Game Story

Pitt and New Hampshire will meet for the first time in history. The Panthers will play their first home game of the season against the Wildcats when they meet at Heinz Field.

The Panthers will look to rebound following a 27-24 overtime loss on the road at No. 24 Utah on Sept. 2 to open the season. UNH enters the weekend 1-0 after a 33-3 win over Central Connecticut State on Sept. 4.

Pitt is 2-0 against schools currently in the Colonial Athletic Association. The wins came against Villanova in 1911 (12-0) and 1998 (48-41).

UNH is one of the nation's most successful Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) programs and is currently ranked No. 5.

Pitt has played eight FCS opponents previously and is 8-0 in those contests.

PITT Notes & Anecdotes

Series Notes

Pitt and New Hampshire will meet for the first time in school history...Pitt has played a Football Championship Subdivision foe (formerly called I-AA) on eight prior occasions and won each time...the Panthers' most recent FCS encounter was a 38-3 win over Youngstown State on Sept. 5, 2009 at Heinz Field...victories over FCS opponents count toward bowl eligibility on an annual basis now...New Hampshire has won 10 games the last two seasons and currently sits at No. 5 in the latest FCS rankings...New Hampshire offensive line coach Joe Conlin is a 2002 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, starting for the Panthers from 1999-2001 at defensive tackle.

Panther Notes

Home Openers: Dating back to 1990, Pitt is 15-5 in home openers. During that time, the Panthers have started the season on the road just two times, not including the 2010 season.

Pitt vs. FCS Teams: Pitt is undefeated in eight games against Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) opponents. The following is a game-by-game breakdown.

Chalking up W's: Pitt is 20-8 over its last 28 games, dating back to the 2007 regular-season finale at West Virginia when it upset the heavily favored Mountaineers, 13-9.

It marks the Panthers' winningest stretch since the 2001-03 seasons when they went 22-6 over a 28-game period.

Heartbreak Hotel: Pitt's 10-3 record in 2009 marked its winningest campaign since 1981. The Panthers, however, were an eyelash away from perhaps an undefeated regular season. Their three losses came by a combined 11 points, an average of just 3.6 points per game.

Pitt's defeats included a 45-44 setback to Cincinnati in a game that decided the Big East title, a 19-16 decision at West Virginia that came down to a field goal as time expired, and a 38-31 loss at NC State.

Pitt now averages just a 3.5 point deficit in its last four losses including a three-point overtime loss to open the 2010 season at Utah.

On the Road: Dating back to 2007, Pitt is 9-4 in its last 13 road contests, the Panthers' best away stretch since going 13-1 on the road over the 1980-82 seasons. Pitt's four road losses during that stretch are by a combined 20 points, an average of just 5.0 points per game.

Bringin' Heat: Bolstered by an outstanding defensive front, Pitt led the country in quarterback sacks in 2009, averaging 3.62 sacks per game.

The Panthers totaled 47 sacks in 13 games. Incredibly, that impressive total was compiled without an abundance of blitzing. The defensive line accounted for 37 of Pitt's sacks (79%). Greg Romeus, the reigning Big East Defensive Player of the Year, led Pitt with eight sacks.

Pitt's 2009 sack total was its highest since 1987, when the Panthers recorded an astounding 54 sacks in 12 games.

To Serve and Protect: As potent as Pitt's pass rush was in 2009, the Panthers were equally air tight on their own pass protection. Pitt gave up just 15 sacks (1.15 sacks/game) to rank first in the Big East (tied) and 16th nationally (tied).

The 15th-ranked Panthers opened on the road at No. 24 Utah at Rice-Eccles Stadium. The contest marked Pitt's first season opener on the road featuring two Top 25 teams since its national title year in 1976 when the No. 9 Panthers defeated No. 11 Notre Dame, 31-10. Pitt nearly earned its ninth fourth-quarter comeback under Dave Wannstedt, but came up just short in overtime. Down 11 points in the fourth, Pitt rallied with a last-second field goal to tie the game at 24-24 and send the game into overtime. The Panthers were not able to capitalize in overtime, however, as they were held scoreless and allowed a Utah field goal for the win.

PITT'S PATHWAY TO CANTON

Pitt's sparkling legacy in the NFL added two more crown jewels this year with the induction of offensive lineman Russ Grimm and defensive end Rickey Jackson into the Pro Football Hall of Fame. Their election brings Pitt's total to six inductees in Canton, joining linebacker Joe Schmidt (inducted in 1973), tight end Mike Ditka (1988), running back Tony Dorsett (1994) and quarterback Dan Marino (2005). Both Grimm and Jackson starred at Pitt from 1977-80.

A member of Washington's famed "Hogs" offensive line, Grimm (top photo) went on to start 11 seasons at guard for the Redskins (1981-91) and helped lead the team to four Super Bowl appearances and three victories. Jackson spent 15 seasons in the NFL, including 13 with New Orleans (1981-93) and two with San Francisco (1994-95), helping the 49ers to a victory in Super Bowl XXIX. He compiled an incredible 128 sacks, which ranked third all-time when he retired following the '95 campaign.

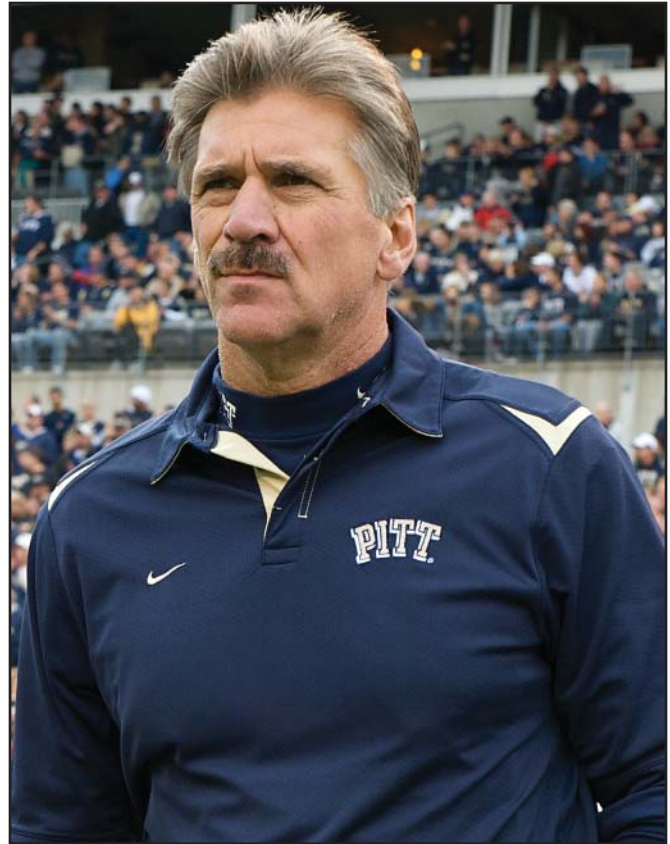
