FRIARS VERSUS ST. JOHN'S... On Tuesday, March 1, the Friars will play the St. John's Red Storm at the Dunkin' Donuts Center. The game will be the 91st meeting between the two teams with the Red Storm holding a 53-37 lead in the series. The Friars are 7-0 in the last seven games against St. John's. PC is 19-19 all-time at home against St. John's, 14-28 on the road and 4-6 on neutral courts against the Red Storm. The two teams first met on February 25, 1927 when the Friars earned a 36-33 win in Brooklyn, N.Y. In the Red Storm's last win against the Friars, St. John's defeated the Friars, 61-46, at the Dunkin' Donuts Center on February 8, 2000. In the most recent game between the two teams, the Friars earned a 103-78 win over St. John's at Madison Square Garden on February 29, 2004. St. John's leads the all-time series in BIG EAST regular season play, 26-19.

FRIARS TRYING FOR EIGHTH STRAIGHT WIN AGAINST ST. JOHN'S... The Friars enter Tuesday's game attempting to earn their eighth consecutive win against St. John's. Last season, the Friars defeated St. John's 103-78 on February 29, 2004. The Friars' last loss to the Red Storm was a 61-46 defeat at the Dunkin' Donuts Center on February 8, 2000.

SCOUTING THE RED STORM... St. John's enters Tuesday's game with a 9-16 mark, which includes a 6-5 record in non-conference action. The Red Storm are 3-11 in BIG EAST action this season. In their most recent game, St. John's was defeated by Duke, 58-47, on February 26. St. John's has earned three wins in league action over Pittsburgh, Rutgers and Georgetown. St. John's is led by sophomore guard Daryll Hill. He is one of the top scorers in the league, averaging 20.1 ppg. Sophomore forward Lamont Hamilton is third on the team in scoring, averaging 13.0 ppg. He also leads the team in rebounding (7.5 rpg).

SENIOR NIGHT... Tuesday's game will be the final home contest for PC seniors Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) and Tuukka Kotti (Forssa, Finland). Gomes and Kotti have posted helped the Friars post a 43-22 mark over the past four seasons at the Dunkin' Donuts Center. It also will be the final home game for four of the Friar student managers. The four student managers working their final game are Chris Judge, Richard Pitino, Mark Quercia, and Chuck Simonds.

FRIARS VERSUS GEORGETOWN... On Saturday, March 5, the Friars will play Georgetown at the MCI Center. The Friars

2003-04 (20-7/11-5)...Friars made the team's 15th appearance in the NCAA Tournament...Friars finished third in the BIG EAST, tying the team record for league wins with an 11-5 mark...Team was ranked for nine weeks during season, reaching as high as No. 12 in the Associated Press Poll on March 1...Friars earned the 23rd 20-win season and first since 2001.

2002-03 (18-14/8-8)...Friars posted their second highest win total in the last six years with an 18-14 mark...Finished third in the BIG EAST East Division with an 8-8 record...Team advanced to the Second Round of the NIT and posted a 2-1 mark in the Tournament...Ended the season winning eight of the last 11 games, including a 76-70 victory at Connecticut on March 5.

2004-05 PROVIDENCE COLLEGE BASKETBALL

LAST SEASON VERSUS ST. JOHN'S... Last season, the Friars posted a 1-0 mark against St. John's. The Friars defeated St. John's, 103-78, on February 29, 2004 at Madison Square Garden in New York. For the Friars, it was their 20th win of the season, their 11th BIG EAST victory and their seventh consecutive win over the Red Storm. The Friars set a BIG EAST record for points in the first half as they recorded 62 in the first 20 minutes. Rob Sanders (New London, Conn.) led the Friars in the first half as he scored 14 points in 14 minutes to pace the team to a 62-38 lead. In the second half, most of the Friar starters played sparingly as Head Coach Tim Welsh used his bench. The Friars continued to play inspired offensive basketball as they produced 41 second half points. Sanders finished the games win 15 points and each of the Friars' other four starters finished with 11 or more points. Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) recorded a team high 19 points and 11 rebounds. Marcus Douthit (Syracuse) added 13 points and nine rebounds. Sheiku Kabba (Bronx, N.Y.) and Donnie McGrath (Katonah, N.Y.) each added 11 points in the win.

FRIARS DEFEATED AT SYRACUSE... Playing their first game at Syracuse since 1999, the Friars were defeated by the 15th-ranked Syracuse Orange, 91-66, on February 26. Seven minutes into the game, Syracuse led by 12 points (18-6) before the Friars went on a 15-4 run to get within one point with of tying the game with 8:54 remaining in the half. The Orange closed out the half with a 40-36 lead. In the second half, the Friars kept the game close and trailed by seven points (64-57) with 10:40 remaining in the game. However, Syracuse out scored the Friars, 25-9, over the remainder of the game to earn the win. Senior Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) led the Friars with 21 points. Freshman Randall Hanke (New York, N.Y.) scored a career-high 17 points. He also grabbed six rebounds and made four blocks. Senior Tuukka Kotti (Forssa, Finland) scored eight points and registered a team-high eight rebounds.

GOMES SETS PROVIDENCE ALL-TIME SCORING MARK... Friar senior forward Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) scored 19 points at Seton Hall on February 23 and surpassed Jimmy Walker (2,045 points) as the Friars' all-time scoring leader. On February 15, he scored a career-high 37 points in the Friars' loss to Connecticut and surpassed the 2,000 point mark for his career at Providence. He is just the third Friar all-time to accomplish this feat as he has scored 2,069 career points. The other two PC players to score more than 2,000 points in their careers were Jimmy Walker (1964-67) with 2,045 points and Eric Murdock (1987-91) with 2,021 points. In his rookie season, Gomes scored 332 points in 24 games (13.8 ppg). As a sophomore, he registered 589 points in 32 games (18.4 ppg) and as a

junior he scored 547 points in 29 games (18.9 ppg). In 2004-05, Gomes has scored 601 points and is averaging 21.5 ppg.

GOMES SCORES 600 POINTS... Senior Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) registered 21 points in the Friars' loss at Syracuse on February 26. With his 21 points, Gomes now has scored 601 points this season. It marks just the 10th time in the history of Friar basketball that a player has scored 600 or more points in a season. Jimmy Walker is the all-time single season leader with 851 points in 28 games (30.39 ppg) in 1966-67.

FRIARS HAVE THIRD TOUGHEST SCHEDULE IN THE NATION... According to the most recent report from RPI Ratings.com (Feb. 28), the Friars have played the third toughest schedule in the nation. Only Kansas with a RPI of 1 and Oklahoma State with a RPI of 3 have played a more difficult schedule. The Friars are one of only two BIG EAST schools with a top-10 schedule (Villanova 4). Eight of the Friars' first 28 opponents this season have a RPI Rating in the top-21 (Wake Forest 4, Boston College 5 (twice), Villanova 12 (twice), Connecticut (23) and Syracuse 21 (twice).

GOMES BECOMES EIGHTH PLAYER TO RECORD 1000 PTS AND 500 REBS... Senior Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) became the eighth player to record 1,000th points and 500 rebounds in BIG EAST games. On February 9, Gomes recorded his 1,000th point in league action in the Friars' loss at West Virginia. On February 15, Gomes grabbed his 500th rebound in league action in a loss to Connecticut. After 62 career BIG EAST games, Gomes has recorded 1,124 points and 521 rebounds. He now ranks 16th all-time in scoring in league play.

GOMES SIXTH PLAYER IN BIG EAST TO REGISTER 2,000 POINTS AND 1,000 REBOUNDS... On February 23 in the Friars' win over Seton Hall, senior Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) recorded his 1,000th career rebound and became just the sixth player in BIG EAST history score more than 2,000 points and record 1,000 rebounds. In the 26 years of BIG EAST action, only five other players have accomplished this feat. Gomes ranks first all-time in scoring at Providence (2,069 points) and fifth all-time in rebounds (1,007).

GOMES HAS SCORED 20 OR MORE 17 TIMES... Senior Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) registered 21 points in the Friars' loss at Syracuse on February 26. He has scored 20 or more points in 17 games this season. His 21 points versus Syracuse also marked the 49th time in his career that he has recorded 20 or more points in a game. He has scored 20 or more points in 43 percent of the 113 games in his collegiate career.

HANKE RECORDS A CAREER HIGH... Freshman Randall Hanke (New York, N.Y.) scored a career-high 17 points at No. 15 Syracuse on February 26. Hanke was 5-5 from the free-throw line and 6-7 from the field. He also grabbed six rebounds and made four blocks in 22 minutes.

GOMES NINTH IN NATION IN SCORING, FIRST IN THE BIG EAST... Entering last week, senior forward Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) ranked ninth in the nation in scoring. Gomes ranks first in the BIG EAST in scoring (21.5 ppg) and third in rebounding (8.4 rpg). He also ranks seventh in field goal percentage (49.8 percent), 10th in free throw percentage (76.8 percent), 11th in assists (3.32 apg) and 14th in steals (1.54 spg). He is the only player in the BIG EAST ranked in the top 15 in all six of these categories

FRIARS RANK FIFTH IN THE NATION IN BLOCKED SHOTS... The Friars entered last week ranked fifth in the nation in blocked shots. Through 28 games, the Friars are averaging 6.2 blocks per game. Connecticut leads the nation with an average of 9.4 blocks per game.

MCGRATH SECOND IN LEAGUE ACTION IN THREES... Junior Donnie McGrath (Katonah, N.Y.) ranks second in the BIG EAST in three-point field goal percentage in league action. In 13 BIG EAST games, McGrath has made 34 of 81 attempts (.420) from behind the arc. In overall action, he ranks fourth in the BIG EAST, connecting on 65 of 159 attempts (.409) from three-point territory. One of the top all-time three pointers shooters at Providence, McGrath ranks second all-time at PC in threes made with 190 in 88 games. Former Friar Jamel Thomas holds the PC record with 201 threes in 124 games.

MCGRATH A KEY TO VICTORY... In his three seasons at Providence, junior Donnie McGrath (Katonah, N.Y.) has scored 14 or more points in 25 of the 88 games he has played. The Friars are 18-7 (.720) when McGrath has scored 14 or more points in a game. In addition, the team has posted a 23-13 (.639) record when McGrath scores 10 or more points in a game.

MCGRATH TIES NCAA RECORD... Junior Donnie McGrath (Katonah, N.Y.) tied the NCAA single-game, three-point field goal percentage mark in the Friars' win over Virginia on February 2. McGrath was 9-9 from three-point territory. Only two other players have been 9-9 from behind the three-point arc - Mark Poag of Old Dominion versus VMI on November 25, 1997 and Markus Wilson of Evansville versus Tennessee-Martin on November 18, 1998. In addition, McGrath established a Providence three-point field goal percentage mark, eclipsing Delray Brooks' 8-9 (.889) effort versus Villanova on January 10, 1987.

MCGRATH ALMOST TIES SECOND NCAA RECORD... Junior Donnie McGrath (Katonah, N.Y.) entered the game versus West Virginia on February 9 having hit 11 straight three-point field goals over two games and needed to make four consecutive threes to tie the NCAA record of 15 consecutive threes. He made his first three three-point attempts, but did not connect on his fourth attempt of the game and came up one short of the record.

GOMES RECORDS A CAREER HIGH... Senior Ryan Gomes registered a career-high 37 points in the Friars' loss to No. 18 Connecticut on February 15. His 37 points were the most scored in the BIG EAST this season. For Gomes, it marked the third time this season that he scored 32 or more points. On February 9, he registered 33 points and a career-high 16 field goals versus West Virginia. His 16 field goals were the most by a Friar since Eric Murdock recorded 16 (48 points) versus Pittsburgh on January 23, 1991. He recorded 32 points as he shot 10-22 from the field and 9-9 from the free-throw line versus No. 24 Villanova on February 5. Gomes has scored 30 or more points four times in his career. As a freshman, he scored 31 points versus Miami on January 19, 2002. His 37 points against Connecticut marked the 123rd time a PC player scored 30 or more points.

FRIARS PLAY DOUBLE OVERTIME GAME... The Friars double overtime loss to Connecticut on February 15 marked PC's third overtime game of the season and the team's 100th overtime contest all-time. For PC, it marked the team's first double-overtime game since March 13, 1991. PC has now posted a 1-2 mark this

season and 50-50 record all-time in overtime games.

BREWINGTON INJURED... Friar sophomore guard Dwight Brewington (Lynn, Mass.) injured his ankle in the Friars' loss to Villanova on February 5 and is expected to be out of the lineup for the next several weeks. Brewington is the team's second leading scorer, averaging 13.6 ppg. He also is second on the team in three pointers made (44-127, .346).

MCGRATH SCORES A CAREER HIGH... Friar junior point guard Donnie McGrath (Katonah, N.Y.) tied the NCAA single-game, three-point field goal percentage mark and set a career high for points with 27 in the Friars' win over Virginia on February 2. All 27 points were scored on three point field goals as McGrath was 9-9 from three-point territory. His previous career high was 23 which he reached versus Boston College in 2003 and Villanova in 2004. For the season, McGrath is averaging 9.6 points per game.

GOMES SETS PC RECORD FOR ASSISTS BY A FORWARD... Senior Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) has established a Providence record for assists by a forward with 263 in his career as a Friar. The old record was 229 which was set by Bruce Campbell (1974-78). This season, Gomes has recorded a career best 93 assists. He needs six assists to establish the PC single-season record for assists by a forward.

GOMES NAMED A TOP 30 CANDIDATE FOR WOODEN AWARD AND NAISMITH TROPHY... Senior forward Ryan Gomes (Waterbury Conn.) has been a top-30 candidate for the Wooden Award and the Naismith Trophy. Gomes earned nine All-America honors last year, including Wooden All-America accolades.

GERALD BROWN LEAVES THE TEAM... It was announced Tuesday, February 1 that sophomore guard Gerald Brown (Baltimore, Md.) has left the men's basketball team for personal reasons. Brown played in 15 games this season and averaged 7.1 points per game and 2.5 rebounds.

GOMES FIFTH IN CONSECUTIVE STARTS... Friar senior Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) has started 112 consecutive games. His consecutive start streak ranks fifth in the nation behind Craig Forth of Syracuse (132 games), Chris Thomas of Notre Dame (125 games), T.J. Sorrentine of Vermont (115 games) and Lawrence Roberts of Mississippi State (113 games).

ALL-TIME VERSUS RANKED TEAMS... The Friars have registered a 90-192 record all-time versus top-25 teams. PC is 8-41 (.163) versus top-5 teams, 21-99 (.175) versus top-10 teams

and 80-178 (.310) against top-20 squads. Head Coach Tim Welsh has registered a 9-32 record (.213) versus top-25 teams. This season, the Friars are 0-9 against ranked teams. Providence was defeated by No. 1/1 Wake Forest, 79-67, on November 24, No. 23/22 Florida, 84-66, on November 27, No. 25/- Boston College, 69-60, on January 8, No. 7/7 Syracuse, 75-71, on January 15, No. 8/8 Boston College, 78-75, on January 26, No. 16/15 Pittsburgh, 86-66, No. 24/25 Villanova, 89-81, on February 5, No. 18/18 Connecticut 94-89 on February 15 and No. 15/15 Syracuse, 91-66, on February 26.

BREWINGTON SECOND ON THE TEAM IN SCORING... Sophomore guard Dwight Brewington (Lynn, Mass.) ranks second on the team in scoring, averaging 13.6 points per game. He registered 17 points in the Friars' victory over Virginia on February 2. For Brewington, it marked the 16th time in 22 games this season that he scored 10 or more points. On January 15, he scored 21 points and grabbed eight rebounds in the Friars' 75-71 loss to No. 7 Syracuse. It marked the fourth time this season that he registered 20 or more points in a game and the first time since he scored 23 points versus Michigan on November 26.

FRIARS WIN 400TH GAME AT THE DUNK'... On February 2, the Friars defeated Virginia, 98-79, to earn their 400th win at the Dunkin' Donuts Center. In 33 seasons of action at the Dunkin' Donuts Center, the Friars have posted a 401-163 (.711) mark. The Friars did not lose a game at the Dunk' in their first two seasons in the building (1973 and 1974).

KOTTI REGISTERS A DOUBLE-DOUBLE... Senior forward Tuukka Kotti (Forssa, Finland) recorded the second double-double of his career when he notched 17 points and a career-high 11 rebounds in the Friars' win over Rutgers on February 13. Kotti is averaging 10.0 ppg and 5.8 rpg this season.

FRIARSON NATIONAL TELEVISION... The Friars have appeared on national television 10 times this season, posting a record of 4-6 record in those games. Seven of the contests were televised on ESPN 2, one game was on ESPN, one game was shown on ESPN Classic and one game was on CBS. The Friars have appeared on national tv 154 times. Providence has posted a 59-95 mark all-time in games televised on national tv. The Friars have registered a 7-6 record on NBC, a 7-22 mark on CBS, a 34-51 record on ESPN, an 11-15 mark in games televised on ESPN2 a 0-1 record on ESPN Classic.

FRIARS SHOOT 50 PERCENT... The Friars shot an impressive 55.9 percent (33-59) in their 81-64 win over Rutgers on February 13. It

marked the seventh time this season that PC shot over 50 percent from the field. The Friars are 6-1 this season when they shoot over 50 percent from the field. On November 18, the Friars defeated Pennsylvania, 89-52, and the squad shot a season best 65.5 percent (36-55) from the field.

GOMES REGISTERS HIS 40TH CAREER DOUBLE-DOUBLE... Senior Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) recorded his 40th career double-double with his 33 points and 14 rebounds versus West Virginia on February 9. Gomes is the active career leader for double-doubles in the BIG EAST. Syracuse's Hakim Warrick is second to Gomes with 39 career double-doubles. Gomes has posted six double-doubles this season. Last season, he registered 13 double-doubles. He had a career-high 17 double-doubles as a sophomore.

HILL JUST MISSES TRIPLE-DOUBLE... Sophomore Herbert Hill (Kinston, N.C.) nearly recorded a triple-double in the Friars' loss to Villanova on January 11. Hill finished one block shy of a triple-double. He recorded career-highs of 15 points, 12 rebounds and nine blocks in the game. For Hill it was his first career double-double. The last Friar to register a triple-double was Karim Shabazz with 25 points, 15 rebounds and 10 blocks versus Long Island on December 27, 1999. Hill is averaging 5.1 points and 3.6 rebounds per game.

FRIARS ESTABLISH BLOCK RECORDS... With their 16 blocks against Villanova on January 11, the Friars established a team record for blocks in a game. The team was one block shy of tying the BIG EAST single-game mark of 17 blocks established by Georgetown on February 22, 1989. The previous Friar record was 14 blocks, which had occurred three times in the past. Sophomore Herbert Hill (Kinston, N.C.) led the team with nine blocks, which tied the Friar BIG EAST single-game mark. Marcus Douthit also registered nine blocks versus Connecticut on March 5, 2003.

HANKE SETS FRIAR FRESHMAN RECORD WITH NINE BLOCKS: Friar freshman center Randall Hanke (New York, N.Y.) registered nine blocks in the second half of the Friars' 72-59 win at Memphis on December 23. He also registered seven rebounds in 19 minutes of action versus the Tigers. With his nine blocks, Hanke established the Friar freshman record for blocks in a game. The previous record was eight blocks which was set by Bob Cooper versus Cal-Irvine on January 7, 1974. Hanke leads the Friars in blocks with 54 and ranks fifth in the BIG EAST with 2.00 blocks per game.

IMPRESSIVE NUMBERS VERSUS MAINE... In the Friars' 104-74 win over Maine on December 21, the team posted some impressive num-

bers with 104 points, 26 assists, 45 rebounds, 23 steals and 29 turnovers forced. The 104 points scored was the team's highest output since scoring 119 versus Binghamton on February 22, 2001. The 26 assists was the most assists by a Friar team since PC recorded 26 versus St. John's on February 29, 2003. The Friars' 23 steals was one shy of the Providence record of 24, which was established on December 21, 1996 versus Brown. Lastly, the 29 turnovers committed by the Black Bears was the most by a Friar opponent since Morgan State made 29 turnovers on December 27, 2001.

FRIARS REACH 1,200 VICTORIES... With the Friars' 72-63 win over Michigan on November 26, the team earned its 1,200th victory all-time. The Friars' all-time record is 1,208-779 (.608). Providence is the fourth team in New England to earn its 1,200th victory. Three other programs in New England that have earned 1,200 victories are Connecticut, Rhode Island and Yale.

PROVIDENCE ALL-TIME... In 78 seasons of PC basketball, the team has posted a 1,208-779 (.608) mark. The team's all-time record at the Dunkin' Donuts Center is 401-163 (.711). In 2003-04, Providence registered an 11-4 mark at the Dunkin' Donuts Center, an 8-3 record on the road and a 1-2 mark in neutral arenas.

LAST SEASON... In 2003-04, PC posted a 20-9 record overall. In 16 BIG EAST games in 2003-04, the Friars registered an 11-5 record and finished third in the BIG EAST. The Friars earned their 15th appearance in the NCAA Tournament and were ranked as high as 12th in the Associated Press Poll.

GOMES NAMED BIG EAST PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR... It was announced on October 27 at the BIG EAST Media Day at Madison Square Garden in New York that Providence College senior forward Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) was named Preseason Player of the Year and one of seven players named to the Preseason All-BIG EAST First Team. Gomes, a 2003 All-BIG EAST Second Team selection and a 2004 All-BIG EAST First Team member, became the first Friar to earn BIG EAST Preseason Player of the Year accolades. Gomes, who earned nine All-America honors in 2004, also has been named one of the Top-50 Preseason Candidates for the 2004-05 Wooden Award and Naismith Trophy. In addition, he is a preseason candidate for the Adolph Rupp Trophy. He has been named to a number of preseason First Team All-America squads, including Basketball Times, Street & Smith's and Rivals.com.

He has brought three teams to the NCAA Tournament. His 1998 Iona team and his 2001 and 2004 Providence squads qualified for the NCAA Tournament.

EFEJUKU, KALE AND HOSLEY TO ATTEND PROVIDENCE... Providence College men's basketball coach Tim Welsh announced that student-athletes Weynmi Efejuku (Queens, N.Y.), Jonathan Kale (Pawtucket, R.I.) and Quinten Hosley (Denver, Colo.) have signed a National Letter of Intent to attend Providence College beginning in September 2005.
