HEAD COACH TIM WELSH

In seven seasons as a collegiate head coach, Tim Welsh's squads have produced an impressive 133-81 mark (.621). Since his hiring at Providence in 1998, Welsh has led the Friars to a 63-59 record, which includes NCAA and NIT appearances.

Entering his fifth season with the Friars, Welsh has brought stability to Friar basketball program. Following a highly successful season in 2000-01, he signed a seven-year contract extension, which ensured that Welsh will be leading the Friars through the 2007-08 season.

After signing his contract extension in the spring of 2001, Welsh expressed his excitement about his future with the Friars. "The administration has stepped up and made a statement to support the program. I love it here. My roots are here, I agree with the mission of the college and I enjoy living in Rhode Island. I'm excited about staying at Providence College as the head coach of the basketball program."

Welsh, formerly the head coach at Iona College, came to Providence with the task of revitalizing one of the most successful programs in New England. In his four seasons at the helm, Welsh has brought a high-energy and up-tempo style of play to Providence.

Last season, Welsh led a Friar team that was devastated by injuries to a 15-16 mark. His star senior John Linehan had a very impressive season. Under Welsh's tutelage, Linehan established the NCAA and BIG EAST career steals records. For his efforts, Linehan earned his second BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year honor, as well as NABC Defensive Player of the Year, ESPN.com Defensive Player of the Year, Second Team All-BIG EAST honors and Honorable Mention All-America accolades.

In 2000-01, Welsh led the Friars to one of their most successful campaigns ever. The squad posted a 21-10 mark and earned its first bid to the NCAA Tournament since 1997. Welsh also guided the team to its best season ever in BIG EAST competition as the Friars posted a school record 11 BIG EAST wins. The team finished in second place with an 11-5 mark in the BIG EAST East Division.

Another one of Welsh's accomplishments during his highly productive third season as the Friars' bench boss was that he had the team ranked No. 25 in the Associated Press Poll on February 19. It marked the first time the Friars had earned an in-season ranking since January 24, 1989.

One of the reasons for the Friars' in-season ranking was their monumental 103-79 victory over the 12th-ranked Georgetown Hoyas on February 10 at the Dunkin' Donuts Center. Welsh's Friars became the first team to score 100 or more points against Georgetown in a BIG EAST game. Also, the 24-point Friar win was the largest deficit ever for the Hoyas in a BIG EAST loss. In the win, Welsh had the team flying in the first half as the squad scored a BIG EAST record 61 points in the first 20 minutes of action.

The 2000-01 season also was significant for Welsh as he earned his 100th career coaching victory. On November 29, 2000, Providence defeated Florida International, 74-55, at the Dunkin' Donuts Center for Welsh's 100th victory.

Welsh continues to be regarded as one of the game's top recruiters. Welsh and his staff consistently find recruits who will be able to complement an already solid core of players.

Once being named head coach at Providence, it did not take long before Welsh found success in the Ocean State. His first Friar squad posted a 16-14 mark with a team that featured no regular player over 6-7. The Friars were 9-9 on the year in the BIG EAST including five league road wins. Early in the season, PC knocked off four Top-25 teams in a row (Rhode Island, Pittsburgh, Purdue and Syracuse) on the way to the Friars' first post-season appearance since 1997.

The Tim Welsh Era at Providence College officially began on April 2, 1998 when the Massena, New York native was named the 13th head basketball coach in the school's storied basketball history. The announcement was made by Providence College President Reverend Philip A. Smith.

In making the appointment, Father Smith said, "We sought the opinions of some of the most knowledgeable people in the country about college basketball and coaching talent. Specifically, we wanted a coach capable of sustaining the rich tradition of Providence College basketball and, equally important, an outstanding person who would fully embrace the College's educational philosophy. Tim Welsh was at the top of everyone's list."

Welsh achieved a great deal of success in just three seasons as the head coach at Iona, leading the Gaels to three consecutive 20-win seasons. During that time, his teams turned in a 70-22 overall mark (76.1%), including a 27-win season in 1997-98. His 1997-98 squad was the first Iona team to advance to the NCAA Tournament since 1985.

During the 1997-98 campaign, Iona recorded just six losses while knocking off two BIG EAST opponents (Providence and Rutgers) and one Atlantic 10 foe (Fordham). The Gaels also put together the nation's longest winning streak - 15 games during the season. In the three-game, MAAC Tournament, Iona led in all three games for all but 11 seconds with the closest game being an 11-point win over Loyola (Md.).

In three years with Welsh calling the shots, Iona advanced to post-season action each year, going to the National Invitation Tournament in 1996 and 1997 and the NCAA Tournament in 1998.

A two-time Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Coach of the Year (1997, 1998), Welsh also received 1996-97 NABC District II Coach of the Year honors and the 1995-96 Peter A. Carlesimo Award as the Metropolitan Area's Division I Coach of the Year.

Welsh served as an interim head coach at Iona for 10 games during the 1994-95 season, replacing his father, Hall of Fame coach Jerry Welsh, who stepped down following that season due to medical reasons. Prior to that Tim had served as an assistant on his father's staff for four years.

No stranger to the BIG EAST, Tim Welsh served as an assistant coach to Jim Boeheim at Syracuse for three seasons (1988-91). During that time, Syracuse was 82-21, won two BIG EAST Conference Championships, the 1988 Preseason NIT Championship, and made three trips to the NCAA Tournament.

The 42-year old head coach got his start in college coaching at Iona where he served as a volunteer assistant to Pat Kennedy in 1985. Following that season, he became an assistant on Kennedy's staff at Florida State for two years before moving on to Syracuse.

Welsh played his college basketball under his father at Potsdam State. He was a co-captain his senior year and helped his team reach Final Four in 1984.

Welsh's team will feature 12 returning players and two newcomers. The majority of the returning veterans have seen significant playing time in their careers at Providence and they have played in some of the BIG EAST's toughest arenas.

Last season, Welsh's team was devastated by injuries. Providence had five players miss a combined 49 games with injuries in 2001-02. The positive side to that situation was that many of the younger players gained valuable playing time. Those players gained experience that could prove to be very beneficial this season. In fact, 10 of the 12 returners have started games while wearing a Friar uniform.

This group of talented and experienced players are hungry to succeed. The Friars entered last season with high expectations, but were never able to reach their potential due to the injuries. Now, the team is ready to prove that they can be a force in the BIG EAST. In 2001, the Friars finished second in the BIG EAST East Division and were selected to participate in the NCAA Tournament. The eight players on the 2002-03 squad that had an opportunity to experience the thrill and excitement of the NCAA Tournament two years ago have a new appreciation for what it takes to reach the "Big Dance." They have inspired their teammates and they all want to make a trip to March Madness!

THE BACKCOURT

The last time Providence College entered the season without point guard John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) on the roster was 1996-97. Linehan concluded his impressive career with the Friars in 2002 as the all-time NCAA steals leader (385 steals), the BIG EAST career steals leader (226) and the BIG EAST single-season steals leader (77). For his efforts, Linehan earned some of the most prestigious awards in the nation last season, including National Association of Basketball Coaches' Defensive Player of the Year Award, BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year, ESPN.com Defensive Player of the Year and Associated Press Honorable Mention All-America.

Although the Friars will miss Linehan, senior Abdul Mills (Brooklyn, N.Y.) has the experience and ability to lead the Friars. One of the team's tri-captains last season, Mills has been a three-year starter for Providence. During his career as a Friar, the 6-foot-3-inch guard has started 74 of the 90 games he has played. Last season, he started 28 games and led the team in

scoring, averaging 14.5 points per game. He scored 20 or more points in five games last season and recorded double figures in scoring in 25 of the 29 games he played. One of his top performances was a 27-point effort in a 69-60 win over UTEP on November 21, 2001 at the Las Vegas Invitational. Mills, a talented left-handed jump shooter, also led the squad in three pointers with 61 in 2001-02. He has excellent quickness and knows how to create his own shot. In addition to his shooting ability, he can penetrate to the basket or find an open teammate on the wing. A talented offensive player, he is just 11 points shy of becoming the 36th player in Providence College history to score 1,000 or more points.

Joining Mills in the backcourt will be junior Sheiku Kabba (Bronx, N.Y.). Kabba, who is very athletic, came off the bench to replace Linehan at the point guard position for the last two seasons. He has gained tremendous composure practicing against Linehan's defense.

With Linehan gone, Kabba is the team's top returning point guard. He has shown steady improvement on offense and defense. Last season, Kabba averaged 5.6 points, 1.8 rebounds and 1.3 assists per game. In the final game last season, he put in a strong effort with 12 points and three rebounds against Georgetown in the BIG EAST Tournament.

Senior Kareem Hayletts (Bergenfield, N.J.) will add depth to the backcourt. Hayletts is entering his fifth season with the Friar basketball team. Hayletts regained a year of eligibility through a medical hardship waiver after a knee injury caused him to miss all but one game during his freshman season. Last season, he saw action in a career-high 21 games and played an average of three minutes per game. Hayletts plays tenacious defense and often was inserted into the lineup during crucial moments of a game when Head Coach Tim Welsh was looking for a defensive stop. He helped the Friars defeat

2002-03 FRIAR OUTLOOK

Boston College in 2002 when he grabbed a defensive rebound in the final four seconds of the game, drew a foul and converted one of his free throws as the squad earned a 64-61 victory on February 2.

Freshman Donnie McGrath (Katonah, N.Y.) comes to Providence as a highly recruited player out of John F. Kennedy Catholic. The 6-foot-4-inch point guard was ranked as one of the top-100 seniors in the country by several recruiting services, including PrepStars.com. McGrath recorded a school-record 1,725 points at John F. Kennedy. His senior season, he averaged 30.9 points, 7.6 assists and 6.5 rebounds per game. He also scored more than 40 points three times during his senior year. McGrath has the ability to shoot from behind the three-point arc. In 2001-02, he established a school record at John F. Kennedy with 96 three-point baskets. He also is skilled at distributing the ball. In four seasons McGrath recorded more than 500 assists at John F. Kennedy. With his stellar play he earned the 2002 Westchester County Mr. Basketball honor and was named Player of the Year by the Westchester Journal News. He also was an all-star at the Adidas ABCD All-American Camp and was a top-100 finalist for McDonald All-America honors.

THE FRONTCOURT

The Friars will have great depth in the frontcourt this season. It should be a battle to determine starting roles as the squad is loaded with talent.

Junior Romuald Augustin (Montreal, Quebec) enters his fourth season with the Friars. Augustin is a team leader on and off the floor. The 6-foot-7-inch small forward missed 26 games last season with a hip injury. A healthy Augustin will be an important element to the Friars' success. In addition to being one of the team's top defensive players, the versatile Augustin also contributes on the offensive end of the floor. He can score from the outside and he can drive to the basket. He also has a strong inside game. Augustin had an impressive season in 2001-02, when he averaged 9.2 points and 2.7 rebounds a game.

Another forward with exceptional talent is sophomore Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.). Gomes was one of the top rookies in the BIG EAST last season. He finished second on the team in scoring (13.8 ppg) and led the squad in rebounding (7.8 rpg) in 2001-02. Gomes ranks second all-time for Friar freshmen in scoring average (13.8 ppg), field goal percentage (.559), free throws (68), free throw attempts (111) and rebounding (7.8 rpg). In recognition of his strong play, Gomes was a unanimous selection for the BIG EAST All-Rookie Team. He has a very strong inside game. He had a career-best game against Miami when he scored 31 points and grabbed 12 rebounds on January 19, 2002. His

31 points set a Providence single-game record for freshmen. The 6-foot-7-inch, 238-pound power forward also saw limited action at center last year.

In addition to Gomes, juniors Leland Anderson (Attleboro, Mass.) and Marcus Douthit (Syracuse, N.Y.) will help the Friars down low. Anderson is entering his third season in the Friar system and his size and muscle will be needed on the offensive and defensive glass. After a freshman year at Michigan, the 6-foot-8-inch, 245-pound forward transferred to Providence. He sat out in 2000-01 and got his first taste of BIG EAST action last season. Although he was slowed by a knee operation in January, Anderson returned to the lineup in February and contributed during the final weeks of the season. In 20 games, he averaged 3.6 points and 2.1 rebounds. Douthit is the tallest member of the Friar lineup. At 6-feet-10-inches tall, Douthit will need to be a rebounding force for the Friars to be successful. He is a very agile center. In 30 games last season, Douthit averaged 5.2 points, 4.2 rebounds and 1.8 blocks per game.

Junior forwards Maris Laksa (Ventspils, Latvia) and Chris Anrin (Varmdo, Sweden) are two excellent shooters with size to shoot over opposing guards. After a strong rookie campaign in which he shot 45.8 percent from behind the three-point arc, Laksa was plagued by injuries his sophomore season. He missed 11 games with a knee injury and a stress fracture in his foot. The coaches are anticipating a healthy Laksa will be a key component to the lineup. He averaged 9.6 points and 5.1 rebounds in 18 games last season. Laksa also can contribute in the paint for the Friars. He had several strong rebounding performances in 2001-02, including a career-high 14-rebound effort against Rutgers on January 22. Since arriving at Providence his freshman season, the 6-foot-9-inch, 222-pound forward has worked hard at increasing his size and strength. Anrin is a pure shooter, who works hard at getting open shots from behind the three-point arc. Last season, he averaged 6.1 points per game while starting 21 of 29 games. Anrin hit 45 of his 60 field goals from behind the three-point line. He had a career best 20 points against Syracuse on January 5, 2002, which included a 6-10 performance from three-point territory.

Sophomores Rob Sanders (New London, Conn.) and Tuukka Kotti (Forssa, Finland) round out the returners in the frontcourt. Sanders is a very exciting player. With an impressive vertical leap, he brought the Dunkin' Donut Center fans to their feet many times last season with thunderous jams. One of the most athletic players to wear a Friar uniform since Jamel Thomas, the 6-foot, 7-inch Sanders averaged 5.7 points and 4.0 rebounds last season. He can hit a mid-range jumper and he can slash to the basket. Sanders also performed well on the defensive end. With Augustin out of the lineup last

season, Sanders was called upon to guard many of the opponents' top forwards. As Kotti developed confidence and adjusted to the college game, his performance improved throughout the 2001-02 season. In the final game of the regular season, he posted a season-high nine points at Notre Dame on March 2. Kotti appeared in 24 games and averaged 1.8 points and 1.3 rebounds. At 6-feet-9-inches, he can provide a presence inside for the Friars and is able to hit outside shots.

Freshman Herbert Hill (Kinston, N.C.) is the only rookie in the frontcourt. With so much depth and experience in front of Hill, he will be able to learn from some of the top forwards in the BIG EAST. Hill comes to Providence after playing at Kinston High School in North Carolina. A 6-foot-9-inch, 205-pound forward, he averaged 14 points, nine rebounds and six blocks as a senior at Kinston. Hill's strengths are his rebounding and shot blocking skills. He also has the ability to handle the ball in transition.

Senior Stephen Traugott (New Rochelle, N.Y.) is a walk-on who provides added depth in the frontcourt and as a practice player. He is a hard-working player. Traugott is entering his third season with the Friars.

OVERVIEW

Head Coach Tim Welsh has a solid nucleus of players returning for the 2002-03 season. These veterans understand what is necessary for the Friars to be successful.

Abdul Mills and Romuald Augustin are two veterans who will provide leadership for the team. Each player has spent three years in Welsh's system and they understand their roles.

Sheiku Kabba, Kareem Hayletts, Chris Anrin, Maris Laksa, Marcus Douthit, Leland Anderson and Stephen Traugott also are returning upperclassmen who will need to use their experience and leadership to help make the Friars a better team this season.

Ryan Gomes had a strong rookie season. He has the potential to be one of the top young players in the BIG EAST this season. His scoring and rebounding will be an important aspect of the Friar offense.

Rob Sanders and Tuukka Kotti also had solid rookie seasons and should be ready to make a consistent contribution in 2002-03.

Newcomers Donnie McGrath and Herbert Hill will add depth to an already strong team. McGrath enters the program as very highly regarded recruit with skills and ability. He should help improve the backcourt.

The 2002-03 Friars should provide plenty of excitement this season. Tim Welsh's squad will be ready to make a run at the BIG EAST title and a trip to the NCAA Tournament.
