Game Story

One of the nation's longest running rivalries, Pitt and West Virginia renew ties for the 102nd time in the "Backyard Brawl" series. With 101 prior encounters, West Virginia is the Panthers' most-played opponent.

Pitt has defeated West Virginia the past two years, including its landmark 13-9 upset in Morgantown on Dec. 1, 2007. The Panthers have not beaten WVU in three consecutive years since winning seven straight in the series from 1976-82.

Ranked No. 8 by The Associated Press and No. 9 in the *USA Today* coaches poll, Pitt has its highest November rankings since 1982. The Panthers are No. 9 in the BCS ratings, their highest listing ever.

Pitt achieved its lofty rankings after winning six consecutive games to improve to 9-1 on the year, its best start since the 1982 Panthers also began 9-1. Pitt last had a 10-1 record in 1981. Both the '81 and '82 Pitt squads were quarterbacked by Dan Marino.

Series Notes

This year's "Backyard Brawl" between Pitt and West Virginia marks the 102nd game played between the two rivals...the Panthers lead the series, 61-37-3...with 101 prior meetings dating back to 1895, Pitt and West Virginia have the longest running series among Big East schools...West Virginia is Pitt's most-played opponent...Penn State is next with 96 games played...the two teams have met every year since 1943...this year's game marks the 67th consecutive year the teams have played...the visiting team has won 13 of the last 22 games...Pitt has won the last two encounters, a 13-9 road victory in 2007 and 19-15 at Heinz Field last year...Pitt is seeking a third consecutive win over WVU, something it last accomplished during a seven-game series win streak from 1976-82...the Panthers lead the series this decade, 5-4, with Pitt winning three times in Pittsburgh (2000, 2004 and 2008) and twice at WVU (2001 and 2007).

Panther Notes

Tough Final Stretch: Pitt closes with perhaps the most difficult final two regular-season games in school history, including this week's road contest at West Virginia (7-3) and a Dec. 5 home date against undefeated Cincinnati (10-0).

The Panthers' final two opponents are a combined 15-3 (.833) against FBS competition.

Brawl Family Ties: The father of first-year Pitt offensive coordinator Frank Cignetti Jr. (Frank Sr.) served as head coach at West Virginia from 1976-79. Additionally, Frank Jr.'s brother Curt was a quarterback on WVU's 1981 Peach Bowl and 1982 Gator Bowl teams.

Chalking up W's: With a 9-1 start to the year, Pitt is now 19-5 over its last 24 games dating back to the 2007 regular-season finale at West Virginia when it upset the heavily favored Mountaineers, 13-9. It marks the Panthers' winningest stretch since the 1980-82 seasons when they went 22-2 over a 24-game period.

Seeking a Seventh: Since losing 38-31 at NC State on Sept. 26, Pitt has won six consecutive contests, its longest single-season winning streak since 2001, when the Panthers closed with six straight wins to finish 7-5, including a 34-19 victory over NC State in the Tangerine Bowl.

A victory over West Virginia Nov. 27 would give Pitt a seventh consecutive victory, its longest in-season winning streak since the 1982 Panthers won their first seven games of the year.

Eyeing No. 10: Pitt's 27-22 victory over Notre Dame Nov. 14 improved the Panthers to 9-1 on the season, their best mark after 10 games since the 1982 edition also started 9-1. (Pitt finished 9-3 that year.)

The Panthers last boasted a 10-1 record in 1981, when it finished with an 11-1 mark and No. 2 national ranking. Both the '81 and '82 Pitt teams were quarterbacked by Dan Marino.

Big East Best: Following its Nov. 7 victory over Syracuse, Pitt boasts a 5-0 Big East mark, matching its best league start ever. The Panthers started a conference season 5-0 only once before (2002). Pitt finished with a 5-2 Big East record in '02 to achieve its best conference record ever (matched in 2003 and '08).

A sixth Big East win would be a program first for Pitt.

Blue & Gold Rally Caps: Pitt has won seven games with fourth-quarter comebacks under Coach Dave Wannstedt, the latest coming on Oct. 10 when the Panthers overcame a 15-point deficit late in the third period to defeat Connecticut, 24-21, on Dan Hutchins' field goal as time expired.

Pitt had five fourth-quarter comebacks during its 2008 Sun Bowl campaign, including three on the road.

Panthers Preseason Favorite in Big East Conference Media Poll

Pitt was selected as the favorite to win the 2009 Big East championship in a preseason media poll.

The poll saw four different teams earn multiple first-place votes and the top five teams separated by just 35 points.

The Panthers received eight of a possible 24 first-place votes to finish with 161 points in the poll of media representatives from each of the eight Big East markets.

Bringin' Heat: Pitt's pass rush has been outstanding thus far, producing an average of 4.00 sacks per game to lead the nation. The Panthers have an impressive 40 total sacks over 10 games.

Defensive end Greg Romeus paces Pitt's pass rush with 7.5 sacks, while middle linebacker Adam Gunn is second with five sacks.

To Serve and Protect: As potent as Pitt's pass rush has been, the Panthers have been equally air tight on their own pass protection. Pitt has given up just nine sacks to rank ninth (tied) nationally (0.90 sacks/game) and first (tied) in the Big East.

Devastating Defense: Pitt boasts the No. 1 total defense in the Big East Conference. The Panthers are yielding only 314.7 yards per game, which ranks 21st nationally.

In its 27-22 victory over Notre Dame Nov. 14, Pitt held the high-flying Irish offense to a season-low 349 yards. Prior to the Notre Dame game, the Panthers held each of their prior three opponents to under 300 yards, including Rutgers (286), USF (212) and Syracuse (285).

Red Zone Success: Pitt is scoring at a 88.9% clip in the red zone (40 of 45) to rank first (tied) in the Big East and tied for 18th nationally.

In contrast, the Panthers' opponents have managed only a 75% success rate (18 of 24) in the red zone, which ranks first in the Big East and 19th (tied) nationally.

Big-Play Panthers: Pitt has recorded three touchdowns covering more than 70 yards this season, including an 85-yard rushing TD and passing TDs of 79 and 71 yards.

Over the 2007 and 2008 seasons, the Panthers did not have any plays of 70 or more yards.

In 2006, however, Pitt recorded seven plays of 70 or more

yards, including three receptions (80, 78 and 72), one rush (70), a kick return (97), a punt return (73) and an interception return (78), all of which resulted in touchdowns.

A Fresh Outlook: Pitt's depth chart features two true freshmen at running back, Dion Lewis and Ray Graham. Major contributions by freshmen backs are nothing new to Pitt, though. Just two seasons ago true frosh LeSean McCoy, now with the Philadelphia Eagles, rushed for 1,328 yards en route to 2007 unanimous Freshman All-America status and first-team All-Big East honors.

Fastest Pitt Frosh to 1,000: Dion Lewis and the legendary Tony Dorsett both needed just eight games to reach 1,000 yards during their freshman seasons. Lewis compiled 1,029 yards after his eighth game, while Dorsett was at 1,142 over the same span.

Pitt's other freshman 1,000-yard rushers, LeSean McCoy and Curvin Richards, needed nine games to reach the milestone.

The NCAA record for earliest game for a freshman reaching 1,000 yards rushing is seven games. Just five players have accomplished that feat, including Emmitt Smith (Florida, 1987), Marshall Faulk (San Diego St., 1991), Adrian Peterson (Oklahoma, 2004), Jamario Thomas (North Texas, 2004) and P.J. Hill (Wisconsin, 2006).

Pitt Frosh TD Record: Dion Lewis also has in his sights the Pitt freshman record for rushing touchdowns and total touchdowns.

LeSean McCoy holds both marks, totaling 14 rushing touchdowns and 15 total TDs in 2007.

Scorin' Dorin: Dorin Dickerson ranks second nationally among the country's tight ends with 10 touchdown catches.

Dickerson's 10 TD catches are a single-season record for a Pitt tight end, surpassing the former mark of nine set by Kris Wilson in 2003. Wilson, now of the San Diego Chargers, was an All-Big East honoree and a John Mackey Award finalist during the '03 campaign.

Overall, Dickerson's 10 touchdown receptions are the most by a Pitt player since the Panthers' 2004 Fiesta Bowl season when receiver Greg Lee also had 10. All-America receiver Larry Fitzgerald had a national-best and school-record 22 TD catches in 2003.

Efficiency Excellence: Quarterback Bill Stull, a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist, is the nation's fourth most efficient passer, and tops in the Big East, with a 159.37 rating. Stull has thrown 18 touchdowns and only four interceptions, while completing 66.26% of his passes.

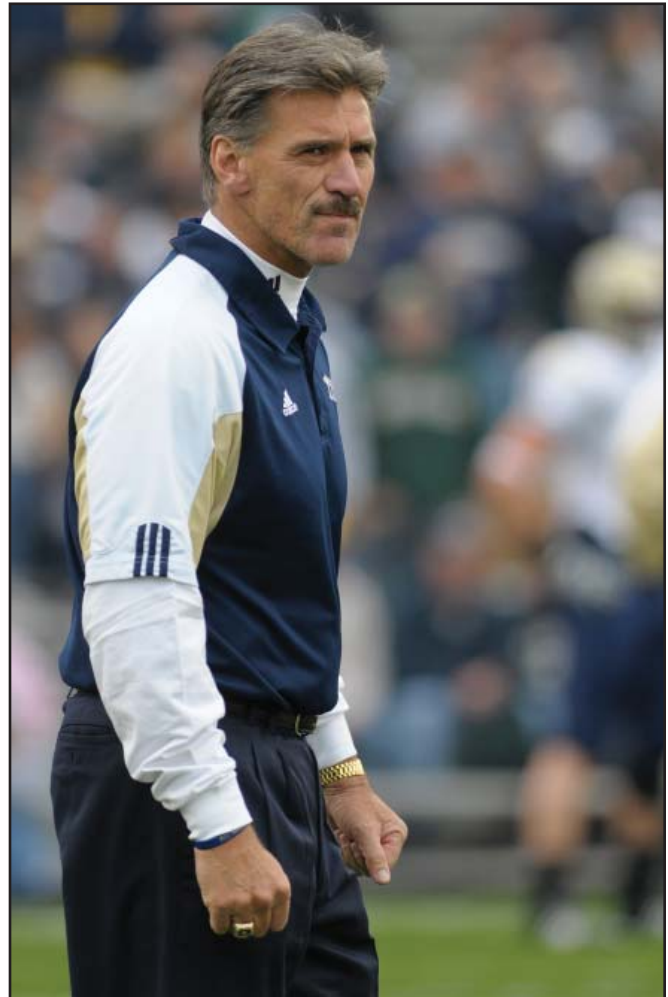
