No. 3 seeded Pitt (27-6, 12-4 Big East) advances to Big East Championship Final against No. 1 seed Georgetown (25-6, 13-3 Big East).

The contest will be broadcast nationally on ESPN. Dan Shulman (play-by-play) and Len Elmore (analysis) will make the call with sideline reports from Mark Jones. Bo Garrett will handle production.

Pitt meets Georgetown for the third time this season. Pitt claimed a 74-69 victory over the Hoyas at the Petersen Events Center on Jan. 13. Georgetown won a 61-53 decision at the Verizon Center on Feb. 24. In Georgetown, Pitt is attempting to defeat its third opponent who accounted for four of its six losses this year. It defeated Marquette in the Quarterfinal Round, a team that handed Pitt two losses this year.

Then it defeated Louisville in the Semifinal Round, a team that beat the Panthers at home.

Pitt is playing in its sixth Big East Championship Final in the last seven seasons. It advanced to the title game in 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004 and 2006 and claimed the championship in 2003. Jamie Dixon has now guided Pitt to the title game in three of his first four seasons as head coach.

Pitt battled back from an 11-point halftime deficit to defeat Louisville 65-59 in the Semifinal Round. It used a 20-2 run and a career-high 23 points from Antonio Graves including 10 second half points to register the win. Mike Cook added 13 points as the Panthers held off Louisville to advance to the Big East title game.

Pitt defeated Marquette 89-79 to advance to Big East Semifinal play. With the win, the

- Pitt advances to its sixth Big East Championship Final in each of the last seven years. Jamie Dixon has guided Pitt to Big East Championship title games in three of his four years as head coach.

Panthers avenged two regular season losses to the Golden Eagles. Aaron Gray scored 22 points and grabbed 10 rebounds in leading the Panthers to victory. It marked Gray's seventh 20-point performance of the year. Pitt also placed four other players in double figures including Sam Young (17 points/5-6 FG/7-10 FT), Mike Cook (16 points and seven rebounds), LeVance Fields (13 points) and Antonio Graves (10 points). Pitt surpassed season-highs for free throws made (27) and free throw attempts (27). Pitt, which improved to 20-0 in games in which it led at halftime, led by as many as 16 points late in the second half.

Pitt concluded its regular season with a 25-6 overall record and 12-4 Big East record. Over the last six years, Pitt has proven to be the winningest Big East Conference basketball program. From 2001-07, Pitt owns the league's top records for league play (71-24) and overall games (160-38). It has averaged 11.8 league wins and 26.7 overall wins

per year during that period, the best totals in the Big East. Pitt is the only Big East Conference school to win 20 or more overall games and 10 or more league contests in each of the last six seasons. This year, Pitt also set a school record with its sixth consecutive 20-overall win and 10-league win season. Prior to the 2001-02 season, Pitt won 20 or more games in only two consecutive seasons. It marks Pitt's 14th all-time 20-win season.

Additionally, Pitt Head Coach Jamie Dixon (103 career wins) is the first coach in school history to win 20 or more games in four consecutive seasons. Dixon is one of only nine coaches in NCAA Division I history to win 100 or more games in the first four years of a coaching career. Dixon needs five more wins to break the NCAA record for most victories over the first four seasons of a coaching career. Everett Case holds the record with 107 wins in his first four years as the head coach at North Carolina State (1947-50).

**SEVERAL PANTHERS VIE FOR ALL-TOURNAMENT HONORS**

Several Panthers have made their case for Big East Championship All-Tournament honors. Antonio Graves scored a career-high 23 points vs. Louisville and is averaging 16.5 points per game and shooting .667 from 3-point range (6-9). Aaron Gray scored 22 points against Marquette and is averaging 15.0 points and 5.0 rebounds per game.

Mike Cook has hit double figures in each of Pitt's two games and is averaging 14.5 points and leading the team with a 7.5 rebounds per game average. Sam Young is averaging 11.0 points off the bench for Pitt.

**PITT REACHES 27 WINS FOR FOURTH TIME IN SCHOOL HISTORY**

With its victory over Louisville, Pitt won its 27th game for the fourth time in school history. Pitt is attempting to set its school record for victories in a season. The record is 31 wins in 2003-04, Dixon's first season at Pitt. Pitt also won 29 games in 2001-02 and 28 games in 2002-03.

**GRAY EARNS NABC ALL-AMERICA THIRD TEAM HONORS**

Aaron Gray became the 10th player in school history to earn All-

America honors when he was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches All-America Third Team. Fifteen players nationally were honored with the award.

He is the fifth player in school history to earn All-America honors from the NABC including Don Hennon, Billy Knight, Jerome Lane and Charles Smith.

Gray earned NABC All-District 3 honors earlier in the year.

**YOUNG ON SCORING STREAK**

Sophomore forward Sam Young has reached double figure scoring in five of his last seven games including a 17-point performance against Marquette. During that seven-game streak, Young has scored 67 points (9.6 ppg), all coming off the bench.

**GRAY'S PLAY ELEVATES IN BIG EAST CHAMPIONSHIP**

Aaron Gray has set a precedent for outstanding consistent play in the Big East Championship. Over his last six games in BEC play, Gray has averaged 13.7 ppg. (82 points) and 9.5 rebounds (57 rebounds). He has netted four double-doubles in those six games.

Last year, Gray set the Big East Championship record with 47 rebounds over a full tournament.

Gray needs just 15 rebounds to set Pitt's all-time Big East Championship career record for most rebounds. The record is 71 rebounds held by Jaron Brown from 2000-04 followed by 70 from Isaac Hawkins (1997-01) and 63 from Ricardo Greer (1998-01). Gray currently stands in fourth place with 57 career rebounds.

**SENIOR TRIO ADVANCES ON ALL-TIME BIG EAST CHAMPIONSHIP WIN LIST**

Seniors Aaron Gray, Antonio Graves and Levon Kendall moved into seventh place on Pitt's all-time Big East Championship win list with their seventh victory. The trio still trails several other players including Jaron Brown (10), Julius Page (10), Toree Morris (10), Carl Krauser (8), Brandin Knight (8), Donatas Zavackas (8), Chevon Troutman (7) and Mark McCarroll (7).

Next week, the trio will set the school record with their fourth straight NCAA Tournament appearance. Only three other Pitt

players appeared in four NCAA Tournaments: Chevon Troutman, Carl Krauser and Mark McCarroll.

**GRAY EARNS AEROPOSTALE MEN'S BASKETBALL SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AWARD**

Aaron Gray was named the 2006-07 Big East/Aéropostale Men's Basketball Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Gray receives a \$2,000 scholarship which may be applied to graduate or professional studies.

A Communication & Rhetoric major, Gray is on pace to graduate from the University of Pittsburgh in August. He has also been involved in numerous community service activities on campus and around Pittsburgh. The 2006-07 preseason Big East Player of the Year, Gray is a finalist for the Wooden Award, Naismith Award and Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. Last week he was named to the NABC All-District 3 team.

An Emmaus, Pa., native, Gray was named to the All-Big East First Team for the second consecutive season. He joined the company of Charles Smith (1986-87 and 1987-88) and Brian Shorter (1988-89, 1989-90) as Pitt's three players who earned All-Big East First Team honors in two different seasons. A unanimous selection by league coaches, Gray is one of only two Big East players to average double figures in both scoring (14.4 ppg) and rebounding (10.1 rpg). Gray, who has 14 double-doubles on the year, is shooting 59.1 percent (179-303) from the floor and leads the team in blocked shots with 51. For his career, Gray has totaled 1,041 points (9.7 ppg), 752 rebounds (7.0 rpg) and 119 blocked shots.

No. 3 seeded Pittsburgh (25-6, 12-4 Big East) opens Big East Championship competition on Thursday when it plays the winner of the Marquette-St. John's game at 9 p.m. The contest will be nationally televised on ESPN.

- With his 22 points and 10 rebounds, Aaron Gray registered his 33<sup>rd</sup> c
- Pitt advances to its sixth Big East Championship Final in the last seven years. Head Coach Jamie Dixon guided his third team to the Big East Championship in four years as head coach at Pitt. Pitt is 1-4 all-time in Big East Championship Finals appearances.
- In the Big East Championship Final, Pitt meets Georgetown on Saturday night at 9 p.m. ET at Madison Square Garden. Pitt and Georgetown meet for the third time this season. The two teams split the season series, each winning the home game in the series.
- With the win, Pitt has now won 15 of its last 20 Big East Championship games since 2001.
- According to school records, the 11-point halftime deficit overcome ranked tied for second among largest halftime deficits overcome to win in school history. Pitt trailed 37-26 at halftime and used a 20-2 run to win the game, 65-59. Pitt's largest-ever halftime comeback to win was at St. Francis (Pa.) on Dec. 5, 1983 when it trailed by 12 points and battled all the way back to register a 14-point win.
- Antonio Graves finished with a career-high 23 points. He also surpassed or tied career-highs for field goals made (7) and 3-point

field goals made (4). It was his first-ever 20-point performance at Pitt. Graves hit double figure scoring for the 34<sup>th</sup> time in his career and 16<sup>th</sup> time this year.

- Graves' 23 points ranked tied for sixth all-time among Pitt's best scoring performances in Big East Championship play.
- With his 13 points, Mike Cook hit double figure scoring for the 19<sup>th</sup> time on the year. He also finished with a season-high eight rebounds.
- Pitt improves to 27-6 overall.
- With the win, Pitt improves to 6-3 in Big East Championship Semifinal games. Pitt also improves to 21-23 all-time in Big East Championship games and 2-0 vs. Louisville.
- With the win, Jamie Dixon (103-28) moved into a tie for fourth place on the NCAA Division I all-time best coaching start list after four seasons. Dixon now has 103 victories and is tied with Roy Williams, who accumulated a 103-30 record after four seasons at Kansas. North Carolina State's Everett Case owns the top spot with a 107-22 record from 1947-50.
- Dixon improved to 7-3 all-time in Big East Championship games.
- Louisville entered the game with a 16-0 record when leading at halftime. Pitt improved to 7-6 on the year when trailing at halftime.
- Pitt held Louisville to 59 points in the contest. For the season, Pitt has limited 15 of its 18 total Big East opponents, 18 of its last 22 opponents and 28 of its 33 total opponents under 70 points. Under Jamie Dixon, Pitt has held opponents to 70 points or less in 109 of his 131 games.

- With his 22 points and 10 rebounds, Aaron Gray registered his 33<sup>rd</sup> career double-double and 15<sup>th</sup> double-double on the year. It was his 39<sup>th</sup> career double figure rebounding game and 19<sup>th</sup> of the year. With his 33 career double-doubles, Gray is now in sole possession of sixth place on the all-time career double-doubles list. Gray also moved into fifth place on Pitt's all-time career double figure rebound game lists.
- Sam Young hit double figure scoring for the fifth time in his last six games. He scored 17 points on career-highs for free throws made (7) and free throw attempts (10).
- Mike Cook hit double figure scoring for the 18<sup>th</sup> time on the year. He finished with 16 points and a season-high tying seven rebounds in 34 minutes.
- LeVance Fields finished with 13 points. It was his 14<sup>th</sup> double figure scoring game of the season and 26<sup>th</sup> of his career.
- With his 10 points, Antonio Graves hit double figure scoring for the first time in seven games. It was his 33<sup>rd</sup> career double figure scoring game and 15<sup>th</sup> of the year.
- Pitt improves to 26-6 overall.
- Pitt is seeking to advance to its sixth Big East Championship Final in the last seven years.
- With the win, Pitt has now won 14 of its last 19 Big East Championship games since 2001.

- Dixon improved to 6-3 all-time in Big East Championship games.
- Pitt improved to 20-0 on the year when leading at the half. Pitt is 6-6 when trailing at halftime.
- Pitt met Marquette for the first time in Big East Championship play.
- With the win, Pitt avoided losing to a team for a third straight time. The last time Pitt lost three games to an opponent in the same season was in 1995 when it lost to Connecticut three times.
- With its 79 points in the contest, Marquette is the only Big East team to score 70 or more points against Pitt on the year. In fact the Golden Eagles accomplished the task in all three games played against Pitt as they registered 77 points in a 77-74 overtime win over Pitt on Jan. 21. For the season, Pitt has limited 14 of 17 total Big East opponents, 17 of its last 21 opponents and 27 of its 32 total opponents under 70 points. Under Jamie Dixon, Pitt has held opponents to 70 points or less in 108 of his 130 games.
- Pitt set season-highs for free throws made (27) and free throw attempts (41). Pitt's previous game highs were 23 free throws made two times and 36 free throw attempts vs. Marquette on Jan. 21, 2007.
