SOFTBALL (23-30, 7-13 BIG EAST)... The Providence College softball team was defeated by No. 21/25 Notre Dame, 6-4, Thursday afternoon in the quarterfinals of the BIG EAST Championship played at Ulmer Stadium in Louisville, Ky. Notre Dame jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the first inning when Alexa Maldonado scored from third on a throwing error and Sadie Pitzenberger drove in Kelsey Thorton on an RBI double. Senior Justine Stratton (Fresno, Calif.) tied up the game at 2-2 in the top of the fourth inning with a two-run homer to left-center field that brought home junior Michelle Huber (Dana Point, Calif.). In the sixth inning, Stratton gave the Friars a 4-2 lead with her second two-run homer of the game. Stratton finished with 10 long balls on the season and 21 in her career. For her efforts, she was named to the BIG EAST Championship All-Tournament team. The Fighting Irish responded with four runs of in the bottom of the inning to take a 6-4 lead and went on to win by the same score. Sophomore Corinne Clauss (Davie, Fla.) pitched six innings, gave up only four earned runs and retired 12 straight batters at one point. Head Coach Kerri Jacklets has now reached the BIG EAST Championship four times in the last six years.

MEN'S TRACK AND FIELD... Sophomore Ahmed Ali (Boston, Mass.) represented the men's track and field team at the IC4A Championships in Princeton, N.J. Ali competed in the 10,000 meters, crossing in 31:19.56. Meanwhile, freshman Alex Wallace (Waipukurau, New Zealand) competed at Swarthmore College's Last Chance Meet in Swarthmore, Pa. Wallace posted a personal best in the 1500-meters with a 3:49.64. Up next for the Friars is the NCAA Regionals, held May 26-28 in Bloomington, Indiana.

WOMEN'S TRACK AND FIELD... Members of the women's track and field team competed in the ECAC Championships at Princeton. Freshman Laura Nagel (Napier, New Zealand) continued her strong outdoor campaign by earning second place in the competitive 3000-meter final. Her clocking of 9:25.78 is her best at the distance. Nagel crossed just ahead of junior teammate Hannah Davidson, who posted a 9:38.68. Meanwhile freshman Grace Thek (Melbourne, Australia) posted her third fastest time at the distance this spring, crossing in 9:57.04. In the 5000-meters, senior Emma Perron (West Hartford, Conn.) represented the Friars with a time of 17:34.85. The Friars are now off until the NCAA Regional, to be held May 26-28 in Bloomington, Ind.
