FRIARS IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT... The Providence College Friars are making their 14th appearance in the NCAA Tournament. Providence has posted a 14-14 mark all-time in the NCAA Tournament. The Friars' last appearance in the NCAA Tournament was in 1997 when the team advanced to the Elite Eight. The Friars were eliminated from the 1997 NCAA Tournament with a 96-92 overtime loss to eventual national champion Arizona on March 23, 1997. PC's most recent win in the NCAA Tournament was a 71-65 victory against the University of Tennessee-Chattanooga in the Sweet Sixteen on March 21, 1997. The Friars have advanced to the Final Four twice in the team's 74-year history (1973 and 1987).

FRIARS VERSUS THE TOURNAMENT FIELD... This season, the Friars have posted a 2-4 mark against teams in this year's NCAA Tournament field. The Friars defeated Georgetown (103-79) and Holy Cross (63-57) and lost to Syracuse (55-54), Creighton (63-51) and Boston College (81-73, 59-58).

FRIARS IN THE BIG EAST TOURNAMENT... The Friars went to the BIG EAST Tournament as a No. 2 seed. PC finished the season in second place in the BIG EAST East Division with an 11-5 mark. The Friars played 17th-ranked Syracuse (No. 3 West) in the Quarterfinals on March 8 and were defeated, 55-54.

PROVIDENCE ALL-TIME... In 74 seasons of Friar basketball, the team has posted a 1,143-723 (.613) mark. The team's all-time record at the Providence Civic Center is 357-141 (.717).

FRIARS VERSUS PENN STATE... The Friars and the Nittany Lions have met once in the all-time series with Providence holding a 1-0 lead. In the only meeting between the two teams, the Friars earned an 81-65 victory on December 27, 1971 at Madison Square Garden in New York.

FRIARS FALL TO NO. 17 SYRACUSE IN BIG EAST TOURNAMENT...

On March 8, No. 17 Syracuse defeated the Friars, 55-54, in the BIG EAST Quarterfinals at Madison Square Garden. The loss was the Friars' fourth consecutive defeat in BIG EAST Tournament action as the team fell to 14-21 all-time in BIG EAST Tournament play. The Friars had their lowest point production of the season in the first half and fell behind 32-17 after 20 minutes of play. PC shot just 24.1 percent from the floor in the first half. The Friars came out strong in the second half and improved on their 0-10 performance from three-point territory in the first half. PC shot 8-15 from behind the three-point arc in the second half and took a 47-43 lead with 7:59 remaining in the game. The Friars remarkable comeback was fueled by an 11-0 run to open the second half. Syracuse regained the lead with 2:48 to play (51-49). The Orangemen led by three points with 19 seconds remaining in the game when Kueth Duany missed two foul shots and the Friars hopes remained alive. However, freshman Maris Laksa's three-point shot with three seconds left fell short and freshman Chris Anrin (Varmdo, Sweden) put in the rebound. The Friars' 55-54 loss marked the third time in the last three contests that the game could have been won or tied on the last shot of the game. Senior Erron Maxey (Lake Elsinore, Calif.) led the Friars in scoring with 10 points.

FRIARS END REGULAR SEASON WITH WIN OVER RUTGERS...

In the team's final regular-season game, the Friars closed out the season with a 69-66 win at Rutgers on March 3 and ended a five-game losing streak against the Scarlet Knights. The victory gave the Friars an 11-5 record in BIG EAST action, which marked the first time ever PC finished with 11 wins in BIG EAST play. The Friars also finished with an 8-3 road record, which gave the team eight road wins for the first time since the 1973-74 team posted an 8-2 mark. Sophomore Abdul Mills (Brooklyn, N.Y.) scored nine of his 11 points in the first half and helped the team take a 37-28 lead after 20 minutes of play. Rutgers cut into PC's lead in the second half. With 2:30 remaining in the game, the Scarlet Knights took a 66-63 lead. However, the Friars scored the final six points of the game to earn the win. Senior Erron Maxey (Lake Elsinore, Calif.) scored a team-high 16 points and grabbed eight rebounds. Senior Karim Shabazz (Far Rockaway, N.Y.) added 15 points and nine rebounds. Junior John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) was the fourth Friar

to score in double figures with 13 points.

CLOSE GAMES... In each of PC's last three games, the final shot of the contest could have changed the outcome of the game. On February 24, the Friars were defeated by 10th-ranked Boston College, 59-58. Friar sophomore Romuald Augustin (Montreal, Quebec) took a jump shot from the free-throw line that hit the rim and bounced out with one second remaining in the game. On March 3, the Friars defeated Rutgers, 69-66, in Piscataway, N.J. Rutgers' Todd Billet took a shot from behind the three-point arc to tie the game with two seconds remaining in the game, but the shot hit the front of the rim and the Friars earned the win. On March 8, the Friars needed a three-point basket to tie the game when freshman Maris Laksa took a shot with three seconds remaining. Laksa's shot came up short and Chris Anrin made a layup as the Friars were defeated 55-54 by 17th-ranked Syracuse.

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES...

Last year, PC finished the season with an 11-19 mark overall and a 4-12 record in BIG EAST play. This season, PC has posted a 21-9 record overall. In 16 BIG EAST games this season, the Friars established a school record for BIG EAST wins with an 11-5 mark. This year, Providence College was picked to finish sixth of seven teams in the BIG EAST East Division in the Preseason Coaches' Poll.

LINEHAN NAMED BIG EAST DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR...

Providence College junior guard John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) was named BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year on Tuesday, March 6. Linehan becomes the first Friar ever to earn one of the BIG EAST's four post-season individual honors (Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, Most Improved Player and Rookie of the Year).

LINEHAN EARNS SECOND TEAM ALL-BIG EAST HONORS...

Providence College junior guard John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) was named All-BIG EAST Second Team on Monday, March 5. Linehan is the first Friar to earn All-BIG EAST honors since Jamel Thomas was named to the First Team in 1999.

were named Second Team NABC All-District 1. Linehan and Maxey are the first Friars named to the NABC All-District Team since Jamel Thomas earned First Team accolades in 1999. It marks the first time PC has had two players named to the squad since 1989-90 when Marty Conlon, Eric Murdock and Carlton Screen all received Second Team honors.

LINEHAN RECEIVES COLLEGE INSIDER.COM NATIONAL DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR... Providence College junior guard John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) was named College Insider.Com National Defensive Player of the Year on Friday, March 9. For Linehan, who also was named to the College Insider.Com All-Defensive Team on March 3, it marks his second Defensive Player of the Year honor.

NCAA TOURNAMENT EXPERIENCE... PC senior center Karim Shabazz (Far Rockaway, N.Y.) is the only Friar with NCAA Tournament experience. In his freshman season at Florida State, Shabazz played two games with the Seminoles in the NCAA Tournament. Shabazz scored five points and registered four rebounds in a 96-87 win over 15th-ranked Texas Christian on March 13, 1998. In the second round, Shabazz recorded two points and three rebounds in an 83-77 overtime loss to Valparaiso on March 15, 1998.

WELSH IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT... PC Head Coach Tim Welsh is making his second appearance in the NCAA Tournament as a head coach. Welsh led the Iona Gaels to the 1998 NCAA Tournament with an automatic bid after capturing the MAAC Tournament title. Welsh's 1998 Iona squad was defeated in the first round by Syracuse.

FRIARS TOUGH AGAINST THREES... PC has the top three-point field goal percentage defense in overall action of all BIG EAST teams. In 30 games, PC only has allowed 143 three pointers in 487 attempts (29.4 percent).

PC EARNS 11 BIG EAST WINS... On March 3, PC defeated Rutgers, 69-66, to improve to 11-5 in BIG EAST action. It marks the first time ever that PC has earned 11 wins in BIG EAST play. The last PC team to earn 10 BIG EAST wins was the 1996-97 team (10-8). The 1993-94 team (10-8) and the 1986-87 squad (10-6) also earned 10 league wins. All three teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

FRIARS EARN 21ST WIN... On March 3, PC defeated Rutgers, 69-66, and earned its 21st win of the season. The Friars became the first PC team to record more than 20 wins in the regular season since the 1977-78 squad posted a 23-6 mark. On February 22, PC defeated Binghamton (119-58) and became the 22nd Friar team to earn 20 or more wins in a season. Of the 22 Friar teams to earn 20 or more wins, 15 of those teams reached the 20-win plateau in the regular season. The last Friar squad to earn 20 wins in the regular season was the 1986-87 team that had a 20-7 record entering the BIG EAST Tournament.

ROAD WARRIORS... Providence, which has one of the best road records in overall play of all BIG EAST teams, improved to 8-3 in away games with a 69-66 victory at Rutgers on March 3. It marks the first time since 1973-74 (8-2) that a PC team earned eight road wins. On January 28, PC defeated Miami, 80-70, to earn its third consecutive BIG EAST road win. For the Friars, it marked only the third time in the history of the program that the team had won three consecutive BIG EAST road games. The Friars also accomplished the feat in 1988-89 and 1989-90. In road games last year, Providence posted a 3-7 mark overall and a 2-6 record in conference games.

FRIARS LEAD BIG EAST IN 3PT FG... PC has the top three-point field goal percentage in overall action in the BIG EAST. The Friars have made 246 of 608 (.405) attempts from three-point territory. The Friars finished the BIG EAST season tied with Rutgers for the best three-point field percentage (.400) as the team made 132 of its 330 attempts. PC is 14-4 when the team has made 40 percent or more of its three-point attempts in a game. On February 10, PC shot 14-19 (73.7 percent) from three-point territory in a 103-79 win against Georgetown and established a team record for three-point percentage in a game.

FRIARS STRONG WITH THE LEAD... Providence College has registered a 17-2 mark this season when leading at halftime. PC's only losses this season when leading at halftime were against Creighton at the Energia Systems Thanksgiving Tournament in Kansas City, Mo. and Boston College on February 24. In addition, the Friars are 21-1 when leading with 10 minutes remaining in a game and 21-0 when leading with five minutes remaining in a game.

FRIARS FORCE TURNOVERS... PC has posted a 13-0 mark this season when opponents have committed 20 or more turnovers in a game. Entering the NCAA Tournament, opponents are averaging 17.7 turnovers per game against the Friars. In conference action, opponents averaged 18.7 turnovers per game. In the Friars' 11 BIG EAST wins this season, Providence College forced a combined 232 turnovers (21.1 turnovers per game) in victories over Villanova (twice), Connecticut, Virginia Tech (twice), Pittsburgh, Miami, St. John's (twice), Georgetown and Rutgers.

DEFENSE IS THE KEY... Providence College has posted a 19-3 mark this season when opponents have scored 75 or fewer points in a game. Opponents have shot 50 percent from the floor against the Friars in just three of PC's 30 games this season (Miami on January 16, Villanova on January 31 and BC on February 17).

STARTING LINEUP... Providence College's starting lineup of sophomore forward Romuald Augustin (Montreal, Quebec), senior forward Erron Maxey (Lake Elsinore, Calif.), senior center Karim Shabazz (Far Rockaway, N.Y.), sophomore guard Abdul Mills (Brooklyn, N.Y.) and junior guard John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) have started the last 24 games for the Friars and have posted a 18-6 record as starters.

LINEHAN LEADS BIG EAST IN STEALS... Junior John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) led the BIG EAST in steals this season with 53 in 16 conference games (3.31). He leads the league in steals in overall action, averaging 3.24 thefts per game (81 steals in 25 games). Linehan ranks second all-time in steals at Providence with 246 in 90 games (2.73). In 1998-99, he led the BIG EAST in steals with 60 and was tied for fourth in the nation with a 3.3 thefts per game average.

FRIARS LEAD IN FREE THROWS... Providence finished the BIG EAST season with the top free-throw percentage in the league

at .741. The Friars were 281 of 379 from the charity stripe. In overall action, Providence also is tops in the league, shooting 72 percent from the free-throw line. The Friars have made 486 of 675 attempts in 30 games.

FRIARS ESTABLISH BIG EAST MARK FOR POINTS IN THE FIRST HALF... In PC's 103-79 win over 12th-ranked Georgetown on February 10, the Friars established a BIG EAST record for points in the first half with 61. The previous record was 57 points scored by Syracuse against Boston College on February 19, 1983.

PC SETS A TEAM RECORD FOR THREE-POINT PERCENTAGE... In the Friars' 103-79 win over Georgetown on February 10, the Friars were 14-19 from three-point territory. The team's 73.7 percentage from behind the three-point arc established a PC record for three-point percentage in a game. The previous record was .706 (12-17) against Villanova on January 10, 1987.

FRIARS REACH 100 POINTS FOR THIRD TIME... On February 22, PC defeated Binghamton, 119-58. It marked the third time this season the Friars scored 100 or more points. The last time PC scored 100 or more points three times in a season was in 1990-91 when the Friars reached the 100-point plateau six times.

PC DEFEATS VIRGINIA TECH BY 40... The Friars' 40-point win (96-56) over Virginia Tech was PC's largest margin of victory ever in a BIG EAST game. The previous record was a 29-point win over St. John's (98-69) on January 3, 1989.

FRIARS HIT CENTURY MARK FOR FIFTH TIME IN BIG EAST PLAY... The Friars' 103-79 victory over Georgetown marked the first time since 1991 the Friars scored 100 or more points in a BIG EAST game. It also marked only the fifth time in the team's history the Friars scored 100 or more points in a BIG EAST game.

FRIARS 13-3 AT THE CIVIC CENTER... The Friars finished their home schedule with a 13-3 record at the Providence Civic Center this season. It marks the first time the Friars have earned 13 home wins since 1994-95 when the squad was 13-5 at home.

FRIARS SET RECORD FOR POINTS IN A GAME AT THE CIVIC CENTER... On February 22, PC defeated Binghamton, 119-58. With the team's 119 points, the Friars established a record for most points scored in a game at the Providence Civic Center. The old record was 118 scored by PC in a 118-88 victory over Western Kentucky on January 10, 1973.

FRIARS EARN THIRD BIG EAST SWEEP... On February 20, PC defeated Virginia Tech, 96-56, for its second win of the season against the Hokies. The win over the Hokies gave PC its third BIG EAST series sweep of the season. The Friars also swept the season series against Villanova and St. John's. The 1992-93 team was the last PC squad to sweep three BIG EAST teams in one season.

PC ENDS ST. JOHN'S 27-GAME WIN STREAK... PC's 64-53 win over St. John's on February 14 ended the Red Storm's 27-game winning streak at Alumni Hall. PC's victory ended the Red Storm's second longest winning streak at Alumni Hall. St. John's longest winning streak ever at Alumni Hall was 30 games, which the Friars ended on February 14, 1987 with a 79-78 win.

FRIAR FIRSTS VERSUS HOYAS... PC's 103-79 victory against the Georgetown Hoyas on February 10 marked the first time ever Georgetown allowed 100 or more points in a BIG EAST game. Also, the 24-point Friar win was the largest deficit ever for the Hoyas in a BIG EAST loss.

FRIARS WIN FIVE STRAIGHT BIG EAST GAMES... On February 3, Providence defeated St. John's, 75-63, for its fifth consecutive BIG EAST win. It marked only the fourth time ever that the Friars have earned five straight BIG EAST wins. PC also earned five consecutive league wins in 1996-97, 1993-94 and 1986-87. During the 1986-87 season, PC earned six straight BIG EAST wins, the only Friar squad to ever accomplish that feat.

A NEW LEADER EVERY GAME... One of the trademarks of the Friars this season has been that a different player has led the team

in scoring almost every game. Only six times in the team's 30 games this season has the same player led the team in scoring in consecutive games. In addition, seven different players have led the team in scoring in the squad's 21 wins this season. The Friars do not have a player averaging more than 11.2 points a game this season.

LINEHAN'S DEFENSE LEADS FRIARS...

Junior guard John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) leads the team in steals with 81 (3.24 steals per game). Linehan has been an integral part of the Friars' success this season. With Linehan in the lineup, the Friars have posted an impressive 19-6 record. Linehan missed five games this season with a hamstring injury which he suffered in the first game. The Friars posted a 2-3 record without Linehan. On March 3, Linehan scored 13 points and added three assists in PC's 69-66 win against Rutgers. Linehan has scored 10 or more points in nine of the last 11 games. On February 20, he scored 10 points, dished out five assists, had six steals and made two blocks in PC's 96-56 victory against Virginia Tech. On February 14, Linehan was the team's high scorer in PC's 64-53 win at St. John's. He scored 13 points while shooting 8-8 from the free-throw line as the Friars ended the Red Storm's 27-game winning streak at Alumni Hall. On February 17, Linehan scored a career-high 22 points, including a 4-8 effort from behind the three-point arc, in PC's 81-73 loss to ninth-ranked Boston College. He also had four steals in the game. He recorded his first double-double of the season as he scored 18 points and dished out 10 assists in the Friars' 103-79 win against Georgetown on February 10. He also had a game-high six steals and was 4-4 from three-point territory. On January 31, Linehan had a strong game for the Friars as he scored 20 points and was 6-7 from the three-point arc in PC's 84-64 win against Villanova. He also had three steals and three assists in the contest. On February 3, Linehan continued his fine play with 14 points, two steals and five assists in PC's 75-63 win over St. John's. Linehan also tied his career high for free throws made (connecting on 10 of 12 free throw attempts) and rebounds (six). Linehan was named BIG EAST Player of the Week on Monday, January 15. Linehan was named Player of the Week after leading the Friars to two BIG EAST wins with his impressive defense. On January 9, Linehan had six steals, six assists and six rebounds in PC's 76-67 win at Villanova. On January 13, the 5-9 guard

scored 19 points and registered five steals as the Friars upset 13th-ranked Connecticut at the Providence Civic Center. For the season, he is third on the team in scoring, averaging 10.9 points per game.

SHABAZZ PLAYS STRONG...

Senior Karim Shabazz (Far Rockaway, N.Y.) had a team-high nine rebounds in PC's 55-54 loss to 17th-ranked Syracuse in the BIG EAST Tournament Quarterfinals. On March 3, he scored 15 points and registered a game-high nine rebounds in PC's 69-66 win against Rutgers. Shabazz has scored 11 or more points nine of the last 13 games. Shabazz registered his third double-double of the season when he scored a BIG EAST career-high 22 points and grabbed 11 rebounds in the team's 103-79 victory against Georgetown on February 10. On January 23, Shabazz scored 17 points with a career-best 7-7 effort from the floor in PC's 77-61 win against Pittsburgh at the Providence Civic Center. On January 28, Shabazz recorded his second double-double of the season when he scored 11 points and had a game-high 12 rebounds in the Friars' 80-70 win at Miami. He also recorded six blocks and three assists in the game. Shabazz recorded his first double-double of the season (14 points and 13 rebounds) in the Friars' 93-80 win over George Washington on December 11. On December 2, he returned to the Providence lineup against the URI Rams and tied his career high with 10 blocks. Shabazz had 10 blocks in PC's 79-63 win over Long Island on December 27, 1999. Shabazz had injured his knee in PC's 60-53 win over UMKC on November 24. The senior center missed three games due to the injury. For the season, he is averaging 8.8 points. He leads the team in rebounding, averaging 7.3 boards per game. The 1999-00 season was his first year at PC. Shabazz transferred to Providence in January 1999 from Florida State. The Far Rockaway, N.Y. native is the tallest player in the history of PC basketball.

AUGUSTIN CONTRIBUTES FOR PC...

Sophomore Romuald Augustin (Montreal, Quebec) is averaging 9.4 points per game. He is one of the team's top three-point shooters, connecting on 45 of his 111 attempts (.405). Augustin recorded a career-high 22 points in PC's 83-68 loss to Connecticut on February 6. Augustin was 4-6 from behind the three-point arc in the loss. On January 31, Augustin recorded a career-high six assists against Villanova on

January 31. In PC's 78-64 loss to Miami on January 16, the sophomore forward had a game-high 20 points and was 8-9 from the free-throw line. On January 9, he registered season highs in three pointers (five), assists (five) and minutes played (35) while scoring 21 points and leading the Friars to a 76-67 win over Villanova.

MILLS SCORES FOR FRIARS...

Sophomore Abdul Mills (Brooklyn, N.Y.) is second on the team in scoring, averaging 11.0 points per game this season. He also ranks second on the team in steals with 44. On March 3, Mills scored 11 points in the Friars' 69-66 win over Rutgers on March 3. He scored a BIG EAST career-high 20 points and was a perfect 5-5 from the floor in a 96-56 win against Virginia Tech on February 20. He also was 3-3 from behind the three-point arc and was 7-7 from the free-throw line. On February 17, Mills scored 19 points in PC's 81-73 loss to Boston College. On February 14, Mills scored 12 points and registered four assists in PC's 64-53 win at St. John's on February 14. Mills registered a career-high five three pointers and finished with 15 points in the Friars' 103-79 win against Georgetown on February 10. On January 20, he scored 14 points in PC's 75-60 victory at Virginia Tech. Mills has been one of PC's most consistent scorers this season, recording double figures in 17 of the team's 29 games. Mills recorded a career high with 25 points in PC's 93-80 win against George Washington on December 11. On December 7, Mills had 16 points in the Friars' 85-70 win against UMass. He scored 19 points in the Friars' 80-71 loss to the Maine Black Bears on November 21. On November 29, Mills registered 16 points against FIU.

LAKSA FOR THREE...

Freshman Maris Laksa (Ventspils, Latvia) is one of the team's top three-point threats. Laksa has a three-point shooting percentage of .453, connecting on 43 of his 95 attempts. In PC's 103-79 win over Georgetown on February 10, Laksa scored 14 points and was 3-5 from three-point territory. On February 3, Laksa registered 13 points in PC's 75-63 win over St. John's. For the season, Laksa is averaging 9.1 points and 3.2 rebounds per game. In the Friars' 77-61 victory against Pittsburgh on January 23, Laksa scored 15 points while shooting 4-5 from the floor, including 3-3 from three-point territory. He also had six rebounds in the game. Laksa led the Friars to a 73-48 win against Boston

University on December 28 at the Providence Civic Center. In the win, Laksa had a career-best game for the Friars as he scored 24 points and was 4-4 from behind the three-point line (7-8 from the floor) and was 6-6 from the foul line. He registered 18 points in PC's 93-80 win against George Washington on December 11. Laksa was 3-5 from behind the three-point line and shot 3-3 from the free-throw line. He had 17 points in 33 minutes of action in the Friars' 74-55 win against Florida International on November 29.

MAXEY LEADS THE TEAM IN SCORING...

Senior Erron Maxey (Lake Elsinore, Calif.) leads the team in scoring, averaging 11.2 points per game. He also is second on the team in rebounding, averaging 6.4 rebounds per game. In PC's most recent game, Maxey had a team-high 10 points in the Friars' 55-54 loss to 17th-ranked Syracuse in the Quarterfinals of the BIG EAST Tournament on March 8. Maxey has scored 10 or more points in 18 of the team's 30 games this season. Maxey scored a team-high 16 points and grabbed eight rebounds in the Friars' 69-66 win at Rutgers on March 3. On February 20, he scored 19 points as PC defeated Virginia Tech, 96-56. On February 10, Maxey scored 14 points in PC's 103-79 win over Georgetown. Maxey recorded his third double-double of the season with 13 points and 11 rebounds in PC's 75-63 win over St. John's on February 3. On January 31, Maxey tied his season-high as he scored 19 points in the Friars' 84-64 victory over Villanova. On January 23, Maxey scored 15 points and grabbed eight rebounds in PC's 77-61 win against Pittsburgh. He recorded his second double-double (17 points, 12 rebounds) of the season on December 7 when he led the Friars to an 85-70 victory against Massachusetts. Maxey scored a season-high 19 points and grabbed a team-high eight rebounds in 24 minutes of action in the Friars' 95-72 win over in-state rival Rhode Island on December 2. Maxey became the 35th player in Friar history to record 1,000 points when he scored 14 points in PC's 80-69 loss to Auburn on November 26. He has played in 119 career games and has scored 1,290 points. On November 21, he recorded his first double-double of the season in PC's 80-71 loss to Maine. He had 11 points and 11 rebounds in the loss. Last season, Maxey led the team in scoring, averaging 14.8 points and 8.0 rebounds per game.

ANRIN STRONG OFF THE BENCH...

Freshman Chris Anrin (Varmdo, Sweden) has become a very productive scorer off the bench for the Friars. He has made 40 of his 108 attempts from behind the three-point arc this season (.370). On January 31, he scored nine points, including two three pointers, in PC's 84-64 victory over Villanova. On January 16, the 6-7 freshman forward scored a career-high 18 points and tied his career high with four three-point baskets in the Friars' 78-64 loss to Miami at the Providence Civic Center. On January 20, Anrin scored 11 points and was 3-5 from three-point territory in PC's 75-60 win at Virginia Tech. For the season, he is averaging 6.0 points per game.

DOUTHIT AT CENTER... Freshman center

Marcus Douthit (Syracuse, N.Y.) is second on the team in blocks with 50. On February 14, Douthit scored eight points and blocked three shots in PC's 64-53 win at St. John's. Douthit scored 12 points and recorded eight rebounds in PC's 87-80 loss to 11th-ranked Seton Hall on January 3. On December 26, Douthit was named BIG EAST Rookie of the Week. He became the first Friar to earn Rookie of the Week since Sean Connolly received the accolade on November 30, 1998. Douthit earned the honor after he led the Friars to a 110-59 win over cross-town rival Brown on December 23. The 6-10 rookie center recorded career highs in points (22), rebounds (11) and field goals (11-14) while registering his first double-double. This season, he is averaging 5.5 points and 4.0 rebounds per game. On December 30, Douthit made a career-high five blocks in PC's 60-55 win against South Carolina. On December 2, the rookie scored 14 points in the Friars' win over Rhode Island.

ON THE BLOCKS... Senior Karim Shabazz

(Far Rockaway, N.Y.) had 10 of the Friars' 14 blocked shots in PC's 95-72 win over Rhode Island on December 2. In addition to Shabazz's 10 blocks, freshman Marcus Douthit (Syracuse, N.Y.) registered three blocks and sophomore Romuald Augustin (Montreal, Quebec) recorded one swat in the win. The team's 14 blocks tied the Friars' all-time record for blocks in a game. The mark of 14 blocks in a game was established twice by the Friars. On December 14, 1974, PC had 14 blocks against Syracuse and the team tied the mark versus Jacksonville on January 11, 1975. Shabazz's 10 blocks versus URI tied his

The 51-point win was the largest margin of victory ever in the all-time series. The Friars also recorded their largest offensive output over a Division I team since PC defeated Brown, 116-69, on November 28, 1990. Seven Friars scored 11 or more points, including freshman Marcus Douthit (Syracuse, N.Y.). On December 30, PC earned improved to 9-3 overall with a 60-55 victory against SEC foe South Carolina at the Providence Civic Center. The win gave the Friars their best start under third-year Head Coach Tim Welsh and marked the first time the team had nine victories prior to New Year's day since 1996-97 season. In the win over South Carolina, sophomore Romuald Augustin (Montreal, Quebec) led the Friars with a game-high 13 points. Augustin matched his career high with three three-pointers. On January 31, PC earned an 84-64 win over Villanova at the Civic Center. It gave the Friars their second win of the season over the Wildcats and marked only the seventh time in the all-time series between the two teams that Providence defeated Villanova twice in one season. The victory also put Providence 10 games over .500 for the first time since the 1996-97 season. Villanova became just the second team this season to shoot 50 percent from the floor against the Friars. Providence forced Villanova into 27 turnovers.
