**FRIARS VERSUS VILLANOVA...** On Tuesday, the Friars will play Villanova at the Dunkin' Donuts Center in Providence, R.I. The Friars and the Wildcats have met 72 times in the all-time series with Villanova holding a 42-30 lead. PC is 18-13 all-time at home against Villanova, 10-23 on the road and 2-6 on neutral courts against the Wildcats. The two teams first met on February 15, 1936 when the Friars earned a 46-37 win at the Rhode Island Auditorium. In the first meeting between the two teams this season, Villanova defeated the Friars, 76-57, at Villanova on January 2. PC won both games between the two teams last season. PC defeated the Wildcats, 76-67, at Villanova on January 9, 2001 and the Friars earned an 84-64 win at the Dunkin' Donuts Center in Providence, R.I. on January 31, 2001. Villanova leads the all-time series in BIG EAST regular season play, 24-17.

**SCOUTING THE WILDCATS...** The Wildcats enter the game with a 14-9 mark overall and a 5-7 record in BIG EAST play. In their most recent game, the Wildcats defeated Georgetown in overtime, 83-72, on February 16. Villanova is led by 6-3 junior guard Gary Buchanan (St. Louis, Mo.). Buchanan leads the team in scoring, averaging 18.5 points per game. Junior forward Ricky Wright (East Chicago, Ind.) also is having a strong season for the Wildcats, averaging 14.1 points and 8.0 rebounds per game. Senior center Brooks Sales (Bloomfield, Conn.) is leading the team in rebounding, averaging 8.7 boards per game.

**LAST GAME VS. VILLANOVA...** On Wednesday, January 2, Villanova defeated the Friars, 76-57, at the Pavilion in Villanova, Pa. Freshman Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) was 6-7 from the field in the first half as he scored 12 points. PC trailed, 36-35, after 20 minutes of play. However, PC came out flat in the second half as Villanova went on a 21-3 run over the first eight minutes of the second half. The Friars struggled the entire second half, recording only seven field goals and 22 points. Villanova was impressive during the final 20 minutes of the game, shooting 61.9 percent. The Wildcats shot 59.1 percent from the field for the game. Gomes led PC in scoring with 13 points. Senior John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) was the only other Friar in double figures as he registered 12 points.

# 2001-02 PROVIDENCE COLLEGE BASKETBALL

**LAST SEASON VS. VILLANOVA...** Last season, PC earned two wins against Villanova. It marked only the seventh time in the all-time series between the two teams that Providence defeated Villanova twice in one season. In the first meeting between the teams last season, the Friars defeated the Wildcats, 76-67, at Villanova, Pa., on January 9, 2001. Romuald Augustin led the Friars with 21 points and five assists. Michael Bradley had a strong game for the Wildcats, scoring 27 points and registering 10 rebounds. On January 31, 2001, PC earned an 84-64 win over Villanova at the Dunkin' Donuts Center. Providence forced Villanova into 27 turnovers. John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) scored 20 points and was 6-7 from behind the three-point arc. He also had three steals and three assists. Erron Maxey (Lake Elsinore, Calif.) and Maris Laksa (Ventspils, Latvia) each had a strong game for the Friars. Maxey scored 20 points, shooting 5-6 from the floor, and Laksa added 12 points.

**FRIARS DEFEATED BY BC...** On Wednesday, February 13, the Friars were defeated by Boston College, 89-79, at Conte Forum in Chestnut Hill, Mass. Led by junior Abdul Mills (Brooklyn, N.Y.), who had 15 points in the first 20 minutes of action, the Friars played a strong first half and led, 42-41, at halftime. The Friars shot 47.4 percent in the first half. PC came out strong in the second half, scoring the first seven points and taking an eight-point lead (49-41) in the first minute of action. However, BC battled back and took its own seven-point lead with 12:27 remaining in the game. The Friars cut the Eagle lead to three points six times over the final 12 minutes, but could not pull ahead. BC's Troy Bell scored a game-high 39 points in the win. PC was led by Mills, who finished the game with 26 points and a team-high eight rebounds. Senior John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) contributed with 14 points, seven assists and six steals in 39 minutes of action.

**LINEHAN SIX STEALS AWAY FROM BIG EAST SINGLE-SEASON STEAL MARK...** Senior John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) is six steals away from becoming the BIG EAST single-season steals leader. Linehan, who has 62 steals in conference action this season, needs six steals to break Allen Iverson's (Georgetown) mark of 67 steals, which he established in 1996. Linehan has set the BIG EAST single-game steals record (11) and the BIG EAST career steals record this season (211).

**PROVIDENCE ALL-TIME...** In 75 seasons of Providence College basketball, the team has posted a 1,157-736 (.611) mark. The team's all-time record at the Dunkin' Donuts Center is 368-145 (.717).

**LINEHAN CLOSE TO 100 ASSIST, 100 REBOUNDS AND 100 STEALS IN 2001-02...** Senior John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) is two rebounds shy of becoming only the second Providence College Friar ever to record 100 or more steals, rebounds and assists in one season. Linehan has registered 119 steals, 118 assists and 98 rebounds this season. Eric Murdock is the only Friar to accomplish this feat. In 1990-91, Murdock recorded 111 steals, 148 assists and 168 rebounds.

**LINEHAN SETS BIG EAST CAREER STEALS RECORD...** With 17:51 remaining in the second half of PC's 67-56 loss to Connecticut on February 5, senior John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) made his second steal of the game and his 198th BIG EAST career steal to become the league's all-time steals leader. Linehan surpassed former Friar Eric Murdock who registered 197 steals in his BIG EAST career. Linehan finished the game with three steals. He now has 205 steals in BIG EAST action.

**LINEHAN SETS PROVIDENCE SINGLE SEASON STEAL MARK...** Senior John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) set the Providence College single-season steals mark when he made his 112th steal of the season with 5:23 remaining in the game in PC's 77-69 win against Virginia Tech on February 9. In 26 games this season, Linehan has recorded 119 steals (4.6 steals per game). The former PC single-season record of 111 steals was set by Eric Murdock in 1990-91 season. Linehan is just the third PC player to ever register 100 or more steals in a season.

**FRIARS IN OVERTIME...** Providence has posted a 1-1 mark in overtime games this season. On January 26, the Friars defeated St. John's, 75-70, in overtime. For the Friars, it was their first overtime victory in BIG EAST Conference action since a 90-84 win at Villanova on February 20, 1999. It also was their 93rd overtime game all-time. Providence has a 46-47 record all-time in overtime games, including a 38-40 mark in games decided in the first overtime period.

# 2001-02 PROVIDENCE COLLEGE BASKETBALL

## LINEHAN SETS BIG EAST AND PC SINGLE-GAME STEAL MARK...

On January 22, in a 70-55 win against Rutgers, Friar senior John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) registered a Providence College and BIG EAST single-game record 11 steals. Linehan broke the Conference record of 10 steals established by Allen Iverson of Georgetown against Miami on January 13, 1996. The Providence College record of 10 steals in a game was set by God Shammgod on December 21, 1996 against Brown. Linehan's previous career high for steals in a game was nine, which he had done twice. The NCAA single-game steal record is 13, which was reached twice by Oklahoma's Mookie Blaylock (versus Centenary on December 12, 1987 and versus Loyola Marymount on December 17, 1988).

## LINEHAN SECOND IN THE NATION IN STEALS PER GAME...

Senior John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) is second in the nation in average steals per game. Linehan has made 119 steals in 26 games this season for an average of 4.6 steals per game. He trails Desmond Cambridge of Alabama A&M, who leads the nation with a 5.5 steals per game average (104 steals in 19 games).

## LINEHAN IN PURSUIT OF MURDOCK...

John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) now ranks second all-time in NCAA history with 365 career steals in 117 games. The senior guard needs 12 steals to surpass former Friar Eric Murdock (1987-91) as the NCAA all-time steals leader. He ranks first on the BIG EAST all-time steal list with 211. Linehan leads the team and the BIG EAST in steals with 119 in 26 games this season. He also ranks second in the nation in steals, averaging 4.6 per game.

## LINEHAN OVER 400 ASSISTS...

Senior guard John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) recorded six assists in PC's 89-79 loss to BC on February 13. For his career, he ranks eighth all-time at Providence in assists with 431 in 117 games.

## WHEN THE FRIARS SHOOT 50 PERCENT OR HIGHER...

The Friars are 4-0 this season in games when they have recorded a 50 percent or higher field goal percentage. Most recently, PC shot 50.0 percent from the field (24-48) and earned a 78-57 win against St. John's on January 12. PC's top shooting performance of the season occurred in its 94-63 win against Central Connecticut on December 30, 2001. In that win, the Friars shot 33-60 (55.0 percent) from the field.

## WHEN THE FRIARS SHOOT UNDER 40 PERCENT...

PC has shot under 40 percent in 13 of its 26 games this season. The team has posted a 5-8 mark in games when it has a field goal percentage under 40 percent. PC shot a season-low 29.4 percent from the field in a 69-62 loss to UConn on January 16. In the 13 games this season that the team has shot 40 percent or higher from the field, it has registered an 8-5 record.

## LINEHAN CHASING NCAA ALL-TIME STEAL RECORD...

Senior guard John Linehan (Chester, Pa.), who registered a PC and BIG EAST record 11 steals in PC's 70-55 win against Rutgers on January 22, has 365 career steals. He has a chance to become the NCAA all-time steals leader this season. He needs 12 steals to surpass the NCAA's all-time steals leader former Friar Eric Murdock (376 steals, 1987-91). On January 5, Linehan made his 300th steal with 5:21 remaining in the first half of PC's game against Syracuse. Linehan became the 26th player in the history of the NCAA to register 300 or more steals in a career. In the last 10 games, the senior theft master has recorded 55 steals (6.1 steals per game), including nine steals in PC's 64-61 win against BC on February 2. After a slow start in which he recorded just eight steals in the first five games (1.6 steals per game), Linehan is back in form and is averaging 4.6 steals per game this season. In 117 career games, he ranks second all-time at Providence with 365 steals (3.12 steals per game). Linehan trails all-time Friar great Eric Murdock (1987-91) in PC's record book in career steals and career steals average. With four regular-season games remaining, he would need to average 3.0 steals a game to break Murdock's all-time career steal mark of 376 steals.

## FRIARS VS. RANKED TEAMS...

PC has posted a 0-3 mark this season against ranked teams. In PC's most recent game against a ranked team, the Friars were defeated by No. 24/20 Miami, 102-96, in overtime on January 19. On January 5, PC was defeated by No. 16/10 Syracuse, 73-66. On November 19, the Friars were defeated by No. 16/16 Oklahoma State (83-65) at Las Vegas, Nevada. Since 1958-59, Providence has recorded 76 wins over teams ranked in the top-20. Last season, the Friars registered two wins over top-20 teams when they defeated 12th-ranked UConn (81-68) on January 13 and 12th-ranked Georgetown (103-79) on February 10.

## GOMES IMPRESSIVE FOR FRIARS...

Freshman Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.), who sat out the first seven games of the season before seeing his first collegiate action at South Carolina on December 3, has been one of the Friars' top players this season. Gomes is second on the team in scoring (13.5 ppg) and leads the squad in rebounding (8.4 rpg). In PC's most recent game, Gomes registered eight points and four rebounds in an 89-79 loss to Boston College on February 13. On February 2, Gomes scored 12 points and grabbed 12 rebounds in a 64-61 win against Boston College. For Gomes, it was his third double-double of the season. On January 19, the rookie sensation recorded a team-high 31 points, a game-high 12 rebounds and four steals in the Friars' 102-96 overtime loss to the 24th-ranked Miami Hurricanes in Miami, Fla. With his 31 points, Gomes became the first Friar to register 30 or more points in a game since Donta Wade recorded 38 points against Notre Dame on February 23, 2000. He recorded his first career double-double with 12 points and 15 rebounds in the Friars' 73-66 loss to 16th-ranked Syracuse on January 5. His 15 rebounds is a team high for the season. He scored a game-high 21 points and registered six rebounds in PC's 94-63 win against Central Connecticut on December 30 at the Dunkin' Donuts Center in Providence, R.I. On December 3, Gomes played in his first game with the Friars and scored a team-high 15 points, while registering eight rebounds in 28 minutes of action in a 67-48 loss at South Carolina. Prior to attending Providence, Gomes played at Wilby High School in Waterbury, Conn. In his senior season at Wilby, Gomes averaged 26.9 points, 16 rebounds, five assists and three blocks per game.

## GOMES TWO-TIME BIG EAST ROOKIE OF THE WEEK...

Freshman forward Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) has been named BIG EAST Rookie of the Week twice this season. Most recently, he was named BIG EAST Men's Basketball Rookie of the Week on Monday, January 21. He received his first Rookie of the Week accolade on December 31, 2001.

## GOMES SCORES 31 POINTS - FIRST FOR A BIG EAST FROSH SINCE TROY MURPHY...

The Friars' 6-7 forward Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) registered a team-high 31 points, a game-high 12 rebounds and four steals in a 102-96 loss to Miami on January 19. With his 31 points, Gomes became the first Friar to register 30 or more points in a game since Donta Wade recorded 38 points against Notre Dame on February 23, 2000. With his 31 points against Miami, Gomes posted the 120th 30-point game in Friar history. Gomes' 31 points also was the first time a freshman had recorded 30 or more points in a BIG EAST game since

Notre Dame's Troy Murphy had 32 against West Virginia on February 14, 1999.

## GOMES ESTABLISHES PC FRESHMAN RECORD...

On January 19, Friar rookie Ryan Gomes (Waterbury, Conn.) scored 31 points against 24th-ranked Miami. His 31 points set a Providence single-game record for most points by a freshman. The old record was 28 points, which was scored by Matt Palazzi in a double overtime, 84-75, win at Holy Cross on December 5, 1984.

## STARTING LINEUP...

Due to injuries this season, Head Coach Tim Welsh has used 11 different starting lineups in PC's 26 games. Last season, he used six different starting lineups in the Friars' 31 games.

## LINEHAN NAMED BIG EAST PLAYER OF THE WEEK...

Senior guard John Linehan (Chester, Pa.) was named BIG EAST Men's Basketball Co-Player of the Week on Monday, January 28. Linehan shared the honor with Darius Rice of Miami. Linehan was named Co-Player of the Week after he averaged 13 points, 8.5 steals and 5.0 assists in the Friars' two BIG EAST wins last week. On January 22, Linehan registered a Providence College and BIG EAST single-game record 11 steals in PC's 70-55 win against Rutgers at the Dunkin' Donuts Center in Providence, R.I. On January 26, Linehan scored a team-high 19 points and registered a game-high six steals in the Friars' 75-70 overtime win against St. John's at Madison Square Garden in New York.

## LAKSA SECOND IN REBOUNDING...

Sophomore Maris Laksa (Ventspils, Latvia) has been one of the team's top rebounders. In the last seven games, he averaged 8.9 rebounds per game. For the season, Laksa ranks second on the squad in rebounding (5.2 rpg). On January 26, Laksa scored 18 points and recorded 13 rebounds in PC's 75-70 win against St. John's. Laksa registered his first double-double of the season when he recorded 12 points and a game-high 14 rebounds against Rutgers on January 22. Laksa was diagnosed with a stress fracture in his right foot prior to the Brown game on November 28. Due to the injury, Laksa missed seven consecutive games. He returned to action against Central Connecticut on December 30 and scored two points in 11 minutes of action. Laksa was forced to sit out the first two games of the season as a result of his violation of NCAA rules concerning his amateurism status. Laksa returned from the two-game suspension on November 20 and equalled his career-high with 24 points in a 93-84 win against Austin Peay in Las Vegas, Nev. He played in games against Texas El Paso (Nov. 21) and Columbia (Nov. 24) before being

sidelined with the stress fracture. In 17 games this season, Laksa is averaging 10.1 points per game. Last season, he was one of the Friars' top three-point threats, connecting on 44 of 96 attempts (.458) from behind the three-point arc.

**SANDERS OFF THE BENCH...** Freshman forward Rob Sanders (New London, Conn.) has been displaying steady improvement for the Friars and has become one of the team's top players coming off the bench. In the team's most recent game, he scored 12 points and recorded six rebounds in PC's 89-79 loss to Boston College on February 13. On February 9, Sanders equalled his career high when he scored 15 points in a 77-69 win against Virginia Tech. On January 22, the rookie forward scored 15 points in PC's 70-55 win against Rutgers. On December 27, he scored eight points and registered 10 rebounds in PC's 91-47 win against Morgan State. The Morgan State game marked the first time this season that Sanders recorded 10 rebounds in a contest. Sanders is averaging 5.6 points and 4.0 rebounds per game this season.

**AUGUSTIN OUT OF LINEUP...** Junior forward Romuald Augustin (Montreal, Quebec), who has missed 21 games this season with a hip injury, is out of the lineup indefinitely. He has not played in the last 18 games. On November 28, he scored eight points in 16 minutes in a 67-60 loss to Brown. On December 1, Augustin scored eight points in 27 minutes in a 71-59 win against Rhode Island. Augustin played in the team's 83-65 loss to Oklahoma State and scored six points. After the Oklahoma State game, he missed two consecutive games before playing five minutes against Columbia. He entered the preseason as one of the Friars' top returnees. Over the summer, Augustin toured Mexico with a Canadian student men's team on July 25-August 1. From August 22-September 1, he played for the Canadian Team at the World University Games in Beijing, China. Augustin completed his summer with the Canadian Team at the Goodwill Games in Brisbane, Australia. He is the only Friar basketball player to ever compete at the Goodwill Games.

**MILLS SCORES 26 POINTS AGAINST BOSTON COLLEGE...** Junior guard Abdul Mills (Brooklyn, N.Y.) scored a team-high 26 points in the Friars' 89-79 loss to Boston College on February 13. Mills leads the team in scoring this season, averaging 14.9 points per game. The junior guard has scored in double figures in 22 of the 25 games he has played this season. On January 30, Mills scored 17 points in the team's 89-81 loss at West Virginia. On December 19, Mills scored a game-high 21 points and dished off five assists in the Friars'

85-76 win against Sacred Heart. On November 20, he scored 20 points and recorded six rebounds in a 93-84 win against Austin Peay in Las Vegas. On November 21, Mills had a career-high 27-point effort in a 69-60 win over UTEP. For his efforts, Mills was named to the All-Las Vegas Tourney Team. Mills has scored 20 or more points in four games this season. Last season, Mills finished second on the team in scoring with a 10.9 points per game average.

**INJURY BUG BITES FRIARS...** Through 26 games this season, the Friars have suffered a number of injuries. PC has had five players miss a combined 39 games this season with injuries. Junior Romuald Augustin (Montreal, Quebec) has missed 20 games with a hip injury, sophomore Leland Anderson (Attleboro, Mass.) missed eight games with a knee injury, junior Abdul Mills (Brooklyn, N.Y.) missed one game with a groin injury, sophomore Chris Anrin (Varmdo, Sweden) was sidelined for two games with an ankle injury and sophomore Maris Laksa (Ventspils, Latvia) missed seven games due to a stress fracture in his foot. In 31 games last season, PC only had three players miss a combined nine games due to injuries.

**THOMPSON LEAVES TEAM...** Junior Garnett Thompson (Islip, N.Y.) has left the team for personal reasons. He left the team prior to its trip to Villanova on January 2. Thompson played in 10 games this season and averaged 4.6 points and 3.9 rebounds.

**LAST SEASON...** In 2000-01, PC posted a 21-10 record overall. In 16 BIG EAST games in 2000-01, the Friars established a school record for BIG EAST wins with an 11-5 mark. In 2000-01, PC was picked to finish sixth of seven teams in the BIG EAST East Division in the Preseason Coaches' Poll. The Friars made their 14th appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 2001 and first since 1997. The 10th seeded Friars were defeated by the seventh seeded Penn State Nittany Lions, 69-59, on March 16 in the South Region in New Orleans, La.
