Tim Army returned to his alma mater to take over the reigns of the PC hockey program on June 17, 2005. Army, a 1985 graduate of the college and an East Providence native, became the 11th coach in the history of the program. He is the first PC alumnus to coach the team since his former coach Lou Lamoriello guided the Friars (1968-83). He also is the first former HOCKEY EAST player to be a head coach in the league. Army, who has an extensive coaching background, spent the last 3 seasons as the head coach of the Portland Pirates of the American Hockey League. Prior to coaching at Portland, Army spent 9 seasons as an assistant coach in the NHL for 2 different teams. He worked as an assistant for Friar great Ron Wilson with the Anaheim Mighty Ducks (1993-97) and for Wilson with the Washington Capitals (1997-02). In addition to the NHL and AHL, Army has worked with USA Hockey. In 1994 and 1996, Army was assistant coach for the U.S. National Team. Most recently, he served as an assistant with the U.S. World Cup Team in 2004. Army also was the head coach for the U.S Under 18 Team at the 1995 and 1996 Pacific Cup.

LOCATION

Camp is conducted on the campus of Providence College in Providence, Rhode Island

FACILITIES

Schneider Arena, (home of the PC Friars), Varsity Pool, Alumni Hall, Raymond Athletic Field and Peterson Field House.

HOUSING/MEALS

All campers will be housed in one of the dormitories on campus. **There will be 3-4 campers per room. If you do not request roommates, we will assign you to an age appropriate room.** Each camper must bring his own bed linens or sleeping bag. Breakfast, Lunch and dinner are served daily in Raymond Hall. This is the same facility used by our students.

ON-ICE ACTIVITY

Each camper will be provided 3 plus hours of ice time daily. A typical day includes 3 separate on-ice sessions; power skating; afternoon skills and evening scrimmages. Each camper will receive instruction from highly qualified coaches

2008 COACHING STAFF



Stan Moore, a 1978 graduate of Oswego State, begins his 3rd consecutive season and 6th overall as an assistant coach at Providence College. Prior to joining the Friars in 2005-06, Moore spent seven seasons (1998-2005) at Colgate University. Stan began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Brown University (1985-88), before moving to Providence College (1988-92), where he along with Tim Army served as assistant coaches under Mike McShane. Moore also has had extensive experience with USA Hockey and has been involved since 1985. Most recently, Moore coached the 2005 US under 17 Select team that competed in the 2005 Under 17 Five Nations Tournament in Switzerland., and has spoken at many Coaching Education Program events.



David Berard enters his 16th season overall in college hockey and his 3rd as an assistant under head Coach Tim Army. Overall it's Berard's 10th season at PC. David graduated from PC in 1992. A former goaltender in his playing days at PC, Berard was a member of one of the most successful classes to ever wear a Friar uniform, amassing a total of 87 wins over their 4 year career. During the past 13 years, David has worked at various USA Hockey Select Festivals and since 2002, has served as the Director of Player Development and Select Coaching for the New England District. Known as one of the top recruiters in the country, Berard has been instrumental in bringing in a number of talented players to PC over the past 10 years, and 13th players have been selected in the NHL Entry Draft and 5 of those players have signed contracts with NHL teams after graduation.



Bob Bellemore, one of the top goaltenders ever to play at Providence College. Bob is entering his 15th season as an assistant coach with the hockey team. In addition to working with the goaltenders, he assists with scouting and various other duties. As a sophomore in 1964, he helped the Friars win their 1st ECAC title and earn their first berth in the NCAA Final Four. Bellemore also starred on the school's baseball team and served as the team's captain his senior year. In 1984, he was inducted into the Providence College Athletic Hall of Fame. Bellemore left Providence College in 1987 to serve as the goaltender coach for the New Jersey Devils until 1991.
