Looking At The Panthers

Pitt enters the week with a 11-1-1 record overall and 2-0 in EWL action, which has landed them at No. 18 in the latest NWCA rankings.

The Panthers have not suffered a loss since they fell 24-9 to then-No. 17-ranked Lehigh on Nov. 15. Pitt's only other blemish was a 19-19 tie to No. 14 Penn State on Dec. 12.

Pitt is led by sophomore **Tyler Nauman**, who is ranked 18th by InterMat at 141 and has enjoyed a nearly perfect season entering the weekend with a 24-3 record. Nauman is also perfect in dual matches with a 12-0 mark.

Also having an outstanding year for Pitt are junior heavyweight **Ryan Tomei** with a 24-4 record on the season and freshman Anthony Zanetta at 26-7 in the 125 weight class.

Pitt vs. Cleveland State

The Vikings will open their EWL season Thursday against the Panthers. Cleveland State is 2-10 on the season and is led by senior Marcus Effner, who is closing in on 100 career victories.

Head coach Ben Stehura is in his second year at the helm with a 6-23 record during that time. Those wishing to watch the match live can do so at: www.csuvikings.com

Series History

Pitt holds the slight 17-14-1 advantage over Cleveland State in the series history, which dates back to the 1977-78 season (a 22-18 Pitt win). Last season, the Panthers dominated with a 38-3 victory at home.

Pitt vs. Penn

Penn holds a 4-3 record in duals this season including last weekend's loss to No. 24 Virginia, 28-9. The loss marked the Quakers' first-ever loss to the Cavaliers.

Penn is led by second year head coach Rob Eiter, who also served as an assistant for the squad from 2006-08.

Series History

Pitt and Penn have met up just one time on the mat with the Quakers coming away with a 20-16 victory last season.

Rookie Review...

Freshman Anthony Zanetta recently broke into the top 10 for wins by a freshman, as he currently holds a 26-8 mark on the season, which ties him for 10th. Zanetta is tied with Scott Hovan, who recorded a 26-14-1 record in the 1987-88 season. Wrestling at 125, his 26 wins are the most on the squad.

Oh Brother...

Pitt currently has two sets of brothers on the squad including sophomore **Chris Albright** and his brother, redshirt senior **Eric Albright**; as well as freshman **P.J. Tasser** and his brother, redshirt freshman **Donnie Tasser**.

In addition, in Pitt's signing class, two more sets of brothers are set to join the squad. Sophomore **Zac Thomusseit's** brother Max signed a letter of intent with the Panthers, as well as **Matt Wilps'** brother Tyler.

Stottlemeyer's 30-Year Stint

Pitt head coach **Rande Stottlemeyer** is in his 31st season at the helm of the Panther program. In his 31st season, Stottlemeyer is the winningest coach in Pitt history, recording a 262-216-12 record, including a 4-7-1 mark last season and 11-1-1 this season in dual action.

Stottlemeyer helped guide four wrestlers to the NCAA Tournament last season, with three of those returning in 2009-10.

Open Success

After a successful appearance at the Buffalo Open, the Panthers continued to make a mark at the Penn State Open on Dec. 6, where heavyweight **Ryan Tomei** (285) claimed a second place finish and five others placed.

Anthony Zanetta (125) and **Tyler Nauman** (141) both captured fifth place finishes while in State College after falling to the consolation bracket. After winning his first two matches of the day, Zanetta captured his fifth place finish with a marginal 9-8 decision over Matthew Snyder of Virginia. Nauman entered the open with a previously undefeated record, falling to Penn State's Colby Pisanni, 9-3, in his third match of the day.

Mark Powell (157) completed the day with a 6-2 record to clinch a seventh place finish after a 3-0 decision over Bucknell's Corey Lear. **Ethan Headlee** (174) wrestled unattached and finished sixth following a 14-6 major decision over Navy's Michael Billings.

At 197, sophomore **Matt Wilps** captured a fourth place finish at the Penn State Open when he tallied a 10-1 major decision over former Panther A.J. Brentzel of Pitt-Johnstown.

Ryan Tomei continued to make his presence known when he claimed the Panthers' best place of the day, finishing second in the heavyweight class. Tomei accrued four consecutive wins before appearing in the championship round where he fell to third-ranked Zachery Rey of Lehigh with a 3-2 decision.

197 Battle

At 197 this season, head coach **Rande Stottlemeyer** has a good problem on his hands. Stottlemeyer has two successful wrestlers available for the lineup as **Matt Wilps** holds a 25-7 record on the year and **A.J. Hunte** has challenged all season with an 10-6 record. In the Clarion Open, Hunte earned a second place finish with a 3-1 mark.

He's Back!

Former Pitt wrestler **Matt Kocher** is back with the Panther program. This time, as an assistant coach. Kocher joined the Pitt staff this summer and has been an invaluable addition to the squad.

While at Pitt, Kocher was a four-time NCAA qualifier and currently sits at second on the all-time wins list in Pitt history at 151-45.

Stottlemeyer Earns 250th Career Win with 38-3 Dismantling of Vikings

January 28, 2009 — Pittsburgh, Pa.

PITTSBURGH — Zach Sheaffer's 2-0 decision over Rashard Goff in the heavyweight match broke a three-match losing streak and gave head coach Rande Stottlemeyer his 250th career win as the University of Pittsburgh wrestling team found its way back to the win column with a 38-3 sinking of Cleveland State.

"We had a pretty good performance to say the least tonight," said Stottlemeyer. "We really should have won the 10th match as [Alex] Munoz got out to a great start but just couldn't finish."

Sheaffer, now 17-4 on the year, escaped just three seconds into the second frame and held on in the third, riding the 18th ranked heavyweight in the country for two straight minutes, capping Pitt's biggest win since last season's 42-0 shutout of Findlay.

Entering the third period scoreless, freshman Chris Albright was able to rack up two takedowns within a minute span and survive a late reversal as time ran out in the 125-pound match. Albright's 4-3 decision put Pitt (3-5, 3-0 EWL) on top 3-0.

Junior Jimmy Conroy broke the floodgates open in the first period with two takedowns and a near fall, building a 6-2 advantage which included 1:16 of riding time. In the bottom position to start the second, Conroy wasted no time in escaping and tallying his third takedown of the match, increasing his lead to 9-2. Three more back points and another takedown in the third period gave the 17th ranked 133-pounder a 15-4 major decision and Pitt a 7-0 lead.

"We had some really good performances tonight from Ethan [Headlee], [Tyler] Nauman, Jimmy [Conroy] and [Zach] Sheaffer. Those four guys are really stepping up in a leadership role for this team."

Despite falling behind 2-0 just 20 seconds into the first period of the 141-pound match, redshirt freshman Tyler Nauman bounced back and earned his team-leading ninth fall of the year with 13 seconds remaining in the first period. Nauman's fall was his 22nd win of the year, another team-high for the Middletown, Pa. native.

Senior Mark Powell put Pitt on top 16-0 with his 3-1 decision in a nine and a half minute marathon match at 149 pounds. Powell and Antonio Nicholson traded escape points in the second and third periods before forcing overtime. With 22 seconds left in the second sudden victory period, Powell was able to maneuver his way into a takedown, ending the longest match of the year for any Pitt wrestler.

Cleveland State was finally able to stop the Pitt offensive in the 157-pound match. A late takedown by Corey Carlo knotted the match up at four and called for a second straight sudden victory ending. Just eight seconds in, Carlo secured a takedown, winning 6-4 over freshman Alex Munoz.

Sophomore Ethan Headlee continues to chase Nauman for the team lead in wins and pins. Less than 20 seconds into the second period and working from the top position, Headlee recorded his 21st win and eighth fall of the season over Rob Michaels in the 165-pound bout, putting the Panthers up 22-3.

It was all Pitt in the 174-pound match as redshirt A.J. Brentzel poured it on in his first start of the 2008-09 season. A flurry of scoring in both the first and second periods gave Brentzel a comfortable 9-3 lead with over three minutes of riding time heading into the final stanza. He added another takedown as time ran out, running away with a 14-3 major decision.

Freshman Zac Thomsseit made it two dual wins in a row with his 7-0 shutout over J.T. Miller in the 184-pound contest. Thomsseit tallied a takedown in each period and tacked on a riding time point for the decision.

Quakers Edge Panthers 20-16

January 25, 2009 — Philadelphia, Pa.

PHILADELPHIA — In the first match between the Pennsylvania mainstays, Penn built a seven point lead and never looked back, handing the Panthers their second consecutive loss, 20-16 here today at The Palestra in Philadelphia, Pa.

Cesar Grajales put the Quakers on the board first with an 8-3 decision in the 149-pound bout against Mark Powell. Gabriel Burak increased the lead to 7-0 with his 10-2 major decision over Phil Sorrentino in the 157-pound match.

At 165 pounds, Ethan Headlee closed the gap to 7-3 with a 6-1 decision over Andrew Coles. The win was the 20th on the year for the sophomore. Penn answered quickly with Scott Giffin earning an 11-2 major decision over Karl DiCiantis, bringing the score to 11-3.

Zac Thomsseit broke out of a recent slump with an 11-1 major decision at 184 pounds. Thomsseit yielded just a single escape point in the win over Cory Beaver. At 197 pounds, Thomas Shovlin was a 5-4 winner for the Quakers over Matt Wilps.

Trey McLean was able to pull off the upset against sixth ranked Zach Sheaffer in the heavyweight match, capitalizing on two takedowns for the 5-2 decision.

The Panthers closed the match taking two of the final three weights from the Quakers. No. 17 Jimmy Conroy was a 4-1 winner over Bryan Ortenzio at 133 while No. 10 Tyler Nauman continued to dominate, earning his eighth fall of the season late in the third period over Zack Kemmerer in the 141-pound bout.
