Twenty-Win Seasons - This year, the Panthers have seven wrestlers with at least twenty wins on the season. Ryan Bosso (125 pounds), Drew Headlee (141 pounds), freshman Tyler Nauman (141 pounds), Matt Kocher (157 pounds), Keith Gavin (174 pounds), Dave Sullivan (184 pounds) and Zach Sheaffer (285 pounds) have all reached this benchmark total. Sheaffer leads the team with 29 victories this season against only seven losses. He has competed in 21 tournament matches and has only dropped five bouts. Headlee is 14-1 in duals and has only five total losses on the season. Kocher also has only five recorded losses this season — three in duals and two in tournaments. He has won 13 matches in dual competition and has recorded six pins on the season. Gavin, who has been a mainstay at the No. 1 spot at 174 since the beginning of the season, has 22 wins this season without a single loss.

Perfection – Keith Gavin completed the dual-match season with a perfect 15-0 record, making him one of only 28 Panther wrestlers to have gone undefeated in dual matches in a season. If he were to continue his winning ways through this weekend, he would record Pitt's first undefeated season since two-time NCAA Champion Pat Santoro went 48-0 during the 1987-88 campaign.

Tourney Time - The Panthers were able to take home top-10 team finishes at the four tournaments in which the majority of their starters competed. They began the year's tourney schedule without the No. 1 ranked Gavin, who was selected to take part in the NWCA All-Star Classic that same week, and grabbed a seventh-place showing at the Cornell Body Bar. Pitt also had top placewinners at the Midlands Championships, the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational and the EWL Conference Tournament, including multiple first-place honors. Gavin captured titles at all three events, while Matt Kocher claimed second at the Midlands, third at EWL's and fourth in Vegas. Jimmy Conroy, Drew Headlee and Zach Sheaffer also helped Pitt's cause at the EWL Tournament with championship honors, giving the Panthers a program-best four EWL champions and allowing the team to take second place overall with 111.5 points.

Brotherly Love - Drew and Ethan Headlee are just the second pair of brothers to compete at the NCAA tournament in the same season in Pitt's rich history. The other sibling duo to accomplish the feat was Bill and Bob Bailey in 1976.

Finishing Strong - The Panthers finished 20th last season at the NCAA Championships in Detroit, Mich., with 30 team points. That performance marked the sixth time in the past 11 seasons that Pitt has placed within the top-25 at the national tournament. 2008 also marks the 17th straight season that Pitt has sent four or more qualifiers to NCAA's. The most qualifiers Pitt has ever sent to the NCAA's was 10 back in 1956.

Twice is Nice - Keith Gavin, Matt Kocher and Drew Headlee are all looking for their second All-America honors at this year's tournament. There have only been 15 other Panthers who have been honored on two separate occasions. They are Pat Santoro (four times), Mark Bodo (three), Vic DeFelice (three), Larry Lauchle (three), Ed Peery (three), Hugh Peery (three), head coach Rande Stottlemyer (three), John Withrow (three), Tom Alberts (two), Ed DeWitt (two), Scott Hovan (two), Bill Hulings (two), Daryl Kelvington (two), Dick Martin (two) and Joe Solomon (two). The most All-Americans Pitt has had in a season was five in 1956 and 1957.

Four for Four - Matt Kocher is one of only 12 Panther wrestlers to have qualified for the NCAA tournament four times during his career. The others are Bill Bailey, Carl Fronhofer, Scott Hovan, Rob Loper, Bryan Matusic, Justin Nestor, Pat Santoro, head coach Rande Stottlemyer, assistant coach Ron Tarquinio, Craig Tritch and Pat Wiltanger.

Conroy in the NCAA Tournament:

This is Conroy's first appearance at the NCAA Tournament in just his second season. He earned an automatic bid after claiming the EWL Championship at 133 pounds with a 3-1 victory over former high school teammate Billy Ashnault of Lock Haven. Conroy racked up 27 points in his two matches prior to the championship bout and helped the Panthers captured a second place overall finish with 111.5 points.

2007-08: The starter since the beginning of the season at 133 pounds, Conroy owns a 17-11 record this year...Pinned his first opponent of the season, Matt Henry of Purdue, at the Eastern Michigan Open...Knocked off his first ranked opponent of the season with a 7-3 decision over No. 19 Jeff Hedges of UNC-Greensboro at the Ohio Duals...Recorded three major decisions in a span of four matches in December, including a 10-0 shutout of Missouri's John Olanowski...Steamrolled through the competition at the EWL Championships to win his first conference crown and earn his first nod to the NCAA Tournament.

2006-07: Conroy broke into the starting lineup as a true freshman at 125 and 133 pounds...Served as the primary backup to Drew Headlee for part of the season...Earned a 4-1 dual record and also had three falls, one technical fall and three major decisions...Placed third at the Edinboro Open and fifth at the Cornell Body Bar...Competed against Clarion and Lock Haven in league duals and picked up two victories.

High School: Conroy was a four-time New Jersey state placewinner, the first person in his school's history to accomplish that feat...Won state title as a sophomore and was a runner-up his junior and senior years...Placed third at states as a freshman...Four-time county and district champion...Holds school and county records for most wins...A 2004 Asics All-America Team honorable mention...Compiled a record of 144-8 under coach Kevin McCann...Two-time cadet All-American in freestyle...Selected to the all-tournament team as a cadet his junior year...Also competed in cross country.

Headlee in the NCAA Tournament:

Drew Headlee will be making his third NCAA tournament appearance, having qualified in the 2004-05 and 2006-07 seasons. In 2004-05 he earned All-America honors after going 3-3 in the tournament for eighth place. He defeated No. 4 Mark Jayne of Illinois for one of the biggest upsets in the tournament and also defeated Tim Harner of Rider and Derek Moore of UC Davis. In 2007, he entered the tournament as the No. 11 seed and dropped his first two matches against Wisconsin's Zach Tanelli and Virginia's Eric Albright.

2007-08: Headlee started the year with four straight wins, including a 10-2 major decision over Maryland's Jon Kohler...Ripped off four major decisions and a fall in a span of six matches in December, vaulting him into the Intermat rankings where he peaked at No. 15...Finished the season with seven straight victories, including three falls and a second consecutive EWL title...Leads the team in major decisions with seven. **2006-07:** Headlee returned to the Panthers' lineup to earn his second bid to nationals after winning the EWL title at 133 pounds...Also won the Cornell Body Bar and placed fifth at both the Las Vegas Invitational and Southern Scuffle...Was named EWL Wrestler of the Week in November...Went 22-9 on the season with a 16-6 tournament record...Six falls contributed to his 17 career total...Began the season with 10 consecutive wins, including two in dual meets. **2005-06:** Headlee had a medical redshirt due to an injury. **2004-05:** Headlee started his season with a victory in dual competition at ISU en route to a season with All-America honors...Placed in the Michigan State Open (8th)...Mat Town Invitational (3rd)...Las Vegas Invitational (6th)...EWL Championship (3rd) and finished eighth at the NCAA Championships...Traveled to China over the summer to compete in the NWCA All-American Tour. **2003-04:** Headlee pinned his first opponent in the Michigan State Open and never looked back, going 18-6 in his freshman campaign with a second-place finish in that season-opening tournament...Won the Mat Town Invitational at 125 pounds and pinned Ryan Broughman of Virginia Tech in his first EWL Championships match...Had a total of seven falls and four major decisions among his victories, scoring bonus points in 11 of his 18 wins. **High School:** Headlee was a four-time letterwinner for Waynesburg Central High School under head coach John Yates...Compiled a career record of 137-28, including a 32-8 season record his senior year...A three-time state championship qualifier, placing first as a junior and fourth as a sophomore...Won WPIAL Section championship each year...A two-time Cadet Greco-Roman runner up in 2000 and 2001...Placed fourth in the Cadet Freestyle in 2000...Competed in Junior Freestyle Nationals, placing seventh in 2002 and sixth in 2003...Placed seventh in the Junior Greco-Roman Nationals in 2000...Member of the National Honor Society. **Personal:** Born May 17, 1985...Son of Ron and Karen Headlee...Has one brother, Ethan, who is also a member of the Pitt wrestling team...An architectural studies major.

Kocher in the NCAA Tournament:

Matt Kocher is Pitt's only current four-time NCAA qualifier entering this year's tournament. He is one of only 12 Pitt wrestlers in school history to accomplish this feat. During his freshman campaign, Kocher went 2-1 in the tournament, defeating Edinboro's Deonte Penn and Fresno State's Casey Olsen. In 2005, he defeated Tyler Turner of Wisconsin in a 4-3 decision. Last season, he battled a loaded weight class at the EWL tournament and came away with a second-place finish and an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament. Twenty-nine years at the helm of one of the most history-rich wrestling programs in the East is no small accomplishment. Pitt's head wrestling coach, Rande Stottlemeyer, has done it the old-fashioned way: a dedication and commitment to one's principles and beliefs and a good day of hard work.

"Coach Stottlemeyer has a competitive spirit that is unfailing," said Carol Sprague, Senior Associate Athletic Director. "As a student-athlete at Pitt, Rande was driven to become a champion and ended his Panther Career as a three-time All-American. As a coach he expects that same commitment to work to be the best from the young men on his team. Rande is the consummate educator and he, his assistant coaches and his student-athletes fully understand that the true measure of success is that each young man takes advantage of the multiple opportunities available at Pitt and earns his degree. A championship athletic career without a degree is simply not acceptable in Pitt wrestling."

Along with his assistant coaches, Stottlemeyer has continued a winning tradition that he was a part of prior to his coaching days.

This season, Stottlemeyer and his assistants coached six grapplers to the NCAA Championships, the 17th straight season that Pitt has sent at least four competitors to the national event.

Last season, the Pitt staff saw four wrestlers advance to the NCAA Championships and two capture All-America honors. Keith Gavin became a runner-up at the national tournament, and Matt Kocher finished fifth. Gavin and teammate Drew Headlee also captured league titles in the EWL tournament that year.

In 2006, for the second consecutive season, the Pitt coaching staff guided six wrestlers to the NCAA championships. Stottlemeyer and his assistants additionally led his fourth wrestler in three years to an EWL title when Justin Nestor won at 165 pounds. In 2005, they coached yet another NCAA All-American in Headlee, the 24th wrestler to reach achieve this career milestone under Stottlemeyer's tenure. In addition, Zach Sheaffer became the EWL Champion at 285 pounds in his first season as a Panther. Three years ago, Carl Fronhofer, went from being unseeded to an NCAA finalist and an All-American at 174 pounds.

Pitt's all-time winningest coach with 247 victories in those 29 seasons, Stottlemeyer still enjoys what he does and gets just as much of a thrill in seeing his team succeed that he did in taking the job back in 1979. His excitement and enthusiasm for a sport he has been a part of for over 30 years is contagious as he talks about his coaching duties with the Panthers.

"Coaching at the University of Pittsburgh has given me an opportunity to work with great young men and top-notch assistants," Stottlemeyer said. "It has also given me an opportunity to help student-athletes build character and acquire tools they will need in the future."

The Panthers have seven NCAA qualifiers returning to their starting lineup in 2007-08, including three All-Americans, making them a viable threat on the conference and national level.

During his tenure, Stottlemeyer and his staff have produced a two-time national champion in Pat Santoro, 26 NCAA All-Americans, 117 national qualifiers and 32 Eastern Wrestling League titles. In 18 of the last 24 years of his career, they have coached at least one NCAA All-American and his teams have finished in the top-30 nationally. Pitt has finished in

the nation's top-25 in six of the last 11 seasons.

Academically, seven of his athletes have been honored as recipients of either the Blue-Gold or Panther Awards, student-athletes whose names are permanently etched in the stones of the sidewalk leading between the Cathedral of Learning and Heinz Chapel. His most recent addition to that special list was Fronhofer, who earned the Blue-Gold Award in 2003.

Just recently, 149-pounder Joe Ciamploi was honored with the Emma W. Locke Memorial Award, which is given annually to the a graduating senior in recognition of high scholarship, character, and devotion to the ideals of the University. The student must have at least a 3.85 GPA and plan to continue his or her education after graduation. Ciamploi currently carries a 3.917 GPA in Pitt's School of Nursing.

In addition, two of Stottlemeyer's former wrestlers, Greg Zimmerman and John Withrow, were the recipients of the prestigious Omicron Delta Kappa Award, presented annually to the outstanding senior student at Pitt. Numerous Pitt wrestlers have been named to the Eastern Wrestling League's Academic Honor Roll and last season the wrestling team captured Pitt's Men's Scholar-Athlete Academic Cup, which is awarded annually to the athletic team with the highest GPA.

Stottlemeyer's strong ties and success in the sport of wrestling date back to his high school career at Hickory High School in nearby Hermitage, Pa., where he was a PIAA state runner-up and two-time Junior National Freestyle wrestling champion.

Following a stellar scholastic career at Hickory, Stottlemeyer enrolled at the University of Pittsburgh, where he became a three-time NCAA All-American, achieving that level of distinction only one year before becoming a full-time assistant coach to then Panther wrestling coach Dave Adams. As a collegian, Stottlemeyer put together a record of 68-16-2, won one EWL title and served as team captain for each of his varsity seasons.

As a coach, Stottlemeyer stresses the importance of keeping one's priorities straight.

"What we hope to accomplish here at Pittsburgh is to give our guys tools for life," Stottlemeyer said. "I believe in education through athletics. You learn so much in the sport of wrestling, where there is no place to hide. It is two guys going against each other, exposed in a public forum.

"We want our wrestlers to not just love the sport but love the process of progressing in our sport. It's important for them to realize that although they only do it for a short period of time, wrestling will be a part of who they are the rest of their lives."

And as a celebrated wrestler and coach, Stottlemeyer, who in 1992 received induction into the Western Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame, realizes the unique nature of his chosen sport and the value of its potential rewards.

"Wrestling is a very grueling sport. And in order to be successful it takes an unusual amount of discipline and the ability to make a lot of personal sacrifices. It's a very combative sport and a battle of wills. Who's going to quit first? And that's one of the things we emphasize the most — never give in. Your opponent may end up scoring more points than you, but it won't be because of a lack of effort or commitment. Don't give up, because then you've lost more than just a wrestling match."

Those words tell more about Stottlemeyer than any others. His work ethic is as unwavering as his desire to keep Pitt among the elite wrestling programs in the country.

Jason Peters
Assistant Coach

Jason Peters is now in his sixth season on the Pitt coaching staff and fifth as the top assistant under Head Coach Rande Stottlemyer.

"Jason's main responsibility has been recruiting," said Stottlemyer. "That's an area where you need somebody who knows all the kids, is diligent and knows the sleepers as well as the superstars.

"I think Jason does a really good job of scouring the country, knowing the best kids out there and then getting us in the door."

In his five years with the Panthers, Peters, along with the Panther coaching staff, has made a significant contribution in helping with on-the-mat training as well as boosting recruiting. This year's recruiting class includes state champion Tyler Nauman and state runner-ups A.J. Brentzel and David Crowell as well as other potential starters with significant scholastic success. He has coached four Pitt wrestlers to All-America status, including Keith Gavin (2007), Matt Kocher

(2007), Drew Headlee (2005) and Carl Fronhofer (2003). Peters has also guided 22 wrestlers to the NCAA tournament in the last four seasons.

Peters joined the Panthers from Harvard University. He was an assistant coach with the Crimson for the 2001-02 season. While at Harvard, he helped lead individual workouts for the wrestlers while training himself for freestyle competitions. Peters was also an instructor for the Dave Schultz Wrestling Club in Boston, Mass.

"Jason has a wealth of coaching experience that has helped us get better in training and in practice, allowing us to perform stronger in meets and in the tournaments," Stottlemyer said.

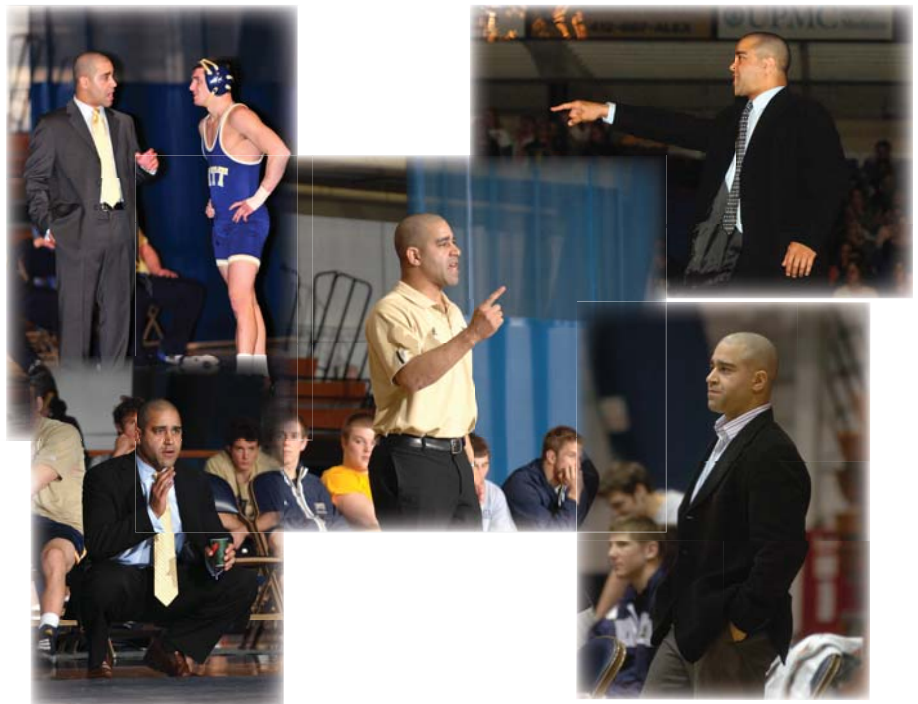
In his spare time, Peters was a personal wellness trainer and promoter for the Boston Sports Club at the Harvard University Recreational Department. There, he educated members by providing specialized wellness programs designed for specific individual needs, incorporating exercise and nutrition.

Peters also served as the head wrestling coach for the Massachusetts Cadet and Junior National Team. He worked directly with the USA Wrestling state director and headed his team to the national competition in Fargo, N.D. His team was the first in 10 years from Massachusetts to compete in the Cadet and Junior Nationals.

From 1998-2001, Peters was the head assistant wrestling coach at Princeton University where he served as recruiting coordinator as well as helped with marketing, fundraising and the development of practice plans and strategies.

Prior to Princeton, Peters gained experience as an assistant wrestling coach at his alma mater, East Stroudsburg University. In 1997-98, Peters assisted the coaching staff at East Stroudsburg with training the team's wrestlers for competition.

He is a 1998 graduate of East Stroudsburg with a bachelor's degree in movement studies and exercise science with a concentration in exercise physiology.





Ron Tarquinio
Assistant Coach

Ron Tarquinio is in his second season with the University of Pittsburgh's wrestling program after completing a successful career as a student-athlete for the Panthers that included a conference title and four NCAA tournament appearances.

"He's one of our own. He's a western Pennsylvania guy and a Pittsburgh guy," said head coach Rande Stottlemyer. "He's a quality individual, and we're happy to have him on board. He's a great fit for our program. Because of his size, he's able to train some of our lightweights. Not only was he a competent collegiate wrestler, but he was also a great freestyle wrestler who has had a lot of success. He's decided this is something he wants to do, and he's doing a great job for us."

In his freshman campaign with the Panthers, Tarquinio posted a 25-9 record in tournament competition including six major decisions, two falls and one technical fall. He opened his first dual meet season in 2001-02, qualifying for the NCAA Championships after a fourth-place finish at the Eastern Wrestling League (EWL) Championships. Tarquinio finished 21-13 overall with a 9-4 record in dual competition. In that season, he finished second at the Michigan State Open and won his first match at nationals against Frank Edgar of Clarion.

As a redshirt sophomore, Tarquinio brought home the EWL Championship title at 141 pounds, joining teammate Josh Birt as the first league titlists for Pitt in three seasons. Tarquinio finished 10-4 in dual meets for the season, bringing his total win count to 72.

In 2004-05, he not only secured another NCAA bid, but Tarquinio also won the prestigious Las Vegas Invitational with a 6-3 decision over Richard LaForge of Hofstra. Tarquinio finished 2-2 in the NCAA tournament, registering wins over Josh Wooton of Northern Illinois and Charlie Pinto of Maryland. He also finished second at the EWL Championships and was the champion of the Mat Town Invitational.

In his final season as a Panther, Tarquinio advanced to the top 12 of the NCAA tournament, just one win away from All-America honors. He battled to a second-place finish in the Southern Scuffle with an overtime match against Lehigh's Cory Cooperman. Tarquinio also placed second at the EWL tournament and seventh at the Las Vegas Invitational. He finished with a 22-11 record including two falls and nine major decisions. Tarquinio was named co-MVP of the team in 2005-06 and finished his career in fifth place among Pitt's all-time win leaders with 120 victories.



Bryan Stout
Volunteer Assistant Coach

Bryan Stout, now in his sixth season working with the Panthers' wrestling program as a volunteer assistant coach, has helped mold the heavier weight classes into solid competitors. Stout was a four-time All-American at Clarion University, becoming the Golden Eagles' only four-time honoree.

While with the Panthers, Stout has offered his time to concentrate on technique and training with the upper weight classes for Head Coach Rande Stottlemyer. In 2005, Stout helped coach Zach Sheaffer to a EWL Championship in the young heavyweight's first season with the Panthers. "I think he's done a good job with Zach in particular, in terms of trying to develop him," Stottlemyer said. "And obviously [Sheaffer] won EWLs three years ago as a freshman, so Bryan must be doing something right."

"Having him on the staff has given us a wealth of championship experience. He was a very strong and intelligent wrestler at Clarion and he has helped the wrestlers at Pittsburgh improve in trying to get to the same level. He is excellent in the wrestling room and an outstanding technician. Bryan also communicates extremely well with the wrestlers on this team and they have a great deal of respect for him."

Stout was named the Eastern Wrestling League's Freshman of the Year in 1993-94 at Clarion and went on to win two EWL titles during his career. He was also a three-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference finalist, winning two PSAC titles. A 190-pounder for his first three years for the Golden Eagles, Stout moved up to the heavyweight class in his senior season. Stout's wrestling achievements were recognized last year as he was a 2005 inductee into the EWL Wrestling Hall of Fame.

Before his time at Clarion, Stout was a three-time district and region champion at Southern Regional High School in Barnegat, N.J. He also became the school's first state champion in his senior year. In that incredible season, no opponent scored a single point on Stout and every one of his victories was by major decision, technical fall or pin.

After his graduation from Clarion in 1997, Stout worked at a medical marketing company in Philadelphia for two years while helping out with the University of Pennsylvania's wrestling program. Stout moved to Pittsburgh in 1999 and has worked with Bayer Corporation for the past few years. In 2002-03, he held a sales manager position at Bayer for a nationwide network of distributors. Now, he works in the sales and marketing department, focusing on national industrial paint accounts.

Stout and his wife currently reside in Mt. Lebanon with their three sons.
