Game Storylines

- Pitt resumes ACC play with a key Coastal Division encounter against Georgia Tech at Heinz Field. The Panthers close the regular season with seven consecutive ACC contests beginning this week with the Yellow Jackets.

- The Panthers' stingy ground defense will be challenged by Georgia Tech's potent spread option attack. Pitt is yielding 69.8 rushing yards per game to rank first in the ACC and fourth nationally. The Yellow Jackets average 226.8 rushing yards, fifth best in the ACC and 28th in the nation.

- Pitt is plus-5 in the turnover margin department (10 gained and five lost), while Georgia Tech is minus-3 (five gained and eight lost). Pitt has forced at least one turnover in each game this year.

- Georgia Tech coach Paul Johnson is 2-0 all-time at Heinz Field, including the Yellow Jackets' 56-28 win in 2014. As coach of Navy in 2007, he led the Midshipmen to a 48-45 double-overtime win.

- Pitt's Ejuan Price is making a strong case for All-America and ACC Defensive Player of the Year honors. The senior defensive end leads the entire nation in quarterback sacks (7.5) and tackles for loss (11.5). Price has logged at least one sack in each contest this season.

- The Panthers boast one of college football's most dangerous all-purpose players in Quadree Henderson. The sophomore wide receiver leads the nation in total all-purpose yards (tied) with 937. Henderson's average of 187.4 yards per game leads the ACC and ranks fifth nationally.

- Junior running back James Conner, who overcame both a knee injury and Hodgkin lymphoma during the past 12 months, is just the fifth player in Pitt history to surpass 3,000 career rushing yards. The Panthers' leading ground-gainer this season with 381 yards, Conner now has 3,022 for his career.

✓ In his debut campaign at Pitt in 2015, Pat Narduzzi led the Panthers to an 8-4 regular-season record, their best 12-game mark since 2009, and a Military Bowl invitation. Pitt finished as the runner-up in the ACC Coastal Division with a 6-2 mark, its best conference record ever.

✓ Pitt boasted the ACC's top offensive and defensive newcomers in 2015. Safety Jordan Whitehead was named the league's Overall and Defensive Rookie of the Year. Tailback Qadree Ollison, a third-string reserve when the season began, was named the Offensive Rookie of the Year following a 1,000-yard rushing campaign.

✓ Narduzzi arrived at Pitt following eight highly successful years as the defensive coordinator at Michigan State. Under his direction, the Spartans were the only team to rank in the nation's top 10 in total defense and rushing defense each season from 2011-14. Working under two-time Big Ten Coach of the Year Mark Dantonio, Narduzzi helped Michigan State to five Top 25 finishes.

✓ In 2014, the Spartans finished with a No. 5 national ranking and 11-2 record following a stirring 42-41 victory over Baylor in the AT&T Cotton Bowl. Narduzzi's defense shut out the high-scoring Bears in the fourth quarter, opening the door for 21 unanswered points by Michigan State in one of the most thrilling games of the 2014-15 bowl season.

✓ Michigan State boasted the nation's top rushing defense in 2014, yielding just 88.5 yards per game. The Spartans finished third nationally with 34 turnovers gained and eighth in total defense, holding opponents to just 315.8 yards per contest.

✓ In 2013, Michigan State finished No. 3 in the country following a Big Ten title and 24-20 victory over No. 5 Stanford in the Rose Bowl. In the wake of that championship season, Narduzzi was named the 2013 recipient of the prestigious Broyles Award, annually presented to the country's top assistant coach.

✓ Narduzzi has tutored an impressive list of decorated defensive players, including first team All-Americans in cornerback Darqueze Dennard, safety Kurtis Drummond, linebacker Greg Jones and defensive tackle Jerel Worthy.

✓ Dennard was a unanimous All-American in 2013, becoming the first Michigan State cornerback to earn that distinction. He also was the school's first winner of the Jim Thorpe Award, given annually to college football's top defensive back.

✓ Dennard was a first-round NFL Draft pick of the Cincinnati Bengals in 2014, the first Spartans defensive back taken in the initial round since 1961. In the 2015 draft, another Narduzzi pupil, Michigan State cornerback Trae Waynes, was a first-round pick of the Minnesota Vikings.

✓ Narduzzi coached 19 first-team All-Big Ten selections. Four players won the conference's top individual awards under his watch, including two Big Ten Defensive Back of the Year honorees (Dennard in 2013 and Drummond in 2014). Shilique Calhoun was the Big Ten Defensive Lineman of the Year in 2013 while Greg Jones was the overall Defensive Player of the Year in 2009.

✓ Prior to Michigan State, Narduzzi spent three years (2004-06) as defensive coordinator under Dantonio at Cincinnati, helping the Bearcats to a pair of bowl invitations.

✓ In 2003, Narduzzi was the defensive coordinator at Miami of Ohio under the late Terry Hooppner. The RedHawks stormed to a 13-1 record that season, capturing the Mid-American Conference (MAC) championship and defeating nationally ranked Louisville in the GMAC Bowl to finish No. 10 in the Associated Press poll.

✓ While quarterback Ben Roethlisberger headlined Miami's offense in 2003, Narduzzi's stout unit topped the MAC in rushing defense (19th nationally), scoring defense (22nd nationally) and pass efficiency defense (34th nationally).

✓ Narduzzi served as linebackers coach at Northern Illinois for three seasons (2000-02). NIU won a pair of MAC divisional titles during his tenure and in 2002 had the league's top rushing defense.

✓ From 1993-99, Narduzzi coached at his alma mater, Rhode Island, serving as the Rams' defensive coordinator his final two seasons. He began his coaching career at Miami of Ohio, working as a graduate assistant in 1990 and 1991, before earning his first full-time position as receivers coach for the 1992 season.

✓ Narduzzi was a starting linebacker under his father, the late Bill Narduzzi, as a freshman at Youngstown State University in 1985 before transferring to Rhode Island, where he became a three-year starter for the Rams from 1987-89.

✓ Bill Narduzzi was head coach at YSU from 1975-85. He led the Penguins to two NCAA Division II playoff appearances, including the national championship game in 1979, and twice was named the Ohio Valley Conference (OVC) Coach of the Year.

SERIES NOTES

This is the 11th meeting between Pitt and Georgia Tech in a series that began in 1918...Pitt leads the overall series, 6-4, and won last year's encounter at Bobby Dodd Stadium, 31-28...the Panthers are 3-1 in games played in Pittsburgh and 3-1 in Atlanta...Pitt and Georgia Tech have twice met in bowl games with the Yellow Jackets winning each time...Georgia Tech defeated the Panthers in the Jan. 2, 1956 Sugar Bowl (7-0) and the Dec. 29, 1956 Gator Bowl (21-14)... the 2016 game marks the fourth Atlantic Coast Conference encounter between the two schools...Georgia Tech leads the ACC series with Pitt, 2-1...this year's game marks only the second time since 1920 that Georgia Tech has played in Pittsburgh...in fact, the initial three games of the series from 1918-20 were all played in Pittsburgh... led by legendary coach Glenn "Pop" Warner, Pitt won each of those three contests by an aggregate score of 58-9...before the 2013 revival of the series, the two schools had not played since a pair of games at Georgia Tech in the 1970s...in 1976, Tony Dorsett scored three touchdowns as Pitt routed the host Yellow Jackets, 42-14...under the direction of Coach John Majors, Pitt would go 12-0 in 1976 and claim the national championship, while Dorsett would win the Heisman Trophy...the Panthers also defeated Georgia Tech, 27-17, during the 1974 season.

TEAM NOTES

TURNOVER MARGIN

Pitt has been strong in the turnover margin department this season. The Panthers are plus-five with 10 takeaways compared to only five turnovers. Pitt ranks 16th nationally and second in the ACC with a 1.00 turnover margin per game.

Last season the Panthers ranked 66th in the country and seventh in the ACC with a 0.00 turnover margin (16 turnovers gained and 16 lost).

HEARTBREAK HOTEL

Pitt's two losses this season—both on the road—have been by a combined eight points. The Panthers lost at North Carolina (Sept. 24), 37-36, falling on a touchdown pass with two seconds to go. A week prior (Sept. 17), Pitt lost to Oklahoma State, 45-38, when the host Cowboys scored on a one-yard run with 1:28 remaining.

CLOSE SHAVES

Under Pat Narduzzi, the Panthers have a winning record in close contests. Narduzzi has directed Pitt to a 6-5 record in games decided by single digits, including this season's 42-39 victory over Penn State (Sept. 10).

In contrast, the Panthers were 1-5 in single-digit contests in 2014, the year before Narduzzi's arrival. From 2010-14, Pitt was 8-17 in such games.

STRIVING FOR ANOTHER WINNER

The Panthers are looking to build off last season's 8-5 record and runner-up finish in the ACC's Coastal Division.

Pitt completed the 2015 regular season with an 8-4 mark after going 6-6 each of the prior four years (2011-14). The Panthers previously finished a regular season above the .500 mark in 2010 when they went 7-5. That 2010 team defeated Kentucky, 27-10, in the BBVA Compass Bowl to finish 8-5 overall—Pitt's last eight-win season prior to the 2015 campaign.

127 YEARS AND COUNTING

The 2016 campaign marks the 127th football season in Pitt history. The Panthers, who played their inaugural season in 1890, have a 707-517-42 all-time record (.575). The program's rich legacy includes 90 first team All-Americans, 24 College Football Hall of Famers, eight Pro Football Hall of Famers and nine national titles.

700 CLUB

Pitt's 26-19 win over Virginia last season (Oct. 10) marked the 700th victory in program history. The Panthers are one of 23 Bowl Sub-division programs to achieve the 700-win milestone. Only five ACC schools belong to the "700 Club"—Virginia Tech (721), Georgia Tech (717), Clemson (708), Pitt (707) and Syracuse (703)—according to NCAA.org.

YOUR 2016 PITT TEAM CAPTAINS

As selected by their teammates, the captains for the 2016 Panthers are senior offensive tackle Adam Bisnowaty, junior running back James Conner and senior defensive end Ejuan Price.

FRESH FACES

Four true freshmen have played for Pitt this season: wide receiver Maurice Ffrench, wide receiver Aaron Mathews, running back Chawntez Moss and defensive tackle Amir Watts.

Of that group, Moss has compiled the most playing time and production. Appearing in the last four contests as a reserve, Moss has rushed for 152 yards and a touchdown on 21 carries (7.2 avg.). He is yet to be tackled for a loss this season.

Ffrench has played in each of the last two games in a reserve role. In the Oct. 1 Marshall victory, he had an 11-yard touchdown run off a jet sweep. Mathews has played in the last four games, earning his first start against Marshall.

Watts has provided reserve duty on the defensive line against Villanova, Oklahoma State and Marshall.

RECORD-BREAKING CROWD FOR THE RIVALRY

Prior to this season, it had been 16 long years since Pitt and Penn State met on the football field. The historic rivalry was renewed on Sept. 10 and an overflow crowd at Heinz Field was treated to arguably the most thrilling contest in the history of the series.

The Panthers defeated Penn State, 42-39, in front of 69,983 fans, the largest crowd to ever attend a sporting event in the city of Pittsburgh. Interestingly, the prior mark was also a Pitt football game. On Oct. 29, 1938, the Panthers defeated Fordham, 24-13, with 68,918 in attendance at Pitt Stadium.

BLUE & GOLD RALLY CAPS

Since the 2002 season, Pitt has won 26 games with second-half comebacks. Most recently, the Panthers rallied past host Syracuse, 23-20, on Oct. 24, 2015, after entering the fourth quarter trailing, 17-13. Chris Blewitt provided the winning points when he kicked a 25-yard field goal as time expired. The Syracuse victory marked the first time since 2009 that Pitt rallied to win when facing a fourth-quarter deficit. The Panthers previously had not overcome a deficit in the final period since Dec. 26, 2009, when they defeated North Carolina, 19-17, in the Meineke Car Care Bowl.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

SCORING OUTBURST

Over its last four contests, Pitt has scored a combined 159 points, an average of 39.75 points per game. It is the Panthers' highest point total over a four-game stretch in 10 years.

The 2006 season was the last time a Pitt team scored more over a four-game span. That year the Panthers compiled 169 points in victories over The Citadel (51-6), Toledo (45-3), Syracuse (21-11) and UCF (52-7), an average of 42.25 points per game.

TIME MANAGEMENT

Pitt has dominated its opponents in time of possession this season, averaging 35:25 per game to rank ninth nationally and second in the ACC. The Panthers have won the time of possession battle in four of their five games this year. The lone exception was the season opener when Villanova edged Pitt by a mere 17 seconds (30:17 to 29:43).

RUSH HOUR

The Panthers feature one of the most potent rushing attacks in the country. Pitt is averaging 250.0 rushing yards per game to rank 16th in the nation and second in the ACC.

Two seasons ago, Pitt averaged 249.5 yards on the ground over 13 games (15th in the nation and third in the ACC). It was the Panthers' highest rushing output per game since the 1988 team averaged 253.2.

The school record for rushing yards per game is 290.5 set in 1976, the same season Heisman Trophy running back Tony Dorsett ran for 2,150 yards in leading Pitt to a 12-0 record and the national championship.

JAMES CONNER: HE'S BACK

When Pitt opened the season against Villanova on Sept. 3, it had been 364 days since James Conner ran onto the Heinz Field turf to play a game for the Panthers. During that nearly year-long absence, Conner defeated Hodgkin lymphoma and rehabilitated a significant knee injury.

Conner's return has been nothing short of remarkable. He currently leads the Panthers in rushing (381 yards on 90 carries) and scoring (42 points on seven touchdowns).

In 2015, Conner appeared in only one game—the opener against Youngstown State—due to a torn medial collateral ligament in his right knee. Conner sustained the injury in the second quarter against YSU. He had entered the season as one of college football's most decorated players. In 2014 Conner was selected the ACC Player of the Year after rushing for 1,765 yards and 26 touchdowns.

He was named to seven postseason All-America squads as a sophomore, including first-team honors from the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA). Conner was the first Pitt running back to garner first-team All-America honors in 27 years, dating back to Craig "Ironhead" Heyward in 1987.

CONNER'S RUSHING TD STREAK

James Conner has scored a rushing touchdown in 13 consecutive games. It is the longest streak in Pitt history, erasing a nearly century-old mark set by George McLaren, who had a rushing TD in 10 consecutive games over the 1916-17 seasons.

Conner's streak of rushing TDs is the longest among all active Bowl Subdivision players.

CONNER'S CENTURY RUSHING GAMES

James Conner has rushed for at least 100 yards 13 times in his Pitt career, including eight in which he had more than 150 yards and four 200-yard games.

JESTER'S BIG NIGHT

Jester Weah was a catalyst in the Panthers' 43-27 win over Marshall (Oct. 1) by producing the highest receiving yardage by a Pitt player in 12 years. The junior compiled 176 yards on seven catches—both career highs—and made the game's decisive play when he beat a defender for a 54-yard touchdown to put Pitt up by 10 with 1:04 left.

His receiving yardage was the most by a Pitt player since Nov. 6, 2004, when Greg Lee had 188 yards (on nine catches) at Syracuse.

On the season, Weah leads Pitt in receiving yards (313) and touchdown catches (three). His average of 22.36 yards per reception ranks 14th in the country and third in the ACC.

AIR-TIGHT PROTECTION

The Pitt offensive line has provided excellent protection thus far, surrendering just three sacks on the season. The Panthers rank second in the ACC and sixth nationally in sacks allowed per game with an average of 0.60. The only teams to register sacks against Pitt this year are Oklahoma State (two) and Villanova (one).

In 2015 the Panthers surrendered 29 sacks, an average of 2.23 per game, which ranked 73rd nationally and ninth in the ACC.

O-LINE EXPERIENCE

Pitt boasts a combined 125 starts on the offensive line, led by senior tackle Adam Bisnowaty with 35 career starts. Senior offensive guard Dorian Johnson is right behind with 34 career starting assignments.

EJUAN PRICE: PASS RUSHER SUPREME

Senior defensive end Ejuan Price spearheads Pitt's pass rush. Price leads the nation in total sacks (7.5) and tackles for loss (11.5).

It is a continuation of his highly productive 2015 season. Last year Price led the ACC and ranked eighth nationally with an average of 0.88 sacks per game. He had 11.5 total sacks, the most by a Pitt player since 2000 when defensive end Bryan Knight also had 11.5.

Price had a game for the ages last season in the Panthers' 45-34 victory over Louisville (Nov. 21). He dominated the Cardinals' offensive front for five sacks, the most by a Bowl Subdivision player last season and one shy of the FBS record.

Pitt has scored five defensive touchdowns in Pat Narduzzi's two seasons as head coach. The Panthers have two defensive TDs this year to rank first in the ACC (tied) and ninth nationally.

Junior cornerback Avonte Maddox is responsible for two of those scores under Narduzzi. He had a 33-yard interception return for a touchdown in the 43-27 win over Marshall on Oct. 1. In 2015, Maddox had a 30-yard "pick six" against Louisville.

LOOSE BALLS

Pitt has been exceptional at forcing and recovering fumbles. The Panthers are second in the nation and pace the ACC with seven fumble recoveries. Senior end Ejuan Price has forced three fumbles. His average of 0.60 forced fumbles per game is second in the ACC and fourth nationally. Senior linebacker Mike Caprara has recovered two fumbles (both in the Penn State win) to lead the ACC and rank fifth nationally.

HOT TURNOVERS

Pitt has forced 10 total turnovers (seven fumbles and three interceptions) to rank 19th in the nation and fourth in the ACC. The Panthers are well ahead of last season's turnover pace. In 2015 they forced only 16 turnovers (six fumbles and 10 picks) in 13 contests.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

BLEWITT ECLIPSES CAREER KICK SCORING MARK

Senior placekicker Chris Blewitt this season became Pitt's all-time career kick scoring leader, eclipsing a record that stood for more than four decades. Blewitt has 302 points, surpassing Carson Long (268 points from 1973-76), who held the top spot since 1975.

With 49 career field goals, Blewitt is also approaching Conor Lee's (2006-08) Pitt record of 50.

In terms of overall scoring, Blewitt ranks second. The Panthers' career scoring leader is legendary tailback Tony Dorsett, who compiled 380 points from 1973-76.

QUADREE TAKES IT TO THE HOUSE

Sophomore Quadree Henderson ranks among college football's most dangerous kick returners. Henderson leads the ACC and ranks third nationally with a 36.0-yard return average. He has 396 yards and a touchdown on 11 returns for the season.

In the Panthers' stirring 42-39 victory over Penn State, Henderson made one of the game's critical plays when he returned a kickoff 84 yards to the Nittany Lions' 10. Three plays later James Conner scored on a shovel pass to put Pitt up 42-31, providing the winning cushion.

In the 28-7 win against Villanova, Henderson had a 96-yard touchdown return, marking the second consecutive game he had a kick return TD. In the Panthers' 2015 Military Bowl game against Navy, he took the opening kickoff 100 yards for a score—Pitt's first 100-yard kickoff return since 1990 (Ricky Turner vs. West Virginia).

Sept. 3, 2016 • Heinz Field • 50,149

Pitt used a stifling defensive effort to defeat Villanova in the season opener for both teams...the Panthers did not surrender an offensive touchdown and limited the Wildcats to 172 total yards, including a mere 53 on the ground...the game marked the return of tailback James Conner, who saw his first action since a season-ending knee injury in the 2015 opener and defeating Hodgkin lymphoma in the offseason... Conner scored Pitt's first two touchdowns, on a three-yard run and nine-yard reception, to give the Panthers a 14-0 intermission lead... Quadree Henderson extended Pitt's advantage to 21 points when he took the second half's opening kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown...it was the second consecutive game Henderson had a kick return TD... he had a 100-yard return in the 2015 Military Bowl vs. Navy...the Panthers notched six sacks, including two by CB Avonte Maddox...safeties Terrish Webb and Jordan Whitehead tied for team-high honors with six tackles each...Webb added an interception...Chris Blewitt converted four PATs to become Pitt's all-time leading kick scorer with 271 points...Blewitt surpassed Carson Long (268 points from 1973-76)... Pitt improved to 14-1 all-time against FCS programs.

The return of the Pitt-Penn State rivalry after a 16-year hiatus proved to be worth the wait as the Panthers triumphed in front of the largest crowd to ever attend a sporting event in Pittsburgh...James Conner rushed for 117 yards and scored two TDs and cornerback Ryan Lewis intercepted a Penn State pass in the end zone with 1:15 left to seal the 42-39 victory...behind a pounding rushing attack that produced 341 yards, Pitt (2-0) achieved its highest point total ever against Penn State...the 81 combined points also marked a series high...Pitt scored touchdowns on four of its first five possessions to build a 28-7 lead...Penn State (1-1) would rally to within single-digits four times in the second half and was poised to take the lead when it reached the Pitt 31 with under two minutes to play...that's when Lewis ended the threat, and the game, by intercepting Trace McSorley's pass to the end zone...Nathan Peterman threw three TDs for Pitt, including a 12-yard shovel pass to Conner that put the Panthers up 42-31 with 10:24 left...the Panthers caused four PSU turnovers, with Ejuan Price forcing two fumbles and Mike Caprara posting two recoveries.

Sept. 17, 2016 • Boone Pickens Stadium • 53,514

Pitt could not contain a lethal Oklahoma State passing attack in a 45-38 loss in Stillwater...Cowboys quarterback Mason Rudolph was 26 of 46 for 540 yards and two touchdowns, while wide receiver James Washington hauled in nine receptions for an incredible 296 yards and two TDs...despite those prolific numbers, Pitt was deadlocked with OSU, 38-38, entering the fourth quarter...but at the 12:55 mark of the final period, play was suspended for nearly two hours due to lightning...when action resumed, it was eventually Rudolph who would make the decisive play—an 86-yard pass to Jhajuan Seales—that put Oklahoma State at the Pitt 1...on the next play, Rennie Childs rushed in for the game-winning score, his fourth TD of the game, with 1:28 left...Pitt had one last chance, advancing to the OSU 45-yard line, but Nathan Peterman was intercepted by Ramon Richards with 15 seconds left to seal the result...James Conner rushed for 111 yards and a touchdown in the loss for Pitt (2-1)...it was the inaugural meeting between the Panthers and Cowboys (2-1).

Pitt's frustrations against North Carolina continued with a 37-36 defeat in the ACC opener for both teams...it was the Panthers' fourth consecutive loss to the Tar Heels...Pitt fell to 0-5 all-time in games played in Chapel Hill...this one was particularly heartbreaking as Pitt held a 13-point lead with under six minutes to play...North Carolina would rally behind the arm of quarterback Mitch Trubisky, who threw for 453 yards and five touchdowns... Trubisky threw two TDs to Bug Howard in the final 5:24, including a two-yard score with two seconds left...Nick Weiler's extra-point kick provided the winning margin and gave North Carolina (3-1, 1-0) its first and only lead of the game...the winning march was a 17-play, 63-yard drive that included three fourth-down conversions...Pitt (2-2, 0-1) piled up 281 rushing yards, led by a 107-yard effort from Quadree Henderson... the Panthers, however, went three-and-out on their final two possessions, opening the door for the Tar Heels' rally.
