MEN'S BASKETBALL (11-6, 3-2 BIG EAST)...The men's basketball team went 0-1 this past week. On Saturday, January 17, the Friars fell to #14 Marquette by a score of 91-82 at the Dunkin' Donuts Center. Senior Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) registered 15 points and tied a career-high with 17 rebounds. The 17 rebounds were the most McDermott has registered in BIG EAST play. Sophomore Marshon Brooks (Stone Mountain, Ga.) paced the Friars with 21 points and grabbed 6 rebounds. PC shot 56.4 percent (31-55) from the field for the game and out-rebounded the Golden Eagles 38-to-27, but could not overcome a 12-3 Marquette run at the end of the second half. This week, the Friars host Cincinnati on Monday, January 19 at the Dunkin' Donuts Center and travel to Newark, N.J. on Thursday, January 22 for a 7:00 p.m. tilt with Seton Hall.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL (7-10, 1-3 BIG EAST)...The Providence College women's basketball team posted an 0-2 record last week. On January 12, the Friars fell to Rhode Island, 55-49, at Alumni Hall/Mullaney Gymnasium in Providence, R.I. Emily Cournoyer (North Attleboro, Mass.) netted a team-high 16 points, while Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) hauled in a team-best nine boards. On January 17, the Friars fell to DePaul, 87-64, at McGrath Arena in Chicago, Ill. Marandola posted a team-best 15 points and became the 29th player all-time to reach the 1,000-point career milestone. Shantee Darrian (Trenton, N.J.) led the Friars on the boards with 12 rebounds. Providence returns to action on Tuesday, January 20 against USF at Alumni Hall.

WOMEN'S HOCKEY (12-10-2, 7-3-1 HOCKEY EAST)...The women's hockey team went 1-2-0 this week. On Tuesday, January 13, PC fell by a score of 7-3 to #7 Dartmouth in Hanover, N.H. The Friars fought back to even the score on three occasions but were unable to take the lead. Sophomore Alyse Ruff (Tualatin, Ore.) registered a power-play goal and an assist while freshman Christie Jensen (Delta, B.C.) earned her first point as Friar with an assist on the third goal of the game. Providence welcomed Vermont for a pair of games in Schneider Arena this weekend and split the series, 1-1. Game one saw the Friars blank UVM, 3-0. Freshman Jennifer Friedman (San Gabriel, Calif.) netted two goals while classmate Genevieve Lacasse (Scarborough, Ontario) recorded 16 saves to earn the shutout. Lacasse now has four clean sheets on the season, the most by a PC freshman since Jana Bugden recorded seven in 2002-03. Providence had a 2-1 lead going into the second period after goals from Friedman and Kate Bacon (Chanhasen, Minn.) but suffered four-straight unanswered goals and fell, 5-2. PC recorded five goals on the weekend with all five strikes coming off the sticks of the freshmen class. The Friars are next in action when they take on Boston University in a home-and-home series beginning at Schneider Arena on Saturday, January 24, at 2:00 p.m.

MEN'S HOCKEY (6-12-2, 3-8-2 HOCKEY EAST)...The men's hockey team posted a 2-0-1 record last week. On Tuesday, January 13, the Friars defeated No. 2 Boston University, 4-2, in Boston, Mass. Freshman Matt Bergland (Faribault, Minn.) scored two goals, including the game winner, while classmate Alex Beaudry (Cumberland, Ontario) made 39 saves to lead the Friars. Sophomore Ian O'Connor (Londonderry, N.H.) had one goal and one assist, while senior Chris Eppich (Surrey, B.C.) recorded one goal. On Friday, January 16, the Friars defeated UMass, 5-4, in Amherst, Mass. Senior Matt Taormina (Washington Township, Mich.) scored the game-winning goal with 53 seconds left in the third period to lead the Friars. Sophomores Matt Germain (Rockland, Mass.), Austin Mayer (Providence, R.I.), Kyle MacKinnon (Walnut, Calif.) and freshman Andy Balysky (Randolph, N.J.) also scored for the Friars. Freshman Alex Beaudry (Cumberland, Ontario) made a career-high 42 saves, including 18 in the first period. The Friars finished the week with a 2-2 overtime tie at Maine on Sunday, January 18. Beaudry stopped 40 shots, while senior Nick Mazzolini (Anchorage, Alaska) scored the game-tying goal. Germain also scored for the Friars. The Friars are back in action on Friday, January 23, with a home game against Northeastern.

WOMEN'S INDOOR TRACK...The Providence College women's indoor track team returned to action on Friday, January 16 at the University of Rhode Island Sorlein Invitational. The Friars enjoyed success in the distance events, with individual wins in both the mile and 3,000 meters. The Friars took the top-four places in the mile race. Freshman Mary Kate Champagne (Plattsburg, N.Y.) led the field with a winning time of 4:57.42, followed closely by junior Krystal Douglas (Harpwell, Maine) in second (4:58.13). Senior Katie Elliot (Penfield, N.Y.) was third (5:10.13) and junior Amie Shumacher (Wolcott, Conn.) placed fourth (5:16.27). In the 3,000 meters, senior Katie DiCamillo (Garden City, N.Y.) won in a time of 10:05.73. Hannah Davidson (Saratoga Springs, N.Y.) placed second in the 1,000 meters in a time of 2:59.49. The women compete next at the Terrier Classic Invitational at Boston University on Friday, January 23.

MEN'S INDOOR TRACK...The Providence College men's indoor track team returned to action on Friday, January 16 at the University of Rhode Island Sorlein Invitational. The Friars enjoyed success in the distance events, with individual wins in 1,000 meters, the mile, and 3,000 meters races. In the 1,000 meters it was junior Hayden McLaren (Christchurch, New Zealand) who set the pace, winning in a time of 2:25.78. Freshman David McCarthy (Waterford, Ireland) led the mile field with a winning time of 4:14.18. Senior Richard Yeates (Dublin, Ireland) took the victory in the 3,000 meters race (8:27.02) and junior Michael Anderson (Ajax, Ontario) placed third (8:35.00). On the sprinting side, Charlie Dewey (Worcester, Mass.) placed second in the 500 meter race in a time of 1:05.42. Providence ended the meet on a high note, winning the 4x800 meter relay (7:43.94). The team was comprised of David McCarthy, Hayden McLaren, Charles Dewey and Nick Berluti (Westwood, Mass.). The men compete next at the Terrier Classic Invitational at Boston University on Saturday, January 24.

WOMEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING (2-7)...The Providence College women's swimming & diving team went 0-1 this week. The Friars returned from winter break for a road trip to the University of Maine, where they fell, 168-106. Pacing Providence, sophomores Courtney Larcom (Morristown, N.J.) and Alexis Fatigati (New Milford, N.J.) each earned individual wins on the day. Larcom took first in the 500-yard freestyle (5:25.19), while Fatigati won the 200-yard individual medley (2:19.96). Junior Ryann Dillon (Downington, Pa.) placed first in the one-meter diving event, earning 126.68 points. The Friars return to action on Friday, January 23 when they host Drexel University at home in Providence, R.I. The meet is scheduled for a 1:00 p.m. start. Providence will also host Villanova on Saturday, January 24 at 11:00 a.m.

MEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING (4-4)....The Providence College men's swimming & diving team went 0-1 this week. The Friars returned from winter break for a road trip to the University of Maine, where they fell, 179-115. Leading the way for PC, junior Tim Reilly (Floral Park, N.Y.) took a first-place finish in the 200-yard backstroke, finishing in a time of 2:03.72. Providence also earned a relay victory with juniors Mike Loftis (Branford, Conn.) and Mathew Card (Bow, N.H.), senior Nick Trilla (Belmont, Mass.), and freshman Matt Green (Westfield, N.J.) who took the 400-yard freestyle relay. The Friars return to action on Friday, January 23 when they host Drexel University at home in Providence, R.I. The meet is scheduled for a 1:00 p.m. start. Providence will also host Villanova on Saturday, January 24 at 11:00 a.m.
