FRIARS IN THE BIG EAST TOURNAMENT... The Friars enter the BIG EAST Tournament as a No. 10 seed. PC finished the season in 10th place in the BIG EAST with an 8-8 record. The Friars will play West Virginia (seventh seed) on Wednesday, March 7 at 7:00 p.m. in the First Round. Providence is 1-4 in its last five BIG EAST Tournament games. The Friars are making their first appearance in the BIG EAST Tournament since 2005 when they were defeated in the First Round by West Virginia. PC did not qualify for the BIG EAST Tournament last season. It is the only time the Friars have not played in the BIG EAST Tournament. The Friars hold an all-time record of 15-25 at the BIG EAST Tournament. PC won its only BIG EAST Tournament title in 1994 when the team defeated Georgetown, 74-64, in the title game.

HILL EARNS ALL-BIG EAST FIRST TEAM HONORS... It was announced on Monday, March 5 that Providence senior Herbert Hill (Kinston, N.C.) was selected to the All-BIG EAST First Team. For Hill it marks the first time he has earned All-BIG EAST honors. He is the eighth Friar all-time to earn First Team accolades. The other seven former Friars on the First Team were Otis Thorpe (1984), Billy Donovan (1987), Eric Murdock (1991), Eric Williams (1995), Austin Croshere (1997), Jamel Thomas (1999) and Ryan Gomes (2004 and 2005).

CURRY AND MCDERMOTT EARN BIG EAST HONORABLE MENTION... Sophomores Sharaud Curry (Gainesville, Ga.) and Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) earned All-BIG EAST Honorable Mention accolades. Curry averaged 16.0 ppg and averaged 4.6 apg. McDermott led the league in assists (5.4 apg). He also averaged 10.0 ppg and 9.3 rpg.

FRIARS DEFEATED AT ST. JOHN'S... SJU's Qa'rraan Calhoun had 21 points to help St. John's snap a 10-game losing streak to Providence with a 77-64 win on March 4 in the Friars' regular-season finale at Madison Square Garden. Anthony Mason added 17 points for the Red Storm (16-14, 7-9 Big East), who had lost their last three games. Herbert Hill (Kinston, N.C.) scored 27 points on 12-of-16 shooting for the Friars (18-11, 8-8). For Hill, it marked his third consecutive game with 27 or more points. Dwain Williams (Murrieta, Calif.) added 12 points and Sharaud Curry (Gainesville, Ga.) had 10. A three-point play by Hill gave the Friars their last lead of the game, 18-17, at 9:22 of the first half. St. John's went on a 21-14 run the rest of the half behind Mason's eight points, which included a pair of 3-pointers, for a 38-32 lead at the break. Calhoun closed a 15-5 run to start the second half with a 3-pointer, increasing the Red Storms' lead to 53-37 at 14:05. Eugene Lawrence and Mason added 3-pointers in the run.

FRIARS 2-1 ALL-TIME VERSUS WEST VIRGINIA AT BIG EAST TOURNEY... The Friars have posted a 2-1 mark all-time versus the Mountaineers in BIG EAST Tourney action. The Friars' most recent win in the BIG EAST Tournament was a 73-50 victory over West Virginia in a First Round game in 2003. PC's other win over West Virginia at the BIG EAST Tournament was a 76-69 victory in 1997. PC's only loss to the Mountaineers in the BIG EAST Tournament was an 82-59 defeat in the First Round in 2005.

FRIARS VERSUS WEST VIRGINIA... On Wednesday, the Friars will play West Virginia at Madison Square Garden in New York. The Friars and the Mountaineers have met 20 times in the all-time series, with PC leading, 11-9. PC has posted a 7-2 mark all-time at home against WVU, a 1-6 record at West Virginia and a 3-1 record on neutral courts against the Mountaineers. The two teams first met on March 8, 1965 in the NCAA Tournament at the Palestra in Philadelphia when the Friars earned a 91-67 win against West Virginia. In the last game between the two teams, the Friars defeated WVU, 64-61, on February 20, 2007 in Providence. In the Mountaineers' most recent win over PC, WVU defeated the Friars, 64-48, on January 17, 2006 at Morgantown.

SCOUTING THE MOUNTAINEERS... The West Virginia Mountaineers enter Wednesday's game with a 21-8 mark and a 9-7 record in BIG EAST action. In their most recent game, the Mountaineers defeated Cincinnati, 79-65, on March 3. The Mountaineers are led by senior forward Frank Young. He is averaging a team-best 13.7 points per game. Sophomore forward Joe Alexander leads the team in rebounding (4.7 rpg).

HILL AND McDERMOTT EARN NABC ALL-DISTRICT 1 HONORS... Providence College senior forward/center Herbert Hill (Kinston, N.C.) was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-District 1 First Team and sophomore forward Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) earned Second Team honors on Wednesday, February 28. It marks the first time Hill or McDermott has earned NABC honors and the first time a Friar has been named to the First Team since Ryan Gomes earned the accolade in 2005. The last time PC had two players earn NABC All-District honors in the same season was 2001 when Erron Maxey and John Linehan were each named to the second team. Thirty five former Friars have been named to the NABC All-District 1 First Team.

HILL FINISHES REGULAR SEASON AS THIRD FRIAR ALL-TIME TO LEAD THE BIG EAST IN SCORING... Senior center Herbert Hill finished the regular season as the BIG EAST

scoring leader, averaging 19.9 ppg in league action. Hill is just the third Friar ever to finish the season as the scoring leader in the BIG EAST. The other Friars to accomplish the feat were Eric Murdock (27.2 ppg, 1991) and Ryan Gomes (23.2 ppg, 2005). Hill ranks second in the BIG EAST in scoring in overall action, averaging 18.0 ppg.

HILL ONE OF THE LEAGUE'S MOST IMPROVED PLAYERS... Senior Herbert Hill (Kinston, N.C.) is one of the BIG EAST's most improved players this season. Hill is one of the top scorers and rebounders in the BIG EAST this season.

250 REBOUNDS, 150 ASSISTS... Sophomore Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) is the first player in Friar history to record more than 250 rebounds and more than 150 assists in the same season. This season, he has recorded 156 assists and 269 rebounds in 29 games. Only eight other Friars have recorded 100 or more rebounds and 100 or more assists in the same season.

FIRST NON-GUARD TO LEAD BIG EAST IN ASSISTS... Sophomore forward Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) leads the BIG EAST in assists in overall action at 5.4 apg. He is trying to become the first player, who is not a guard, to lead the BIG EAST in assists.

HILL RANKS FOURTH ALL-TIME IN BLOCKS... Senior Herbert Hill (Kinston, N.C.) has registered 184 blocks in four seasons with the Friars. Hill ranks tied for fourth all-time at Providence. This season, he has recorded a career-high 86 blocks. He is averaging 2.97 blocks per game this season.

FRIARS 16-3 AT HOME... With the team's 64-61 win over West Virginia on February 20, the Friars earned their 16th win of the season at home. PC finished the regular season with a 16-3 mark at home. The 16 wins marks the most victories by the Friars at home since the 1990-91 team registered a 17-3 record. The 16 wins is tied for the fifth highest win total all-time by a Friar team at the Dunkin' Donuts Center.

FRIARS REGISTER MOST OVERALL AND BIG EAST WINS SINCE 2004... With the Friars' win over South Florida on February 28, PC registered its eighth BIG EAST win of the season. It is the most league wins the Friars have posted since the team registered an 11-5 record in 2004. PC also has earned 18 overall victories which is the most since the 2004 team posted a 20-9 record. The 18 wins also is tied for the third highest win total in the Tim Welsh's nine seasons as a head coach at Providence.

FRIARS FEATURE A YOUNG LINEUP... For the second consecutive season the Friars feature a youthful lineup with only one senior. Last season, Donnie McGrath was the lone senior. This season, starting center Herbert Hill (Kinston, N.C.) is the only senior in the lineup. Four of the Friars' five starters are sophomores. Junior Charles Burch (Dorchester, Mass.) is the only other upperclassman in the lineup. Junior Randall Hanke (New York, N.Y.) is using this season as a redshirt year and will rejoin the lineup in 2007-08. The Friar roster also features four freshmen, Dwain Williams (Murrieta, Calif.), Jamal Barney (Baltimore, Md.), Brian McKenzie (Brooklyn, N.Y.)

and Ray Hall (Denver, Colo.) who all see action.

FRIARS QUALIFY FOR BIG EAST TOURNAMENT... With the Friars' win over West Virginia on February 20, PC recorded its seventh win in BIG EAST action. By earning their seventh win in conference action, the Friars clinched a berth in the BIG EAST Tournament. PC, which did not qualify for the BIG EAST Tournament last season, will be making its first trip to conference tournament since 2005.

EFEJUKU MAKES A DIFFERENCE... Sophomore Weynmi Efejuku (Fresh Meadows, N.Y.) has made a difference in the Friar lineup this season. Providence has posted a 15-1 mark this season when he scores 13 or more points in a game.

FRIARS PLAYED 600TH GAME AT DUNKIN'... The Friars' game versus Syracuse on February 24 was the team's 600th game all-time at the Dunkin' Donuts Center. The team's all-time record at the Dunkin' Donuts Center is 427-173 (.712). PC is currently in its 35th season playing in the Dunkin' Donuts Center.

HILL AVERAGES 27.5 PPG AND 11.0 RPG-NAMED BIG EAST PLAYER OF THE WEEK... Senior Herbert Hill (Kinston, N.C.) averaged 27.5 points, 11.0 rebounds and 6.0 blocks in the Friars' last two games. For his efforts, he was named BIG EAST Player of the Week on Sunday, March 4. It marks the second time this season he has been named Player of the Week. He also shot 66.7 percent (24-36) from the field. On February 28, he scored 28 points, grabbed 16 rebounds and made six blocks in PC's win at South Florida. On March 4, Hill scored 27 points, recorded six rebounds and six blocks in a loss at St. John's. He has scored 20 or more points in 11 games this season and has recorded 12 double-doubles. Hill leads the league in scoring in conference action, averaging 19.9 ppg. He also ranks second in rebounding, as he is averaging 9.8 boards per game in league action.

FRIARS 3-3 VERSUS RANKED TEAMS... The Friars earned their third win of the season over a ranked squad when they posted a 64-61 victory against No. 22 West Virginia on February 20. It was the Friars' sixth game of the season versus a ranked squad (3-3). It also was the Friars' 294th game all-time versus a ranked team. PC is now 93-201 all-time versus ranked squads, including a 3-3 mark this season. The last time PC had three wins over ranked teams was in 2003-04 when it posted a 3-2 record versus top-25 squads. On February 10, Providence was defeated at No. 7 Pittsburgh. On February 3, the Friars were defeated at No. 14 Marquette, 69-62. On January 4, PC defeated 15th-ranked Marquette, 74-59. The Friars' other win against a ranked opponent was a 73-64 victory over 23rd-ranked Boston College on November 22, 2006. In PC's first loss against a ranked team this season, the Friars were defeated at No. 7 Florida on December 6, 2006.

FRIARS TOUGH ON THE BOARDS... The Friars, one of the top rebounding teams in the BIG EAST, have outrebounded 22 of their 29 opponents. PC is averaging 37.8 rebounds per game this season and hold a +7.0 rebounding margin.

HILL KEEPS ROLLING IN THE BIG EAST... Senior Herbert Hill (Kinston, N.C.) has been impressive in BIG EAST action this season. Through 16 league games, he averaged 19.9 points, 9.8 rebounds and 3.3 blocks per game. In league action, he leads the BIG EAST in scoring and ranks second in rebounding. On March 4, he registered 27 points and six rebounds and six blocks in a loss to St. John's. He has 11 double-doubles this season.

FRIARS SHOOT OVER 50 PERCENT IN WIN AT USF... The Friars shot 54.5 percent (30-55) in a 77-72 win at South Florida on February 28. For the Friars, it marked the 14th time the team has shot over 50 percent this season. PC has posted a 12-2 record this season when it shoots over 50 percent from the field. The Friars have one of the top field goal percentages in the nation. PC has made 787 of 1,619 attempts (48.6 percent) this season.

MCDERMOTT GRABS 14 REBOUNDS VERSUS SYRACUSE... Sophomore Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) grabbed 14 rebounds in a loss to Syracuse on February 24. He recorded 15 rebounds versus Seton Hall on January 6. For McDermott it was his third game this season with 15 or more rebounds. He recorded 16 rebounds versus No. 23 Boston College on November 22. He registered a career-high 17 rebounds in the team's win over Holy Cross on December 19. He has recorded 13 or more rebounds in a game 11 times in two seasons at Providence. In 56 career games, McDermott has recorded 10 or more rebounds 24 times. McDermott, who was second in the nation in rebounding amongst freshmen last year, averaged 9.0 rebounds per game as a freshman.

CURRY SECOND ON TEAM IN SCORING... Sophomore Sharaud Curry (Gainesville, Ga.), who is second on the team in scoring (16.0 ppg), recorded 17 points in the Friars' win at USF on February 28. On February 10, he scored 20 points in a loss at Pittsburgh. It was the fourth time he scored 20 or more points in a game this season. He scored a game-high 24 points in a win over Cincinnati on February 6. On December 22, Curry registered 22 points in Friars' win over Harvard. On November 26, he scored a career-high 27 points in a win over George Washington. Last season, he averaged 11.9 ppg.

BALANCED SCORING... The Friars are averaging 75.9 points per game this season. The team ranks second in BIG EAST in scoring. PC has had four or more players score in double figures in 17 of the team's 29 games, including four games in which five players scored in double figures and two games with six players in double figures. Currently, four players are averaging 10 or more points per game this season for PC -- Sharaud Curry (16.0 ppg), Weyinmi Efejuku (13.4 ppg), Herbert Hill (18.0 ppg) and Geoff McDermott (10.0 ppg).

BURCH MISSES 12TH GAME... Friar junior forward Charles Burch (Dorchester, Mass.) missed his 12th consecutive game when he sat out the game at St. John's on March 4 due to an injury.

SOPHOMORES LEAD OFFENSE... PC's sophomore class of Sharaud Curry (Gainesville, Ga.), Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.), Weyinmi Efejuku (Fresh Meadows, N.Y.) and Jonathan Kale (Mattapan, Mass.) are four of the team's top six scorers. They have accounted for 1,285 of the team's 2,200 points this season (58.4 percent).

THREE FRIARS RANK HIGH IN THE LEAGUE... Senior Herbert Hill (Kinston, N.C.), sophomore Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) and sophomore Sharaud Curry (Gainesville, Ga.) each ranks high in the BIG EAST in at least one category. Hill ranks second in the conference in field goal percentage at 63.4 percent (210-331). McDermott ranks fourth in the league in rebounding, averaging 9.4 boards per game and first in assists (5.3 apg). Curry ranks second in the league in free-throw percentage (89.7 percent) and fifth in assists (4.6 apg).

MCDERMOTT ASSISTS FRIARS... Sophomore Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.), who was a star quarterback of the New Rochelle High School football team, is accustomed to distributing the ball. In addition to being a rugged power forward who leads the team and ranks near the top of the BIG EAST in rebounding (9.4 rpg), he also ranks first in the league in assists. He is averaging 5.3 assists per game. On January 4, McDermott added a career-high 11 assists in PC's win over Marquette. He has 149 assists for the season, including at least three in 26 of PC's 28 games.

KALE PRODUCTIVE FOR FRIARS... Sophomore Jon Kale (Mattapan, Mass.), who has started the Friars' last 15 games, recorded 10 points and six rebounds in the team's win at USF on February 28. On February 15, he scored 17 points at Notre Dame. On January 27, he scored 10 points and grabbed nine rebounds against UConn on January 27. On January 20, he scored 13 points versus Rutgers. He made his first career start in the Friars' win over Marquette on January 4. In the win, he registered nine points and three rebounds. On January 2, he scored a career-high 18 points and grabbed eight rebounds in 21 minutes of action against Longwood on January 2. On December 2, he added his first double-double of the season with 13 points and 11 rebounds in the team's win over Rhode Island. He is averaging 7.2 points and 4.2 rebounds per game.

EFEJUKU SCORES 24 VERSUS WEST VIRGINIA... Sophomore guard Weyinmi Efejuku (Fresh Meadows, N.Y.) recorded a game-high 24 points and added seven rebounds in the Friars' win over West Virginia on February 20. He has recorded seven games with 20 or more points this season. Efejuku registered 22 points in the Friars' win over St. John's on February 17. He had 24 points and eight rebounds in PC's win over Seton Hall on January 6. He recorded his first career double-double with 18 points and 10 rebounds in a win over Marquette on January 4. He ranks third on the team in scoring, averaging 13.4 ppg. He scored 21 points and recorded six rebounds in a win over Holy Cross on December 19. On December 22, Efejuku scored a career-high 26 points and registered four rebounds in a win over Harvard.

MCDERMOTT ADDS 10 ASSISTS AT MARQUETTE... Sophomore Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.), who leads the BIG EAST in assists (5.3 apg), registered 10 assists in the team's loss at Marquette on February 3. It was the third game this season that he recorded 10 or more assists. In the Friars' previous game, he recorded seven assists in the Friars' 84-72 win over Connecticut on January 27.

CURRY RECORDS DOUBLE-DOUBLE... Sophomore point guard Sharaud Curry (Gainesville, Ga.) registered his second double-double of the season with 12 points and 10 assists in an 84-72 win over UConn on January 27. It also was the second time this season that he has recorded 10 or more assists in a game as he had a career-high 12 versus Rhode Island on December 2. Curry ranks second on the team in assists, averaging 4.6 assists per game.

SIX PLAYERS SCORE IN DOUBLE FIGURES... In the Friars' 84-72 win over UConn on January 27, six Friars scored in double figures. It is the second time this season that PC has had six players score in double figures. In the win over UConn, senior Herbert Hill (19 points), sophomore Weyinmi Efejuku (19 points), sophomore Sharaud Curry (12 points), freshman Brian

McKenzie (11 points), sophomore Jonathan Kale (10 points) and sophomore Geoff McDermott (10 points) all scored in double figures.

MCDERMOTT DOUBLES UP... Sophomore Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) recorded 11 points and grabbed 14 rebounds in PC's loss at Louisville on January 13. For McDermott, it was his 10th double-double of the season. He has registered one triple-double this season versus Harvard on December 22.

CURRY RETURNS TO THE LINEUP... Sophomore guard Sharaud Curry (Gainesville, Ga.) did not play in the Friars' games versus Florida State on December 29, Longwood on January 2, Marquette on January 4 and Seton Hall on January 6. Curry was suspended for a violation of team rules. He returned to the lineup on January 13 at Louisville. Curry scored 13 points and grabbed seven rebounds in his first game back in the Friar lineup.

WILLIAMS SCORES 18 POINTS VERSUS VILLANOVA... Freshman Dwain Williams (Murrieta, Calif.) came off the bench to score 18 points in a loss to Villanova on January 23. Williams started four games for the Friars while Sharaud Curry served a four-game suspension. In those four games, he averaged 12.0 points and 4.25 assists. He made his first career start in the Friars' loss to Florida State on December 29. He scored 15 points and was 8-10 from the free-throw line. On December 4, he came off the bench to score a career-high 19 points in the Friars' 67-50 win over Fairfield. The freshman guard was 5-6 from three-point territory in 26 minutes of action. The freshman guard has played in 23 of the team's 29 games this season and is averaging 6.8 points per game.

CURRY SECOND IN ASSISTS... Sophomore Sharaud Curry (Gainesville, Ga.) ranks second on the team in assists this season with 115 (4.6 apg). On January 27, he registered 10 assists in a win at UConn. On December 22, he recorded eight assists in a win over Harvard. On December 4, he registered nine assists in a 67-50 win over Fairfield on December 4. In the previous game, he recorded 12 assists in the Friars' 95-66 win over Rhode Island on December 2. It marked the first time that a Friar recorded 10 or more assists in a game since Donnie McGrath registered 10 versus Pennsylvania on December 30, 2002.

HILL NAMED BIG EAST PLAYER OF THE WEEK ON JANUARY 8... Senior Herbert Hill (Kinston, N.C.) helped lead the Friars to a 3-0 week on January 2-6, he averaged 21.7 ppg, 10.3 rpg and 5.7 bpg. He shot 61.9 percent (26-42) from the field. For his efforts, he was named the BIG EAST Player of the Week. He scored 17 points and grabbed 13 rebounds in PC's 107-69 win over Longwood on January 2. On January 4, Hill led the Friars to a 74-59 upset of 15th-ranked Marquette. He had 23 points and nine rebounds in the victory. Hill also recorded seven blocks. On January 6, Hill led the Friars to their second BIG EAST win of the week as they defeated Seton Hall, 91-69. He registered a game-high 25 points. He also recorded nine rebounds and four blocks.

MCDERMOTT RECORDS A TRIPLE-DOUBLE... Sophomore forward Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) recorded an impressive two games on December 19 and December 22 as he nearly averaged a triple-double in the Friars' two wins and did record a triple double in one of the victories. In the two games, he averaged 11.5 points, 14 rebounds, 8.5 assists and 2.5 blocks. For his efforts, he was named BIG EAST Player of the Week. On December 19,

McDermott scored 11 points, grabbed a career-high 17 rebounds, registered seven assists and made three blocks in a victory over Holy Cross. FRIARS WIN THIRD STRAIGHT AT UCONN... On January 27, Providence earned an 84-72 win over UConn at Hartford. For the Friars, it marked their third straight road win over the Huskies. In addition to the Friars win on January 27, PC also defeated the Huskies at Gampel Pavilion (76-70) on March 5, 2003 and registered a 66-56 win against the Huskies at Hartford on January 24, 2004. It is the first time the Friars ever have won three consecutive road games against UConn.

FRIARS CONCLUDE NON-CONFERENCE SEASON... The Friars concluded their non-conference season with a 107-69 win over Longwood on January 2. PC finished with a 10-3 mark in non-conference play.

HANKE RETURNS... Providence College junior forward Randall Hanke (New York, N.Y.) returned to the men's basketball team on January 6. He is practicing with the team, but he will not compete in any games. If he does not play in any games this season, he will have two years of eligibility remaining. Hanke played in 27 games in 2005-06 and averaged 13.0 points per game and 5.0 rebounds per game, while averaging 21.6 minutes per game. As a sophomore, he led the nation in field goal percentage (67.7 percent).

HILL SEEING 20/20... Senior forward Herbert Hill (Kinston, N.C.) accomplished an impressive feat in the PC's win over George Washington when he scored 20 points and grabbed 20 rebounds on November 26. It marked the 31st time that a PC player posted a 20-20 game and the first time since Marvin Barnes scored 37 points and recorded 23 rebounds versus Brown on March 4, 1974. Hill is just the sixth Friar all-time to register a 20-20 game.

FRIARS SCORE 107 POINTS... Providence College scored 107 points in the team's win over Longwood on January 2. For the Friars, it marked the most points they scored in a game since a 120-60 win over American-Puerto Rico on November 27, 1999. It also was the squad's second game with 100 or more points this season and 70th time in the history of Friar basketball that the squad scored in triple digits.

HEAD COACH TIM WELSH EARNS 200TH WIN... Friar Head Coach Tim Welsh reached a milestone in his coaching career as he earned his 200th career victory as the Friars defeated George Washington, 86-67, on November 26. Currently, his record is 215-147 (.593) over 12 seasons as a head coach. He has coached for nine seasons at Providence and he has posted a 145-125 mark with the Friars. Prior to coming to Providence, Welsh was the head coach at Iona College where he recorded a 70-22 mark. In his 12 seasons as a head coach, he has guided three teams to the NCAA Tournament - his 1998 Iona team and his 2001 and 2004 Providence squads.

FRIARS HONOR GAVITT AND MULLANEY... On January 6, the Friars honored former Head Coach Dave Gavitt by naming the floor the Dave Gavitt Court. PC also hung banners to honor Gavitt and PC's all-time winningest coach Joe Mullaney.

PROVIDENCE ALL-TIME... In 80 seasons of basketball, the Friars have posted a 1,240-806 mark (.606). The team's all-time record at the Dunkin' Donuts Center is 427-173 (.712). In 2006-07, Providence has registered a 16-3 mark at the Dunkin' Donuts Center.

FRIARS PICKED 10TH IN BIG EAST PRE-SEASON RANKINGS... Providence was picked to finish 10th out of the 16 schools in the BIG EAST Preseason Coaches' Poll released on Wednesday, October 25 at the BIG EAST Media Day at Madison Square Garden in New York. Pittsburgh was picked to finish first, followed by Georgetown, Syracuse, Marquette and Connecticut.

LAST SEASON... In 2005-06, PC posted a 12-15 record overall. In 16 BIG EAST games in 2005-06, the Friars registered a 5-11 record and finished tied for 13th in the BIG EAST.

FRIARS ON THE RADIO... All the Friar action this season can be heard on 99.7 FM WSKO with John Rooke and former Friar Joe Hassett calling all the action. It marks the 18th season the two have teamed up to broadcast Friar basketball. This is the third season that the Friars can be heard on 99.7 FM WSKO.

PROVIDENCE COMPETES WITH THE BIG BOYS... Providence College, which has an enrollment of 3,912 students, is the smallest Division I school competing in one of the six major conferences (ACC, BIG 12, BIG EAST, PAC-10, BIG 10 and the SEC). In fact, of schools that compete in those six conferences only Seton Hall (9,600), Northwestern (7,700), Vanderbilt (6,319), Villanova (6,295) and Wake Forest (4,263) have enrollments under 10,000.

TIM WELSH COACH'S SHOW... The Tim Welsh Coach's Show on WJAR-TV 10 airs every Sunday night at 11:15 p.m. The show is hosted by WJAR's Frank Carpano.

RENOVATIONS TO THE DUNK'... In the spring of 2006, renovations began on the Dunkin' Donuts Center that are due to be completed in 2008. The \$62 million project enhances almost every aspect of the arena and will include luxury boxes, new seats, a new video scoreboard, a new sound system, new concessions stands, new lockerrooms, and a new weight training and fitness area. The most notable part of the renovations occurred over the summer when the new video scoreboard was installed.

PROVIDENCE TO HOST NCAA TOURNAMENT IN 2010... It was announced on July 6 by the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee that the Dunkin' Donuts Center - Providence will serve as one of the sites for the First and Second Rounds of the 2010 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament. Providence College will serve as the host institution for the First and Second Rounds which will be played on March 18-21, 2010 at the Dunkin' Donuts Center - Providence. It will mark the first time the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament has been held at the Dunkin' Donuts Center since 1996.

2006-07 PROVIDENCE COLLEGE BASKETBALL - Tim Welsh



In his 12 seasons as a collegiate head coach, Tim Welsh's squads have produced an impressive 215-147 mark (.594). Since his hiring at Providence in 1998, Welsh has led the Friars to a 145-125 record, which includes two NCAA and two NIT appearances. With his 145 wins as a Friar head coach, Welsh ranks fourth all-time at Providence behind coaching legends Joe Mullaney (18 seasons - 319 victories), Dave Gavitt (10 seasons - 209 victories) and Al McClellan (11 seasons - 147 victories).

Over the past two seasons, the Friars have played some of the toughest teams in nation. In fact, the Friars' schedule was ranked as the 12th toughest in 2005 and the 19th most difficult in

2006. In 2006, Welsh's starting five featured two freshmen, two sophomores and a senior. The two freshmen, Sharaud Curry and Geoff McDermott, earned BIG EAST All-Rookie team honors and McDermott was one of the top rebounders in the nation.

His 2005 team played nine games against ranked opponents and 16 games versus teams that qualified for the 2005 NCAA Tournament. PC recorded a 14-17 mark, which included a 3-1 record and a third-place finish in the Preseason NIT. Welsh's top player, senior All-American Ryan Gomes, became the College's all-time leading scorer (2,138 points) and the first Friar ever to earn consecutive First Team All-BIG EAST honors. He also became just the second Friar ever to lead the league in scoring (23.2 ppg).

Welsh's goal to build the Friars into one of the top basketball programs in the country came closer to fruition in 2004 as he led the team to one of its most productive seasons in 30 years. The Friars recorded their second 20-win season under Welsh and also made their second trip to the NCAA Tournament under his tutelage. Providence earned its highest seed ever in the NCAA Tournament as the team was picked as a five seed. In BIG EAST action, the squad also had a monumental season tying the team record for league wins with an 11-5 mark and finishing in third place in the conference standings. The Friars recorded a 3-2 mark over ranked teams and a 4-2 record against teams that reached the 2004 NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen. The team achieved two significant firsts in 2004 when it defeated fourth-ranked and eventual national champion Connecticut, 66-56, in Hartford on January 24, 2004 to post the Friars' first win ever on the road over a top-four team and when it defeated 18th-ranked Syracuse, 74-61, for its first win ever over a defending national champion. Welsh's squad's success did not go unnoticed in 2004 as the team spent nine weeks in the national polls and climbed as high as 12th in the Associated Press Poll and 13th in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. It marked the highest the Friars had been ranked since 1978.

In 2004, Welsh saw Gomes blossom into one of the top players ever to wear a Friar uniform. Gomes averaged 18.9 points and 9.4 rebounds per game. He earned First Team All-BIG EAST accolades and received nine All-America honors, including Associated Press First Team. Gomes became just the fourth Friar ever to earn Associated Press First Team honors and the first since Marvin Barnes earned the distinction in 1974.

The 2002-03 season was another successful campaign for Welsh as the Friar bench boss. His squad won eight of its last 11 games, including one in the BIG EAST Tournament and two in the NIT, to finish with an 18-14 mark overall. In league play, the Friars finished in third place in the BIG EAST East Division with an 8-8 record.

In 2002, Welsh led a Friar team that was devastated by injuries to a 15-16 mark. His star senior John Linehan had a very impressive season. Under Welsh's guidance, Linehan established the NCAA and BIG EAST career steals records. For his efforts, Linehan earned his second BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year honor, as well as NABC Defensive Player of the Year, ESPN.com Defensive Player of the Year, Second Team All-BIG EAST honors and Honorable Mention All-America accolades.

In 2000-01, Welsh guided the Friars to one of their most successful seasons ever. The squad posted a 21-10 mark and earned its first bid to the NCAA Tournament since 1997. Welsh also guided the team to one of its best seasons ever in BIG EAST competition as the Friars posted a school record 11 BIG EAST wins. The team finished in second place with an 11-5 mark in the BIG EAST East Division.

Another one of Welsh's accomplishments during his highly productive third season as the Friars' bench boss was that he had the team ranked No. 25 in the Associated Press Poll on February 19. It marked the first time the Friars had earned an in-season ranking since January 24, 1989.

One of the reasons for the Friars' in-season ranking was their monumental 103-79 victory over the 12th-ranked Georgetown Hoyas on February 10 at the Dunkin' Donuts Center. Welsh's Friars became the first team to score

100 or more points against Georgetown in a BIG EAST game. Also, the 24-point Friar win was the largest deficit ever for the Hoyas in a BIG EAST loss.

The 2000-01 season also was significant for Welsh as he earned his 100th career coaching victory. On November 29, 2000, Providence defeated Florida International, 74-55, at the Dunkin' Donuts Center for Welsh's 100th victory.

Welsh continues to be regarded as one of the game's top recruiters. Welsh and his staff consistently find recruits who will be able to complement an already solid core of players.

Once being named head coach at Providence, it did not take long before Welsh found success in the Ocean State. His first Friar squad posted a 16-14 mark with a team that featured no regular player over 6-7. The Friars were 9-9 on the year in the BIG EAST including five league road wins. Early in the season, PC knocked off four Top-25 teams in a row (Rhode Island, Pittsburgh, Purdue and Syracuse) on the way to the Friars' first post-season appearance since 1997.

The Tim Welsh Era at Providence College officially began on April 2, 1998 when the Massena, New York native was named the 13th head basketball coach in the school's storied basketball history. The announcement was made by former Providence College President Reverend Philip A. Smith.

In making the appointment, Father Smith said, "We sought the opinions of some of the most knowledgeable people in the country about college basketball and coaching talent. Specifically, we wanted a coach capable of sustaining the rich tradition of Providence College basketball and, equally important, an outstanding person who would fully embrace the College's educational philosophy. Tim Welsh was at the top of everyone's list."

Welsh has brought stability to the Friar basketball program. Following a highly successful season in 2000-01, he signed a seven-year contract extension, which ensured that Welsh will be leading the Friars through the 2007-08 season. After his success in 2004, his contract again was extended through the 2009 season.

In the spring of 2001, Welsh expressed his excitement about his future with the Friars. "The administration has stepped up and made a statement to support the program. I love it here. My roots are here, I agree with the mission of the college and I enjoy living in Rhode Island. I'm excited about staying at Providence College as the head coach of the basketball program."

Welsh, formerly the head coach at Iona College, came to Providence with the task of revitalizing one of the most successful programs in New England. In his six seasons at the helm, Welsh has brought a high-energy and up-tempo style of play to Providence.

Welsh achieved a great deal of success in just three seasons as the head coach at Iona, leading the Gaels to three consecutive 20-win seasons. During that time, his teams turned in a 70-22 overall mark (76.1%), including a 27-win season in 1997-98. His 1997-98 squad was the first Iona team to advance to the NCAA Tournament since 1985.

During the 1997-98 campaign, Iona recorded just six losses while knocking off two BIG EAST opponents (Providence and Rutgers) and one Atlantic 10 foe (Fordham). The Gaels also put together the nation's longest winning streak - 15 games during the season. In the three-game, MAAC Tournament, Iona led in all three games for all but 11 seconds with the closest game being an 11-point win over Loyola (Md.).

In three years with Welsh calling the shots, Iona advanced to post-season action each year, going to the National Invitation Tournament in 1996 and 1997 and the NCAA Tournament in 1998.

A two-time Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Coach of the Year (1997, 1998), Welsh also received 1996-97 NABC District II Coach of the Year honors and the 1995-96 Peter A. Carlesimo Award as the Metropolitan Area's Division I Coach of the Year.

Welsh served as an interim head coach at Iona for 10 games during the 1994-95 season, replacing his father, Hall of Fame coach Jerry Welsh, who stepped down following that season due to medical reasons. Prior to that, Tim had served as an assistant on his father's staff for four years.

No stranger to the BIG EAST, Tim Welsh served as an assistant coach to Jim Boeheim at Syracuse for three seasons (1988-91). During that time, Syracuse was 82-21, won two BIG EAST Conference Championships, the 1988 Preseason NIT Championship, and made three trips to the NCAA Tournament.

The 45-year old head coach got his start in college coaching at Iona where he served as a volunteer assistant to Pat Kennedy in 1985. Following that season, he became an assistant on Kennedy's staff at Florida State for two years before moving on to Syracuse.

Welsh played his college basketball under his father at Potsdam State. He was a co-captain his senior year and helped his team reach the Final Four in 1984.
