FRIARS TRAVEL TO BOSTON UNIVERSITY... The Friars will play three road games in five days beginning on Tuesday, January 13 at second-ranked Boston University. PC also will play at UMass on Friday, January 16 and will complete the road trip at Maine on Sunday, January 13 at 2:00 p.m.

SERIES HISTORY VERSUS BOSTON UNIVERSITY... In 154 all-time meetings between Providence College and Boston University, the Terriers lead, 94-48-12, including a 51-18-6 mark at BU. Last season, BU won all three games against PC, including one win at Agganis Arena. The Terriers have won six consecutive meetings against the Friars. The Friars' last win over the Terriers was on January 6, 2006 at Agganis Arena.

SCOUTING BOSTON UNIVERSITY... The Terriers come into Tuesday's game on a season-long eight-game unbeaten streak, including five consecutive victories. In its last game, BU posted a 4-1 victory at Maine on January 10. Chris Connolly scored twice, while Kieran Millan stopped 15 shots to lead the Terriers. Colin Wilson leads the team in scoring with 21 points on seven goals and 14 assists, while Chris Higgins (nine goals, 10 assists) and Nick Bonino (six goals, 13 assists) are tied for second with 19 points each. Millan has seen a bulk of the action in goal. He has played in 12 games and has posted a 10-1-1 record, a 1.66 goals against average and a .929 save percentage.

PC DEFEATS UMASS LOWELL FOR FIRST LEAGUE WIN... The Friars notched their first Hockey East win of the season with a 4-2 win over UMass Lowell on Saturday, January 10 at Schneider Arena. Junior John Cavanagh (Warwick, R.I.) scored twice, including the game winner in the third period, to lead the Friars. Sophomore Kyle MacKinnon (Walnut, Calif.) had one goal and one assist, while senior Pierce Norton (South Boston, Mass.) tallied his fifth goal of the season. In goal, freshman Alex Beaudry (Cumberland, Ont.), who was making his collegiate debut, made 19 saves to earn the win. Defensemen David Cavanagh (Warwick, R.I.) and Matt Taormina (Washington Township, Mich.) each had two assists.

FAMILY AFFAIR... John Cavanagh recorded a career-high two goals versus UMass Lowell on Jan. 10, while his cousin, David Cavanagh, assisted on both goals. The two assists also marked a career-high for David.

FRIAR QUICK NOTES...

- John Cavanagh's career-high seven goals this season are one more than he had in his first two seasons at Providence.
- Freshman Alex Beaudry (Cumberland, Ontario) was named Hockey East Rookie of the Week on Monday, January 12.
- Of the 39 goals scored by the Friars this season, 18 have been scored by freshmen and sophomores.
- Senior Matt Taormina has five assists in the last two games.
- The Friars have outshot their opponents in 11 of the 17 games this season, including a season-high 46 shots against Brown on December 9. Last season, PC outshot its opponents in 28 of 36 games.
- Junior Chris Eppich recorded his first career goal on December 5 at Quinnipiac. Eppich also scored in his next game on December 9 to lead PC to a 4-3 victory over Brown.
- Matt Bergland (Faribault, Minn.) has five multiple-point games in his first 17 career contests. He is third among Hockey East rookies with 17 points (five goals, 12 assists). Bergland is in the midst of a four-game point streak in which he has recorded five points (two goals, three assists).
- The Friars rank fourth in Hockey East, averaging 31.2 shots per game. In league games only, the Friars are fifth averaging 30.4 shots per contest.
- Freshman Bryce Anelosky and sophomore Joe Lavin left the PC hockey team after the first semester in December to play junior hockey.

THIRD PERIOD SCORING... The Friars have done a bulk of their scoring in the third period this season. Of the 39 goals score by PC this season, 18 have come in the third period, including 11 in the last seven games. The Friars have scored six goals in the first period and 15 in the second.

TAORMINA CLIMBING THE CHART... Matt Taormina continues to climb PC's all-time scoring list among defensemen. Taormina, who currently has 58 career points (18 goals, 40 assists), ranks 21st all-time at PC. The last PC blueliner to reach the 50-point mark was Stephen Wood '04 who finished with 88 points (28 goals, 60 assists) and was named to the All-America Second Team in 2004. Defenseman Ron Wilson is PC's overall all-time leading scorer with 250 points (78 goals, 172 assists). Last season, Taormina finished with career-highs in goals (9), assists (18), and points (27). He was named to the All-Hockey East Second Team and to the All-New England Team. This season, Taormina is second on the team with 13 points (three goals, 10 assists).

BERGLAND OFF TO QUICK START... Matt Bergland continues to lead the team in scoring with 17 points (five goals, 12 assists) and is looking to become the first Friar freshman to lead the team in points since Rob Gaudreau did it during the 1988-89 season. That season, Gaudreau totaled 57 points on 28 goals and 29 assists. Bergland has five multiple-point games, including a three-point performance (one goal, two assists) in a win over Bowling Green on October 17 at Schneider Arena.

FRIAR FRESHMEN MAKING IMPACT... The PC freshman class has made an impact so far this season. Matt Bergland leads the team in scoring with 17 points (five goals, 12 assists), while defenseman Daniel New (White Plains, N.Y.) is second among rookies with three points (one goal, two assists). Andy Balysky (Randolph, N.J.) has one goal and one assist, and defenseman David Brown (Centennial, Colo.) has two assists. In addition, Robert Maloney has played in 14 games and has one goal, while goaltender Justin Gates has played in 13 games, including 12 starts. Shawn Tingley (North Kingstown, R.I.), who suffered an injury during the pre-season, made his collegiate debut on December 9 at Brown. Freshman Alex Beaudry (Cumberland, Ont.) made his collegiate debut on January 10 and earned the win with 19 saves.

FRIARS SIGN GOALTENDER... Hockey Coach Tim Army announced on January 9 that student-athlete Alex Beaudry (Cumberland, Ontario) committed to attend Providence College beginning in January 2009. Beaudry is a 5-foot-10, 170-pound goaltender who played for the Kemptville 73's and the Gloucester Rangers of the Central Junior Hockey League this season. In 29 games total games, Beaudry recorded a 3.54 goals against average, a .907 save percentage and two shutouts.

FRIARS DRAFTED BY NHL TEAMS... This year's PC team features two players who were selected in the NHL Entry Draft. Senior Pierce Norton (South Boston, Mass.) was a 2004 ninth-round pick, 285th overall by the Toronto Maple Leafs. Junior Mark Fayne (Sagamore Beach, Mass.) was chosen in the fifth round, 155th overall by the New Jersey Devils in the 2005 draft.

HEAD COACH TIM ARMY... Tim Army is in his fourth season with the Friars. Army returned to his alma mater to take over the reigns of the PC hockey program on June 17, 2005 after spending three seasons with the Portland Pirates of the AHL. A 1985 graduate of the College and an East Providence native, Army became the 11th coach in the history of the program. He is the first PC alumnus to coach the team since his former coach Lou Lamoriello guided the Friars (1968-83). He also is the first former Hockey East player to be a head coach in the league. In his first season, Army led the team to a 17-16-3 overall record, including a 14-10-3 mark in Hockey East action. The 17 wins were the most by a Friar squad since 2002-03. In addition, the Friars, who were picked to finish eighth in the preseason coaches poll, recorded 14 conference victories and finished fifth in the league. The 14 Hockey East wins were one shy of tying a school record. During the 2007-08 campaign, the Friars recorded 14 wins and were ranked as high as 11th in the national polls. Among the 14 victories for the Friars, were two triumphs at Boston College, which went on to claim the national title. The Friars also posted an impressive win over defending national champion and fifth-ranked Michigan State at the Great Lakes Invitational at the Joe Louis Arena. In all, the Friars had 10 wins against ranked teams. Prior to coaching at Portland, Army spent nine seasons as an assistant coach in the NHL for two different teams. He worked for four seasons as an assistant for Friar great Ron Wilson with the Anaheim Mighty Ducks (1993-97) and five years under Wilson with the Washington Capitals (1997-02). While in Anaheim, Army was part of the 1996-97 team that earned the franchise's first ever playoff berth and advanced to the second round, where the Mighty Ducks fell to the eventual Stanley Cup Champion Detroit Red Wings. Army helped lead the Capitals to the 1998 Stanley Cup Finals, the team's only appearance in the finals.
