Series: The two schools meet for the second time this season as Marquette claimed a 72-54 contest on Feb. 15 at the Bradley Center. Pitt is 4-6 all-time vs. Louisville. The Panthers eliminated Marquette from last year's Big East Championship with an 89-79 win on March 8, 2007.

No. 7 seed Pitt (24-9) advances to Big East Championship Semifinal play when it takes on No. 6 seed Marquette (24-8, 11-7 Big East). Tonight's contest is slated for 9 p.m. ET. Should Pitt defeat Marquette, it will play in its seventh Big East Championship Final in the last eight seasons against the winner of the No. 1 Georgetown vs. No. 5 West Virginia semifinal which begins at 7 p.m. this evening. The Big East Championship Game is slated for 9 p.m. on Saturday.

The contest will be broadcast nationally on ESPN. Dan Shulman (play-by-play) and Len Elmore (analysis) will make the call, Doris Burke will handle sideline reports while Bo Garrett will produce.

Pitt has advanced to the Big East Champi-

onship Final in six of the last seven seasons. Jamie Dixon has guided Pitt to the title game in three of his four seasons as head coach. Dixon has an 9-4 record in Big East Championship games.

Winners of five of its last six games, Pitt enters the Marquette contest after defeating Louisville 76-69 in overtime in Thursday's Big East Quarterfinal. Sam Young paced Pitt with his sixth career and fourth double-double of the season with game-highs of 21 points and 12 rebounds. Pitt held the Cardinals to 37.5 percent (27-72) field goal shooting and hit 17-20 free throws combining overtime and the second half to claim the victory. Pitt outscored Louisville 14-7 in the overtime period to close out the win. Young scored 21 points and

overall games (186-50). It has averaged 11.6 league wins and 26 overall wins per year during that period, the best totals in the Big East. Pitt is the only Big East Conference school to win 20 or more overall games and 10 or more league contests in each of the last seven seasons. Last year, Pitt also set a school record with its sixth consecutive 20-overall win and 10-league win season. Prior to the 2001-02 season, Pitt won 20 or more games in only two consecutive seasons. It marks Pitt's 15th all-time 20-win season.

Pitt's Jamie Dixon (129-39) is the first coach in school history to win 20 or more games in five consecutive seasons. Last year, he became the first head coach in school history to guide Pitt to four consecutive NCAA Tournaments. His 129 victories (2003-08) rank as the fourth most victories for a head coach after five seasons in NCAA Division I history (see chart in notes, page 4). North Carolina State's Everett Case totaled 137 wins from 1947-51, Gonzaga's Mark Few finished 133 from 2000-04 and Kansas' Roy Williams totaled 132 wins from 1989-93. Additionally, Dixon has led Pitt to Sweet Sixteen appearances in two of his first four seasons at Pitt (20004 and 2007) and Big East title game appearances in three of his first four years (2004, 2006, 2007). Dixon is one of only nine coaches in NCAA Division I history to win 100 or more games in the first four years of a coaching career.

YOUNG ELEVATES HIS GAME FOR THE BIG EAST CHAMPIONSHIP

In Pitt's two Big East Championship games, junior Sam Young has averaged 21.0 points, 9.0 rebounds, 3.0 blocks and 3.0 assists per game. The All-Big East First Team selection and Big East Most Improved Player Award winner, Young scored 21 points against both Cincinnati and Louisville. He is a candidate for the Big East All-Tournament Team.

Sam Young has scored 20 or more points in five of his last eight games including three straight 20-

point performances (Feb. 21-27) and two straight in the Big East Tourney. He has reached double figures in 16 consecutive contests.

PITT TURNS ON THE DEFENSE FOR BIG EAST CHAMPIONSHIP

In Pitt's two Big East Tournament games (vs. Cincinnati and Louisville), Pitt has limited its two opponents to 38.1 percent (48-126) combined field goal shooting and 28.3 percent (13-46) 3-point shooting. Both teams were held to 70 points or less.

On the year, Pitt has limited its opponents to 42.3 percent (787-1860) shooting and 32.7 percent (209-640) 3-point shooting. On the year, Pitt has also held 23 of its 33 opponents to 70 or less points.

Prior to the Big East Championship, Pitt struggled defensively as five of Pitt's last seven opponents shot over 45.0 percent against the Panthers. Additionally, five of its last seven opponents scored 70 or more points against Pitt.

PITT ATTEMPTING TO ADVANCE TO BIG EAST TITLE GAME AFTER PLAYING ON WEDNESDAY, HOPING TO MATCH 2006 ACCOMPLISHMENT

Pitt has appeared in the Big East Championship Final in six of the last seven seasons. Pitt advanced all the way to the Big East title game after playing on Wednesday. It entered the tournament as the No. 6 seed and needed three games to achieve that feat.

PITT ELIMINATES LOUISVILLE FOR THIRD STRAIGHT YEAR IN BIG EAST CHAMPIONSHIP

Pitt eliminated Louisville from the Big East Championship for the third consecutive season. Pitt claimed a 76-69 overtime win yesterday and Pitt has won each of the last two matchups, claiming a 65-59 Quarterfinal win on March 9, 2007 and a 61-56 First Round win on March 8, 2006. Both wins fueled Pitt runs in the Big East Championship Final.

PITT'S HOME AWAY FROM HOME: MADISON SQUARE GARDEN

Madison Square Garden is Pitt's home away from home. Pitt is 4-0 at MSG this season and is 21-8 at MSG since the 2000-01 season. Additionally, Pitt has won six of its last seven games at MSG and 17 of its last 23 Big East Tournament games at the Garden.

PITT-LOUISVILLE POST-GAME NOTES

- Pitt is attempting to earn an appearance in its seventh Big East Championship Final in the last eight years. Jamie Dixon is attempting to guide Pitt to his fourth title game in his first five seasons.
- Pitt has now won five of its last six games on the year.
- Pitt improves to 10-9 in Big East Second Round games. It enters

grabbed nine rebounds as Pitt defeated Cincinnati 70-64 in Big East Championship First Round action. The Panthers pulled away early in the second half using top performances from seniors Keith Benjamin and Ronald Ramon along with Sam Young.

Pitt concluded its regular season with a 22-9 overall record and 10-8 Big East record. Over the last seven years (2002-08), Pitt has proven to be the winningest Big East Conference basketball program. From 2001-07, Pitt owns the league's top records for league play (81-33) and

Friday's Semifinal game with a 6-3 all-time Semifinal record.

- Pitt eliminated Louisville from Big East Championship contention for the third consecutive season. It defeated Louisville 65-59 in last year's Quarterfinal matchup and defeated the Cardinals 61-56 in the First Round in 2006.
- Madison Square Garden is Pitt's home away from home as the Panthers are 21-8 at MSG since 2000-01. Pitt improves to 4-0 at Madison Square Garden this year and has won six of its last seven in the "World's Most Famous Arena."
- Pitt improves to 17-6 in Big East Championship games at Madison Square Garden since 2000-01.
- Pitt Head Coach Jamie Dixon improved to 9-4 in Big East Championship Games. He is now 4-2 in head-to-head games vs. Louisville's Rick Pitino including 3-0 at MSG.
- With his double-double (21 points/12 rebounds), Sam Young registered his sixth career and fourth double-double this season. Young finished with his 16th 20-plus point scoring night and registered his sixth double figure rebounding game. Young has now reached double figure scoring in 32 of Pitt's 33 games this year and in 40 of his last 44 games played. Young has now led Pitt in scoring in 23 of 33 games.
- The 45 minute game saw several Panthers set career-highs for minutes played. Those players include Sam Young (41), Ronald Ramon (42) and Gilbert Brown (36).
- LeVance Fields reached double figure scoring for the fifth game in a row. It also marked his 42nd career double figure scoring game.
- With his 13 points, Ronald Ramon registered his 50th career double figure scoring game and

13th time this year. He also hit a team-high 3-6 3-pointers.

- DeJuan Blair finished the evening with 16 points on the evening. It was his 23rd double figure scoring game of his career.
- Pitt's 24 victories rank tied for eighth among the all-time winningest seasons at Pitt. The school record is 31 set in 2003-04, Jamie Dixon's first year at Pitt. Dixon has guided teams to five of Pitt's 15 winningest seasons.
- Pitt's senior class of Keith Benjamin, Mike Cook, Ronald Ramon and Maurice Polen improved to 98-34 all-time. They are attempting to become just the fifth senior class in school history to win 100 or more games.
- Pitt improved to 2-2 vs. ranked teams on the season.
- Pitt improved to 4-3 all-time vs. Louisville. It split the two games against the Cardinals this year.
- The overtime contest marked Pitt's second of the season. Pitt also defeated Duke in overtime at Madison Square Garden (65-64 on Dec. 20, 2007).
- Pitt held Louisville to 69 points on the evening. On the year, Pitt has now limited 23 of its 33 opponents to 70 points or less.

- Pitt improves to 6-7 in Big East Championship First Round games. It enters Wednesday's Quarterfinal Round game vs. Louisville with a 9-9 all-time Quarterfinal record.
- Madison Square Garden is Pitt's home away from home as the Panthers are 20-8 at MSG since 2000-01. Pitt improves to 3-0 at Madison Square Garden this year and has won five of its last

six in the "World's Most Famous Arena."

- Pitt improves to 16-6 in Big East Championship games at Madison Square Garden since 2000-01.
- Pitt Head Coach Jamie Dixon improved to 8-4 in Big East Championship Games.
- Sam Young (21 points) finished with his 15th 20-plus point scoring night and tied a career-high with four blocked shots. He also blocked four shots vs. Villanova on Jan. 30. Young has now reached double figure scoring in 31 of Pitt's 32 games this year and in 39 of his 43 last games played. Young has now led Pitt in scoring in 22 of 32 games.
- Pitt's backcourt tandem of LeVance Fields and Ronald Ramon combined for 10 assists and just one turnover.
- With his 15 points, Keith Benjamin reached double figure scoring for the 16th time this year and 23rd time in his career.
- LeVance Fields reached double figure scoring for the fourth game in a row. It also marked his 41st career double figure scoring game.
- With his 12 points, Ronald Ramon registered his 49th career double figure scoring game and 12th time this year. He also hit 4-7 3-pointers. Ramon tied a career-high with seven rebounds.
- Pitt's guards combined for 17 of 36 of Pitt's rebounds.
- Pitt met Cincinnati for the first time in Big East Championship play and defeated the Bearcats for the second time this year. It improved to 4-1 vs. Cincinnati since it joined the Big East Conference in 2005-06. It is now 7-5 all-time vs. Cincinnati.
- Cincinnati's Deona Vaughn became the third player this season to score over 30 points

vs. Pitt. West Virginia's Joe Alexander (32 points at WVU, 3/3/08) and Dayton's Brian Roberts (31 points at Dayton, 12/29/07) were the other two players.

PITT EARNS THREE POSTSEASON HONORS AT BIG EAST AWARDS BANQUET

Pitt earned three Big East postseason awards at the league's annual awards banquet on March 11. Sam Young earned the league's Most Improved Player Award, DeJuan Blair was honored as the co-Big East Rookie of the Year and Ronald Ramon was the co-Sportsmanship Award winner.

Pitt's three honors mark the second-most Big East postseason awards earned in a season. Pitt earned four Big East postseason honors following the 2003-04 season.

Young becomes Pitt's fifth Big East Most Improved Player in each of the last nine years. Pitt's four other Big East Most Improved Player honorees during that span include: Ricardo Greer (1999-00), Brandin Knight (2001-02), Carl Krauser (2002-03) and Aaron Gray (2005-06).

Blair earns Pitt's fifth all-time Big East Freshman/Rookie of the Year honor. Other Pitt players to earn the award include: Charles Smith (1984-85), Sean Miller (1987-88), Brian Shorter (1988-89) and Chris Taft (2003-04). As only a freshman, Blair became Pitt's 11th All-Big East Rookie Team selection. He also was named a Big East honorable mention selection.

Ronald Ramon becomes the first player at Pitt to earn the Sportsmanship Award since Jaron Brown took home the honors after the 2003-04 season.
