**Scouting The Explorers:** La Salle is 3-1 on the season, after registering a 79-74 win over Morgan State on November 12. Aaric Murray led the Explorers with 20 points and 11 rebounds. La Salle posted an 88-74 win over Prairie View A&M in their Cancun Challenge opener on Thursday, November 18. The Explorers had three players in double-figures, as Jerrell Williams led the way with 21 points and 14 rebounds, Murray added 19 points and Ruben Guillaudeaux picked up 17 points. La Salle defeated Columbia, 82-71, in their season-opener, before falling at No. 17/17 Baylor, 74-64. Murray is the leading scorer, averaging 18.8 points per game, while Guillaudeaux has added 18.3 points per game and Williams is averaging 12.5 points per game. Williams and Murray are the leading rebounders with an 8.5 rebounds per game average.

**Friars vs. La Salle, The Series:** Providence and La Salle have met four times in their history, with the series even at two wins apiece. The Explorers took the first match-up in 1937 in Philadelphia, 47-36. The teams next met at the Boston Garden in 1967, this time PC taking a win, 77-56. They then met in a home-and-home



series, with La Salle taking a 75-73 win in Providence in 1976, then the Friars taking a rematch in Philadelphia, 75-62, in 1977.

**Providence vs. Atlantic-10:** All-time, the Friars are 139-109 (.565) against the Atlantic-10. The majority of those game have been against in-state rival Rhode Island, a series in which Providence holds a 66-54 advantage. The Friars also have played UMass and St. Joseph's (Pa.) 27 times apiece. PC holds a 22-5 series edge against the Minutemen and a 16-10 series lead against the Hawks. The Friars have also met the following A-10 schools (series record, PC wins first): Charlotte (1-0), Dayton (2-5), Duquesne (4-7), Fordham (1-4), George Washington (3-1), La Salle (2-2), Richmond (3-2), St. Bonaventure (11-12), St. Louis (5-1), Temple (2-2) and Xavier (1-2).

**In-Season Tournaments:** The Cancun Challenge marks the fourth-consecutive year that Providence has taken part in an in-season tournament. Last season, the Friars hosted the World Vision Invitational at the Dunkin' Donuts Center, taking the title after scoring wins over Bryant, Bucknell and Mercer. In 2008-09, Providence took part in the 76 Classic in Anaheim, Calif., falling to Baylor and Saint Mary's (Calif.), while defeating Charlotte. The 2007-08 season marks the last time PC played outside the continental United States, as they opened up at the ESPN Puerto Rico Tip Off in San Juan, Puerto Rico. The Friars defeated Temple and Arkansas, before falling to Miami (Fla.). In 57 in-season tournaments (including the Cancun Challenge), Providence has an overall record of 75-53 (.586). The Friars have won 14 in-season tournament championships, while finishing as the runner-up on 11 occasions.

**Last Time Out:** The Friars defeated Prairie View A&M, 78-62, on Saturday, November 20, in the second round of the Cancun Challenge at the Dunkin' Donuts Center. Senior guard Marshon Brooks (Stone Mountain, Ga.) led the Friars with 22 points. It marked his second consecutive 20-point effort as he recorded 22 points versus Morgan State on November 18. Brooks also registered 10 rebounds for his third straight double-double. He was one of three Friars to post a double-double as sophomore forward Bilal Dixon (Jersey City, N.J.) added 14 points and 14 rebounds, while sophomore guard Vincent Council (Brooklyn, N.Y.) scored 13 points and recorded a career-high 10 assists. The Friars dominated on the boards, out rebounding the Panthers, 53-31.

**Friars Start Season 4-0:** With the Friars win over Prairie View A&M on November 18, it gave Providence its fourth consecutive win. It marked the first time the Friars opened the season winning its first four games since the 1994-95 season.

**Providence Looking To Improve To 5-0:** The Friars enter Tuesday's game with La Salle looking to improve to 5-0. The last time the Friars opened a season with five consecutive wins was in 1990-91.

**On-Deck:** Providence continues play in the Cancun Challenge, wrapping-up the tournament in Cancun, Mexico, where they will play La Salle on Tuesday, November 23, at 3:30 p.m. CST, followed by either Wyoming or Missouri on Wednesday, November 24, at 6:00 or 8:30 p.m. CST. Both games will be televised live on the CBS College Sports Network. After the Cancun Challenge, the Friars return home to begin a four-game homestand, starting with Central Connecticut State on Monday, November 29 at 7:00 p.m.

**Scouting The Tigers:** Missouri, 2-0, won its second game of the Cancun Challenge with a 96-58 win over North Florida on November 20. The Tigers were led by Marcus Denmon's 18 points. Laurence Bowers added a double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds. Missouri picked up a home win in its first Cancun Challenge game, downing Western Illinois, 66-61, on November 18. Bowers, Denmon, Phil Pressey and Steve Moore each had nine points for Mizzou. Bowers just missed a double-double after adding 10 rebounds. The game was the season-opener for the Tigers.

**Friars vs. Missouri, The Series:** Providence and Missouri have never met on the basketball court.

**Providence vs. Big 12:** Providence has an all-time record of 4-8 (.333) against members of the Big 12 Conference. The Friars are 2-3 against Texas and 1-2 against Oklahoma State. They won the only match-up with Texas Tech, while they have fallen to Baylor, Kansas State and Oklahoma in the only meetings with those three schools. The most recent match-up with a Big 12 team was the game with Baylor, a 72-56 Bear victory, in Anaheim, Calif., on November 27, 2008.

**Scouting The Cowboys:** Wyoming defeated Western Illinois, 64-55, in its second game of the Cancun Challenge on November 20. Desmar Jackson and Djibril Thiam each scored 13 points for the Cowboys. Wyoming dropped its first game in the Cancun Challenge, 76-60, to North Florida, in Laramie, Wyo. JayDee Luster led the Cowboys, scoring 13 points while playing all 40 minutes. The Cowboys made only one field goal in the final 14 minutes of the contest. It was the second straight loss for Wyoming, as they lost at Northern Colorado, 67-53. The Cowboys won their season-opener, 92-58 over Kean.

**Friars vs. Wyoming, The Series:** Providence and Wyoming have never played in basketball.

**Providence vs. Mountain West:** The Friars are 3-5 against teams in the Mountain West Conference. PC is 2-0 against San Diego State, 1-2 against Utah, 0-1 against UNLV and 0-2 against BYU. The most recent games were in 2004 and 2005, when the Friars had a



home-and-home series with San Diego State. Providence took a 76-67 win on December 31, 2004, in San Diego, Calif. PC also took the rematch, a 80-65 win at the Dunkin' Donuts Center on December 27, 2005.

**Brooks Leads The Friars In Scoring:** Senior guard Marshon Brooks (Stone Mountain, Ga.) leads the Friars in scoring through four games, averaging 18.0 points. Brooks is currently averaging a double-double, as he is adding 10.3 rebounds per game.

**Council Adds A Double-Double:** Sophomore guard Vincent Council (Brooklyn, N.Y.), who earned BIG EAST All-Rookie Team honors last season, registered his first career double-double with 13 points and 10 assists in the Friars' win over Prairie View A&M on November 20. He ranks second on the team in scoring (15.8 ppg). He leads the squad in assists with 24 (6.0 apg). Last season, Council averaged 10.3 points per game and led the team in assists with 141.

**Dixon On The Boards:** Sophomore forward Bilal Dixon (Jersey City, N.J.) leads the Friars in rebounding, averaging 12.8 rebounds in four games. He has grabbed 11 or more rebounds in each of the four games this season. Dixon registered 11 boards in the Friars' season opening win over Dartmouth. He recorded a game-high 14 rebounds in a win over Yale, before grabbing 12 rebounds against Morgan State. He has now registered at least 10 rebounds in nine career games.

**Double-Double Dixon:** Sophomore forward Bilal Dixon (Jersey City, N.J.) registered his seventh career double-double with 14 points and 14 rebounds in the Friars' win over Prairie View on November 20. Dixon, who averaged 8.2 points and 6.2 rebounds per game last season, recorded five double-doubles as a freshmen, including an 11-point, 19-rebound effort versus Seton Hall on March 6, 2010.

**Brooks Career High On The Boards:** Senior forward Marshon Brooks (Stone Mountain, Ga.) recorded a career-high 12 rebounds in the Friars' victory over Yale on November 15. He also registered his first career double-double as he added 15 points. He followed that up with a matching 12 rebounds against Morgan State, while also scoring a game-high 22 points for another double-double. He recorded his third consecutive double-double with 22 points and 10 rebounds in a win over Prairie View A&M. Last season, Brooks finished third on the team in scoring with 14.2 points per game.

**Cranking Up The D:** With Providence holding its first three opponents of the season under 60 points, it marked the first time since 2004 the Friars held three-consecutive opponents under the 60-point mark. The last time PC held three-consecutive opponents to less than 60 points came Feb. 24, 2004. To begin that stretch, the Friars won at Boston College, 61-52, on Feb. 14, beat Miami, 70-57, on Feb. 21 and won at Notre Dame, 73-59, on Feb 24.

**Friars Hot From The Start:** In the season-opener against Dartmouth, Providence finished the game with a 55.9 (33-59) shooting percentage. It marked the highest shooting percentage in a game for Providence since the team won at Northeastern, 76-72, on December 1, 2009. The Friars shot 56.4 (31-55) from the field in the victory.

**Friars Hold Opponent Under 30% Shooting:** In the Friars' win versus Dartmouth, the Big Green shot just 25.4 percent from the floor. It marked the second time in the last eight years that the Friars held an opponent under 30 percent from the field. The last time PC held an opponent under 30 percent was a 65-58 win over Rhode Island on December 4, 2004, as the Rams shot 27.8 percent (20-72).

**Starting From The Start:** When freshman guard Gerard Coleman started in the season-opener against Dartmouth, he became the 16th true freshman to start in their first career game. Coleman's 17 points against the Big Green is the most by a freshman in a season-opening game. The last time it occurred was 2005-06, when Geoff McDermott started in the opener against Vermont. McDermott scored 13 points, while adding nine rebounds and three assists in the 87-77 Friar victory. Council joins McDermott as one of only six Friar true freshmen to start in the season's first game and score in double-figures.

**The Name Game:** This season, the Friars feature one of the more unusual name combinations in the country, as they have student-athletes with the first name Brice and Bryce on the roster. Freshmen Brice Kofane (Yaounde, Cameroon) and Bryce Cotton (Tucson, Ariz.) form the unique combination. The odds of a team (NCAA Divisions I, II, III and NAIA Divisions I and II) featuring such a combination are 1-in-1,277 (1,277 represents the number of teams across the NCAA and NAIA divisions). Amazingly, another team featured the combination last season, as Dakota State, an NAIA institution in Madison, S.D., had Brice Christensen and Bryce Snyder on its roster. The odds are overwhelmingly against two teams having such a combination in the same season, with that number coming in at 1-in-1,629,452.

**Providence College Basketball:** 2010-11 is the 84th season of basketball at Providence College. Since the program started in 1926-27, Providence has posted a 1,290-857 mark, good for a .601 winning percentage. During their first 83 seasons, the Friars have made the NCAA Tournament 15 times and the National Invitation Tournament on 18 occasions.

**BIG EAST Preseason Poll:** Providence was picked 14th in the 2010 BIG EAST Preseason Coaches' Poll. It was announced at the annual



BIG EAST Media Day at Madison Square Garden on Wednesday, October 20. Pittsburgh was picked as the favorite to win the league, securing 12-of-16 first place votes. Syracuse received two first place votes, while Villanova and St. John's each received one. It also was announced at media day that the coaches had selected Georgetown's Austin Freeman as Preseason Player of the Year, while Fab Melo of Syracuse was selected as the Preseason Rookie of the Year. Coaches are not permitted to vote for their own players or teams.

**New Kids On The Block:** The 2010-11 Providence men's basketball team is among the youngest in the country, with 11 newcomers. The Friars are, in fact, the youngest team in the BIG EAST, as Keno Davis' squad has nine players in their first year of eligibility, with nine true freshmen (Ted Bancroft, Gerard Coleman, Bryce Cotton, Dre Evans, Ron Giplaye, Lee Goldsbrough, Brice Kofane, Mike Murray and Tom Niemeier) and two returners who did not exhaust a year of eligibility in their first season at Providence (Kadeem Batts and Xavier Davis). No other BIG EAST team has more than six players who will start the season with all four years of eligibility remaining (Connecticut, Pittsburgh and Syracuse each return six). By contrast, St. John's will return the most experienced squad in the league, as the Red Storm bring in only one freshman to play along side 10 seniors.

**The Slate:** The Providence men's basketball team will play 31 games during the 2010-11 campaign, including 18 BIG EAST Conference games. The non-conference schedule includes traditional match-ups with Rhode Island, Brown and Boston College, while Alabama, North-eastern, Yale and Dartmouth also highlight the schedule. In BIG EAST play, which includes 18 games, the Friars will play USF, Louisville and Rutgers twice in home-and-homes. St. John's, Pittsburgh, Villanova, DePaul, Cincinnati and Notre Dame will also visit the Dunk. The Friars will travel to Syracuse, West Virginia, Georgetown, Connecticut and Marquette. The 2010-11 BIG EAST Men's Basketball Championship will again be held at Madison Square Garden in New York City. The tournament will be held Tuesday through Saturday, March 8-12. All 16 teams in the league qualify for the championship, with the 9-16 seeds playing on the first day, the 5-8 seeds receiving a bye to the second round and the top four seeds receiving a bye to the quarterfinals. The winner earns the conference's automatic bid to the 2011 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship.

**South Of The Border:** The Friars will participate in the Cancun Challenge this season, with two games played at the Dunkin' Donuts Center against Morgan State and Prairie View A&M before the team travels to Cancun, Mexico, where they will take on LaSalle and either Wyoming or Missouri. The games in Cancun will mark the first time in the program's history that Providence will play a regular-season game outside the United States and its territories. Outside of the continental United States, the Friars have twice played in Puerto Rico (2007 and 1999), while they also have traveled to Hawaii on five occasions (1973, 1977, 1982, 1984 and 1991) and made a trip to Alaska for the Top of the World Classic in 1996. The trip to Cancun will be the longest trip of the season for the Friars, measuring just over 1,688 miles from Providence. The next longest trips are both in BIG EAST play: Tampa, Fla., to take on USF (1,144 miles) and Milwaukee, Wis., to play Marquette (844 miles). Overall, the Friars are 73-53 (.579) while playing in in-season tournaments. They have won 14 in-season tournament championships and finished as a runner-up on 11 occasions. Last season, Providence hosted the World Vision Invitational at the Dunkin' Donuts Center. The Friars defeated Bryant (96-53), Bucknell (76-65) and Mercer (79-77) en route to the title.

**Future Friars:** Providence College men's basketball coach Keno Davis announced on November 10, 2010 that student-athletes Kyan Anderson (Crowley, Texas) and Markus Crider (Huber Heights, Ohio) each signed a National Letter of Intent to attend Providence College beginning in September 2011. Anderson, a 5-foot-11-inch, 165-pound point guard attends North Crowley High School in Fort Worth, Texas. Last season, Anderson led North Crowley to a 33-5 mark. During his three seasons at North Crowley, Anderson has helped the team post a 104-12 mark. As a junior, he averaged 21.1 points, 6.2 assists, 4.0 steals and 2.4 rebounds per game. Anderson established a school record by scoring 48 points in a game last season. Following the 2010 season, he was named to the Dallas Morning News All-Area Team and earned Fort Worth Star Telegram's Player of the Year honors. Crider, a 6-foot-6-inch, 205-pound forward attends Wayne High School in Ohio. As a junior, he averaged 15.2 points, 8.3 rebounds, 2.6 assists and 1.8 blocks per game. He led his team to a 20-3 record and the Greater Western Ohio Conference Championship. Crider earned First Team All-GWOCC honors, was an All-Metro Dayton selection and was selected Honorable Mention All-State. Crider, who has a recruiting grade of 90 by ESPN, is a Pre-Season All-Ohio Candidate.

**Friars On The Air:** Providence will have 23 of its 31 games televised during the 2010-11 season, including nine games that will be shown on a national basis. The final two games in the Cancun Challenge will be shown on the CBS College Sports Network, while two BIG EAST showdowns will be shown on ESPN or ESPN2 (at West Virginia and vs. DePaul). Four Friar games will be broadcast on ESPNU (vs. Alabama, at Syracuse, vs. Louisville and at Cincinnati), while another pair will be on ESPN3 (vs. USF and vs. Rutgers). An additional 14 games will be broadcast, including the remaining BIG EAST games as part of the BIG EAST Network, most of which can be seen in the Providence area on Cox Sports. Cox will also show non-conference showdowns with intrastate rival Rhode Island and

Northeastern. In addition to television broadcasts, every Friar men's basketball game, home and away, can be found on the radio in Providence on WEEI 103.7 FM.

**Friar Legends Forever:** Before the Cincinnati game at the Dunkin' Donuts Center on Saturday, February 19, the college will honor teammates Ray Flynn '63 and the late Vinnie Ernst '63, by unveiling banners in the rafters of the Dunk with their names and numbers (14 and 10, respectively). Flynn and Ernst will become the eighth and ninth members of the Friar basketball family to be honored as part of the Friar Legends Forever Tradition, which began in 1996. To earn the honor, the player or coach must have made a significant impact on Friar basketball and he must have received national recognition during his career at Providence. **Bringing Friartown To Every Town:** The 2010-11 Providence College men's basketball team has continued the tradition of community service and involvement. Already this fall, team members have been active in communities throughout Rhode Island. On Tuesday, November 9, Marshon Brooks and Mike Murray visited St. Joseph's School in West Warwick, R.I., as a part of the Providence College All-Stars School Rewards program. The program is geared toward rewarding academic achievement with tickets to Friar men's basketball games. On Thursday, October 28, Dre Evans and Kadeem Batts visited St. Kevin's School in Warwick, R.I. to talk with fifth through eighth grade students. On Thursday, October 7, Ray Hall, Bilal Dixon, Gerard Coleman, Bryce Cotton and Brice Kofane visited Kent Hospital in Warwick, R.I. The student-athletes shadowed doctors and nurses to learn about various aspects of the health care field, while also having the opportunity to meet with patients. On Thursday, September 30, Kofane visited Ashaway Elementary School in Chariho, R.I., to talk with third and fourth graders.

**All-Rookie Teams:** Youth served the Friars well during the 2009-10 campaign, as two Providence players earned all-rookie honors. Vincent Council (Brooklyn, N.Y.) and Bilal Dixon (Jersey City, N.J.) both garnered accolades at the end of the season. Council was named to the 2010 BIG EAST All-Rookie team after placing second amongst BIG EAST freshmen with 10.2 points per game. In conference play, Council ranked first amongst rookies with 5.3 assists and 1.4 steals per contest. His 5.3 assists per game is over 2.3 more than the second-leading freshman and also third best amongst all BIG EAST players. Dixon was named to the *Sporting News* BIG EAST All-Rookie Team. He started 30 of the Friars' 31 games and finished fifth on the team in scoring (8.2 ppg) and second in rebounding (6.2) rebounds per game. Dixon was one of the top freshmen in the BIG EAST Conference this season. He led all freshmen in rebounding (6.9 rpg) and blocked shots (1.72 bpg) in BIG EAST play.

**Scoring The Basketball:** Providence ended the 2009-10 season as one of the top offensive teams in the country. Averaging 82.4 points per game, the Friars offense finished third nationally out of 334 teams in scoring. In BIG EAST Conference play, the team finished second in scoring, averaging 79.6 points per game.

**Hitting The Boards:** The Friars finished the 2009-10 season ranked first in the BIG EAST in both offensive rebounds (17.3) and total rebounds (40.4). In the Friars' 31 games last season, PC out-rebounded opponents, 1253-1180, for a +2.4 advantage. PC recorded at least 40 rebounds in 17 of 31 games in 2009-10. The team's 56 rebounds against Brown were the most by PC since the Friars recorded 57 rebounds against Seton Hall on January 5, 1994. PC also eclipsed the 50-rebound mark in games against Bryant (52), Mercer (55), Vermont (52), Connecticut (53) and Seton Hall (51).

On April 15, 2008, the Keno Davis era began at Providence College. The 36-year-old Davis became the 14th head coach of the College's storied men's basketball program.

"It is an honor to now be a part of Providence College basketball and it is a dream come true for me to be in the BIG EAST," Davis said after being introduced as the new head coach at the College. "I want to make Providence and the entire state of Rhode Island excited about college basketball. I think it's at a tipping point where we can do something special here!"

Davis quickly got to work as he guided the Friars to a 19-14 mark in 2008-09. Although the Friars were picked 12th in the 2009 BIG EAST Preseason Poll, the squad posted a 10-8 record in league play and finished tied for seventh. As he led the team to 19 victories, he established a Providence College record for the most wins by a head coach in his first season. The team's 19 overall wins and 10 BIG EAST victories marked the most by the Friars since the 2004 season. During the regular season, he saw his team earn two victories over top-15 teams, including an 81-73 win over No. 1 ranked Pittsburgh. It marked just the second time that the Friars defeated a No. 1 ranked team and the first time in 33 years. Davis also led the team to a win over DePaul in the second round of the BIG EAST Tournament -- the team's first BIG EAST tourney victory since 2003. He also led the team back to the post-season as the Friars earned an at-large bid to the NIT Tournament.

In 2009-10 Davis' team was one of the top offensive squads in the country, scoring 82.4 points per game and ranking third in the nation in that category.

Davis came to PC after spending the 2007-08 season as the head coach at Drake University. Davis, a 1995 graduate of the University of Iowa, was named the 2008 National Coach of the Year by six organizations, including the Associated Press, the U.S. Basketball Writers Association and The Sporting News.

In making the appointment, Providence College President Reverend Brian Shanley, O.P. said, "We are very excited to have Keno Davis leading our men's basketball program. We were looking for someone who could inspire and I believe he will. Keno talked to us about developing the right kind of character in his players and as a priest and a teacher, the thing I care about most with respect to athletics is not winning, but it's building character. I believe that we have a coach who will build the character of our student-athletes. And, oh yes, he will win!"

In his first season as a head coach, Davis led the Drake Bulldogs to a 28-5 mark, which included a 15-3 record in the Missouri Valley Conference. His team captured its first MVC regular season title since 1971 and its first ever MVC Tournament title. Drake became the first MVC school to win both the regular season and league tournament titles since 2002. For his efforts, he was named the Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year. The Bulldogs also made their first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 1971. Drake was defeated in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament by Western Kentucky, 101-99, in overtime.

During the 2008 season, Drake was nationally ranked for a school-record eight consecutive weeks. The Bulldogs finished ranked 14th in the Associated Press Poll and 23rd in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. Davis had all this success in his first season after inheriting a team that was 17-15 in 2007 and lost four starters to graduation. His 2008 squad was picked to finish ninth in the MVC.

"I believe Keno Davis has the knowledge, passion, commitment and ability to bring Providence College basketball to another level," Providence College Athletics Director Bob Driscoll said. "Throughout his career he has demonstrated that he is an excellent leader and teacher. From the first moment I met Keno, I was impressed with his competitive nature and his desire to return Friar basketball to national prominence. His hiring is one of the many steps we have taken to improve the Friar men's basketball program."

Prior to being selected as the head coach at Drake, Davis served as an assistant under his father, Dr. Tom Davis, at Drake from 2003-07. He began his coaching career in 1995 as an assistant under Bruce Pearl at Southern Indiana. He left Southern Indiana in 1997 and took an assistant position under Gary Garner at Southeast Missouri State. He was at Southeast Missouri State for six seasons.

Although he never lived in Rhode Island prior to becoming the Friars' head coach, Davis was no stranger to New England. In fact, he spent much of his childhood just one hour from the Ocean State as he lived on Commonwealth Avenue in Newton, Massachusetts adjacent to the Boston College campus. Davis' father, Tom, served as the head coach of the Eagles from 1977-82. While living in Massachusetts, Keno Davis grew to love New England and appreciate college basketball. He also saw the early days of the BIG EAST and has watched closely as the league has become a basketball powerhouse.

Keno Davis was exposed to basketball at a very young age as he watched his father as a head coach. Dr. Tom Davis is one of the winningest coaches all-time in the NCAA. In 32 seasons as a head coach at Lafayette (1971-77), Boston College (1977-82), Stanford (1982-86), Iowa (1986-99) and Drake (2003-07), he registered a 598-355 mark (.628), which included 18 post-season appearances and 16 20-win seasons. He also was named the 1987 Associated Press National Coach of the Year. When Keno earned the same honor in 2007, it marked the first time ever that a father and son duo had captured the national coach of the year honor.

Keno Davis has written two books on basketball, "Pressure Defense," which was published in 1994, and "Camp Success," published in 2004.

Davis and wife, Krista, have one son, Brady, who was born in 2007 and they have one daughter, Mara, who was born in 2010.

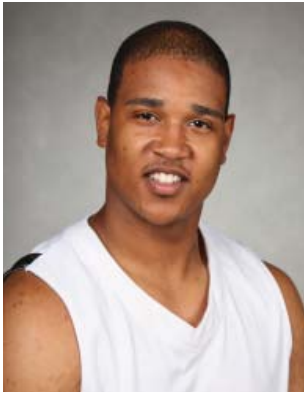
