



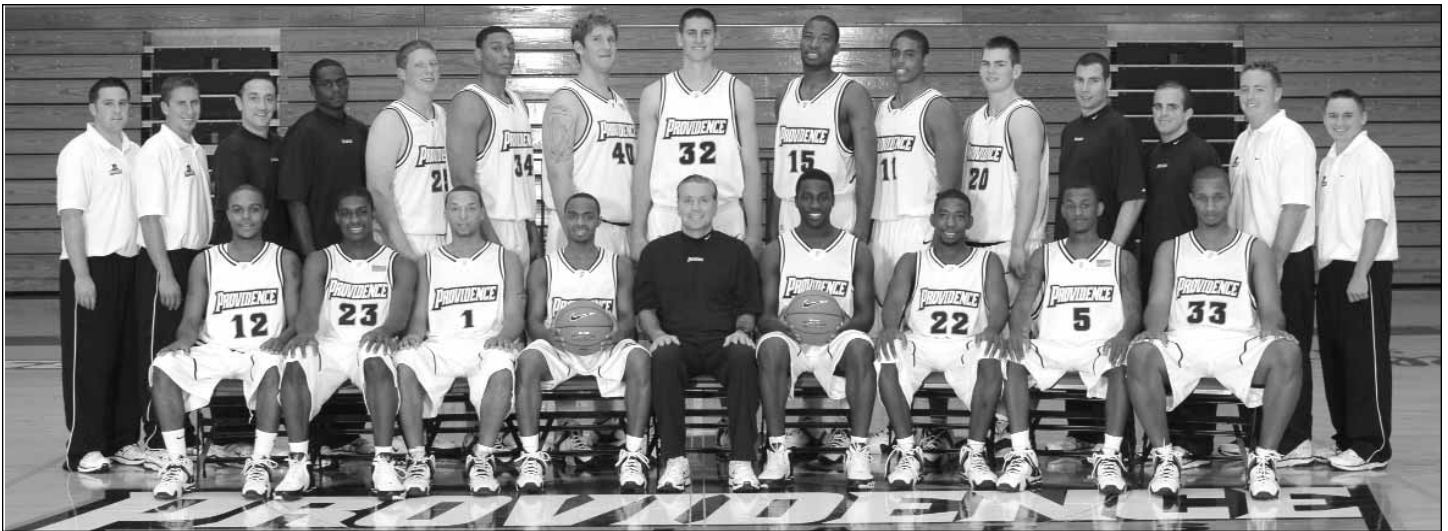

Exciting Times Ahead In Friartown In 2006-07..

Things will look different this season in Friartown. For the first time in four seasons, longtime starter Donnie McGrath will not be patrolling the Friar backcourt and leading the team's three-point shooting attack. This season also will mark the first year of significant renovations to the team's home court, the Dunkin' Donuts Center. The first phase of this \$62 million project will involve the most significant changes to the Dunk' since it was constructed in 1972.

Friartown also will look different as the team will be older, more improved and hungrier for success. One year after having one of the youngest teams in the BIG EAST, the Friars enter the 2006-07 season with another young squad. However this season, Head Coach Tim Welsh's Friars have experience and talent and have postseason play in their sights.

Despite having a roster that featured just eight scholarship players in 2005-06, six of which were freshmen and sophomores, the Friars were very competitive. The Friars might have been described as young and inexperienced, but they also were talented. Friar fans are confident that the experience gained last season will propel the team to a postseason berth this year. This optimism centers around a solid core of seven returning players who all played significant roles during the 2006 season. Six of these seven players started 12 or more games.

The veteran leader of this group of players is senior forward Herbert Hill (Kinston, N.C.). Hill enters his fifth season at Providence ready to establish himself as an impact player in the BIG EAST. The other two upperclassmen that will help lead the Friars are juniors Randall Hanke (New York, N.Y.) and Charles Burch (Dorchester, Mass.). The four sophomores on this year's roster all had a strong first season at Providence. Sharaud Curry (Gainesville, Ga.) and Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) each earned BIG EAST All-Rookie Team honors and Weyinmi Efejuku (Fresh Meadows, N.Y.) and Jonathan Kale (Mattapan, Mass.) were valuable contributors to the lineup.

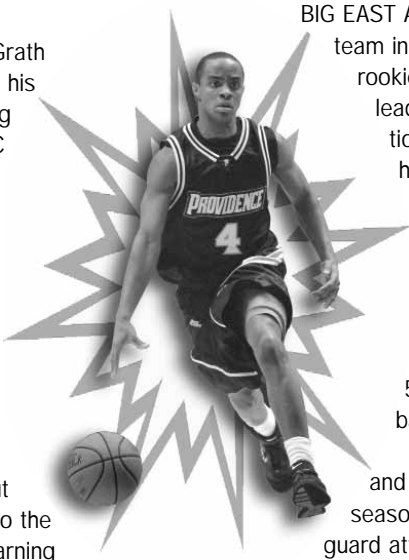
Head Coach Tim Welsh is not afraid to let talented newcomers step in and make an impact. This season, he will once again have some talented rookies who can help the team win. Freshmen guards Brian McKenzie (Brooklyn, N.Y.), Jamal Barney (Baltimore, Md.) and Dwain Williams (Murrieta, Calif.) and center Ray Hall (Denver, Colo.) all come to Providence from winning programs. These four all have the ability to help the team. The fifth newcomer to the team is junior transfer Jeff Xavier (Pawtucket, R.I.). Xavier, a native Rhode Islander, had an impressive season in 2005-06 at Manhattan College. Although he must sit out this season due to NCAA transfer regulations, he will be a key member of the team's practice unit.

Friar fanatics have a lot to look forward to this season and will be anxiously awaiting the debut of the 2006-07 squad. With a solid nucleus of players returning and improvements to the Dunkin' Donuts Center, it is an exciting time in Friartown!

THE BACKCOURT

In four seasons at Providence College, Donnie McGrath left his mark on the Friar record book. He finished his career at Providence ranked 17th all-time in scoring with 1,282 points. He also ranks first all-time at PC in three pointers (274), games started (117) and minutes played (4,128). Last season, he led the team in scoring (15.1 ppg) and three pointers (77). McGrath, who was selected to the league's Second Team, became the 28th PC player to earn All-BIG EAST accolades.

Despite the loss of McGrath, the Friar backcourt should be ready to handle the pressure of BIG EAST competition. Sophomore **SHARAUD CURRY** had an impressive rookie campaign. He missed some of the preseason due to an injury, but once he cracked the starting lineup four games into the season, Curry never looked back. In addition to earning



BIG EAST All-Rookie Team honors, he finished third on the team in scoring, averaging 11.9 points per game. As a rookie point guard, he demonstrated impressive poise, leading the team in assists (95). Curry is an exceptional athlete. He has the ability to penetrate and hit mid-range jump shots.

Another sophomore who played significant minutes last season is **WEYINMI EFEJUKU**. Efejuku is a very athletic guard, who can create offense with his size, strength and skill. He started 12 of 27 games during his freshman season, averaging 7.8 points and 2.4 rebounds per game. At 6-feet-5-inches tall, Efejuku provides a big body in the backcourt.

Freshmen **JAMAL BARNEY**, **BRIAN MCKENZIE** and **DWAIN WILLIAMS** will need to contribute this season. Barney, a 6-foot-3-inch, 185-pound combo guard attended Southwestern High School in Baltimore,

Md. In 2005 and 2006, he earned First Team All-Metro honors. As a senior, Barney averaged 27.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and 5.2 assists per game, while leading Southwestern to the regional 4A North title. He set a school record for most points in a game when he registered 58. Barney is a rangy combo guard, who has put up great numbers. He can shoot and is very athletic. McKenzie, a 6-foot-4-inch, 190-pound shooting guard attended Xaverian High School. As a senior he averaged 18 points, 8.0 rebounds and 5.0 assists. In 2005, he helped his squad capture the New York City Catholic League title and advance to the New York State Federation title game after posting a 23-13 mark. As a junior, he averaged 9.7 points per game. McKenzie is an athletic guard who can shoot from the perimeter. He is regarded as one of the top shooters in his class. In addition, he can penetrate and create offense for the team. Williams, a 6-foot, 170-pound guard, was added to the roster at the end of August. He began his high school career with tremendous accolades as he was named freshman player of the year for the state of California after averaging 18.6 points and 4.6 assists per game. He continued to put up impressive numbers throughout high school, averaging more than 27 points and four assists each season. In his senior year, Williams registered 28.6 ppg and 5.6 apg. He was named first team all-state all four seasons he competed in high school. As he demonstrated in high school, Williams has the ability to score. He can hurt opposing defenses from inside or outside. He also can play both guard positions.

Although not eligible to compete in games this season for the Friars after transferring from Manhattan, **JEFF XAVIER** should add a presence to the team and his competitiveness at practice will be important to the team's success. Xavier, who will be entering his junior year, played two seasons at Manhattan College from 2004-06. Xavier, a 6-foot-1-inch, 190-pound guard, averaged 16.6 points, 5.9 rebounds, 2.3 steals and 1.9 assists in 31 games for the Jaspers in 2005-06. For his efforts he was named Second Team All-Metro Atlantic Conference and Third Team All-New York City. In each of his two seasons at Manhattan, he led the team in three pointers. As a freshman, Xavier recorded 48 threes and hit a Manhattan single-season record of 77 three pointers as a sophomore.

THE FRONT COURT

Size, depth and experience will be the key components of the Friar frontcourt this season. Head Coach Tim Welsh's roster will feature three players 6-10 or taller. It will mark just the second time in the history of Friar basketball (1986-87) that PC has three players with that much size on the squad. In addition to size, there are five returning players who all have the ability to start and provide leadership.

Five-year player **HERBERT HILL** is an athletic big man who has

the potential to have a breakout season for the Friars. Last year, he averaged 9.0 points, 4.8 rebounds and 1.93 blocks per game, while shooting 58.6 percent from the field (99-196). Hill also posted three double-doubles, including a 20-point, 11-rebound effort in a 61-60 win at DePaul on February 7, 2006. He came on strong at the end of the season, averaging 12.5 points and 5.4 rebounds over the squad's final 12 games. Hill concluded the season ranked seventh in the BIG EAST in blocks. The 6-foot-10-inch, 240-pound forward earned the team's Marvin Barnes Defensive Player of the Year Award after leading the team in blocks with 52.

Similar to Hill, junior **RANDALL HANKE** continues to get bigger and better. The 6-foot-11-inch, 240-pound center has added 10 pounds to his frame and some impressive credentials to his biography. He burst onto the college scene with a strong conclusion to his rookie season in 2005 by establishing the Friar all-time single season field goal percentage mark as he shot 72.2 percent (83-115) from the field. In his sophomore campaign, Hanke saw much more action, but continued to score at a prolific pace. He started 20 of 27 games and was 149 of 220 from the field, averaging 13.0 points per game. He scored 20 or more points six times, including a career-high 34-point effort in a win over Northeastern on December 20, 2005. Hanke led the nation in field goal percentage at 67.7 percent. He also averaged 5.0 rebounds and 1.56 blocks per game in 2006. Hanke has excellent hands and runs the floor very well. His soft touch, coupled with his athleticism and long reach make him a difficult player to guard in the low post.

Another upperclassman who will provide valuable leadership to the team in the frontcourt is junior **CHARLES BURCH**. Burch, who started 14 of the team's 27 games last season, shot a team-best 40 percent (16-40) from behind the three-point arc. The 6-foot-7-inch, 225-pound forward has the ability and toughness to help the team in many different areas. In 2006, he averaged 4.8 points per game and 3.1 rebounds. He earned the team's Unsung Hero Award in 2006. It was an honor that truly epitomizes how Burch performs. He always gives a complete effort and will do whatever is necessary to help the team be successful.

Although only a sophomore, **GEOFFREY MCDERMOTT** has given Friar fans plenty of reasons to be optimistic about the 2007 season. McDermott filled a big void in the Friar lineup last season. With the graduation of All-American Ryan Gomes in 2005, one of the questions following the team was its ability to rebound. McDermott stepped up to that challenge last season and answered the call. In addition to earning All-BIG EAST Rookie Team honors, he finished second among freshman in the nation in rebounding, averaging 9.0 boards per game. McDermott also set the Friar freshman record for rebounds (243) and rebounding average (9.0 rpg). He grabbed 10 or more rebounds 12 times in 2006, including three games in which he registered 16 rebounds. Perhaps the most impressive accomplish-

ment by McDermott was the fact that he was able to start every game last season despite being seriously injured for more than half of the season. Prior to the leg injury, he was averaging 11.9 points per game, but his offense dipped after the injury to 8.9 ppg in the final 16 contests. He finished the season with five double-doubles and averaged 8.9 points per game for the season. The 6-foot-7-inch, 240-pound forward is very athletic. One of the top high school quarterbacks in New York his senior year of high school, he came to the Friars with the ability to handle the ball as well as play under the basket. He also can draw the defense away from the basket and hit an outside shot.

Sophomore **JONATHAN KALE** rounds out the returnees to the frontcourt. At 6-feet-8-inches tall and 250 pounds, Kale provides a big body in the low post for the Friars. In his rookie season, he averaged 2.6 points and 2.7 rebounds in 10.9 minutes per game. He registered two double-doubles and recorded a career best game in a win over San Diego State on December 27, 2005 with 15 points and 12 rebounds. Kale has worked hard on developing his shot and his inside game.

It won't take long for opponents to notice the lone newcomer to the Friar frontcourt. Freshman **RAY HALL** is one of the largest players to ever wear a Friar uniform. Hall, a 6-foot-11-inch, 275-pound center, finished his senior season at Mullen High School in Denver, Colo. as runner up for Colorado Player of the Year. Hall averaged 20 points and 12 rebounds and helped lead Mullen to the Class 5A title. In the championship game, Hall scored 14 points and grabbed nine rebounds in a 54-40 win over Cherry Creek. For his efforts, the four-year starter was named Tournament MVP by the *Rocky Mountain News*. Hall also was named First Team All-State by the *Rocky Mountain News* and he earned All-Colorado honors from the *Denver Post*. He is a strong, skilled big man who could help offensively and defensively in the physical battles of a BIG EAST season.

Sophomore **CHRIS BAUDINET** (Watertown, Conn.) enters his second season with the team. He joined the team as walk-on in his freshman season. Baudinet saw action in two games in 2006.

OVERVIEW

The buzz surrounding the Friars in 2006 was that the future looks bright for Providence College. The future has arrived this season as all but graduated Donnie McGrath return to the court for the Friars. Head Coach Tim Welsh's roster features a talented squad that has plenty of experience in BIG EAST action.

Upperclassmen Hebert Hill, Randall Hanke and Charles Burch will provide leadership and stability to the frontcourt. Hill has spent four years in the Friar system and is ready to produce. His athleticism and defense will be important to the Friars' success. The coaching staff will be counting on Hanke's offense. In just two seasons, he

has displayed a unique ability to score against some of the top collegiate talent in the country. Burch is a quiet leader on the team. His maturity and determination will be an asset to the team.

With a season of collegiate experience, sophomore forwards

Geoff McDermott and Jonathan Kale are expected to increase their offensive production this year. Coach Welsh also will be relying on his two burly forwards to provide a strong rebounding presence. McDermott, who is looking forward to entering the season injury free, had a strong rookie season. He was one of the top rebounders in the BIG EAST and the nation last season. Kale is a wide-body who works hard to rebound. He spent a lot of the off season developing his game in the low post.

Two other sophomores who will play significant roles on the team in 2007 are guards Sharaud Curry and Weyinmi Efejuku. Curry returns for his second season looking to continue his development after a strong rookie season. Efejuku also will work on continuing to improve after a solid first year in the BIG EAST. He is a big, athletic guard who can provide matchup problems for opponents.

The Friar coaching staff has once again added quality players to the roster. Transfer Jeff Xavier will not compete in games this season, but he will play an important role

in helping the team improve. The other newcomers, freshmen Ray Hall, Jamal Barney, Brian McKenzie and Dwain Williams also will be important additions to this year's team. Hall adds size and strength to the frontcourt and Barney, McKenzie and Williams will bolster the backcourt.

The Friars have the potential to make the 2006-07 a special year in Friartown. In addition to upgrades to the Dunkin' Donuts Center, there will be a lot to be excited about as the Friars return a talented group of players for another season of BIG EAST action.
