THE STORYLINE

Brad Wanamaker enters his sophomore season at Pitt with an opportunity to compete for the starting off-guard role. Wanamaker is an underrated and athletic competitor with strong ball handling skills who has the ability to take it to the basket. He is a relentless worker and winner who will do whatever it takes for his team to be successful. He is a tough, strong and physical guard who has a reputation as a great defender and superb team player. His style of play has drawn comparisons to Mitch Richmond, Dwyane Wade and former Pitt guard/forward and fellow Philadelphia native Mike Cook. Last year, Wanamaker's minutes increased after injuries to both Cook and Levance Fields. With a year of experience, he now has an opportunity to earn his own minutes.

Played in 30 games, 331 minutes and scored 66 points (2.2 ppg.) with 43 assists off the bench at off guard...Played 10-plus minutes in 19 games on year...Saw action in 17 Big East Conference regular season games and averaged 10.6 minutes per game... Oral Roberts, 3/20...Played 13 minutes in Big East Quarterfinal vs. Louisville, 3/13...Scored a career-high tying seven points (1-2 FG) and hit a career-high 5-6 free throws in 15 minutes at West Virginia, 3/3...Scored six points (3-4 FG) with four assists and two rebounds in 18 minutes vs. Providence, 2/12...Scored a career-high tying seven points (3-4 FG) with two assists in 23 minutes vs. West Virginia, 2/7...Played 10 minutes with three assists at South Florida, 1/9...Played 12 minutes at Villanova, 1/6...Played in a career-high 23 minutes, scored five points (2-3 FG) with two assists and two rebounds vs. Lafayette, 1/2... Finished with six points (3-5 FG) in eight minutes vs. Toledo, 12/1... Scored seven points (3-5 FG) with four assists in 17 minutes vs. Mississippi Valley State, 11/15... Finished with four points and three assists in 12 minutes vs. North Carolina A&T, 11/10...Dished out eight assists, scored four points and grabbed four rebounds in 19 minutes of career debut vs. Houston Baptist, 11/9. His eight assists ranked as the second highest total in a freshman debut game since Sean Miller finished with 10 assists on Nov. 28, 1987.

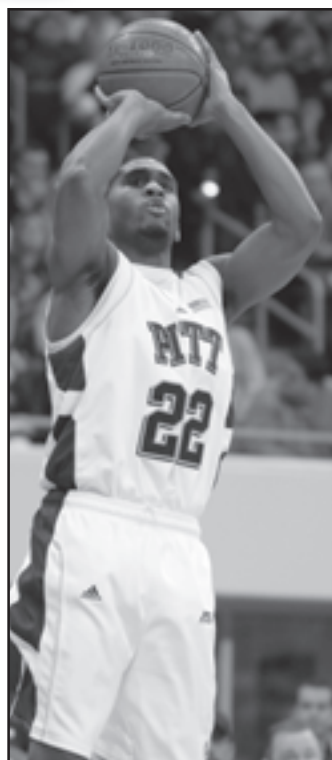

Selected to the PIAA All-State First Team...Named *Philadelphia Daily News* Player of the Year as a senior...Selected the *Philadelphia Inquirer* Southeastern Pennsylvania Player of the Year...Concluded career with 1,306 career points and a 76-18 three-year varsity record...Scored 552 points, averaged 17.8 points, 8.1 rebounds, 3.1 assists and 2.1 steals in guiding Roman Catholic to a 29-3 overall record, league title and consensus top-20 national ranking...Guided the Cahillites to the Alhambra Catholic Invitational Tournament title and earned MVP honors after he rallied his team from 10 points down to register a 59-56 win over Neumann-Goretti...
