville. Pitt held the Cardinals to

37.5 percent (27-72) field goal shooting and hit 17-20 free throws over the second half and overtime periods combined to claim the victory. Pitt outscored Louisville 14-7 in the overtime period to close out the win. Young scored 21 points and grabbed nine rebounds as Pitt defeated Cincinnati 70-64 in Big East Championship First Round action. The Panthers pulled away early in the second half using top performances from seniors Keith Benjamin and Ronald Ramon along with Sam Young.

Pitt concluded its regular season with a 22-9 overall record and 10-8 Big East record. Over the last seven years (2002-08), Pitt has proven to be the winningest Big East Conference basketball program. From 2001-07, Pitt owns the league's top records for league play (81-33) and

overall games (187-50). It has averaged 11.6 league wins and 26 overall wins per year during that period, the best totals in the Big East. Pitt is the only Big East Conference school to win 20 or more overall games and 10 or more league contests in each of the last seven seasons. Last year, Pitt also set a school record with its sixth consecutive 20-overall win and 10-league win season. Prior to the 2001-02 season, Pitt won 20 or more games in only two consecutive seasons. It marks Pitt's 15th all-time 20-win season.

DIXON CONTINUES WINNING TRADITION

Pitt's Jamie Dixon (130-39) is the first coach in school history to win 20 or more games in five consecutive seasons. Last year, he became the first head coach in school history to guide Pitt to four consecutive NCAA Tournaments. His 130 victories (2003-08) rank as the fourth most victories for a head coach after five seasons in NCAA Division I history (see chart in notes, page 4). North Carolina State's Everett Case totaled 137 wins from 1947-51, Gonzaga's Mark Few finished 133 from 2000-04 and Kansas' Roy Williams totaled 132 wins from 1989-93. Additionally, Dixon has led Pitt to Sweet Sixteen appearances in two of his first four seasons at Pitt (20004 and 2007) and Big East title game appearances in four of his first five years (2004, 2006, 2007, 2008). Dixon is one of only nine coaches in NCAA Division I history to win 100 or more games in the first four years of a coaching career.

YOUNG ELEVATES HIS GAME FOR THE BIG EAST CHAMPIONSHIP

In Pitt's three Big East Championship games, junior Sam Young has averaged 21.3 points, 7.3 rebounds, 2.3 blocks and 2.3 assists per game. The All-Big East First Team selection and Big East Most Improved Player Award winner, Young has scored 20 or more points in each of the last three games. He scored 22 vs. Marquette and 21 points each against both Cincinnati and Louisville. He is a candidate for the Big East Most Valuable Player honors.

Young has scored 20 or more points in six of his last nine games including three straight 20-point performances (Feb. 21-27 and March 12-15) and two straight in the Big East Tourney. He has reached double figures in 17 consecutive contests.

PITT TURNS ON THE DEFENSE FOR BIG EAST CHAMPIONSHIP

In Pitt's three Big East Tournament games (vs. Cincinnati, vs. Louisville, vs. Marquette), Pitt has limited its three opponents to 35.8 percent (67-187) combined field goal shooting and 28.6 percent (14-49) 3-point shooting. All three teams were held to 70 points or less.

On the year, Pitt has limited its opponents to 46.0 percent (925-2013) shooting and 33.9 percent (209-617) 3-point shooting. On the year, Pitt has also held 24 of its 34 opponents to 70 or less points.

Prior to the Big East Championship, Pitt struggled defensively as five of Pitt's last seven regular season opponents shot over 45.0 percent against the Panthers. Additionally, five of its last seven opponents scored 70 or more points against Pitt.

PITT SENIORS LOOK TO WIN CAREER GAME NO. 100

With a win today, Pitt's senior class will become just the fifth senior class in school history to win over 100 career games. Pitt's senior class of Keith Benajmin, Mike Cook, Ronald Ramon and Maurice Polen is currently 99-34 (.744 winning percentage).

The foursome currently ranks sixth among career senior classes in winning percentage.

PITT ADVANCES TO BIG EAST TITLE GAME AFTER PLAYING ON WEDNESDAY FOR SECOND YEAR

Pitt has appeared in the Big East Championship Final in seven of the last eight seasons. Pitt advanced all the way to the Big East title game after playing on Wednesday. In 2006, Pitt entered the tournament as the No. 6 seed and needed three games to advance to the Big East Championship game.

The No. 7 seed marks the lowest seed in which Pitt advanced to the title game.

PITT WINS 25 OR MORE GAMES FOR THIRD STRAIGHT SEASON

With its win over Marquette, Pitt has won 25 or more games for the third consecutive season. Pitt finished 29-8 last year and 25-8 in 2005-06.

The 25 wins rank tied for the fifth most wins in school history. The only other seasons in which Pitt won more games were in: 2003-04, 31-5; 2001-02, 29-6; 2006-07, 29-8 and 2002-03, 28-5.

PITT ELIMINATES LOUISVILLE FOR THIRD STRAIGHT YEAR IN BIG EAST CHAMPIONSHIP

Pitt eliminated Louisville from the Big East Championship for the third consecutive season. Pitt claimed a 76-69 overtime win yesterday and Pitt has won each of the last two matchups, claiming a 65-59 Quarterfinal win on March 9, 2007 and a 61-56 First Round win on March 8, 2006. Both wins fueled Pitt runs in the Big East Championship Final.

PITT'S HOME AWAY FROM HOME: MADISON SQUARE GARDEN

Madison Square Garden is Pitt's home away from home. Pitt is 5-0 at MSG this season and is 22-8 at MSG since the 2000-01 season. Additionally, Pitt has won seven of its last eight games at MSG and 18 of its last 24 Big East Tournament games at the Garden.

- Pitt will make an appearance in its seventh Big East

Championship Final in the last eight years. Jamie Dixon has guided Pitt to his fourth Big East Championship Final in his first five seasons as head coach at Pitt.

- Pitt has now won six of its last seven games on the year.
- Madison Square Garden is Pitt's home away from home as the Panthers are 22-8 at MSG since 2000-01. Pitt improves to 5-0 at Madison Square Garden this year and has won seven of its last eight in the "World's Most Famous Arena."

- Pitt Head Coach Jamie Dixon improved to 10-4 in Big East Championship Games.
- With his 22 points, Sam Young finished with his 17th career 20-plus point scoring game. Young has now reached double figure scoring in 33 of Pitt's 34 games this year and in 41 of his last 45 games played. Young has now led Pitt in scoring in 24 of 34 games. Yesterday, Young (21 points/12 rebounds) registered his sixth career and fourth double-double this season. For the Big East Tournament, Young is averaging 21.3 points and 7.3 rebounds per game. He is shooting 49.0 percent (25-51) in the three games.
- Young moved into fourth place on Pitt's Big East Tournament career scoring list. He now has 126 career points and is ranked behind Donatas Zavackas (138 from 2000-03), Brandin Knight (136 from 2000-03) and Carl Krauser (134 from 2003-06). Young also ranks fifth on the rebounding list with 58 career rebounds.
- LeVance Fields reached double figure scoring for the sixth game in a row. It also marked his 43rd

career double figure scoring game. In Big East Tournament action, Fields is averaging 11.7 points, 5.3 assists and 3.7 rebounds per game.

- With his 14 points, Ronald Ramon registered his 51st career double figure scoring game and 14th time this year. In Big East Tournament action, Ramon is averaging 13.0 points and 5.3 assists per game. He is shooting 50 percent (9-18) from 3-point range.
- Pitt's 25 victories rank tied for fifth among the all-time winningest seasons at Pitt. The school record is 31 set in 2003-04, Jamie Dixon's first year at Pitt. Dixon has guided five of Pitt's 15 winningest seasons.
- Pitt's senior class of Keith Benjamin, Mike Cook, Ronald Ramon and Maurice Polen improved to 99-34 all-time. The class needs just one more victory to become just the fifth senior class in school history to win 100 or more games.
- Pitt improved to 3-2 vs. ranked teams on the season.

- Pitt held Marquette to 61 points on the evening. On the year, Pitt has now limited 24 of its 34 opponents to 70 points or less. - Madison Square Garden is Pitt's home away from home as the Panthers are 21-8 at MSG since 2000-01. Pitt improves to 4-0 at Madison Square Garden this year and has won six of its last seven in the "World's Most Famous Arena."

- Pitt improved to 4-3 all-time vs. Louisville. It split the two games against the Cardinals this year.
- The overtime contest marked Pitt's second of the season. Pitt also defeated Duke in overtime at Madison Square Garden (65-64 on Dec. 20, 2007).
- Pitt held Louisville to 69 points on the evening. On the year, Pitt has now limited 23 of its 33 opponents to 70 points or less.

PITT EARNS THREE POSTSEASON HONORS AT BIG EAST AWARDS BANQUET

Pitt earned three Big East postseason awards at the league's annual awards banquet on March 11. Sam Young earned the league's Most Improved Player Award, DeJuan Blair was honored as the co-Big East Rookie of the Year and Ronald Ramon was the co-Sportsmanship Award winner.

Pitt's three honors mark the second-most Big East postseason awards earned in a season. Pitt earned four Big East postseason honors following the 2003-04 season.

Young becomes Pitt's fifth Big East Most Improved Player in each of the last nine years. Pitt's four other Big East Most Improved Player honorees during that span include: Ricardo Greer (1999-00), Brandin Knight (2001-02), Carl Krauser (2002-03) and Aaron Gray (2005-06).

Blair earns Pitt's fifth all-time Big East Freshman/Rookie of the Year honor. Other Pitt players to earn the award include: Charles Smith (1984-85), Sean Miller (1987-88), Brian Shorter (1988-89) and Chris Taft (2003-04). As only a freshman, Blair became Pitt's 11th All-Big East Rookie Team selection. He also was named a Big East honorable mention selection.

Ronald Ramon becomes the first player at Pitt to earn the Sportsmanship Award since Jaron Brown took home the honor after the 2003-04 season.
