FRIARS VERSUS MARQUETTE... On Thursday, the Friars will open the BIG EAST season versus nationally ranked Marquette. The Friars and the Golden Eagles have met six times in the all-time series with the series tied at 3-3. PC has posted a 1-0 mark all-time at home against Marquette, a 0-2 record at Marquette and a 2-1 record on neutral courts against the Golden Eagles. The two teams first met on March 21, 1963 when the Friars earned a 70-64 win against Marquette at Madison Square Garden in the NIT. In the last meeting between the two teams, Marquette defeated the Friars, 88-78, in Milwaukee on March 2, 2006. In the Friars' most recent win, Providence defeated the Golden Eagles, 81-59, in the NCAA Tournament on March 14, 1997.

SCOUTING THE GOLDEN EAGLES... Marquette enters Thursday's game ranked 15th in the nation with a 13-2 mark, which includes a 0-0 record in BIG EAST action this season. In their most recent game, the Golden Eagles defeated Savannah State, 69-51, on December 30. Marquette is led by sophomore guard Dominic James. He is averaging 17.0 ppg. Junior forward Ousmane Barro is the team's leading rebounder, averaging 6.3 boards per game.

FRIARS IN BIG EAST OPENERS... Thursday's game will be the Friars' first BIG EAST game this season. It will mark the first time the Friars have opened the BIG EAST season at home since January 5, 2000. PC has played six consecutive league openers on the road. The Friars have posted a 5-22 record all-time in BIG EAST openers. Thursday's game will mark the first time the Friars have opened the BIG EAST season versus Marquette. In PC's most recent win in an opener, the Friars won at Boston College, 93-80, on January 2, 2003 in Chestnut Hill, Mass. Last season, the Friars were defeated at Georgetown, 72-62, on January 5, 2006, in the team's league opener.

2006-07 PROVIDENCE COLLEGE BASKETBALL

FRIARS DEFEAT LONGWOOD... The Providence College Men's Basketball team (10-3) improved to 10-1 at home and concluded its non-conference slate with a 107-69 win over Longwood on Jan. 2 at the Dunkin' Donuts Center. The 107-point output marked the second straight home game in which PC scored 100-points or more. The last time PC scored 100-plus points in two consecutive home games was during the 1990-91 season. The Friars finished the second half with 66 points, which set a team record for points in a half. Sophomore forward Jonathan Kale (Mattapan, Mass.) scored a game and career-high 18 points on 7-of-8 shooting. Freshman guard Jamal Barney (Baltimore, Md.) also notched a career-high point total as he poured in 13. In addition, senior center Herbert Hill (Kinston, N.C.) scored 17 points and pulled down 13 rebounds to collect his third double-double this season and seventh of his career. The Friars took an early 13-5, but the Lancers fought back to close the PC advantage to 13-10. The Friars responded as they went on an 18-3 run over the next five minutes to increase their advantage to 31-13. During the run, Hill scored eight of his first half nine points. Longwood came back to close the PC advantage to 41-31 heading into the locker room. PC connected on 16-of-31 of its field goals to shoot 51 percent in the first half, while Longwood connected on just 34 percent of its shots. The Lancers opened the second half strong as they closed the PC lead to 43-36, but Longwood got no closer for the rest of the game.

FRIARS PLAYING FIRST TWO BIG EAST GAMES AT HOME... This week, the Friars will play their first two BIG EAST games at home. It will mark just the second time ever and the first time since the 1982-83 season that the Friars played their first two BIG EAST games at home.

CURRY HAS MISSED LAST TWO GAMES... Sophomore guard Sharaud Curry (Gainesville, Ga.) did not play in the Friars' games versus Florida State on December 29 and Longwood on January 2. Curry was suspended for a violation of team rules.

FRIARS CONCLUDE NON-CONFERENCE SEASON... The Friars concluded their non-conference season with a 107-69 win over Longwood on January 2. PC finished with a 10-3 mark in non-conference play.

PC TO HONOR DAVE GAVITT AND JOE MULLANEY... On Saturday, January 6, Providence College will celebrate a very special night in Friar basketball history when it honors the two greatest coaches in the history of the program at the Friars versus Seton Hall game. The College will hold two dedications to honor Joe Mullaney and Dave Gavitt. Prior to start of the game, the floor at the Dunkin' Donuts Center will be named in honor of Coach Gavitt. At halftime, the College will honor both great coaches when it

raises their names to the rafters of the Dunkin' Donuts Center.

FRIARS VERSUS RANKED TEAMS... Thursday's game against 15th-ranked Marquette will be the Friars' 291st game all-time versus a ranked team. PC is 91-199 all-time versus ranked squads, including a 1-1 mark this season. The Friars' last win against a ranked opponent was a 73-64 victory over 23rd-ranked Boston College on November 22, 2006. The win was the Friars' first over a ranked team since February 7, 2004. In PC's other game against a ranked team this season, the Friars were defeated at No. 7 Florida on December 6, 2006.

FRIARS TOUGH AT HOME... The Friars have registered a 10-1 record at home this season. PC's only defeat this season was a 51-41 loss to Brown on November 18.

SIX PLAYERS IN DOUBLE FIGURES... In the Friars' 107-69 win over Longwood on January 2, six Friars scored in double figures. Sophomore Jonathan Kale (18 points), senior Herbert Hill (17 points), sophomore Geoff McDermott (14 points), freshman Dwain Williams (14 points), sophomore Weyinmi Efejuku (13 points) and freshman Jamal Barney (13 points) all scored in double figures. It marked the first time since December 30, 2001 that PC has had six players score 10 or more points in a game.

FRIARS SCORE 107 POINTS... Providence College scored 107 points in the team's win over Longwood on January 2. For the Friars, it marked the most points they scored in a game since a 120-60 win over American-Puerto Rico on November 27, 1999. It also was the squad's second game with 100 or more points this season and 70th time in the history of Friar basketball that the squad scored in triple digits.

WILLIAMS STARTS TWO CONSECUTIVE GAMES... Freshman Dwain Williams (Murrieta, Calif.) made his first career start in the Friars' loss to Florida State on December 29. He scored 15 points and was 8-10 from the free-throw line. In the Friars' most recent game, Williams started and scored 14 points in the PC's win over Longwood on January 2. On December 4, he came off the bench to score a game-high 19 points in the Friars' 67-50 win over Fairfield. The freshman guard was 5-6 from three-point territory in 26 minutes of action. On November 28, he scored 13 points in 21 minutes of action in PC's win over Columbia on November 28. He was 4-7 from the field, including 4-5 from three-point territory. The freshman guard has played in 11 of the team's 13 games this season and is averaging 7.3 points per game.

FRIARS OUTREBOUND LONGWOOD... Providence College has dominated on the boards this season. In the team's most recent game, PC outrebounded Longwood, 43-30. The Friars have outrebounded 11 of their 13 opponents this season. Florida and Florida State are the only two opponents that have outrebounded the Friars this season. In the Friars' win over URI on December 2, PC outrebounded the Rams, 47-21. In the team's win over George Washington on November 26, the Friars outrebounded the Colonials, 51-27, which included 26 offensive rebounds. In the Friars' 73-64 win over the 23rd-ranked Boston College, Providence outrebounded the Eagles, 42-31. The Friars are averaging 38.0 rebounds per game this season, while their opponents are averaging 28.5 rebounds. The Friars rank third in the BIG EAST in rebounding margin at +9.5.

BALANCED SCORING... The Friars are averaging 80.5 points per game this season. PC has had four or more players score in double figures in nine of the team's 13 games, including two games in which five players scored in double figures and one game with six players in double figures. Currently, four players are averaging 10 or more points per game this season for PC -- Sharaud Curry (17.3 ppg), Weyinmi Efejuku (15.2 ppg), Herbert Hill (15.5 ppg) and Geoff McDermott (11.1 ppg).

THREE FRIARS RANK HIGH IN THE LEAGUE... Senior Herbert Hill (Kinston, N.C.), sophomore Sharaud Curry (Gainesville, Ga.) and sophomore Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) each ranks high in the BIG EAST in at least one category. Hill leads the conference in field goal percentage at 73.1 percent (87-119). Curry leads the BIG EAST in assists at 5.64 per game (62 assists). McDermott ranks second in the league in rebounding, averaging 10.3 boards per game.

EFEJUKU THIRD ON THE TEAM IN SCORING... Sophomore guard Weyinmi Efejuku (Fresh Meadows, N.Y.) ranks third on the team in scoring, averaging 15.2 ppg. He scored 21 points and recorded six rebounds in a win over Holy Cross on December 19. On December 22, Efejuku scored a career-high 26 points and registered four rebounds in a win over Harvard. He has recorded four games with 20 or more points this season.

SENIOR IS IMPRESSIVE... Senior Herbert Hill (Kinston, N.C.) ranks second on the team in scoring, averaging 15.5 points per game. On January 2, Hill recorded his third double-double of the season with 17 points and 13 rebounds in a win over Longwood. He had an impressive game in the Friars' win over

Maine on December 9 when he scored a career-high 27 points and pulled down 11 rebounds. It marked his third 20-point performance of the season.

KALE SCORES A CAREER HIGH... Sophomore Jon Kale (Mattapan, Mass.) has been a valuable sixth man for the team this season. In the team's most recent game, he scored a career-high 18 points and grabbed eight rebounds in 21 minutes of action against Longwood on January 2. On December 2, he added his first double-double of the season with 13 points and 11 rebounds in the team's win over Rhode Island. He is averaging 6.9 points and 3.8 rebounds per game.

MCDERMOTT RECORDS A TRIPE-DOUBLE... Sophomore forward Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) recorded an impressive two games on December 19 and December 22 as nearly averaged a triple-double in the Friars' two wins and did record a triple double in one of the victories. In the two games, he averaged 11.5 points, 14 rebounds, 8.5 assists and 2.5 blocks. For his efforts, he was named BIG EAST Player of the Week. On December 19, McDermott scored 11 points, grabbed a career-high 17 rebounds, registered seven assists and made three blocks in a victory over Holy Cross. On December 22, he recorded the first triple-double for the Friars since December 27, 1999 as he scored 12 points, had 11 rebounds, recorded a career-high 10 assists and made two blocks in a win over Harvard.

SOPHOMORES SCORE 70 VERSUS HARVARD... PC's sophomore class of Sharaud Curry (Gainesville, Ga.), Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.), Weyinmi Efejuku (Fresh Meadows, N.Y.) and Jonathan Kale (Mattapan, Mass.) are four of the team's top six scorers. The four sophomores scored 70 of the team's 101 points in a win over Harvard on December 22. They have recorded 621 of the team's 1047 points this season or 59.3 percent. The four sophomores also were instrumental in the Friars' win over No. 23 Boston College on November 22. The four sophomores combined to score 64 of the team's 73 points and record 28 of the squad's 42 rebounds.

MCDERMOTT GRABS 17 REBOUNDS... Sophomore Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) recorded a career-high 17 rebounds in the team's win over Holy Cross on December 19. For McDermott it was his second game this season with 16 or more rebounds. He recorded 16 rebounds in the team's win over No. 23 Boston College on November 22. It also marked the eighth time in his career that he registered 13 or more

rebounds in a game. In 40 career games at Providence, McDermott has recorded 10 or more rebounds 20 times. McDermott, who was second in the nation in rebounding amongst freshmen last year, averaged 9.0 rebounds per game as a freshman.

MCDERMOTT DOUBLES UP... Sophomore Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) has registered a double-double in four of his last six games. He has recorded seven double-doubles in 13 games this season. He ranks second in the BIG EAST with seven this season. For the season, he is averaging a double-double (11.1 ppg and 10.3 rpg).

CURRY ASSISTS AGAIN... Sophomore Sharaud Curry (Gainesville, Ga.) ranks second on the team in assist this season with 62 (5.6 apg). On December 22, he recorded eight assists in a win over Harvard. On December 4, he registered nine assists in a 67-50 win over Fairfield on December 4. In the previous game, he recorded 12 assists in the Friars' 95-66 win over Rhode Island on December 2. It marked the first time that a Friar recorded 10 or more assists in a game since Donnie McGrath registered 10 versus Pennsylvania on December 30, 2002.

FRIARS SCORE 80 OR MORE POINTS... The Friars scored 107 points in a win over Longwood on January 2. For PC it marked the seventh time in 13 games this season that the team scored 80 or more points. The Friars are averaging 80.5 points per game this season.

MCDERMOTT ASSISTS FRIARS... Sophomore Geoff McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.), who was a star quarterback of the New Rochelle High School team, is accustomed to distributing the ball. In addition to being a rugged power forward who leads the team and ranks second in the BIG EAST in rebounding (10.3 rpg), he also ranks fourth in the league in assists. He is averaging 5.4 assists per game. On December 22, McDermott added a career-high 10 assists in PC's win over Harvard. He has 70 assists for the season, including at least three in each of PC's 13 games.

CURRY LEADS THE FRIARS IN SCORING... Sophomore Sharaud Curry (Gainesville, Ga.) leads the team in scoring as he is averaging 17.3 ppg. On December 22, Curry registered 22 points in Friars' win over Harvard. On November 26, he scored a career-high 27 points in a win over George Washington. He scored 18 points in the team's win over 23rd-ranked Boston College on November 22. Last season, he averaged 11.9 ppg.

HANKE TO RETURN... Providence College

junior forward Randall Hanke (New York, N.Y.) is expected to return to the men's basketball team in early January. He is expected to practice with the team, but he will not compete in any games. If he does not play in any games this season, he will have two years of eligibility remaining. Hanke played in 27 games in 2005-06 and averaged 13.0 points per game and 5.0 rebounds per game, while averaging 21.6 minutes per game. As a sophomore, he led the nation in field goal percentage (67.7 percent).

HILL SEEING 20/20... Senior forward Herbert Hill (Kinston, N.C.) accomplished an impressive feat in the PC's win over George Washington when he scored 20 points and grabbed 20 rebounds on November 26. It marked the 31st time that a PC player posted a 20-20 game and the first time since Marvin Barnes scored 37 points and recorded 23 rebounds versus Brown on March 4, 1974. Hill is just the sixth Friar all-time to register a 20-20 game.

THREE FRIARS POST DOUBLE-DOUBLES VERSUS URI... Three Friars recorded double-doubles in PC's 95-66 win over Rhode Island on December 2. It marked the first time since the 1979-80 season and just the seventh time in the history of Friar basketball that the team had three double-doubles in the same game. In PC's win over URI, sophomore Geoff McDermott (15 points, 11 rebounds), Jonathan Kale (13 points, 11 rebounds) and Sharaud Curry (16 points, 12 assists) each recorded a double-double.

FIVE PLAYERS REACH DOUBLE FIGURES VERSUS URI. In the Friars' win over URI on December 2, five players scored 13 or more points. Sophomore Weyinmi Efejuku (20 points), senior Herbert Hill (19 points), sophomore Sharaud Curry (16 points), sophomore Geoff McDermott (15 points) and sophomore Jonathan Kale (13 points) all reached double figures for the Friars.

HEAD COACH TIM WELSH EARNS 200TH WIN... Friar Head Coach Tim Welsh reached a milestone in his coaching career as he earned his 200th career victory as the Friars defeated George Washington, 86-67, on November 26. Currently, his record is 207-139 (.598) over 12 seasons as a head coach. He has coached for nine seasons at Providence and he has posted a 137-117 mark with the Friars. Prior to coming to Providence, Welsh was the head coach at Iona College where he recorded a 70-22 mark. In his 12 seasons as a head coach, he has guided three teams to the NCAA Tournament - his 1998 Iona team and his 2001 and 2004 Providence squads.

of basketball, the Friars have posted a 1,232-798 mark (.607). The team's all-time record at the Dunkin' Donuts Center is 421-171 (.711). In 2005-06, Providence registered a 9-7 mark at the Dunkin' Donuts Center and a 3-8 mark on the road.

FRIARS EARN WIN OVER RANKED TEAM... On November 22, the Friars defeated the 23rd-ranked Boston College Eagles, 73-64. The win was the Friars' first over a ranked team since February 7, 2004. The victory also ended the team's 16-game losing streak against ranked teams. PC is 91-199 all-time versus ranked squads.

FRIARS END GEORGE WASHINGTON'S 22-GAME WIN STREAK... With the Friars' 86-67 victory over George Washington on November 26, PC ended the Colonials regular-season win streak at 22 games, which was the longest in nation.

FRIARS PICKED 10TH IN BIG EAST PRE-SEASON RANKINGS... Providence was picked to finish 10th out of the 16 schools in the BIG EAST Preseason Coaches' Poll released on Wednesday, October 25 at the BIG EAST Media Day at Madison Square Garden in New York. Pittsburgh was picked to finish first, followed by Georgetown, Syracuse, Marquette and Connecticut.

LAST SEASON... In 2005-06, PC posted a 12-15 record overall. In 16 BIG EAST games in 2005-06, the Friars registered a 5-11 record and finished tied for 13th in the BIG EAST.

FRIARS ON THE RADIO... All the Friar action this season can be heard on 99.7 FM WSKO with John Rooke and former Friar Joe Hassett calling all the action. It marks the 18th season the two have teamed up to broadcast Friar basketball. This is the third season that the Friars can be heard on 99.7 FM WSKO.

PROVIDENCE COMPETES WITH THE BIG BOYS... Providence College, which has an enrollment of 3,912 students, is the smallest Division I school competing in one of the six major conferences (ACC, BIG 12, BIG EAST, PAC-10, BIG 10 and the SEC). In fact, of schools that compete in those six conferences only Seton Hall (9,600), Northwestern (7,700), Vanderbilt (6,319), Villanova (6,295) and Wake Forest (4,263) have enrollments under 10,000.

BIG EAST A BEAST... In 2006-07, the Friars will play their 28th season in the BIG EAST, the largest and arguably the toughest basketball conference in the nation. In 2005-06, the BIG EAST had a record eight teams earn bids to the NCAA Tournament.

McDERMOTT SET PC FRESHMAN REBOUNDING MARK... Sophomore Geoffrey McDermott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) had an impressive freshman campaign for the Friars on the boards - setting a new PC freshman record with 243 rebounds on the season, breaking the mark of 236 set by Bill Eason in 1975.

CURRY DELIVERS... Sophomore Sharaud Curry (Gainesville, Ga.) started 23 of the team's 27 games and led the team in assists (3.52 apg) and free throw percentage (89.1 percent) last season. He also finished third on the team in scoring (11.9 ppg) and field goal percentage (42.8 percent). His 89.1 percent mark from the free throws line ranks second all-time amongst Friar freshman.

TIM WELSH RADIO SHOW... The Tim Welsh Radio Show debuted on Thursday, November 30 from McFadden's Restaurant in Providence. The show airs on 99.7 and 790 The Score from 7:00-8:00 p.m. The show will return on January 10 for the next eight weeks.

RENOVATIONS TO THE DUNK!'... In the spring of 2006, renovations began on the Dunkin' Donuts Center that are due to be completed in 2008. The \$62 million project enhances almost every aspect of the arena and will include luxury boxes, new seats, a new video scoreboard, a new sound system, new concessions stands, new lockerrooms, and a new weight training and fitness area. The most notable part of the renovations occurred over the summer when the new video scoreboard was installed.

PROVIDENCE TO HOST NCAA TOURNAMENT IN 2010... It was announced on July 6 by the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee that the Dunkin' Donuts Center - Providence will serve as one of the sites for the First and Second Rounds of the 2010 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament. Providence College will serve as the host institution for the First and Second Rounds which will be played on March 18-21, 2010 at the Dunkin' Donuts Center - Providence. It will mark the first time the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament has been held at the Dunkin' Donuts Center since 1996.

2006-07 PROVIDENCE COLLEGE BASKETBALL - Tim Welsh



In his 12 seasons as a collegiate head coach, Tim Welsh's squads have produced an impressive 207-139 mark (.598). Since his hiring at Providence in 1998, Welsh has led the Friars to a 137-117 record, which includes two NCAA and two NIT appearances. With his 137 wins as a Friar head coach, Welsh ranks fourth all-time at Providence behind coaching legends Joe Mullaney (18 seasons - 319 victories), Dave Gavitt (10 seasons - 209 victories) and Al McClellan (11 seasons - 147 victories).

Over the past two seasons, the Friars have played some of the toughest teams in nation. In fact, the Friars' schedule was ranked as the 12th toughest in 2005 and the 19th most difficult in

2006. In 2006, Welsh's starting five featured two freshmen, two sophomores and a senior. The two freshmen, Sharaud Curry and Geoff McDermott, earned BIG EAST All-Rookie team honors and McDermott was one of the top rebounders in the nation.

His 2005 team played nine games against ranked opponents and 16 games versus teams that qualified for the 2005 NCAA Tournament. PC recorded a 14-17 mark, which included a 3-1 record and a third-place finish in the Preseason NIT. Welsh's top player, senior All-American Ryan Gomes, became the College's all-time leading scorer (2,138 points) and the first Friar ever to earn consecutive First Team All-BIG EAST honors. He also became just the second Friar ever to lead the league in scoring (23.2 ppg).

Welsh's goal to build the Friars into one of the top basketball programs in the country came closer to fruition in 2004 as he led the team to one of its most productive seasons in 30 years. The Friars recorded their second 20-win season under Welsh and also made their second trip to the NCAA Tournament under his tutelage. Providence earned its highest seed ever in the NCAA Tournament as the team was picked as a five seed. In BIG EAST action, the squad also had a monumental season tying the team record for league wins with an 11-5 mark and finishing in third place in the conference standings. The Friars recorded a 3-2 mark over ranked teams and a 4-2 record against teams that reached the 2004 NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen. The team achieved two significant firsts in 2004 when it defeated fourth-ranked and eventual national champion Connecticut, 66-56, in Hartford on January 24, 2004 to post the Friars' first win ever on the road over a top-four team and when it defeated 18th-ranked Syracuse, 74-61, for its first win ever over a defending national champion. Welsh's squad's success did not go unnoticed in 2004 as the team spent nine weeks in the national polls and climbed as high as 12th in the Associated Press Poll and 13th in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. It marked the highest the Friars had been ranked since 1978.

In 2004, Welsh saw Gomes blossom into one of the top players ever to wear a Friar uniform. Gomes averaged 18.9 points and 9.4 rebounds per game. He earned First Team All-BIG EAST accolades and received nine All-America honors, including Associated Press First Team. Gomes became just the fourth Friar ever to earn Associated Press First Team honors and the first since Marvin Barnes earned the distinction in 1974.

The 2002-03 season was another successful campaign for Welsh as the Friar bench boss. His squad won eight of its last 11 games, including one in the BIG EAST Tournament and two in the NIT, to finish with an 18-14 mark overall. In league play, the Friars finished in third place in the BIG EAST East Division with an 8-8 record.

In 2002, Welsh led a Friar team that was devastated by injuries to a 15-16 mark. His star senior John Linehan had a very impressive season. Under Welsh's guidance, Linehan established the NCAA and BIG EAST career steals records. For his efforts, Linehan earned his second BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year honor, as well as NABC Defensive Player of the Year, ESPN.com Defensive Player of the Year, Second Team All-BIG EAST honors and Honorable Mention All-America accolades.

In 2000-01, Welsh guided the Friars to one of their most successful seasons ever. The squad posted a 21-10 mark and earned its first bid to the NCAA Tournament since 1997. Welsh also guided the team to one of its best seasons ever in BIG EAST competition as the Friars posted a school record 11 BIG EAST wins. The team finished in second place with an 11-5 mark in the BIG EAST East Division.

Another one of Welsh's accomplishments during his highly productive third season as the Friars' bench boss was that he had the team ranked No. 25 in the Associated Press Poll on February 19. It marked the first time the Friars had earned an in-season ranking since January 24, 1989.

One of the reasons for the Friars' in-season ranking was their monumental 103-79 victory over the 12th-ranked Georgetown Hoyas on February 10 at the Dunkin' Donuts Center. Welsh's Friars became the first team to score

100 or more points against Georgetown in a BIG EAST game. Also, the 24-point Friar win was the largest deficit ever for the Hoyas in a BIG EAST loss.

The 2000-01 season also was significant for Welsh as he earned his 100th career coaching victory. On November 29, 2000, Providence defeated Florida International, 74-55, at the Dunkin' Donuts Center for Welsh's 100th victory.

Welsh continues to be regarded as one of the game's top recruiters. Welsh and his staff consistently find recruits who will be able to complement an already solid core of players.

Once being named head coach at Providence, it did not take long before Welsh found success in the Ocean State. His first Friar squad posted a 16-14 mark with a team that featured no regular player over 6-7. The Friars were 9-9 on the year in the BIG EAST including five league road wins. Early in the season, PC knocked off four Top-25 teams in a row (Rhode Island, Pittsburgh, Purdue and Syracuse) on the way to the Friars' first post-season appearance since 1997.

The Tim Welsh Era at Providence College officially began on April 2, 1998 when the Massena, New York native was named the 13th head basketball coach in the school's storied basketball history. The announcement was made by former Providence College President Reverend Philip A. Smith.

In making the appointment, Father Smith said, "We sought the opinions of some of the most knowledgeable people in the country about college basketball and coaching talent. Specifically, we wanted a coach capable of sustaining the rich tradition of Providence College basketball and, equally important, an outstanding person who would fully embrace the College's educational philosophy. Tim Welsh was at the top of everyone's list."

Welsh has brought stability to the Friar basketball program. Following a highly successful season in 2000-01, he signed a seven-year contract extension, which ensured that Welsh will be leading the Friars through the 2007-08 season. After his success in 2004, his contract again was extended through the 2009 season.

In the spring of 2001, Welsh expressed his excitement about his future with the Friars. "The administration has stepped up and made a statement to support the program. I love it here. My roots are here, I agree with the mission of the college and I enjoy living in Rhode Island. I'm excited about staying at Providence College as the head coach of the basketball program."

Welsh, formerly the head coach at Iona College, came to Providence with the task of revitalizing one of the most successful programs in New England. In his six seasons at the helm, Welsh has brought a high-energy and up-tempo style of play to Providence.

Welsh achieved a great deal of success in just three seasons as the head coach at Iona, leading the Gaels to three consecutive 20-win seasons. During that time, his teams turned in a 70-22 overall mark (76.1%), including a 27-win season in 1997-98. His 1997-98 squad was the first Iona team to advance to the NCAA Tournament since 1985.

During the 1997-98 campaign, Iona recorded just six losses while knocking off two BIG EAST opponents (Providence and Rutgers) and one Atlantic 10 foe (Fordham). The Gaels also put together the nation's longest winning streak - 15 games during the season. In the three-game, MAAC Tournament, Iona led in all three games for all but 11 seconds with the closest game being an 11-point win over Loyola (Md.).

In three years with Welsh calling the shots, Iona advanced to post-season action each year, going to the National Invitation Tournament in 1996 and 1997 and the NCAA Tournament in 1998.

A two-time Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Coach of the Year (1997, 1998), Welsh also received 1996-97 NABC District II Coach of the Year honors and the 1995-96 Peter A. Carlesimo Award as the Metropolitan Area's Division I Coach of the Year.

Welsh served as an interim head coach at Iona for 10 games during the 1994-95 season, replacing his father, Hall of Fame coach Jerry Welsh, who stepped down following that season due to medical reasons. Prior to that, Tim had served as an assistant on his father's staff for four years.

No stranger to the BIG EAST, Tim Welsh served as an assistant coach to Jim Boeheim at Syracuse for three seasons (1988-91). During that time, Syracuse was 82-21, won two BIG EAST Conference Championships, the 1988 Preseason NIT Championship, and made three trips to the NCAA Tournament.

The 45-year old head coach got his start in college coaching at Iona where he served as a volunteer assistant to Pat Kennedy in 1985. Following that season, he became an assistant on Kennedy's staff at Florida State for two years before moving on to Syracuse.

Welsh played his college basketball under his father at Potsdam State. He was a co-captain his senior year and helped his team reach the Final Four in 1984.
