### FRIARS TO FACE BROWN IN 24TH ANNUAL MAYOR'S CUP

After eight days without playing a game, the PC men's hockey team will play three games in five days, beginning on Tuesday, November 17 at 7:00 p.m. against Brown in the 24th Annual Mayor's Cup at Schneider Arena.

### FRIARS AGAINST NON-CONFERENCE FOES

Providence College has posted a 4-1 record in non-conference games this season, including a 3-1 mark against teams from the CCHA. The Friars have outscored opponents, 16-8, in the five non-conference contests so far this season. PC also has defeated Atlantic Hockey foe, Holy Cross. The Friars close out their non-conference schedule against Brown and Dartmouth from ECAC Hockey. Last season, the Friars posted a 3-4-0 record in non-league action.

### MAYOR'S CUP HISTORY

Providence College leads the Mayor's Cup series, 13-8-2. Last season, the Friars held on to defeat the Bears, 4-3, on December 9 at Meehan Auditorium. The Friars have won three of the last four meetings, including two consecutive seasons.

### SERIES HISTORY VERSUS BROWN

Tuesday night's game will mark the 90th all-time meeting between Providence College and Brown with the series tied, 43-43-2. In the first ever meeting between the two teams, Brown defeated Providence, 4-1, on March 1, 1927 at the Rhode Island Auditorium. The Friars are 5-4-1 against the Bears in the last 10 meetings.

**BEAUDRY AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS**

Alex Beaudry comes into Tuesday's game among the top-19 in the nation in two statistical categories. He ranks 19th with a 2.15 goals against average and 13th with a .932 save percentage. Beaudry has helped the Friar defense allow just 17 goals in eight games.

**LAST TIME OUT**

In its last game, Providence was defeated at No. 15 Vermont, 3-0, on Sunday, November 8 in Burlington, Vt. The Catamounts scored two late goals in the second period en route to the win. The Friars finished with a 33-20 advantage in shots as UVM's Mike Spillane stopped all 33 attempts. The loss ended PC's three-game road winning streak.

**BEAUDRY NAMED HOCKEY EAST GOALTENDER OF THE MONTH**

Alex Beaudry was named Hockey East Goaltender of the Month for October. Beaudry is the first Friar to earn a league monthly honor since Tyler Sims was named Hockey East Goaltender of the Month in December, 2005. Beaudry finished the month of October with a 4-2 record, a 2.01 goals against average and a .939 save percentage. He recorded 31 saves in a 3-2 win at No. 7 Notre Dame on October 15 and stopped a career-high 47 shots, including 20 in the third period to lead the Friars to a 2-1 victory at No. 17 UMass on October 31. Beaudry, who was named Hockey East Defensive Player of the Week twice in October, held opponents to two goals or fewer in five of the six games he played in. He has helped the Friars jump out to a 5-2 start, including a 4-1 mark on the road.

**TIMELY SCORING**

In three of their five victories this season, the Friars have scored late goals in the second and third period. The Friars scored with 1:18 left in the second period in their 2-1 victory over Holy Cross on October 10. On October 15, PC posted a 3-2 win at No. 7 Notre Dame thanks to a goal with 3:46 left in the third period. The Friars also scored with 3:46 left in the third period to break a 1-1 tie and post a 3-1 triumph at Bowling Green on October 24. In addition, Providence also has scored in the first five minutes of the opening period in three of its five wins.

**FRIARS IN CLOSE GAMES**

Three of Providence College's five wins this season have been one-goal contests. PC edged Holy Cross, 2-1, on October 10 and Notre Dame, 3-2, on October 15. Most recently, PC posted a 2-1 triumph at No. 17 Massachusetts on October 31. In addition, the Friars recorded a 3-1 win at Bowling Green on October 24. Last season, the Friars posted a 3-3 record in one-goal games.

**FAMILY TIES**

Providence College freshmen Chris Rooney (Canton, Mass.) and Alex Velischek (Kinnelon, N.J.) are sons of former Friar hockey greats. Rooney is the son of former Friar, Steve Rooney. Steve Rooney scored the game-winning goal as the Friars defeated Boston College, 2-1, in double overtime in the inaugural Hockey East championship game in 1985. Steve, who finished his collegiate career with 124 career points, went on to play in the NHL for the Montreal Canadiens team that claimed the 1986 Stanley Cup title. Alex is the son of former Friar Randy Velischek, who is one of the best defensemen to play at the College. He was named ECAC Player of the year in and 1982-83 earned All-America honors. Randy, who helped the Friars to the 1981 ECAC championship and two NCAA Tournament appearances (1981, 1983), played 10 seasons in the NHL (509 games). He played for Minnesota, New Jersey and Quebec.

**FROM THE LAND OF 10,000 LAKES TO THE OCEAN STATE**

The 2009-10 Friar squad has six players from Minnesota, more than any other state or province. Last season, Matt Bergland (Faribault) and Rob Maloney (Eagan) were the representatives on the squad from Minnesota. In addition, David Brown (Centennial, Colo.) played high school hockey in Minnesota. This season, the team will have four more players from the "Land of 10,000 Lakes." They are: Willie Hess (Lino Lakes), Aaron Jamnick (Hibbing), Tyler Landman (Roseau) and Billy Simon (Burnsville).

**OCEAN STATE CONNECTION**

The 2009-10 men's hockey team has a strong contingent of Rhode Islanders. In addition to four players, Head Coach Tim Army (East Providence) and Assistant Coach David Berard (Coventry) also hail from the Ocean State. The Rhode Islanders on this season's team are: seniors David Cavanagh (Warwick) and John Cavanagh (Warwick), junior Eric Baier (North Kingstown) and sophomore Justin Gates (Cranston).

### AT FRIAR HEAD COACH

- Tim Army is in his fifth season as head coach of the Providence College men's hockey team.
- Army became the 11th coach in the history of the program.
- He is the first PC alumnus to coach the team since his former coach Lou Lamoriello guided the Friars (1968-83). He also is the first former HOCKEY EAST player to be a head coach in the league.
- In his first season, Army led the team to a 17-16-3 overall record, including a 14-10-3 mark in HOCKEY EAST action. The 17 wins were the most by a Friar squad since 2002-03. In addition, the Friars, who were picked to finish eighth in the preseason coaches poll, recorded 14 conference victories and surprised many as they finished fifth in the league. The 14 HOCKEY EAST wins were one shy of tying a school record.
- In 2006-07, Army guided the Friars to the HOCKEY EAST Tournament Quarterfinals.
- PC recorded wins over four ranked teams, including a 7-1 triumph over third-ranked UNH.
- Several individuals had strong seasons for the Friars, including Mark Fayne who was named to the HOCKEY EAST All-Rookie Team.
- During the 2007-08 campaign, the Friars recorded 14 wins and were ranked as high as 11th in the national polls. Among the 14 victories for the Friars were two triumphs at Boston College, which went on to claim the national title.
- The Friars also posted an impressive win over defending national champion and fifth-ranked Michigan State at the Great Lakes Invitational at the Joe Louis Arena. In all, the Friars had 10 wins against ranked teams.
- The Friars had a rebuilding season in 2008-09, but recorded an impressive victory at then No. 2 Boston University, which went on to capture the 2009 NCAA title. PC also captured the Mayor's Cup trophy for the second consecutive season and third in the last four years.

### AHL EXPERIENCE

- Army spent three seasons as the head coach of the Portland Pirates of the American Hockey League.
- He posted a 99-89-32-20 mark in 240 games with the Pirates. In his second season at Portland (2003-04), Army guided the Pirates to a record of 32-27-13-8 for 85 points as the team qualified for the Calder Cup Playoffs.
- Portland defeated the Providence Bruins in a

first round series, marking the franchise's first playoff series victory in six years.

- That season, Army's team set numerous records, including highest penalty killing percentage (89.5 percent), fewest goals against in one season (160) and most shutouts in a season (17), which also tied the AHL mark.

### NHL EXPERIENCE

- Army spent nine seasons as an assistant coach in the NHL for two different teams.
- He worked for four seasons as an assistant for Friar great Ron Wilson with the Anaheim Mighty Ducks (1993-97) and five years under Wilson with the Washington Capitals (1997-02).
- While in Anaheim, Army was part of the 1996-97 team that earned the franchise's first ever playoff berth and advanced to the second round, where the Mighty Ducks fell to the eventual Stanley Cup Champions Detroit Red Wings.
- That season, Anaheim's team featured Teemu Selanne and Paul Kariya, one of the best scoring tandems in league history, as they finished second and third, respectively, in the league in scoring.
- In the first year with the Capitals, Army helped lead the squad to the 1998 Stanley Cup Finals, the team's only appearance in the finals.

### USA HOCKEY

- In addition to the NHL and AHL, Army has worked with USA Hockey. In 1994 and 1996, Army was assistant coach for the U.S. National Team. The 1996 U.S. National Team captured the bronze medal at the World Championships in Vienna, Austria.
- Most recently, he served as an assistant with the U.S. World Cup Team in 2004. Army also was the head coach for the U.S. Under 18 Team at the 1995 and 1996 Pacific Cup.

### FIRST COACHING EXPERIENCE

- Army began his coaching career as an assistant coach for the Friars in 1987.
- He spent six seasons as an assistant at PC under Mike McShane, helping to lead the Friars to more than 20 wins in four of the six seasons. The Friars also posted a 116-87-18 overall record in that span, including appearances in the 1989 and 1991 NCAA Tournaments.
- During that time, Army helped coach and recruit Friar All-Americans Rick Bennett (second team - 1989), Rob Gaudreau (second team - 1992) and

Chad Quenneville (second team - 1994 and 1995) as well as NHL players Chris Therien, Hal Gill and Craig Darby.

### AS A STUDENT-ATHLETE

- Army is one of the top players in Friar history.
- He ranks first all-time in games played (151), sixth in points (179), 11th in goals (71) and tied for fourth in assists (108).
- He was a member of the class with the most wins in Friar hockey history. He helped the squad post a 97-50-8 mark over four seasons, including the top single-season record ever at PC in 1983 (33-10-0).
- The Friars won 20 or more games in each of his four seasons as a player and reached the Frozen Four twice (1983 and 1985).
- In 1985, he served as the team captain and helped guide the Friars to the inaugural HOCKEY EAST title with a 2-1 double overtime win over Boston College.
- He also led Providence to the NCAA title game where PC was defeated by Rensselaer (2-1).
- In his senior season, Army led HOCKEY EAST in scoring, registering 74 points (27 goals, 47 assists). In recognition of his efforts, he was named First Team All-America and earned the Walter Brown Award as the top American-born player in New England. He also was a Hobey Baker Finalist in 1985.
- Army also excelled in the classroom. He graduated with honors (political science) and was an academic All-American.
- During his high school years at East Providence, Army was a two-time First Team All-State Selection in hockey and was named to the All-Division Second Team in baseball.
- He also was named the Rhode Island Scholar Athlete of the Year during his senior year in 1981.
- That spring, he was selected in the seventh round of that NHL Draft by the Colorado Rockies, which then became the New Jersey Devils.

### PROFESSIONAL PLAYING EXPERIENCE

- Army played professional hockey for the Maine Mariners of the AHL (1985-86), Peliitat of the Finish Div. 1 League (1986-87) and Fribourg of the Swiss Elite League.

### PERSONAL

- Army and his family have always had strong ties to hockey in Rhode Island.
- His father, Tom, played baseball and hockey at PC and captained the hockey team in 1952-53. His grandfather, George, was the long-time trainer for the Rhode Island Reds of the AHL.
- His brothers, Tom, Jr., and Bill, both played high school hockey at East Providence High School and went on to play at Wesleyan and Boston College, respectively.
- Army and his wife, Sue, a former PC track and cross country star, have two sons, Derek (18) and Travis (16).
