ATHLETES OF THE WEEK

Robert Bryan (Jr, GK, Apex, N.C.)... Bryan led the Providence men's lacrosse team to a 5-4 victory over Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) foe St. Joseph's on April 12 in Philadelphia, Pa. The Friars were outshot, 28-17, in the game, but Bryan posted a career-high 13 saves to secure the victory. He also picked up a game-high five groundballs. PC's victory marked the fifth-straight as it remains unbeaten in MAAC action (5-0).

Katherine Schock (Jr, Norwood, Mass.)... Schock led the women's track squad to a first-place finish in the Quinnipiac Invitational as she won the 800m in a time of 2:16.39 and was part of the 4x400m relay team that also placed first with a time of 4:08.43.

Danielle Bertollette (So., Temecula, Calif.)... Bertollette led the softball team to a 3-1 record last week. She pitched in all four games (two starts) and posted a 3-1 record, a 0.68 earned run average and 14 strikeouts in 20.2 innings of action. Bertollette tossed a complete-game shutout and struck out seven batters in PC's 1-0 win over Seton Hall on April 13.

Charles Dewey (Jr., Worcester, Mass.)... Dewey led the men's track team to a first-place finish at the Quinnipiac Invitational as he won the 400m in 49.10 seconds and was part of the 4x400m which took first, setting a new school record, with a time of 3:19.58.

MEN'S OUTDOOR TRACK... The Providence College men's track team competed in the Quinnipiac Invitational at Yale University on Wednesday, April 10. The men took first place, defeating Iona 74-45, Quinnipiac 60-42, and Stony Brook 74-53. The Friars recorded five first-place finishes in the individual events. Junior Charles Dewey (Worcester, Mass.) won the 400m in 49.10 seconds and senior Max Smith (Dunedin, New Zealand) won the 800m in a time of 1:55.59. Junior Hayden McLaren (Christchurch, New Zealand) won the 3000m in a time of 8:30.59 and freshman Phillip Connaughton (Broken Arrow, Okla.) won the long jump with a height of 5.98m (19-07 1/2). Freshman Stephen Justus registered the final first place finish in the javelin throw with a mark of 51.96m (170-06). The Friar men's track team will compete next in the Mt. Sac Relays in Walnut, Calif. on April 17 and 18 and in the UConn Invite in Storrs, Conn. on April 19.

WOMEN'S OUTDOOR TRACK... The Providence College women's track team competed in the Quinnipiac Invitational at Yale University on Wednesday, April 10. The women took first place, defeating Iona 61-34, Quinnipiac 60-42, and Stony Brook 55-30. The women recorded four first-place finishes, including junior Katherine Schock (Norwood, Mass.) who won the 800m in a time of 2:16.39 and sophomore Krystal Douglas (Harpwell, Maine) who won the mile in a time of 4:57.78. Junior Danette Doetzel (Macklin, Sask.) won the 3000m in a time of 9:38.94 and sophomore Caitlin Lawrence (Franklin, Mass.) won the high jump with a mark of 1.55m (5-01). The Friar women's track team will compete next in the Mt. Sac Relays in Walnut, Calif. on April 17 and 18 and in the UConn Invite in Storrs, Conn. on April 19.

WOMEN'S TENNIS (7-9)... The Providence College women's tennis team posted a 2-0 record last week. On Tuesday, April 8, the Friars traveled to West Hartford, Conn. to take on the University of Hartford. Led by strong doubles play along with clutch victories in the No. 1 and No. 2 singles spots by freshman Avery Gibson (Fairfield, Iowa) and junior Ashley Rissolo (Southport, Conn.), Providence went for the 7-0 sweep over the Hawks. On Saturday, April 12, Providence traveled to Queens, N.Y. to take on Manhattan College at the Ally Pond Tennis Center. Due to illness, the Jaspers were forced to forfeit in the No. 6 singles and No. 3 doubles spots. Capitalizing on their weakened opponents, the Friars earned the doubles point with a win by freshman Ayushi Sinha (Mumbai, India) and junior Meghan Gilroy (Fairfield, Conn.) in the No. 2 spot, 8-3. Backed by victories in straight sets in the No. 2, 3, 4, and 5 singles positions, the Friars defeated the Jaspers, 4-1. PC returns to action on Tuesday, April 15 when they host Holy Cross at home in Providence, R.I. The match marks the final event for the Providence tennis team on the season, as the Friars honor seniors Kate Danaher (Norwood, Mass.), Erin Kenaga (Norwalk, Conn.), and Kate Lyons (Barrington, R.I.). The match is set to begin at 4:00 p.m.

SOFTBALL (18-17-1, 4-6 BIG EAST)... The softball team posted a 3-1 record last week in four BIG EAST Conference games. The Friars split a double header against Seton Hall on Friday, April 11. PC was defeated, 2-1, in the first game in eight innings, but bounced back to post a 5-4 win (eight innings) in the second contest. The Friars used the long ball to post a 5-4 win over the Pirates. Sophomore Jenna Garcia (Morro Bay, Calif.) had a solo home run, classmate Teresa Bertels (Lower Gwynedd, Pa.) hit a three-run blast to tie the game (4-4) in the fourth inning, while sophomore Christy Becker (Atlanta, Ga.) sealed the win with a walk-off home run in the eighth inning. The Friars then swept a double header versus St. John's at Raymond Field on Sunday, April 13. PC posted a 1-0 triumph in the first game as sophomore Danielle Bertolette (Temecula, Calif.) pitched a complete-game shutout and struck out seven batters. Freshman Justine Stratton (Fresno, Calif.) accounted for the game's only run when she hit a home run in the fifth inning. In the second game, the Friars rallied from a 3-0 deficit to post a 4-3 win. Junior Mary Rose Sheehy (Woodbridge, Conn.) batted 2-for-3 with a walk-off home run and two RBI's. Classmate Gina Rossi (Bakersfield, Calif.) hit a two-run home run to even the score (3-3) in the sixth inning and Sheehy capped off the comeback with her third home run of the season. The Friars are back in action on Wednesday, April 16 when they travel to New Haven, Conn. to face Yale in a non-conference double header.

MEN'S LACROSSE (5-5, 5-0 MAAC)... The Providence College men's lacrosse team posted a 1-0 record last week. On April 12, the Friars earned their fifth-consecutive victory as they defeated MAAC foe St. Joseph's, 5-4, in Philadelphia, Pa. St. Joseph's outshot Providence, 28-17, but junior goalkeeper Robert Bryan (Apex, N.C.) registered a career-high 13 saves and picked up a game-high five groundballs to solidify the victory for PC. Sophomore Colin Tigh (Garden City, N.Y.) notched two goals, while graduate student Bennett Murphy (Princeton, N.J.) tallied one goal and added two assists. The Friars return to action against MAAC opponent Marist on Wednesday, April 16 at 3:00 p.m. in Poughkeepsie, N.Y. On Saturday, April 19 Providence heads to cross-city rival Brown University to take on the Bears at 7:00 p.m.
