## HEAD COACH TIM WELSH



In eight seasons as a collegiate head coach, Tim Welsh's squads have produced an impressive 151-95 mark (.614). Since his hiring at Providence in 1998, Welsh has led the Friars to an 81-73 record, which includes NCAA and NIT appearances.

The 2002-03 season was one of Welsh's top campaigns as the Friar bench boss. His squad won eight of its last 11 games, including one in the BIG EAST Tournament and two in the NIT, to finish with an 18-14 mark overall.

The team's 18 victories is the second highest win total in the last six years for a Providence squad. In league play, the Friars finished in third place in the BIG EAST East Division with an 8-8 record.

In 2002, Welsh led a Friar team that was devastated by injuries to a 15-16 mark. His star senior John Linehan had a very impressive season. Under Welsh's tutelage, Linehan established the NCAA and BIG EAST career steals records. For his efforts, Linehan earned his second BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year honor, as well as NABC Defensive Player of the Year, ESPN.com Defensive Player of the Year, Second Team All-BIG EAST honors and Honorable Mention All-America accolades.

In 2000-01, Welsh guided the Friars to one of their most successful campaigns ever. The squad posted a 21-10 mark and earned its first bid to the NCAA Tournament since 1997. Welsh also guided the team to its best season ever in BIG EAST competition as the Friars posted a school record 11 BIG EAST wins. The team finished in second place with an 11-5 mark in the BIG EAST East Division.

Another one of Welsh's accomplishments during his highly productive third season as the Friars' bench boss was that he had the team ranked No. 25 in the Associated Press Poll on February 19. It marked the first time the Friars had earned an in-season ranking since January 24, 1989.

One of the reasons for the Friars' in-season ranking was their monumental 103-79 victory over the 12th-ranked Georgetown Hoyas on February 10 at the Dunkin' Donuts Center. Welsh's Friars became the first team to score 100 or more points against Georgetown in a BIG EAST game. Also, the 24-point Friar win was the largest deficit ever for the Hoyas in a BIG EAST loss. In the win, Welsh had the team flying in the first half as the squad scored a BIG EAST record 61 points in the first 20 minutes of action.

The 2000-01 season also was significant for Welsh as he earned his 100th career coaching victory. On November 29, 2000, Providence defeated Florida International, 74-55, at the Dunkin' Donuts Center for Welsh's 100th victory.

Welsh continues to be regarded as one of the game's top recruiters. Welsh and his staff consistently find recruits who will be able to complement an already solid core of players.

Once being named head coach at Providence, it did not take long before Welsh found success in the Ocean State. His first Friar squad posted a 16-14 mark with a team that featured no regular player over 6-7. The Friars were 9-9 on the year in the BIG EAST including five league road wins. Early in the season, PC knocked off four Top-25 teams in a row (Rhode Island, Pittsburgh, Purdue and Syracuse) on the way to the Friars' first post-season appearance since 1997.

The Tim Welsh Era at Providence College officially began on April 2, 1998 when the Massena, New York native was named the 13th head basketball coach in the school's storied basketball history. The announcement was made by Providence College President Reverend Philip A. Smith.

In making the appointment, Father Smith said, "We sought the opinions of some of the most knowledgeable people in the country about college basketball and coaching talent. Specifically, we wanted a coach capable

of sustaining the rich tradition of Providence College basketball and, equally important, an outstanding person who would fully embrace the College's educational philosophy. Tim Welsh was at the top of everyone's list."

Welsh has brought stability to the Friar basketball program. Following a highly successful season in 2000-01, he signed a seven-year contract extension, which ensured that Welsh will be leading the Friars through the 2007-08 season.

After signing his contract extension in the spring of 2001, Welsh expressed his excitement about his future with the Friars. "The administration has stepped up and made a statement to support the program. I love it here. My roots are here, I agree with the mission of the college and I enjoy living in Rhode Island. I'm excited about staying at Providence College as the head coach of the basketball program."

Welsh, formerly the head coach at Iona College, came to Providence with the task of revitalizing one of the most successful programs in New England. In his five seasons at the helm, Welsh has brought a high-energy and up-tempo style of play to Providence.

Welsh achieved a great deal of success in just three seasons as the head coach at Iona, leading the Gaels to three consecutive 20-win seasons. During that time, his teams turned in a 70-22 overall mark (76.1%), including a 27-win season in 1997-98. His 1997-98 squad was the first Iona team to advance to the NCAA Tournament since 1985.

During the 1997-98 campaign, Iona recorded just six losses while knocking off two BIG EAST opponents (Providence and Rutgers) and one Atlantic 10 foe (Fordham). The Gaels also put together the nation's longest winning streak - 15 games during the season. In the three-game, MAAC Tournament, Iona led in all three games for all but 11 seconds with the closest game being an 11-point win over Loyola (Md.).

In three years with Welsh calling the shots, Iona advanced to post-season action each year, going to the National Invitation Tournament in 1996 and 1997 and the NCAA Tournament in 1998.

A two-time Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Coach of the Year (1997, 1998), Welsh also received 1996-97 NABC District II Coach of the Year honors and the 1995-96 Peter A. Carlesimo Award as the Metropolitan Area's Division I Coach of the Year.

Welsh served as an interim head coach at Iona for 10 games during the 1994-95 season, replacing his father, Hall of Fame coach Jerry Welsh, who stepped down following that season due to medical reasons. Prior to that Tim had served as an assistant on his father's staff for four years.

No stranger to the BIG EAST, Tim Welsh served as an assistant coach to Jim Boeheim at Syracuse for three seasons (1988-91). During that time, Syracuse was 82-21, won two BIG EAST Conference Championships, the 1988 Preseason NIT Championship, and made three trips to the NCAA Tournament.

The 42-year old head coach got his start in college coaching at Iona where he served as a volunteer assistant to Pat Kennedy in 1985. Following that season, he became an assistant on Kennedy's staff at Florida State for two years before moving on to Syracuse.

Welsh played his college basketball under his father at Potsdam State. He was a co-captain his senior year and helped his team reach Final Four in 1984.

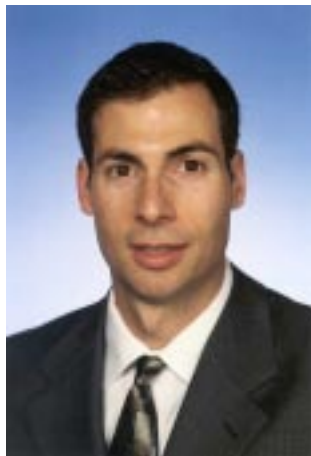

#### Assistant Coach

Steve Demeo enters his sixth season at Providence College and his ninth season as an assistant coach to Tim Welsh.

Known throughout college coaching circles as an excellent recruiter and developer of talent, DeMeo has been on the job at Providence since the day Welsh was hired--April 2, 1998.

In three seasons at Iona, Demeo built a strong reputation as a recruiter which showed up in the success that Iona achieved on the court during that

span.

Prior to joining Welsh's staff at Iona, the 38-year old DeMeo served as the head coach at Monroe Junior College in the Bronx. In two seasons there, the Mustangs compiled a 53-8 record that ranked in the top ten in each of those seasons.

Following the 1994-95 season, Monroe was ranked as the top JUCO team in the country. Following each season, DeMeo was selected as the Region XV Coach of the Year.

DeMeo has also served as the head coach at Bronx Community College (1990-93), as an assistant at LIU-C.W. Post (1989-90), and as an assistant at Queensborough Community College (1988-89). He also worked with the Westchester Stallions of the USBL during the 1994 season.

A graduate of Cardozo High School in New York, DeMeo played his collegiate basketball at the State University of New York at Buffalo.

### PHIL SEYMORE

#### Assistant Coach

Phil Seymore enters his fourth season as an assistant basketball coach at Providence College. Seymore came to Providence after serving as assistant coach at the University of Richmond for three seasons. While at Richmond he was responsible for the team's recruiting and the offensive and defensive development of guards and wingmen. He also prepared scouting reports of the opposing teams for the Spiders.

A native of Brooklyn, N.Y., and a graduate of Canisius College, Seymore began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Canisius in 1983 under his former coach Nick Macarchuk (a former PC assistant coach). After one season at Canisius, he went to Turner Carroll High School in Buffalo, N.Y. where he coached for four years, including two seasons as the head coach. His 1989-90 team at Turner won the State Catholic School Class C title and the 1988-89 squad captured the Manhattan Cup Championship. After leaving Turner Carroll High School in 1990, Seymore spent the next seven years as an assistant coach at Canisius.

Seymore began his collegiate playing career at Independence Junior College before transferring to Canisius. At Canisius, he averaged 16.8 points and 4.6 assists in two seasons as a point guard. Seymore was selected in the seventh round of the 1982 NBA draft by the New York Knicks. ## 2003-04 FRIAR OUTLOOK

### In 2003-04, The Friars Are Looking To Build On Success...

Since 1998, Head Coach Tim Welsh has methodically worked to build the Friars into a force in the BIG EAST. This season, he should see the benefits of his perseverance. Expectations will be high as Welsh's squad enters the season with almost the entire team that finished the 2002-03 campaign by winning eight of its last 11 games and advancing to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament. Providence concluded the year with an 18-14 overall record and an 8-8 mark in league play, which included a third-place finish in the BIG EAST East Division.

It is always a good sign when a basketball team returns all five starters from the previous year's squad. This is exactly the situation for Welsh's 2003-04 Friar team. In addition to the starters, the squad will have a number of seasoned veterans to lead a talented group of Friars. Three highly-touted freshmen join 10 returning players who will attempt to continue the rich tradition of Providence College basketball. This season's group of players are battle-tested and ready to succeed in one of the nation's toughest conferences.

After posting a 2-1 mark in the NIT last year, this season, Providence will look to make its first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 2001. With just one season left, the seniors will try to end their careers with an appearance in the Big Dance.

#### THEBACKCOURT

Head Coach Tim Welsh will have one of the most experienced backcourts in the BIG EAST this season. The Friars return three players who have played 215 games combined at Providence College. Their experience and ability to run the offense will be vital to the team's success.

Last season, Providence entered the year expecting to have a senior leader ABDUL MILLS (Brooklyn, N.Y.) in the backcourt. However, an injury forced him to miss the entire 2002-03 season. Mills regained a year of eligibility through a medical hardship waiver. He returns to the squad for his fifth season with the Friars. The team's top scorer in 2001-02 (14.5 points per game), Mills has consistently been in the Friars' starting lineup his first three seasons. During his career as a Friar, the 6-foot-4-inch guard has started 74 of the 90 games he has played. As a junior, he started 28 games and scored 20 or more points in five of those contests. He also reached double figures in scoring in 25 of the 29 games he played as a junior. Mills, a talented left-handed jump shooter, also led the squad in three pointers with 61 in 2001-02. He is expected to be at full capacity this season and eager to display his excellent quickness and shot creating ability. A talented offensive player, he is just 11 points shy of becoming the 36th player in Providence College history to score 1,000 or more points. After having to sit on the sidelines for a season, this gifted senior will be ready to pace the offense and eclipse the 1,000-point plateau.

One of Mills' backcourt mates will be fellow senior SHEIKU KABBA (Bronx, N.Y.). The very athletic Kabba stepped into the starting lineup after coming off the bench his first two seasons and started 16 games in the backcourt last season. Like Mills, Kabba also brings three seasons of BIG EAST experience to the team. He has shown consistent improvement each of the last three years. Playing in 31 games as a junior, Kabba averaged 10.0 points, which ranked him second on the team in scoring. He also averaged 2.7 rebounds and 2.4 assists per game in 2003. He scored a career-high 25 points in a Friar victory over Villanova on February 22. His athletic ability and high energy helps make him a valuable asset to the squad. Last season, the team posted a 13-2 mark when Kabba registered 10 or more points in a game.

The third returning member of the backcourt is sophomore DONNIE McGRATH (Katonah, N.Y.). McGrath, a highly recruited player out of high school, did not disappoint Friar fans in his first season. He was one of only two players on the squad to start every game for the Friars. On the season, McGrath averaged 9.1 points, 2.1 rebounds and 4.3 assists per game. His 58 three pointers and 138 assists were team highs. His 138 assists is the third highest single-season total ever for a Providence freshman. It also is the most assists in a single season since God Shammgod registered 239 in 1997. McGrath finished eighth in the BIG EAST in assists, averaging 4.3 per game. McGrath registered a season-high 13 assists against Ohio University on November 30, which tied a Providence freshman record for assists in a game. He earned the team's Coca-Cola Promising Prospect Award as well as being named to the BIG EAST All-Rookie squad. McGrath showed his potential and poise in the team's first BIG EAST game of the season at Boston College on January 2. He scored a team-high 23 points, going 5-for-7 from three-point range, while adding five assists.

In addition to these three proven veterans, freshmen DWIGHT BREWINGTON (Lynn, Mass.) and GERALD BROWN (Baltimore, Md.) will join the backcourt. Both players come to Providence as top-100 recruits, who will add quality depth in the backcourt. Brewington, a 6-foot-5-inch, 195-pound guard, was named one of the top-20 shooting guards in the country for the class of 2003 by ESPN.com. He helped Lynn Classical High School reach the Division 2 North semifinal in 2002 by averaging 24 points, 10 rebounds and nine assists. This past season, he played at Worcester Academy and averaged 20.7 points, 7.0 rebounds, 4.7 assists and 2.3 steals. Brewington's multi-dimensional play was key to Worcester Academy posting a 25-4 mark and capturing its first NEPSAC title in 15 years. For his efforts, he

was named NEPSAC First Team All-Star. Brewington is excellent off the dribble and has the ability to shoot from the perimeter. At 6-5, he adds post and rebounding skills from the backcourt. Brown, a 6-foot-4-inch, 190-pound guard, also has been ranked as one of the top-20 shooting guards in the country by ESPN.com. In 2002, Brown helped lead Frederick Douglass High School in Baltimore to a 28-0 mark and the school's first state title. He averaged 19.5 points, eight rebounds, five assists and five steals in 2002 and earned All-Metro honors at Douglass High School. Brown attended Hargrave Military Academy in Chatham, Va. last season and averaged 23 points, five rebounds, six assists and four steals per game, while shooting 69 percent from the field and 88 percent from the free-throw line. He helped lead Hargrave to a 29-3 record. Also in 2003, Brown was named MVP of the Charm City High School All-Star Game after scoring 27 points. In addition to the MVP honors, he won the Charm City Slam Dunk contest. Brown is a very explosive athlete, who can slash to the basket and can shoot from behind the three-point arc.

With two newcomers and three experienced returnees, the backcourt should be one of the team's strengths this season. Veterans Mills, Kabba and McGrath will provide valuable leadership for the talented newcomers Brown and Brewington.

### THEFRONTCOURT

The Friars will once again have great depth in the frontcourt this season. Providence returns six players and adds one newcomer who can fill the forward spot.

RYAN GOMES (Waterbury, Conn.) begins his third season at Providence as one of the top players in the BIG EAST. In just two seasons at Providence, this high-scoring forward has scored 921 points and is just 79 points shy of reaching the 1,000-point plateau. The talented 6-foot-7-inch, 245-pound junior played a major part in the team's success last year. He entered 2003 after a strong freshman season in which he earned BIG EAST All-Rookie Team honors. Not only did Gomes continue to improve as sophomore, but he proved to be one of the top young stars in the league. He started all 32 games averaging a team-high 18.4 points and 9.7 rebounds per game. He also led the team in free-throw shooting, connecting on 163 of his 194 attempts (84.0 percent). Gomes earned Second Team All-BIG EAST, USBWA All-District I, Basketball Times All-Northeast and Second Team NABC District I honors. He posted 17 double-doubles and scored 20 or more points in 15 games. Gomes also set the Providence records for most points by a sophomore (582), free throw percentage by a sophomore (.844), and most field goals by a forward (213). His 589 points in 2002-03 ranks 12th all-time at Providence for a single-season total. Gomes finished 21st in the nation and fourth in the BIG EAST in rebounds per game (9.7). In addition to the national and regional honors, he also earned the team's Jimmy Walker Most Valuable Player Award. He again will be a key component to the team's success in 2004 on December 21.

MARCUS DOUTHIT (Syracuse, N.Y.) again will be patrolling the paint for the Friars this season. At 6-foot-10-inches, Douthit will be asked to continue to be a rebounding and defensive force. He is a very agile and athletic center. On the defensive end, his long arms often force players to alter their shots. Douthit appeared in all 32 games last season, starting 16 contests. He averaged 5.1 points, 4.6 rebounds, and 3.0 blocks per game. His 3.0 blocks per game placed him third in the BIG EAST and 11th in the nation for blocked shots per game. The 97 total blocks on the season was the fourth highest single-season total ever at Providence. Last season, he started 16 of team's 32 games. Douthit had a career-high 12 rebounds versus St. John's on February 15 and a career-best nine blocked shots in a victory at Connecticut on March 5.

CHRIS ANRIN (Varmdo, Sweden) and MARIS LAKSA (Ventspils, Latvia) are the other two senior Friar frontcourt players. These two players are excellent shooters who have the size, 6-foot-7 and 6-foot-9, respectively, to shoot over opposing guards. Anrin is known as a pure shooter who looks to get open beyond the three-point arch. Last season, Anrin appeared in 22 games for the Friars averaging 2.9 points per game. He was in double figures twice last season, scoring 10 points in 16 minutes versus Pennsylvania on December 30 and 10 points in 13 minutes at Siena on January 4. Laksa was plagued by injuries during the 2001-02 season, but recovered well as he appeared in 28 games (15 starts) for the 2002-03 Friar squad. He can contribute both inside the paint as well as behind the three-point arch. Last season, Laksa was fourth on the team in scoring, averaging 8.5 points per game while also contributing 2.4 rebounds per contest. He was third on the team in three-point field goals made (37) and second with a .389 mark from beyond the three-point line. He recorded a career-high 26 points and six assists in a victory over Ohio University on November 30.

Juniors TUUKKA KOTTI (Forssa, Finland) and ROB SANDERS (New London, Conn.) round out the returning frontcourt players. These two played key roles in the Friars' success last season. Kotti can contribute to the Friar cause down low or step behind the three-point arch and hit a shot. He showed tremendous improvement last season. He averaged 7.7 points and 3.6 rebounds while starting 22 games and appearing in all 32 contests last season. He grabbed a career-high 10 rebounds versus Boston College on January 2. Kotti earned the team's John Zannini Most Improved Player Award after averaging 1.8 points and 1.3 rebounds per game his rookie season. Sanders is an athletic player who excites the fans with his vertical leap and thrilling jams. He also can hit the mid-range jumper and plays strong defense. Sanders rejoined the starting lineup in mid January and averaged 11.4 points in the final 10 games of the season, all of

which he started. He appeared in a total of 27 games (10 starts) and averaged 7.4 points and 3.8 rebounds per game. Sanders set six different career-highs this past season, including a career-best, 20-point effort versus Charleston in the First Round of the NIT on March 22.

Freshman HERBERT HILL (Kinston, N.C.) will see his first collegiate action this season. Hill practiced with the team last year, but did not see game action as the coaching staff decided to give the 6-foot-9-inch forward an extra year to develop. He averaged 14 points, nine rebounds and six blocks as a high school senior in 2002. Hill's strengths are his rebounding and shot blocking skills. He will look to strengthen the frontcourt with quality depth.

The only newcomer in the Providence frontcourt is JEFF PARMER (Niagara Falls, N.Y.). He is a 6-foot-7-inch, 230-pound multi-talented, combo forward, who played at Niagara Falls High School in Niagara Falls, N.Y. Parmer can shoot from behind the three-point arc and handle the ball. He is a strong rebounder, who also has good post moves. In three seasons as a starter at Niagara Falls High School, Parmer helped his team post an 82-3 mark. In 2002, he averaged 14.1 points, 9.7 rebounds, 5.0 assists and 1.5 blocks for Head Coach Dan Bazzani at Niagara Falls. His team posted a 23-1 record in that season and advanced to the Section 6 Class A finals. For his efforts in 2002, Parmer earned All-Western New York and All-League accolades. This past season, he averaged 15.3 points, 10.2 rebounds, 4.5 assists and 2.0 blocks for Niagara Falls. Twice in 2003, he established a team record with 21 rebounds in a game. Parmer also earned First Team All-Western New York and First Team All-League honors in 2003.

### OVERVIEW

Once again, Head Coach Tim Welsh has a solid nucleus of players returning for the 2003-04 season. This squad is loaded with veterans, who will look to transfer their past experiences into success on the basketball floor.

Abdul Mills is fifth-year player who knows what it takes to be successful in the BIG EAST Conference. In addition to Mills, Chris Anrin, Marcus Douthit, Sheiku Kabba, and Maris Laksa each have spent three years in Welsh's system and understand what they need to do for the team to be successful.

Ryan Gomes had another strong season and he should challenge for First Team All-BIG EAST honors this season. He has become a force in the BIG EAST. Gomes led the squad in scoring last season and for the second consecutive season was the team's top rebounder.

Returning starters Rob Sanders, Tuukka Kotti, Donnie McGrath and Douthit will need to continue to contribute as they did last season. McGrath will share time with Kabba and Mills as the Friars should have plenty of talent in the backcourt.

Freshmen Dwight Brewington, Gerald Brown, and Jeff Parmer will be welcome additions to this season's squad. They will add talent and depth to an already strong team. Brewington and Brown are two talented members of the backcourt who will have the luxury of learning from veterans Mills, Kabba and McGrath.

The 2003-04 Friars have all the tools to be a successful team. A large number of talented players return while three highly recruited high school prospects are added to the mix. Tim Welsh's squad will be ready to make a serious run at the BIG EAST title while also looking to make another appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

## Exhibition Game 1 - Providence 80, Global Sports All-Stars 56

The Friars opened their exhibition season with an 80-56 win against the Global Sports All-Stars on Saturday, November 2 at the Dunkin' Donuts Center in Providence, R.I. The Friars were led by sophomore Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) who recorded team highs in points (16) and rebounds (eight). Despite the strong play of Gomes in the first half, as he had eight points and four rebounds, the Friars trailed the Global Sports All-Stars, 35-33. Daniel Watts a 6-8 forward, who played his college basketball at Nevada, scored 10 points in first half to pace Global Sports. Watts finished the game with a team-high 16 points and six rebounds. Providence trailed by six points, 45-39, with 14:18 remaining in the game when the Friars got hot. Providence went on a 39-7 run in a 11 minute span and blew the game open with a 26 point lead. Strong three-point shooting and stingy defense were the keys to the Friar comeback. Providence finished the game shooting an impressive 52.5 percent from the field, which included an 11-21 performance from behind the three-point arc. Friar freshman guard Donnie McGrath (Kathonah, N.Y.) and junior guard Sheiku Kabba (Bronx, N.Y.) each got hot in the second half from three-point territory. For the game, McGrath was 4-6 from behind the stripe and Kabba was 3-5. McGrath finished with 12 points and five assists and Kabba recorded nine points, five assists and five steals.

## Game 1 - Providence 83, Brown 64

The Providence College men's basketball team opened the season with an 83-64 win against cross-town rival Brown at the Dunkin' Donuts Center in Providence, R.I. on November 23. The Friars improved to 86-25 all-time versus the Bears and 7-0 all-time against Brown in season openers. Overall, the Friars improved their record in season openers to 66-10. Providence had three players score 17 points in the win. Sophomore Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) recorded a double-double with 17 points and a game-high 12 rebounds. Juniors Maris Laksa (Ventpsils, Latvia) and Sheiku Kabba (Bronx, N.Y.) also added 17 points. Providence held a 40-25 lead at halftime after Gomes sparked the offense with 13 points in 17 minutes of action. Brown came out strong in the second half and cut the lead to five points, 40-35, with 18:13 remaining in the game. That was as close as the Bears would get as the Friars went on a 14-4 run and blew the game open. Sophomore Tuukka Kotti (Forssa, Finland) was impressive in the second half for Providence. Kotti scored 13 of his 15 points in the final 20 minutes of the game. Brown was led by Jason Forte, who recorded a game-high 18 points in the loss.

However, Northeastern finished the half on a 35-20 run and held a 41-37 lead after 20 minutes of action. Sophomore Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) led the Friars with 12 points in the first half. Strong defense by the Friars in the second half changed the flow of the game. Providence held the Huskies to just eight field goals on 34 attempts (23.5 percent) in the final 20 minutes of action. On the offensive end, the Friars shot 42.9 percent in the second half. Providence took a 46-45 lead at 15:39 on a basket by sophomore Tuukka Kotti (Forssa, Finland) and never trailed again in the game. Gomes recorded his fourth consecutive double-double as he finished with 20 points and 10 rebounds. Junior Romuald Augustin (Montreal, Quebec) also had a double-double as he registered a game-high 21 points and 10 rebounds. It marked the first time two Friars scored 20 or more points in a game since November 20, 2001 when John Linehan, Maris Laksa and Abdul Mills all accomplished the feat. Kotti contributed with 13 points and six rebounds.

## Game 31 - Providence 69, Charleston 64 - NIT First Round

The Providence College Friars earned a 69-64 win over the College of Charleston in the First Round of the NIT on Saturday, March 22 at the Dunkin' Donuts Center in Providence, R.I. The victory gave Providence consecutive wins in the NIT for the first time since 1993. The Friars were paced by sophomores Rob Sanders (New London, Conn.), who had a career-high 20 points, and Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.), who added 19 points and a game-high eight rebounds. Despite shooting 53.6 percent in the first half, the Friars trailed by one point (35-34) at halftime. Charleston connected on six of 16 three-point attempts, including one with two seconds remaining in the half by Troy Wheless to take a one-point lead into the lockerroom at halftime. Sanders and Gomes combined for 18 of the Friars' 34 first-half points. In the second half, the Friars could not put away the Cougars. The Friars never held a lead larger than eight points in the second half as the scrappy Cougars refused to give up. With 6:05 remaining in the game, Gomes converted on a layup to give PC a 58-54 lead. The Friars came up with a defensive stop and junior Sheiku Kabba (Bronx, N.Y.) hit a key three pointer with 5:04 left in the game to give the Friars a seven point lead. The Friars did not make another field goal in the game, but did convert on eight of 10 free throw opportunities to earn the win. Kabba added 10 points and four assists for the Friars.
