FRIARS IN THE NATIONAL INVITATION TOURNAMENT... The Providence men's basketball team is playing in its first National Invitation Tournament (NIT) since 1999. On Saturday, the Friars will play the College of Charleston in the First Round of the NIT at the Dunkin' Donuts Center at 7:30 p.m. The Friars opened the NIT with a 67-49 victory at Richmond on March 19 in the Opening Round. The Friars, who finished the regular season in third place in the BIG EAST East Division with an 8-8 mark, have registered a 17-13 record overall. The Friars posted a 1-1 mark at the BIG EAST Tournament on March 12-13 with a win against West Virginia (73-50) in the first round and a loss to fifth-ranked Pittsburgh (67-59) in the quarterfinals. Providence is making its 16th appearance in the NIT. The Friars, who won the NIT in 1961 and 1963, have registered a 29-16 mark all-time in NIT games.

FRIARS VERSUS CHARLESTON... Saturday's game will be the second meeting all-time between Providence and Charleston. In the first game between the two teams, the Friars defeated the Cougars, 72-67, on March 16, 1995 in the First Round of the NIT at the Dunkin' Donuts Center.

FRIARS VERSUS THE SOUTHERN CONFERENCE... The Providence-Charleston game on Saturday, March 22 will be the fourth contest all-time for the Friars against a team from the Southern Conference. PC's all-time record versus Southern Conference teams is 3-0 (1.000). Saturday's game will mark the Friars' first game against a Southern Conference squad this season. The Friars' most recent game against a Southern Conference squad was a 71-65 victory versus Tennessee-Chattanooga on March 21, 1997 in the NCAA Tournament at Birmingham, Ala.

NEXT GAME... The winner of the PC/Charleston game will advance to the Second Round of the NIT against Georgetown on March 24 or 25.

2002-03 PROVIDENCE COLLEGE BASKETBALL

SCOUTING THE COUGARS... Charleston has posted a 25-7 mark this season. The Cougars were defeated in the Southern Conference Tournament by East Tennessee State, 64-55, on March 7. In their most recent game, the Cougars defeated Kent State, 71-66, in the opening round of the NIT on March 19. Earlier in the season, Charleston captured the Great Alaska Shootout with wins over Wyoming, Oklahoma State and Villanova on November 27-30. Senior guard Troy Wheless (Bunn, N.C.) leads the team in scoring (15.5 ppg). Junior center Mike Benton leads the team in rebounding (6.6 rpg) and is averaging 9.0 points per game.

FRIARS DEFEAT RICHMOND IN THE NIT...

The Providence College Friars improved to 29-16 all-time in NIT play with a 67-49 win against Richmond in the opening round of the tournament at Richmond, Va. It marked PC's first win in the NIT since a 91-79 victory over Fairfield on March 15, 1996. The Friars held the Spiders to just 49 points as they shot 29 percent from the field, including 13 percent from behind the three-point arc. In the Friars' 16 appearances in the NIT Tournament, it is the lowest point total ever for an opponent. Sophomore Rob Sanders (New London, Conn.) scored 12 of his team-high 16 points in the first 20 minutes of action to pace the Friars to a 31-20 halftime lead. Providence did not let up in the second half as they outscored the Spiders, 36-29, over the final 20 minutes. Richmond cut the Friars' lead to nine points with (56-47) with 4:39 to play in the game, but junior Sheiku Kabba (Bronx, N.Y.) hit a three-point shot to regain a double-digit lead and the Friars never looked back. In addition to Sanders' 16 points, four other Friars scored in double figures. Freshman Donnie McGrath added 13 points and four assists. Sophomore Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.), junior Marcus Douthit (Syracuse, N.Y.) and Kabba each scored 10 points. Gomes also recorded a game-high 10 rebounds for his 16th double-double of the season and fourth in the last four games.

FRIARS POST A 1-1 MARK AT THE BIG EAST TOURNAMENT...

The Friars posted a 1-1 mark last week. The Friars earned their first win at the BIG EAST Tournament since 1998 with a 73-50 victory against West Virginia in the first round on Wednesday, March 12. The 23-point win was the Friars' second largest margin of victory in a BIG EAST Tournament game. Providence came out strong in the first half, shooting 48.4 percent and earning a 44-27 lead at halftime. Sophomore Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) led the Friars in the first half with 18 points. He finished the game with his 14th double-double of the season. He had game highs in points (26) and rebounds (15). Gomes shot 11-18 from the field

(.611). His 11 field goals tied a Providence BIG EAST Tournament record for most field goals in a game. In the second half, the Friars continued their stingy defense and productive offensive play, outscoring the Mountaineers, 29-23, over the final 20 minutes of action. Sophomore Rob Sanders (New London, Conn.) registered 17 points and four rebounds. Freshman Donnie McGrath (Katonah, N.Y.) chipped in with nine points and four steals. On March 13, the Friars were defeated by fifth-ranked Pittsburgh, 67-59, in the quarterfinals of the BIG EAST Tournament. It marked the first meeting ever between the two teams at the BIG EAST Tournament. The Friars battled back and forth with the fifth-ranked Panthers for the entire game. After 20 minutes of action, PC trailed, 31-30. In the second half, Providence led by two points (51-49), with 5:34 remaining in the game when Gomes scored on a layup. However, Pittsburgh closed the game on a 16-8 run to earn the win. Freshman Donnie McGrath (Katonah, N.Y.) scored a game-high 17 points and was 5-9 from behind the three-point arc. Gomes finished with 16 points and a game-high 11 rebounds. It marked his 15th double-double of the season. Junior Sheiku Kabba (Bronx, N.Y.) added 14 points and five rebounds.

ALL-TIME NIT APPEARANCES... The Friars, who captured NIT titles in 1961 and 1963, have a storied tradition in the NIT. PC is making its 16th appearance in the NIT. Only five other colleges have been in more NITs.

Sophomore Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) and freshman Donnie McGrath (Katonah, N.Y.) earned BIG EAST accolades on March 10. Gomes, who is averaging 18.3 points and 9.7 rebounds per game, was named Second Team All-BIG EAST. Last season, Gomes was selected to the BIG EAST All-

FRIARS EARN FIRST POST SEASON WIN SINCE 1997... Providence's 67-49 win against Richmond in the opening round of the NIT on March 19 was the team's first post season victory since the Friars' defeated Tennessee-Chattanooga, 71-65, in the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen on March 21, 1997.

GOMES NAMED USBWA ALL-DISTRICT 1... Sophomore Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) was named USBWA All-District 1 on March 12. Gomes also was named Second Team NABC All-District 1 in February.

GOMES SCORES 20+ POINTS... Sophomore forward Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) scored a game-high 26 points in the Friars' 73-50 win over West Virginia on March 12 at the BIG EAST Tournament. Gomes has scored 20 or more points in 14 of the Friars' 30 games and seven of the last 12 contests. He leads the team in scoring (18.3 ppg) and rebounding (9.7 rpg).

FRIARS POST 7-2 MARK IN THEIR LAST NINE GAMES... The Friars have won seven of their last nine games. In PC's most recent game, the Friars defeated Richmond, 67-49, in the opening round of the NIT on March 19 in Richmond. On March 12-13, the Friars defeated West Virginia, 73-50, in the first round of the BIG EAST Tournament and were defeated by fifth-ranked Pittsburgh, 67-59, in the Quarterfinals at Madison Square Garden. PC began its impressive play with a 69-59 win at St. John's on February 5. The Friars then defeated Miami (73-63) on February 18 and Villanova (70-60) on February 22 at home. The Friars were defeated 71-56 at Georgetown before earning their most impressive win of the season, a 76-70 victory at Connecticut on March 5. On March 8, the Friars ended the regular season with a 64-61 overtime win against Seton Hall.

FRIARS IMPROVE REBOUNDING... Providence only has been outrebounded once in the last 10 games. In the last 10 games, the Friars are averaging 34.8 rebounds per game and have a +3.4 rebound margin. Providence has posted a 7-3 record in those games.

GOMES' 11 FIELD GOALS TIES PROVIDENCE BIG EAST RECORD... Sophomore Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) scored 26 points in a 73-50 win against West Virginia on March 12 at the BIG EAST Tournament. Gomes shot 11-18 from the field and tied the Providence record for most field goals made in a BIG EAST Tournament

Head Coach Tim Welsh has started freshman guard Donnie McGrath (Katonah, N.Y.), junior guard Sheiku Kabba (Bronx, N.Y.), junior center Marcus Douthit (Syracuse, N.Y.), sophomore forward Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) and sophomore forward Rob Sanders (New London, Conn.) in the team's last eight games. PC has posted a 6-2 mark in its last eight games.

FRIARS IN OVERTIME... The Friars have registered a 2-0 mark in overtime games this season. Providence defeated Pennsylvania, 74-71, on December 30 and Seton Hall, 64-61, on March 8.

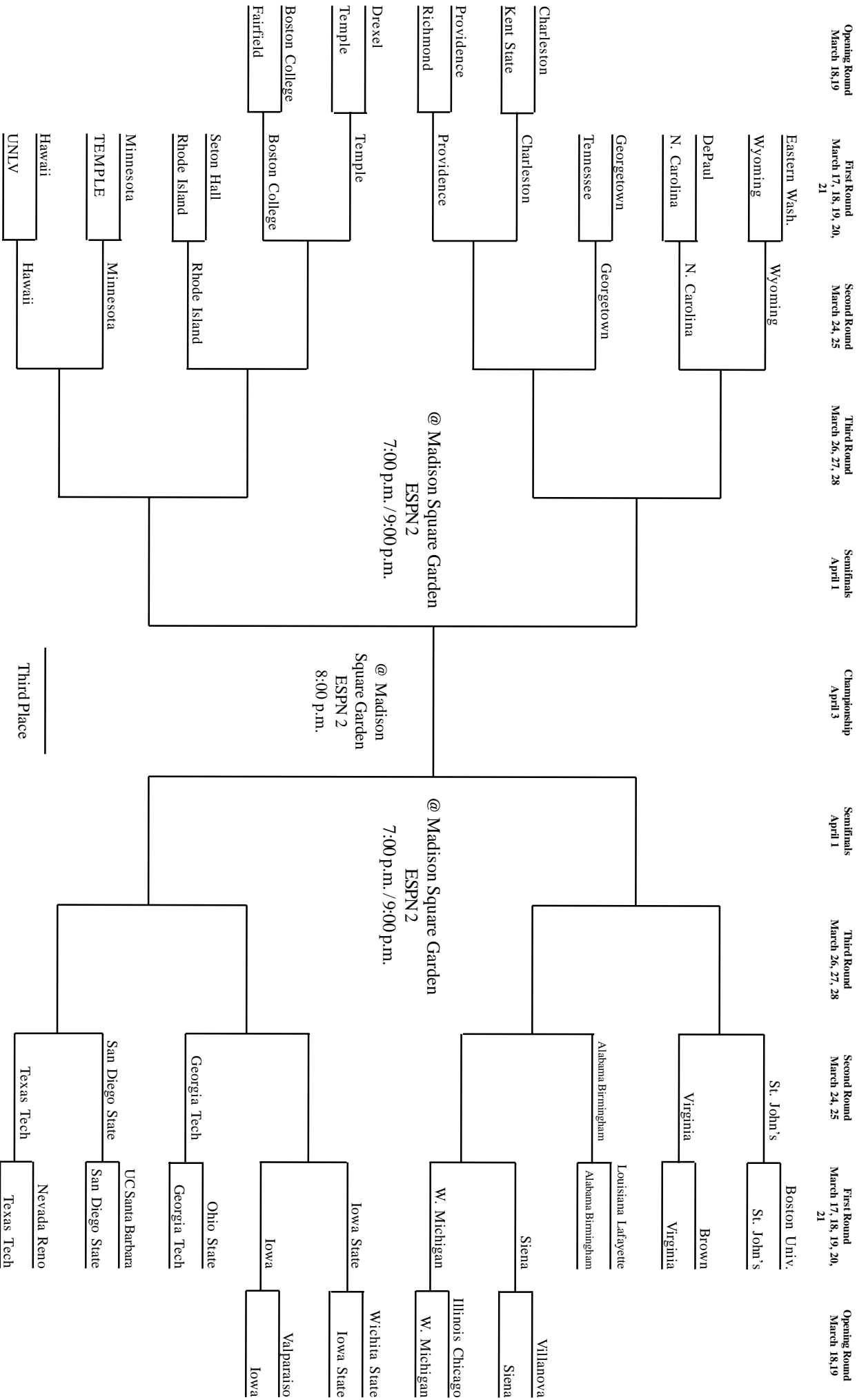
