**FRIARS VERSUS LOUISVILLE...** On Saturday, February 16 the Friars will play No. 23 Louisville at the Dunkin' Donuts Center. The Friars and the Cardinals have met 10 times in the all-time series with Louisville holding a 6-4 advantage. PC is 2-2 all-time at home against Louisville, 0-4 on the road and 2-0 on neutral courts against the Cardinals. The two teams first met on March 20, 1971 when the Friars earned a 64-58 win in the NIT at Madison Square Garden. Louisville has captured the last four meetings between the two squads, including the most recent game at Louisville on January 13, 2007 when the Cardinals earned a 78-63 victory. In Providence's last win over Louisville, the Friars earned a 57-51 victory on November 30, 1977 at Providence, R.I.

**SCOUTING THE CARDINALS...** No. 23 Louisville enters Saturday's game with a 19-6 mark, which includes a 9-3 record in BIG EAST action this season. The Cardinals are led by former Friar Head Coach Rick Pitino. In their most recent game, the Cardinals defeated DePaul, 88-68, on February 12. Louisville is led by Terrence Williams. He is averaging 11.8 ppg. He also is second on the team in rebounding, averaging 7.8 boards per game. Earl Clark is the team's top rebounder. He is averaging 8.2 boards per game.

**FORMER FRIAR HEAD COACHES...** Louisville Head Coach Rick Pitino is one of two former Friar head coaches who are serving as head coaches in the NCAA ranks. The other head coach is Rick Barnes (Texas). Pitino spent two seasons as the head coach of the Friars from 1985-87. Pitino posted a 42-23 mark (17-15 BIG EAST) at Providence, including a 25-9 record in 1986-87 when he led the team to the NCAA Final Four. Pitino's son, Richard, served as a manager for the Friars for two seasons prior to graduating in 2005.

**FRIARS DEFEATED AT NO. 22 PITTSBURGH.** The Friars were defeated at No. 22 Pittsburgh, 82-63, on February 12. The Panthers' Sam Young scored 22 points and led Pittsburgh as it limited Providence to six points in the opening 11 minutes of the second half, allowing the Panthers to pull away for the victory. The Friars haven't beaten Pitt since January 2001 and haven't won in Pittsburgh since December 1998. Providence stayed close for a half, leading 28-27 late in the first half after junior Jeff Xavier (Pawtucket, R.I.) hit three 3-pointers in the opening four minutes. The Friars trailed by only three, 42-39, in the opening minute of the second half. But the Friars, despite getting 15 points from freshman Marshon Brooks (Stone Mountain, Ga.) and 14 from Xavier, suddenly lost their offense as Pitt went on runs of 8-0 and 13-0 over the next nine-plus minutes to seize a 63-41 lead. DeJuan Blair's basket finished off the 8-0 run that gave Pitt its first double-figure lead at 50-39. Ronald Ramon hit a 3-pointer and Keith Benjamin scored consecutive hoops on drives to the basket as Pitt took a 63-41 lead by scoring 21 of the first 25 points of the half. Friar junior Randall Hanke (New York, N.Y.) added 10 points after shooting 5-7 from the field.

**FRIARS TO INDUCT 14 INTO ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME ON HOMECOMING WEEKEND.** The Friar Athletic Department will induct 14 members into the Athletic Hall of Fame on Saturday, February 16. Former Friar Doris Burke '87, a member of the Friars Athletic Hall of Fame, will serve as the emcee for the ceremony. The 2007 inductees are Mark Carroll (cross country/track), Andy Keith (cross country/track), Tina Moloney Kimball (cross country/track), Amy Rudolph (cross country/track), Ed Monahan (men's ice hockey), Michael Smith (men's basketball), Seamus Purcell (men's soccer), Lou Merloni (baseball), Alex Nahigian (baseball coach), Cathy Guden (field hockey), Mary Burke (women's basketball), Britt King (women's basketball), Cammi Granato (women's ice hockey), and John Marchetti (women's hockey coach, men's hockey player). The inductees will be honored at halftime of the men's basketball game versus the University of Louisville. A reception at the Hilton Hotel in downtown Providence will follow the game, starting at 6:00 p.m. The Providence College Athletic Hall of Fame was

started in 1970 with 10 inductees. The 14 inductees of 2007 will join the 110 current members of the Hall of Fame.

**FRIARS PLAY THREE STRAIGHT VERSUS RANKED OPPONENTS...** On Saturday, the Friars will play the second of three consecutive games versus ranked opponents when they host No. 23 Louisville. On Tuesday, PC was defeated at No. 21 Pittsburgh, 82-63. On Monday, the Friars will host No. 8 Georgetown. The last time Providence played at least three consecutive games versus ranked teams was in 1994-95 when the faced No. 4 Connecticut, No. 11 Villanova, No. 21 Syracuse and No. 13 Villanova.

**NEXT FOR THE FRIARS...** After Saturday's game versus No. 23 Louisville, the Friars will return action on Monday in Providence to face No. 8 Georgetown at 4:00 p.m.

**BROOKS HAS STRONG GAME...** Freshman Marshon Brooks (Stone Mountain, Ga.) posted his top game as a Friar at No. 22 Pittsburgh on February 12. The freshman guard scored 15 points and was 5-8 from the field, including 2-4 from three-point territory, in 18 minutes of action.

**XAVIER REACHES 1,000 POINTS...** Junior Jeff Xavier (Pawtucket, R.I.) surpassed 1,000 points for his career in the Friars' loss to West Virginia on February 2. The junior guard, who transferred from Manhattan, scored 740 points in two seasons with the Jaspers. In 24 games with the Friars this season, he has scored 299 points. He has registered 1,039 points in his career. Thirty seven players have scored 1,000 or more points all-time at Providence.

**FRIARS VERSUS RANKED TEAMS...** The Friars have posted a 1-2 mark this season versus ranked teams. On November 16, the Friars defeated 18th-ranked Arkansas, 67-51, in Puerto Rico. On January 3, the Friars were defeated, 96-67, at 10th-ranked Marquette. On February 12, the Friars were defeated at #22 Pittsburgh, 82-63. The Friars have posted a 94-203 record all-time against ranked opponents, including a 1-2 record this season and a 3-3 mark last season.

**MCDERMOTT ASSISTS FRIARS...** Junior Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) recorded eight assists in the Friars' loss at St. John's on February 9. McDermott leads the team in assists (114, 4.75 apg). He registered

10 assists in the Friars' 101-95 win over Florida State on December 22. It marked the fifth time in his career and the second time this season that he has recorded 10 or more assists in a game.

**FRIARS 9-2 AT HOME...** Friars have posted a 9-2 record at home this season. The Friars are 25-5 in their last 30 home games. PC was 16-3 at home last season.

**FRIARS 7-1 WHEN SHOOTING 50%...** On February 9, the team shot 53 percent from the field (23-43) but they were defeated by St. John's, 64-62. The Friars fell to 7-1 on the season when they shoot 50 percent or better in a game.

**MCDERMOTT POSTS A DOUBLE-DOUBLE...** Junior Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) registered his sixth double-double of the season when he scored 11 points and grabbed 10 rebounds in the Friars' win over DePaul on February 5. McDermott has registered 21 double-doubles for his career. He recorded 10 last year and five his freshman season.

**WILLIAMS ON THE OFFENSIVE...** Sophomore Dwain Williams (San Diego, Calif.) scored 20 points in the Friars' win over DePaul on February 5. It marked the fourth time in the last seven games that he scored 20 or more points. He recorded a team-high 20 points in an overtime loss at Notre Dame on January 31. On January 27, Williams recorded 21 points in a loss at Syracuse. On January 17, he registered a career-high 23 points in a win at UConn. Williams has registered four 20-point performances this season. He is second on the team in scoring, averaging 11.4 points.

**HALL SEES ACTION...** Sophomore center Ray Hall (Denver, Colo.) has seen action recently for the Friars. He had a career game in the Friars' loss at Notre Dame on January 31. Hall tied his career high for points with 10 and established his BIG EAST career high for rebounds with seven. He also played a career-high 25 minutes in the game. On February 2, Hall recorded six rebounds and four points in 17 minutes of action versus West Virginia.

**MCDERMOTT GRABS 14 REBOUNDS...** Junior forward Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) grabbed 14 rebounds in the Friars' loss at Syracuse on January 27. He has recorded 10 or more rebounds in a game 10

times this season and 34 times in his career. McDermott leads the team in rebounding, averaging 8.1 rebounds per game.

**SIX FRIARS HAVE SCORED 20 OR MORE POINTS...** The Friars have a well balanced offensive attack this season. Five different players are averaging more than 10 points per game and six players have recorded 20 or more points in a game this season. Junior Weyinmi Efejuku (Fresh Meadows, N.Y.) leads the team with six 20-point games and sophomores Brian McKenzie (Brooklyn, N.Y.) and Dwain Williams (San Diego, Calif.) each have registered four 20-point contests. Junior Jeff Xavier (Pawtucket, R.I.) and junior Randall Hanke (New York, N.Y.) each have added three 20-point performances. Junior Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) has recorded two 20-point games.

**HANKE HAS IMPRESSIVE FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE...** Junior forward Randall Hanke (New York, N.Y.) is shooting 67.2 percent from the floor this season. He leads the BIG EAST in field goal percentage. He has made 78 of his 116 field goal attempts. For his career, Hanke is shooting 68.7 percent (310-451). His 68.7 percent average ranks top all-time at Providence College. In 2005-06, Hanke led the nation in field goal percentage with a 67.7 percent average (149-220).

**XAVIER LEADS THE TEAM IN SCORING...** Junior guard Jeff Xavier (Pawtucket, R.I.) leads the Friars in scoring, averaging 12.5 ppg. He has registered two 27-point performances in 2007-08.

**WILLIAMS TOPS FROM THREE...** Sophomore Dwain Williams (San Diego, Calif.) is leading the Friars in three-point shooting percentage. Williams is 47-115 (40.9 percent) from behind the arc.

**WILLIAMS RETURNS AND EXCELS...** Sophomore Dwain Williams (San Diego, Calif.) who missed four games with an injury returned to the Friar lineup in the team's win over USF on January 12. Williams was very impressive with 16 points and three assists in 26 minutes of action. He was 5-8 from three-point territory in the win. On January 17, he registered a career-high 23 points in a 77-65 win over UConn on January 17. Williams started at the point guard position in the Friars' first 11 games this season, including the team's 67-51 victory over No. 18 Arkansas on November 16. However, Williams did not play in the team's games versus Saint

Peter's, Marquette, DePaul and Rutgers with an injured leg. Williams is second on the team in scoring (11.4 ppg). Last season, Williams started four games at the point while Sharaud Curry was serving a suspension. The squad posted a 3-1 mark last season with Williams as the starting point guard.

**CURRY RETURNS, THEN SITS...** After not playing in the first nine games of the season due to an injury to his foot, junior Sharaud Curry (Gainesville, Ga.) returned to action versus Sacred Heart on December 19. In eight minutes of action versus the Pioneers, Curry scored three points and dished off three assists. However, his injury has caused him to miss the Friars' last 14 games. He is the team's top returning scorer. In 27 games last season, Curry averaged 15.3 points per game.

**FRIARS SHOOT FOR THREE...** The Friars are very active from behind the three-point arc this season. Through 24 games, the team is 194-508 (38.2 percent) from three-point territory.

**FRIARS HOLD RUTGERS TO TWO FIELD GOALS IN SECOND HALF...** In the Friars' win over Rutgers on January 9, PC held the Scarlet Knights to just two field goals and 16 points in the second half. In the final 20 minutes of action, the Scarlet Knights shot just 10 percent (2-20) from the field. It marked an all-time Friar BIG EAST opponent low for a half. The previous record was 19.4 percent (7-36) registered by Georgetown versus the Friars on February 6, 1993.

**MCKENZIE RECORDS A CAREER-HIGH...** Sophomore Brian McKenzie (Brooklyn, N.Y.) recorded a career-high with 24 points in a 76-50 win over Rutgers on January 9. He was 10-14 from the field and 2-3 from three-point territory. He is third on the team in scoring, averaging 10.9 points per game.

**MCDERMOTT GRABS 15 REBOUNDS VERSUS DEPAUL...** Junior Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) registered 15 rebounds at DePaul on January 5. For McDermott, it marked the fifth time in his career that he registered 15 or more rebounds in a game. He has recorded 10 or more rebounds in a 31 times in a game. He leads the Friars in rebounding, averaging 8.1 rebounds per game.

**PETERSON STRONG OFF THE BENCH...** Freshman Jamine Peterson (Brooklyn, N.Y.)

scored 10 points and grabbed five rebounds in 23 minutes of action at No. 10 Marquette on January 3. Peterson scored 10 points on 5-6 shooting in 13 minutes versus Florida State on December 22. He was efficient versus Brown on December 9 with 13 points in 11 minutes. Peterson came in off the bench and scored 14 points and grabbed seven rebounds in 19 minutes of action versus BC on December 1. The freshman forward is averaging 4.8 ppg and 2.9 rpg.

**HANKE EARNS START...** Junior forward Randall Hanke (New York, N.Y.) started at center in the Friars' win over Sacred Heart on December 19. For Hanke, who did not play last season, it marked his first start for the Friars since February 7, 2006 versus DePaul. In the win over Sacred Heart, Hanke recorded 20 points as he shot 8-11 from the field in 21 minutes of action. He has now started the last 15 games for the Friars. In 2005-06, he averaged 13.0 points per game. Hanke is averaging 8.5 points per game and 15.6 minutes per game this season.

**BALANCED SCORING...** The Friars have featured balanced scoring this season as five players are averaging 10 or more points per game. Junior Jeff Xavier (Pawtucket, R.I.) leads the team (12.5 ppg). Sophomore Dwain Williams (San Diego, Calif.) is averaging (11.4 ppg). Sophomore Brian McKenzie (Brooklyn, N.Y.) is third on the team (10.9 ppg). Weyinmi Efejuku (Fresh Meadows, N.Y.) is fourth on squad (10.7 ppg). Lastly, junior Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) is averaging 10.3 ppg.

**XAVIER SCORES 27 AGAIN...** Junior guard Jeff Xavier (Pawtucket, R.I.), who leads the team in scoring (12.5 ppg) made seven three-pointers versus Florida State and scored a game-high 27 points for the second time this season. Xavier matched his nearly identical effort against Harvard on November 24 when he tallied 27 points and seven three-pointers. He is third on the team from beyond the arc, shooting 37.7 percent (63-167).

**FRIARS 1-1 IN OVERTIME...** Providence's 98-89 overtime win over Boston College was the Friars' first overtime victory since the team defeated Rhode Island, 65-58, in overtime on December 4, 2004. On January 31, Providence was defeated at Notre Dame, 81-74. PC is 1-1 this season in overtime. The Friars have now posted a 51-52 mark all-time in overtime games.

## 2007-08 PROVIDENCE COLLEGE BASKETBALL

**MCDERMOTT IS VERSATILE...** Junior Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) is a very versatile player for the Friars. The 6-8, 235-pound power forward often presents matchup problems for opposing defenses because he knows how to handle and distribute the ball. McDermott, who was a top-ranked high school football recruit, played quarterback in high school and knows how to handle pressure. Last season, he became the first Friar ever to register more than 250 rebounds and more than 150 assists in one season (283 rebounds, 159 assists). Last season, he earned Honorable Mention All-BIG EAST accolades and this year was named to the Preseason All-BIG EAST Team.

**XAVIER BACK IN RHODE ISLAND...** Junior guard Jeff Xavier (Pawtucket, R.I.), a native of Pawtucket, grew up dreaming of playing for the Friars. He spent his first two years of college at Manhattan. At the conclusion of his sophomore campaign, he transferred to Providence. After sitting out the 2006-07 season, Xavier is now eligible to compete for the Friars. In his last season at Manhattan, Xavier averaged 16.6 ppg.

**FRIARS PICKED 8TH IN BIG EAST PRE-SEASON RANKINGS...** Providence was picked to finish 8th out of the 16 schools in the BIG EAST Preseason Coaches' Poll released on Wednesday, October 24 at the BIG EAST Media Day at Madison Square Garden in New York. Georgetown and Louisville each earned the same amount of points and were picked to finish first.

**FRIARS TOUR ITALY...** In late August, the Friars embarked on a 13-day tour of Italy to build some early success in preparation for the upcoming season. While overseas, the team played six games and posted a 3-3 record. The highlight of the trip was an 84-83 last-second victory over Premiata Montegrano. Geoff McDermott threw an alley-oop from midcourt and Weyinmi Efejuku laid it in at the buzzer to earn the victory. Premiata, which had defeated Stanford, 93-79, plays in the A-League in Italy and is considered one of the top professional squads in the country. Throughout the trip, Providence was led by junior Jonathan Kale as he averaged 16.2 points a game to go along with 9.7 rebounds per game.

**MCDERMOTT NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-BIG EAST TEAM...** Geoff McDermott

(New Rochelle, N.Y.) was named to the 2007-08 Preseason All-BIG EAST Team. McDermott is one of the most dynamic players in the BIG EAST. The junior forward was third in the league in assists (5.13 apg), ranked fourth in rebounding (9.1 rpg) and fifth in steals (1.9 spg) in 2006-07. McDermott recorded 10 double-doubles last season, including the first triple-double at PC since 1999 when he registered 12 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists versus Harvard on December 22, 2006. He was the first Friar ever to register more than 150 assists and more than 250 rebounds in the same season as he posted 159 assists and 283 rebounds. McDermott averaged 9.5 ppg.

**PROVIDENCE ALL-TIME...** In 81 seasons of basketball, the Friars have posted a 1,253-819 mark (.605). The team's all-time record at the Dunkin' Donuts Center is 436-175 (.713). In 2006-07, Providence registered a 16-3 mark at the Dunkin' Donuts Center.

**FRIARS FINISH 2007 AT 18-13...** Competing in one of the top college basketball conferences in the nation, the 2006-07 Providence College Friars had a strong season, finishing 18-13 overall and 8-8 in BIG EAST play. Head Coach Tim Welsh's squad made its fifth post-season appearance in his nine years as a head coach of the Friars. The Friars earned an at-large bid to the NIT for the 17th time in the 80-year history of Friar basketball.

**FRIARS ON WEEI RADIO...** It was announced on August 1 that 103.7 WEEI-FM will be the exclusive broadcast partner of the PC Friar men's basketball team beginning this fall and extending through the 2011-12 season. Sports Radio 103.7 WEEI-FM will broadcast the PC men's basketball home and away regular and post-season games, as well as 30-minute pre- and post-game shows on all game days. John Rooke and Joe Hassett are in their 19th year together as the voices of PC men's basketball as play-by-play commentator and analyst, respectively, and will lead the broadcast team on Sports Radio 103.7 WEEI-FM. Sports Radio 103.7 WEEI-FM also will be the new home to Friar Head Coach Tim Welsh's Radio Show. The Tim Welsh show will be broadcast 10 times during the regular season and throughout the post season.

**FRIARS TO HONOR THREE LEGENDS...** It was announced on November 8 that Providence College will honor three of its greatest

men's basketball players ever on Friday, March 7 and Saturday, March 8, 2008. On Saturday, March 8, Providence College will honor Jimmy Walker '67, Ernie DiGregorio '73 and Marvin Barnes '74, at halftime of the Friar men's basketball game versus Villanova at the Dunkin' Donuts Center. To acknowledge their accomplishments, the College will unveil banners with the names and numbers of the three legends. On Friday, March 7, the College will tip off the weekend with a dinner at the Westin Hotel to recognize Walker, DiGregorio and Barnes. To help the College honor Walker, DiGregorio and Barnes and recognize the tradition that they helped establish, all former Friar men's basketball players will be invited to attend the game and participate in the ceremony. Fans interested in attending the game can purchase tickets by calling the PC ticket office at 401-865-GO PC. Any fans that wish to purchase tickets to the March 7 dinner at the Westin should call Jen Cote at 401-865-1880.

**FRIARS PLAY IN THE NIT...** In 2007, the Providence men's basketball team played in its first National Invitation Tournament (NIT) since 2003. The Friars played Bradley in the First Round of the NIT at Carver Arena in Peoria, Illinois. The Friars, who captured NIT titles in 1961 and 1963, have a storied tradition in the NIT. Last season, PC made its 17th appearance in the NIT. Only five other colleges have been in more NITs.

**250 REBOUNDS, 150 ASSISTS...** Junior Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) is the first player in Friar history to record more than 250 rebounds and more than 150 assists in the same season. In 2007, he recorded 159 assists and 283 rebounds in 31 games. Only eight other Friars have recorded 100 or more rebounds and 100 or more assists in the same season.

## 2007-08 PROVIDENCE COLLEGE BASKETBALL - Tim Welsh



In his 13 seasons as a collegiate head coach, Tim Welsh's squads have produced an impressive 228-160 mark (.588). Since his hiring at Providence in 1998, Welsh has led the Friars to a 158-138 record, which includes two NCAA and three NIT appearances. With his 158 wins as a Friar head coach, Welsh ranks third all-time at Providence behind coaching legends Joe Mullaney (18 seasons - 319 victories), Dave Gavitt (10 seasons - 209 victories).

In the Friars' most recent campaign (2006-07), Welsh led the team back to post-season play as the squad qualified for the BIG EAST Tournament and was selected to participate in the NIT. The team registered 18 wins, including three victories over ranked opponents. Leading the team was the 2007 BIG EAST Most Improved Player, Herbert Hill. Hill became the first Friar ever to earn the prestigious Most Improved Player Award. He received the honor after becoming the second player under Welsh to lead the BIG EAST in scoring (19.9 ppg). Hill also was named First Team All-BIG EAST.

In 2006, Welsh's starting five featured two freshmen, two sophomores and a senior. The two freshmen, Sharaud Curry and Geoff McDermott, earned BIG EAST All-Rookie team honors and McDermott was one of the top rebounders in the nation.

His 2005 team played nine games against ranked opponents and 16 games versus teams that qualified for the 2005 NCAA Tournament. PC recorded a 14-17 mark, which included a 3-1 record and a third-place finish in the Preseason NIT. Welsh's top player, senior All-American Ryan Gomes, became the College's all-time leading scorer (2,138 points) and the first Friar ever to earn consecutive First Team All-BIG EAST honors. He also became just the second Friar ever to lead the league in scoring (23.2 ppg).

Welsh's goal to build the Friars into one of the top basketball programs in the country came closer to fruition in 2004 as he led the team to one of its most productive seasons in 30 years. The Friars recorded their second 20-win season under Welsh and also made their second trip to the NCAA Tournament under his tutelage. Providence earned its highest seed ever in the NCAA Tournament as the team was picked as a five seed. In BIG EAST action, the squad also had a monumental season tying the team record for league wins with an 11-5 mark and finishing in third place in the conference standings. The Friars recorded a 3-2 mark over ranked teams and a 4-2 record against teams that reached the 2004 NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen. The team achieved two significant firsts in 2004 when it defeated fourth-ranked and eventual national champion Connecticut, 66-56, in Hartford on January 24, 2004 to post the Friars' first win ever on the road over a top-four team and when it defeated 18th-ranked Syracuse, 74-61, for its first win ever over a defending national champion. Welsh's squad's success did not go unnoticed in 2004 as the team spent nine weeks in the national polls and climbed as high as 12th in the Associated Press Poll and 13th in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. It marked the highest the Friars had been ranked since 1978.

In 2004, Welsh saw Gomes blossom into one of the top players ever to wear a Friar uniform. Gomes averaged 18.9 points and 9.4 rebounds per game. He earned First Team All-BIG EAST accolades and received nine All-America honors, including Associated Press First Team. Gomes became just the fourth Friar ever to earn Associated Press First Team honors and the first since Marvin Barnes earned the distinction in 1974.

The 2002-03 season was another successful campaign for Welsh as the Friar bench boss. His squad won eight of its last 11 games, including one in the BIG EAST Tournament and two in the NIT, to finish with an 18-14 mark overall. In league play, the Friars finished in third place in the BIG EAST East Division with an 8-8 record.

In 2002, Welsh led a Friar team that was devastated by injuries to a 15-16 mark. His star senior John Linehan had a very impressive season. Under Welsh's guidance, Linehan established the NCAA and BIG EAST career steals records. For his efforts, Linehan earned his second BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year honor, as well as NABC Defensive Player of the Year, ESPN.com Defensive Player of the Year, Second Team All-BIG EAST honors and Honorable Mention All-America accolades.

In 2000-01, Welsh guided the Friars to one of their most successful seasons ever. The squad posted a 21-10 mark and earned its first bid to the NCAA Tournament since 1997. Welsh also guided the team to one of its best seasons ever in BIG EAST competition as the Friars posted a school record 11 BIG EAST wins. The team finished in second place with an 11-5 mark in the BIG EAST East Division.

Another one of Welsh's accomplishments during his highly productive third season as the Friars' bench boss was that he had the team ranked No. 25 in the Associated Press Poll on February 19. It marked the first time the Friars had earned an in-season ranking since January 24, 1989.

One of the reasons for the Friars' in-season ranking was their monumental 103-79 victory over the 12th-ranked Georgetown Hoyas on February 10 at the Dunkin' Donuts Center. Welsh's Friars became the first team to score 100 or more points against Georgetown in a BIG EAST game. Also, the 24-

point Friar win was the largest deficit ever for the Hoyas in a BIG EAST loss.

The 2000-01 season also was significant for Welsh as he earned his 100th career coaching victory. On November 29, 2000, Providence defeated Florida International, 74-55, at the Dunkin' Donuts Center for Welsh's 100th victory.

Welsh continues to be regarded as one of the game's top recruiters. Welsh and his staff consistently find recruits who will be able to complement an already solid core of players.

Once being named head coach at Providence, it did not take long before Welsh found success in the Ocean State. His first Friar squad posted a 16-14 mark with a team that featured no regular player over 6-7. The Friars were 9-9 on the year in the BIG EAST including five league road wins. Early in the season, PC knocked off four Top-25 teams in a row (Rhode Island, Pittsburgh, Purdue and Syracuse) on the way to the Friars' first post-season appearance since 1997.

The Tim Welsh Era at Providence College officially began on April 2, 1998 when the Massena, New York native was named the 13th head basketball coach in the school's storied basketball history. The announcement was made by former Providence College President Reverend Philip A. Smith.

In making the appointment, Father Smith said, "We sought the opinions of some of the most knowledgeable people in the country about college basketball and coaching talent. Specifically, we wanted a coach capable of sustaining the rich tradition of Providence College basketball and, equally important, an outstanding person who would fully embrace the College's educational philosophy. Tim Welsh was at the top of everyone's list."

Welsh has brought stability to the Friar basketball program. Following a highly successful season in 2000-01, he signed a seven-year contract extension, which ensured that Welsh will be leading the Friars through the 2007-08 season. After his success in 2004, his contract again was extended through the 2009 season.

In the spring of 2001, Welsh expressed his excitement about his future with the Friars. "The administration has stepped up and made a statement to support the program. I love it here. My roots are here, I agree with the mission of the college and I enjoy living in Rhode Island. I'm excited about staying at Providence College as the head coach of the basketball program."

Welsh, formerly the head coach at Iona College, came to Providence with the task of revitalizing one of the most successful programs in New England. In his six seasons at the helm, Welsh has brought a high-energy and up-tempo style of play to Providence.

Welsh achieved a great deal of success in just three seasons as the head coach at Iona, leading the Gaels to three consecutive 20-win seasons. During that time, his teams turned in a 70-22 overall mark (76.1%), including a 27-win season in 1997-98. His 1997-98 squad was the first Iona team to advance to the NCAA Tournament since 1985.

During the 1997-98 campaign, Iona recorded just six losses while knocking off two BIG EAST opponents (Providence and Rutgers) and one Atlantic 10 foe (Fordham). The Gaels also put together the nation's longest winning streak - 15 games during the season. In the three-game, MAAC Tournament, Iona led in all three games for all but 11 seconds with the closest game being an 11-point win over Loyola (Md.).

In three years with Welsh calling the shots, Iona advanced to post-season action each year, going to the National Invitation Tournament in 1996 and 1997 and the NCAA Tournament in 1998.

A two-time Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Coach of the Year (1997, 1998), Welsh also received 1996-97 NABC District II Coach of the Year honors and the 1995-96 Peter A. Carlesimo Award as the Metropolitan Area's Division I Coach of the Year.

Welsh served as an interim head coach at Iona for 10 games during the 1994-95 season, replacing his father, Hall of Fame coach Jerry Welsh, who stepped down following that season due to medical reasons. Prior to that, Tim had served as an assistant on his father's staff for four years.

No stranger to the BIG EAST, Tim Welsh served as an assistant coach to Jim Boeheim at Syracuse for three seasons (1988-91). During that time, Syracuse was 82-21, won two BIG EAST Conference Championships, the 1988 Preseason NIT Championship, and made three trips to the NCAA Tournament.

The 47-year old head coach got his start in college coaching at Iona where he served as a volunteer assistant to Pat Kennedy in 1985. Following that season, he became an assistant on Kennedy's staff at Florida State for two years before moving on to Syracuse.

Welsh played his college basketball under his father at Potsdam State. He was a co-captain his senior year and helped his team reach the Final Four in 1984.

Dwain Williams led Providence with 21 points, and Jonathan Kale and Jeff Xavier each had 16 points. Geoff McDermott, averaging 11 points a game, failed to score but had 14 rebounds and six assists. Weynmi Efejuke, the second-leading scorer at 12.3 points, also did not score. It was the first appearance in the Carrier Dome in nearly three years for Providence (12-7, 3-4), and their long-range prowess deserted them for a little bit too long. Ice-cold in the first half from beyond the arc, going 1-for-12, the Friars rallied midway through the second as their long-range attack got untracked. After missing five 3s in the first half, Xavier hit his first three attempts in the second. His third moved Providence within 46-44 with 8:51 left and a 3 by Williams tied it at 47-all with 7:40 remaining. A follow dunk by Jamine Peterson gave Providence 49-47 lead, its first since midway through the first half. Flynn hit his only 3-pointer of the game and made two free throws to put the Orange back in front 54-50 with 6:01 left, but Xavier's 3 from the right corner knotted the game at 56-all at 4:21. After a timeout, Greene drained a 3 from right wing and Harris converted two free throws for a five-point lead and Syracuse made 8-of-10 free throws in the final 1:26 to hold on. Greene hit a trio of 3-pointers in a span of 2:11 to break an early tie and send Syracuse on a 12-3 run in the opening minutes of the game. The Friars moved within 20-15 on Kale's follow at 5:50, but Syracuse, led 30-21 at halftime largely because of its perimeter defense.

Friar junior Randall Hanke (New York, N.Y.) added 10 points after shooting 5-7 from the field.
