LINEHAN IN PURSUIT OF MURDOCK'S NCAA CAREER STEAL MARK... John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) ranks second all-time in NCAA history with 373 career steals in 119 games. The senior guard needs four steals to surpass former Friar Eric Murdock (1987-91-376 steals) as the NCAA all-time steals leader. He ranks first on the BIG EAST all-time steal list with 219. Linehan leads the nation in steals with 127 in 28 games this season. He also ranks second in the nation in average steals per game (4.5).

SENIOR GAME... Saturday will mark the final home game for Friar seniors John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) and Brian Schnurr (Fairfield, Conn.). Senior Kareem Hayletts (Bergenfield, N.J.) has one more season of eligibility remaining and will return to the Friar lineup next season. Linehan has played in 119 career games with the Friars since joining the team in 1998. Schnurr has played in five games as a Friar since walking on the team his sophomore season (1999-00). It also will be the final home game for Friar Managers Kevin Kurbec (Smithfield, R.I.) and Sean Radican (Providence, R.I.). Kurbec is in his fourth season with the Friars and Radican is in his third season as a manager.

FRIARS VERSUS MIAMI... On Tuesday, the Friars will play the University of Miami Hurricanes at the Dunkin' Donuts Center. The Friars and the Hurricanes have met 24 times in the all-time series with Providence holding a 13-11 lead. PC has posted a 6-5 mark all-time at home against Miami, a 6-6 record at Miami and 1-0 record on neutral courts against the Hurricanes. The two teams first met on December 8, 1962 when the Hurricanes earned an 82-75 win at Providence. In the first meeting between the two teams this season, Miami defeated the Friars, 102-96, in overtime at the Miami Arena on January 19. Providence posted a 1-1 mark last season against the Hurricanes. In the Friars' most recent win against the Hurricanes, Providence defeated Miami, 80-70, at the Miami Arena on January 28, 2001. Providence is 3-3 in the last six meetings between the two teams. PC has posted a 9-9 mark all-time against Miami in BIG EAST play.

2001-02 PROVIDENCE COLLEGE BASKETBALL

SCOUTING THE HURRICANES... Miami enters Tuesday's game with a 21-6 mark overall and an 8-6 record in BIG EAST play. In their most recent game, the Hurricanes were defeated by Notre Dame, 90-77, at Miami on February 23. The Hurricanes are led by sophomore Darius Rice (Jackson, Miss.). Rice is averaging 14.8 points per game. Junior forward James Jones (Miami, Fla.) also is having a strong season, averaging 13.1 points and leading the team in rebounding (6.5 rebounds per game).

THIS SEASON VS. MIAMI... On January 19, Providence was defeated in overtime, 102-96, by 24th-ranked Miami at Miami, Fla. It marked the first time Providence allowed 100 points in a game since a 104-79 loss to St. John's on February 15, 1999. The Friars held a 48-37 lead at halftime as the team shot 57.6 percent in the first 20 minutes of action. Miami turned up its offense in the second half as it shot 72 percent and held an 89-86 lead with five seconds remaining. However, junior Abdul Mills (Brooklyn, N.Y.) hit a three-point basket with one second remaining in the game to force Friars into their first overtime game since a 70-60 loss at West Virginia on January 30, 2000. Miami outscored the Friars, 13-7, in the extra period to give the Hurricanes the victory. Freshman Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) registered a team-high 31 points, a game-high 12 rebounds and four steals in the loss. His 31 points set a Providence single-game record for most points by a freshman. With his 31 points, Gomes became the first Friar to register 30 or more points in a game since Donta Wade recorded 38 points against Notre Dame on February 23, 2000. Senior John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) finished with 15 points, eight rebounds and a game-high nine assists. Mills added 18 points and four assists.

LAST SEASON VS. MIAMI... Last season, the Friars posted a 1-1 mark against the Hurricanes. On January 16, 2001, Miami defeated PC, 78-64, at Providence. PC shot just 35.6 percent from the floor in the loss. Marcus Barnes and Darius Rice scored 20 and 19 points, respectively, to lead the Hurricanes. Romuald Augustin (Montreal, Quebec) scored 20 points for the Friars. On January 28, 2001, PC defeated Miami, 80-70, at Miami Arena. The Friars were led by Karim Shabazz (Far Rockaway, N.Y.) who recorded his second double-double of the season with 11 points and a game-high 12 rebounds. He also recorded six blocks. Erron Maxey (Lake Elsinore, Calif.) and sophomore Romuald

Augustin (Montreal, Quebec) each scored 13 points in the win. Augustin scored nine of his 13 points from behind the three-point arc as he shot 3-4 from three-point territory. Chris Anrin (Varmdo, Sweden) added 12 points off the bench.

FRIARS DEFEATED BY HOKIES... On February 23, Virginia Tech defeated the Friars, 69-64, at Blacksburg, Va. It marked the Hokies' first BIG EAST victory against the Friars. The short-handed Friars were missing starters Abdul Mills (Brooklyn, N.Y.) and Maris Laksa (Ventspils, Latvia), who were each out of the lineup with an injury. Freshman Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) led the Friars to a 33-26 first-half lead as he scored 12 points and grabbed six rebounds in the first 20 minutes of action. With 19:23 remaining in the second half, senior John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) recorded his 68th steal in conference action this season and established a BIG EAST Conference record. Linehan broke Allen Iverson's record of 67 steals in BIG EAST action, which he set in 1996. The Friars held an 11-point lead (41-30) with 16:09 remaining in game, but could not hold off the Hokies. Virginia Tech went on a 21-5 run and took a 47-46 lead with 11:07 remaining in the game. The Friars could not regain the lead over the final 10 minutes of the game and the Hokies earned the win. Gomes finished with a team-high 15 points and seven rebounds. Linehan registered 14 points, six rebounds, six assists and five steals in the loss. Sophomore Sheiku Kabba (Bronx, N.Y.) added 11 points and five assists.

LINEHAN SETS BIG EAST SINGLE-SEASON STEAL MARK... With 19:23 remaining in the second half of PC's 69-64 loss to Virginia Tech, senior John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) recorded his 68th steal in conference action this season and established a BIG EAST Conference record. Linehan broke Allen Iverson's record of 67 steals in BIG EAST action, which he set in 1996. Linehan also has set the BIG EAST single-game steals record (11) and the BIG EAST career steals record this season (219).

FRIARS VERSUS RANKED TEAMS... Providence College has posted a 0-3 mark this season against ranked teams. In PC's most recent game against a ranked team, the Friars were defeated by No. 24/20 Miami, 102-96, in overtime on January 19. On January 5, PC was defeated by No. 16/10 Syracuse, 73-66. On November 19, the Friars were defeated by No. 16/16 Oklahoma State (83-65) at Las Vegas, Nevada. Since

1958-59, Providence has recorded 76 wins over teams ranked in the top-20. Last season, the Friars registered two wins over top-20 teams when they defeated 12th-ranked UConn (81-68) on January 13 and 12th-ranked Georgetown (103-79) on February 10.

FRIARS ON NATIONAL TV... Tuesday's game against Miami, which will be televised on ESPN2, will be the Friars' 134th game on national television. It will be the fourth of PC's five games on national television this season (two games on ESPN, two games on ESPN2 and one game on CBS). In PC's first game on national television this season (ESPN), the Friars were defeated by Texas, 68-48, on January 7. In the Friars' second game on national television, Providence defeated Boston College, 64-61, on February 2 in a game televised by ESPN. The win against BC ended PC's six-game losing streak in games televised by ESPN. In PC's most recent game on national television, the Friars were defeated by UConn, 67-56, on February 5 on ESPN2. PC has registered a 53-80 mark (.376) all-time in games on national TV. The Friars have posted a 31-47 mark in ESPN games and an 8-8 record in games shown on ESPN2. Providence also has recorded a 7-6 record on NBC and a 7-19 mark in games on CBS. Last season, PC registered a 1-3 mark in games on national TV, including a 0-2 mark in games televised by ESPN. The Friars' first appearance ever on national TV was an 88-72 loss to Bradley in the NIT at Madison Square Garden on March 22, 1960. The game was televised on NBC. The Friars' first game ever on ESPN was a 60-51 loss to Washington on December 19, 1980 at the Providence Civic Center (Dunkin' Donuts Center). PC's first game ever on ESPN2 was a 99-77 loss to Connecticut on February 6, 1996.

SANDERS/GOMES COMBO... Freshmen Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) and Rob Sanders (New London, Conn.) have been instrumental to the Friars' success this season. In Providence's 72-64 win against Villanova on February 23, Sanders and Gomes combined to score 33 points and grab 15 rebounds.

MILLS AND LINEHAN CLOSING IN ON 1,000 POINTS... Junior Abdul Mills (Brooklyn, N.Y.) and senior John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) each are closing in on the 1,000-point plateau. Mills has scored 374 points this season and has 943 career points in 87 games. Linehan has recorded 356 points in 2001-02 and has registered 959 points in his career. Linehan and Mills rank 38th and 39th, respectively, all-time at Providence College in scoring. In 75 seasons of Providence College basketball, 35 players have scored 1,000 or more points in their careers.

PROVIDENCE ALL-TIME... In 75 seasons of PC basketball, the team has posted a 1,158-737 (.611) mark. The team's all-time record at the Dunkin' Donuts Center is 369-145 (.718).

LINEHAN REACHES 100 ASSIST, 100 REBOUNDS AND 100 STEALS IN 2001-02... On February 19, senior John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) recorded his 100th rebound of the season in PC's 72-64 win against Villanova. Linehan became just the second Friar ever to register 100 or more steals, rebounds and assists in one season. Linehan has registered 127 steals, 126 assists and 106 rebounds this season. Eric Murdock is the only other Friar to accomplish this feat. In 1990-91, Murdock recorded 111 steals, 148 assists and 168 rebounds.

LINEHAN SETS BIG EAST CAREER STEALS RECORD... With 17:51 remaining in the second half of PC's 67-56 loss to Connecticut on February 5, senior John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) made his second steal of the game and his 198th BIG EAST career steal to become the league's all-time steals leader. Linehan surpassed former Friar Eric Murdock who registered 197 steals in his BIG EAST career. Linehan finished the game with three steals. He now has 219 steals in BIG EAST action.

LINEHAN SETS PROVIDENCE SINGLE SEASON STEAL MARK... Senior John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) set the Providence College single-season steals mark when he made his 112th steal of the season with 5:23 remaining in the game in PC's 77-69 win against Virginia Tech on February 9. In 28 games this season, Linehan has recorded 127 steals (4.5 steals per game). The former PC single-season record of 111 steals was set by Eric Murdock in 1990-91 season. Linehan is just the third PC player to ever register 100 or more steals in a season.

2001-02 PROVIDENCE COLLEGE BASKETBALL

LINEHAN SETS BIG EAST AND PC SINGLE-GAME STEAL MARK...

On January 22, in a 70-55 win against Rutgers, Friar senior John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) registered a Providence College and BIG EAST single-game record 11 steals. Linehan broke the Conference record of 10 steals established by Allen Iverson of Georgetown against Miami on January 13, 1996. The Providence College record of 10 steals in a game was set by God Shammgod on December 21, 1996 against Brown. Linehan's previous career high for steals in a game was nine. The NCAA single-game steal record is 13, which was reached twice by Oklahoma's Mookie Blaylock (versus Centenary on December 12, 1987 and versus Loyola Marymount on December 17, 1988).

LINEHAN SECOND IN THE NATION IN STEALS PER GAME...

Senior John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) is second in the nation in average steals per game. Linehan has made 127 steals in 28 games this season for an average of 4.5 steals per game. He trails Desmond Cambridge of Alabama A&M, who leads the nation with a 5.4 steals per game average (113 steals in 21 games).

LINEHAN OVER 400 ASSISTS... Senior guard John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) recorded six assists in PC's 69-64 loss to Virginia Tech on February 23. For his career, he ranks eighth all-time at Providence in assists with 439 in 119 games.

FRIARS IN OVERTIME... Providence has posted a 1-1 mark in overtime games this season. On January 26, the Friars defeated St. John's, 75-70, in overtime. For the Friars, it was their first overtime victory in BIG EAST Conference action since a 90-84 win at Villanova on February 20, 1999. It also was their 93rd overtime game all-time. Providence has a 46-47 record all-time in overtime games, including a 38-40 mark in games decided in the first overtime period.

WHEN THE FRIARS SHOOT 50 PERCENT OR HIGHER...

The Friars are 4-0 this season in games when they have recorded a 50 percent or higher field goal percentage. Most recently, PC shot 50.0 percent from the field (24-48) and earned a 78-57 win against St. John's on January 12. PC's top shooting performance of the season occurred in its 94-63 win against Central Connecticut on December 30, 2001. In that win, the Friars shot 33-60 (55.0 percent) from the field.

WHEN THE FRIARS SHOOT UNDER 40 PERCENT...

PC has shot under 40 percent in 13 of its 28 games this season. The team has posted a 5-8 mark in games when it has a field goal percentage under 40 percent. PC shot a

season-low 29.4 percent from the field in a 69-62 loss to UConn on January 16. In the 15 games this season that the team has shot 40 percent or higher from the field, it has registered a 9-6 record.

LINEHAN CHASING NCAA ALL-TIME STEAL RECORD...

Senior guard John Linehan (Chester, Pa.), who registered a PC and BIG EAST record 11 steals in PC's 70-55 win against Rutgers on January 22, has 373 career steals. He has a chance to become the NCAA all-time steals leader this season. He needs four steals to surpass the NCAA's all-time steals leader former Friar Eric Murdock (376 steals, 1987-91). On January 5, Linehan made his 300th steal with 5:21 remaining in the first half of PC's game against Syracuse. Linehan became the 26th player in the history of the NCAA to register 300 or more steals in a career. In the last 12 games, the senior theft master has recorded 63 steals (5.3 steals per game), including nine steals in PC's 64-61 win against BC on February 2. After a slow start in which he recorded just eight steals in the first five games (1.6 steals per game), Linehan is back in form and is averaging 4.5 steals per game this season. In 119 career games, he ranks second all-time at Providence with 373 steals (3.13 steals per game). Linehan trails all-time Friar great Eric Murdock (1987-91) in PC's record book in career steals and career steals average. With two regular-season games remaining, he would need to average 2.0 steals a game to break Murdock's all-time career steal mark of 376 steals.

GOMES IMPRESSIVE FOR FRIARS...

Freshman Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.), who sat out the first seven games of the season before seeing his first collegiate action at South Carolina on December 3, has been one of the Friars' top players this season. Gomes is second on the team in scoring (13.7 ppg) and leads the squad in rebounding (8.5 rpg). In PC's most recent game, Gomes scored a team-high 15 points and recorded seven rebounds in a 69-64 loss to Virginia Tech on February 23. The freshman sensation registered his fourth double-double of the season with 17 points and 11 rebounds in against Villanova on February 19. On February 2, Gomes scored 12 points and grabbed 12 rebounds in a 64-61 win against Boston College. For Gomes, it was his third double-double of the season. On January 19, he recorded a team-high 31 points, a game-high 12 rebounds and four steals in the Friars' 102-96 overtime loss to the 24th-ranked Miami Hurricanes in Miami, Fla. With his 31 points, Gomes became the first Friar to register 30 or more points in a game since Donta Wade recorded 38 points against Notre Dame on February 23, 2000. He recorded his first career double-double with 12 points and

15 rebounds in the Friars' 73-66 loss to 16th-ranked Syracuse on January 5. His 15 rebounds is a team high for the season. On December 3, Gomes played in his first game with the Friars and scored a team-high 15 points, while registering eight rebounds in 28 minutes of action in a 67-48 loss at South Carolina. Prior to attending Providence, Gomes played at Wilby High School in Waterbury, Conn.

GOMES TWO-TIME BIG EAST ROOKIE OF THE WEEK... Freshman forward Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) has been named BIG EAST Rookie of the Week twice this season. Most recently, he was named BIG EAST Men's Basketball Rookie of the Week on Monday, January 21. He received his first Rookie of the Week accolade on December 31, 2001.

GOMES ESTABLISHES PC FRESHMAN RECORD... On January 19, Friar rookie Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) scored 31 points against 24th-ranked Miami. His 31 points set a Providence single-game record for most points by a freshman. The old record was 28 points, which was scored by Matt Palazzi in a double overtime, 84-75, win at Holy Cross on December 5, 1984. With his 31 points, Gomes also became the first Friar to register 30 or more points in a game since Donta Wade recorded 38 points against Notre Dame on February 23, 2000. With his 31 points against Miami, Gomes posted the 120th 30-point game in Friar history.

STARTING LINEUP... Due to injuries this season, Head Coach Tim Welsh has used 12 different starting lineups in PC's 28 games. Last season, he used six different starting lineups in the Friars' 31 games.

LAKSA SECOND IN REBOUNDING... Sophomore Maris Laksa (Ventspils, Latvia) has been one of the team's top rebounders. For the season, Laksa ranks second on the squad in rebounding (5.1 rpg). On January 26, Laksa scored 18 points and recorded 13 rebounds in PC's 75-70 win against St. John's. Laksa registered his first double-double of the season when he recorded 12 points and a game-high 14 rebounds against Rutgers on January 22. Laksa was diagnosed with a stress fracture in his right foot prior to the Brown game on November 28. Due to the injury, Laksa missed seven consecutive games. He returned to action against Central Connecticut on December 30 and scored two points in 11 minutes of action. Laksa was forced to sit out the first two games of the season as a result of his violation of NCAA rules concerning his amateurism status. Laksa returned from the two-game suspension on November 20 and equalled his career-high with 24 points in a 93-

84 win against Austin Peay in Las Vegas, Nev. He played in games against Texas El Paso (Nov. 21) and Columbia (Nov. 24) before being sidelined with the stress fracture. In 18 games this season, Laksa is averaging 9.6 points per game. Last season, he was one of the Friars' top three-point threats, connecting on 44 of 96 attempts (.458) from behind the three-point arc.

LAKSA INJURED VERSUS VILLANOVA... Sophomore Maris Laksa (Ventspils, Latvia) injured his knee in PC's 72-64 victory against Villanova on February 19. He did not play in the Friars' most recent game at Virginia Tech. His status is listed as day-to-day.

SANDERS OFF THE BENCH... Freshman forward Rob Sanders (New London, Conn.) has been displaying steady improvement for the Friars and has become one of the team's top players coming off the bench. On February 19, he scored a season-high 16 points and recorded four rebounds in PC's 72-64 win against Villanova. On February 9, Sanders scored 15 points in a 77-69 win against Virginia Tech. On January 22, the rookie forward scored 15 points in PC's 70-55 win against Rutgers. On December 27, he scored eight points and registered 10 rebounds in PC's 91-47 win against Morgan State. The Morgan State game marked the first time this season that Sanders recorded 10 rebounds in a contest. Sanders is averaging 6.0 points and 4.0 rebounds per game this season.

AUGUSTIN OUT OF LINEUP... Junior forward Romuald Augustin (Montreal, Quebec), who has missed 23 games this season with a hip injury, is out of the lineup indefinitely. He has not played in the last 20 games. On November 28, he scored eight points in 16 minutes in a 67-60 loss to Brown. On December 1, Augustin scored eight points in 27 minutes in a 71-59 win against Rhode Island. Augustin played in the team's 83-65 loss to Oklahoma State and scored six points. After the Oklahoma State game, he missed two consecutive games before playing five minutes against Columbia. He entered the preseason as one of the Friars' top returnees. Over the summer, Augustin toured Mexico with a Canadian student men's team on July 25-August 1. From August 22-September 1, he played for the Canadian Team at the World University Games in Beijing, China. Augustin completed his summer with the Canadian Team at the Goodwill Games in Brisbane, Australia. He is the only Friar basketball player to ever compete at the Goodwill Games.

MILLS LEADS TEAM IN SCORING... Junior guard Abdul Mills (Brooklyn, N.Y.) scored a team-high 26 points in the Friars' 89-79 loss to

The junior guard has scored in double figures in 22 of the 26 games he has played this season. On December 19, Mills scored a game-high 21 points and dished off five assists in the Friars' 85-76 win against Sacred Heart. On November 20, he scored 20 points and recorded six rebounds in a 93-84 win against Austin Peay in Las Vegas. On November 21, Mills had a career-high 27-point effort in a 69-60 win over UTEP. For his efforts, Mills was named to the All-Las Vegas Tourney Team. Mills has scored 20 or more points in four games this season. Last season, Mills finished second on the team in scoring with a 10.9 points per game average.

MILLS SITS OUT VIRGINIA TECH GAME... On February 23, junior Abdul Mills (Brooklyn, N.Y.) missed his second game this season due to a groin injury. Mills has been hampered all season by a sore groin muscle. He

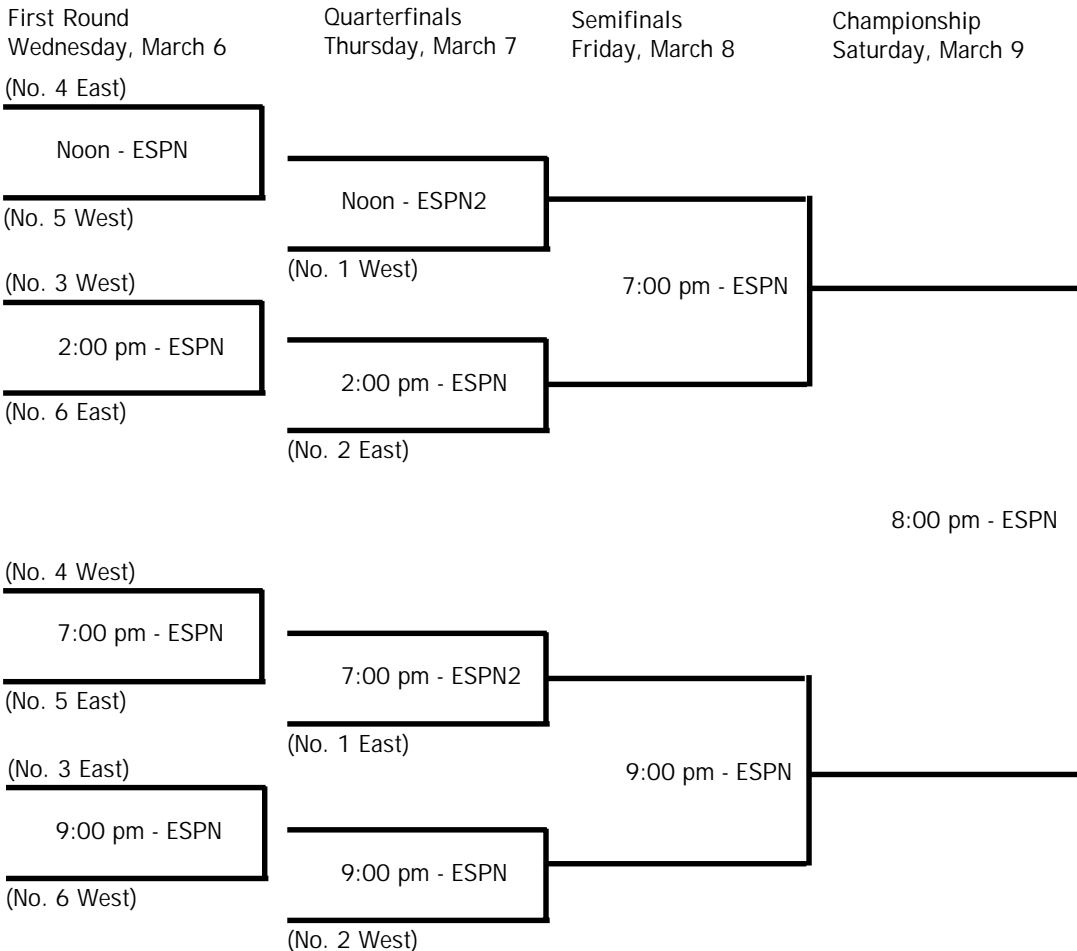
missed his first game with the injury on February 5 in a 67-56 loss at Connecticut. His status is listed as day-to-day.

In 31 games last season, PC only had three players miss a combined nine games due to injuries.

THOMPSON LEAVES TEAM... Junior Garnett Thompson (Islip, N.Y.) has left the team

for personal reasons. He left the team prior to its trip to Villanova on January 2. Thompson played in 10 games this season and averaged 4.6 points and 3.9 rebounds.

LAST SEASON... In 2000-01, PC posted a 21-10 record overall. In 16 BIG EAST games in 2000-01, the Friars established a school record for BIG EAST wins with an 11-5 mark. In 2000-01, PC was picked to finish sixth of seven teams in the BIG EAST East Division in the Preseason Coaches' Poll. The Friars made their 14th appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 2001 and first since 1997. The 10th seeded Friars were defeated by the seventh seeded Penn State Nittany Lions, 69-59, on March 16 in the South Region in New Orleans, La.
