TONIGHT'S GAME... The Friars will look to extend their season-high eight-game unbeaten streak as they play Boston University in a best-of-three Hockey East Quarterfinal series beginning on Thursday, March 6 at Schneider Arena. PC and BU will be meeting in the Hockey East Quarterfinals for the third-consecutive season and the fourth out of the last five seasons.

PROVIDENCE IN THE HOCKEY EAST TOURNAMENT... The Friars are 24-28-1 all-time in Hockey East Tournament games. The Friars have won two Hockey East Tournament titles (1985 and 1996). Last season, Boston University eliminated the Friars in the quarterfinals, two-games-to-zero.

PROVIDENCE IN HOCKEY EAST QUARTERFINALS... Providence is 17-17-1 all-time in the Hockey East Quarterfinals, including a 7-5-0 mark against Boston University in the quarterfinals.

PROVIDENCE VERSUS BU IN THE HOCKEY EAST TOURNAMENT... Since 1984-85, Providence and Boston University have met 17 times in the Hockey East Tournament. Providence holds a 9-8 mark against the Terriers in Hockey East Tournament action, including a 7-5-0 record in the quarterfinals. Providence is the only team in the league with a winning record against the Terriers in Hockey East Tournament play. The Friars were swept (two-games-to-none) by the Terriers last season in the quarterfinal series. In 2001, the Friars defeated the Terriers in the quarterfinals series, two-games-to-one, winning the third game in two overtime periods on March 11.

THE PROVIDENCE-BOSTON UNIVERSITY SERIES... Tonight's game will mark the 135th meeting between Providence and Boston University, with the Terriers leading the all-time series, 80-43-11. The Friars are 26-33-5 all-time at Providence, 14-44-6 at Boston University and 3-3 in neutral sites. Last season, the Friars posted a 0-4-1 mark against the Terriers, including two losses in the quarterfinals of the Hockey East Tournament. The lone tie (5-5) of last season's series came on January 11, 2002 at Schneider Arena.

THIS SEASON VS. BOSTON UNIV...

The Friars have posted a 2-0-1 record versus Boston University this season, with all three games going into overtime. In their most recent meeting, the Friars and the Terriers skated to a 3-3 overtime tie at Walter Brown Arena. The Friars defeated the Terriers, 5-4, in overtime on February 21 at Schneider Arena as senior Jon DiSalvatore (S. Windsor, Conn.) scored a short-handed overtime game winner with 45 seconds left. In the first game between Providence and Boston University this season, the Friars came back from a 2-0 third period deficit to defeat the Terriers in overtime, 3-2, on January 9. Sophomore Chris Chaput (Pawtucket, R.I.) scored the game-winning goal in the extra session to lift the Friars to the win at the 3:33 mark. Senior goaltender Nolan Schaefer (Yellow Grass, Sask.) made 42 saves, including 19 in the second period to keep the Friars in the game at Walter Brown Arena. The win marked the first victory for the Friars at Brown Arena since October 31, 1998. In the three games versus BU this season, the Friars have been outshot, 111-63.

SCOUTING BOSTON UNIVERSITY... The Terriers finished the regular season with 21-12-3 overall record and a 13-10-1 mark in league action. The 10th-ranked Terriers posted an 8-3-1 mark in their last 12 games, including a six-game winning streak in which they captured their 25th Beanpot title. In their most recent action, the Terriers split a two-game series at No. 3 Maine. BU won, 4-2, on February 28 and dropped a 4-2 decision on March 1. The loss to Maine allowed the Friars to garner fourth-place and home ice advantage for the quarterfinals. BU, which has a 7-8 road record, is led by Frantisek Skladany who is ranked first on the team in scoring with 31 points (11 goals, 20 assists). Mark Mullen is second on the squad with 24 points (11 goals, 13 assists) and John Sabo is third with 23 points (10 goals, 13 assists). In net, Sean Fields has posted a 20-11-3 record with a 2.48 goals against average and a .909 save percentage.

FRIARS DEFEAT UMASS LOWELL IN REGULAR SEASON FINALE... The Friars finished the regular season on February 28 with a 3-1 victory over UMass Lowell at Schneider Arena. Graduate student Peter Fregoe (Massena, N.Y.) broke a scoreless tie with 54 seconds remaining in the third period to give the Friars a 1-0 lead. Fregoe scored his second goal of the night early in the third period to give PC a two-goal advantage. Freshman defenseman James Pemberton (Cumberland, R.I.) scored his second goal of the season to increase the Friars' lead to 3-0. The River Hawks cut the lead to 3-1 at the 7:52 mark of the third period, but could not get any closer as senior goaltender Nolan Schaefer made 30 saves to earn his 13th victory of the season.

FRIARS AT HOME... The Friars have posted an 12-4-1 mark at home this season, including a 7-4-1 record in Hockey East home games. After dropping three consecutive home games, the Friars have won their last four games at Schneider Arena, defeating Massachusetts, 5-3, on February 1, No. 4 New Hampshire, 5-2, on February 9, No. 9 Boston University, 5-4 (ot), on February 21 and a 3-1 win over UMass Lowell on February 28. PC's biggest home win this season was against top-ranked Maine (4-2) on January 3.

FRIARS AWAY FROM SCHNEIDER... Providence is 7-8-2 on the road this season, including a 5-5-2 mark in league road games. The Friars are 4-0-2 in their last six road games. Most recently, the Friars tied ninth-ranked Boston University, 3-3, at Walter Brown Arena on February 22 and skated to a 2-2 tie at second ranked Maine. The Friars also defeated the Black Bears, 5-1, on February 14. On January 28 the Friars defeated No. 6 Boston College, 4-1, at Kelley Rink, posted a 3-1 victory over Brown on January 28, and skated past UMass Lowell, 6-1, on February 7. The Friars also defeated Boston University (3-2 ot on January 9) and UMass (2-1 ot on November 1). Aside from the win at Brown, PC's other non-conference road win came against St. Lawrence (4-2 on November 30).

FRIENDLY FEBRUARY... The Friars posted 6-0-2 in the month of February, while outscoring their opponents, 34-17. During this month, the

Friars defeated UMass (5-3 on Feb. 1), UMass Lowell (6-1 on Feb. 7), No. 4 New Hampshire (5-2 on Feb. 9), No. 2 Maine (5-1 on Feb. 14) and tied No. 2 Maine (2-2 on Feb. 15). PC also defeated No. 9 Boston University, 5-4, in overtime on February 21 and tied the Terriers, 3-3, on February 22. Most recently, the Friars defeated UMass Lowell, 3-1, on February 28 at Schneider Arena. With their undefeated record in February, it marked the first time since the 1988-89 season that PC went unbeaten in February. The Friars are 38-21-12 all-time in the month of February under Head Coach Paul Pooley.

FRIARS VERSUS RANKED TEAMS... Providence has posted a 6-6-2 mark versus ranked teams this season with all six wins coming in the last 17 games. Two of the Friars' 14 games versus ranked teams have been against No. 1 squads. On January 3, the Friars upset top-ranked Maine, 4-2, at Schneider Arena and suffered a 6-1 loss against No. 1 Boston College on November 12. The Friars also defeated No. 2 Maine, 5-1, on February 14. Most recently, Providence defeated No. 9 Boston University, 5-4 (ot), on February 21. Last season, PC posted a 1-14-3 record versus ranked teams, with their lone win (4-3) coming at third-ranked New Hampshire on January 13.

WOOD NAMED HOCKEY EAST PLAYER OF THE MONTH... Junior defenseman Stephen Wood (Sudbury, Mass.) was named Hockey East Player of the Month on March 3. Wood tallied 12 points (four goals, eight assists) in eight games, including four multiple-point games. He posted three assists as the Friars defeated second-ranked Maine, 5-1, at Alfond Arena on February 14. In addition, he scored one goal and added one assist in PC's 5-4 overtime victory over No. 9 Boston University on February 21. Wood also posted a plus/minus rating of +16 in eight games. For the season, Wood is fourth on the team in scoring with a career-high 27 points (nine goals, 18 assists). He leads the team with a plus/minus rating of +22 and ranks third among Hockey East defensemen in scoring with 27 points.

SCHAEFER NAMED HOCKEY EAST GOALTENDER OF THE MONTH... Senior goaltender Nolan Schaefer (Yellow Grass, Sask.) was named Hockey East Goaltender of the Month on March 3. Schaefer, a 2001 Second Team All-American, led the Friars to a 6-0-2 record in February. He started all eight games and posted a 2.06 goals against average and a

.936 save percentage. He made a career-high 46 saves as the Friars defeated fourth-ranked New Hampshire, 5-2, on February 9 and stopped 33 shots in the Friars' 5-1 victory at No. 2 Maine on February 14. Most recently, Schaefer stopped 30 of 31 shots as the Friars defeated UMass Lowell, 3-1, in the final regular season game on February 28. During the month of February, Schaefer was named Hockey East Defensive Player of the Week twice and earned Player of the Week honors once as he led the Friars to an undefeated mark in February for the first time since the 1988-89 season. For the season, Schaefer has a 13-6-2 record, a 2.70 goals against average and a .916 save percentage.

SCHAEFER CLOSE TO SAVES RECORD... Senior netminder Nolan Schaefer (Yellow Grass, Sask.) is 55 saves shy of breaking Providence College's all-time record for career saves. Schaefer currently has 2,785 career saves, behind Dan Dennis (2,790) and Bill Milner (2,839).

THREE FRIARS WITH 40+ POINTS... Seniors Jon DiSalvatore (S. Windsor, Conn.) and Devin Rask (Parkside, Sask.) as well as graduate student Peter Fregoe (Massena, N.Y.) have tallied over 40 points each this season. DiSalvatore leads the team with a career-high 44 points (17 goals, 27 assists), Rask is second with 43 points (17 goals, 26 assists) and Fregoe is third with a career-high 42 points (22 goals and 20 assists). Providence is the only team in Hockey East with three players who have 40 points or more. The last time Providence had three players tally 40 or more points in the same season was in 1998-99. Jerry Keefe tallied 52 points (16 goals, 36 assists), Fernando Pisani had 51 points (14 goals, 37 assists) and Mike Omicicoli recorded 50 points (19 goals, 31 assists).

WHEN SCORING FIRST... The Friars are 14-3-1 when scoring the game's first goal. During their eight-game unbeaten streak, the Friars have scored the first goal in seven of the eight games. The Friars surrendered the game's first goal at Maine on February 15, but came back to tie the Black Bears, 2-2.

DISALVATORE LEADS TEAM IN SCORING... Senior Jon DiSalvatore (S. Windsor, Conn.) leads the Friars in scoring with a career-high 44 points on 17 goals and a team best 27 assists. DiSalvatore scored his career-high 17th goal of the season in a 3-3 tie against Boston University on February 22. DiSalvatore has recorded 13 multiple-point games this season, including a five point effort (one goal, four assists) in the team's, 6-5, overtime win versus UMass Lowell on October 25. Most recently, he scored two goals, including the overtime game winner versus Boston University on February 21. He ranks fourth in Hockey East with 44 points and is third with 27 assists. Last season, DiSalvatore led the Friars in scoring with career-highs of 16 goals and 26 assists for 42 points.

WOOD LEADING FRIAR BLUELINERS... Junior defenseman Stephen Wood (Sudbury, Mass.) leads all Friar defensemen with a career-high nine goals and 18 assists for 27 points. Wood has registered 12 points (four goals, eight as-

sists) over the last eight games, including three assists in a 5-1 win at Maine on February 14. He also posted three assists in a 5-3 win against UMass on February 1 and added three points (two goals, one assist) in a 6-1 victory at Lowell on February 7. Most recently, he recorded one goal and one assist in a 5-4 overtime win over Boston University on February 21. He ranks fourth on the team and third among Hockey East defensemen in scoring with 27 points. In addition, he ranks first on the team with a plus/minus rating of +22. Last season, Wood also led all Friar defensemen in scoring with five goals and 18 assists for 23 points.

RASK HEATING UP... Senior forward Devin Rask (Parkside, Sask.) has tallied 24 points (eight goals, 16 assists) in the last 17 games for the Friars. The 2001 Second Team All-American has recorded at least one point in 15 of the last 17 games. For the season, Rask is second on the team in scoring with 43 points (17 goals, 26 assists), including a four-goal game against Princeton on November 3. He has tallied at least one point in 25 of the 33 games he has played this season.

FREGOE LEADS HOCKEY EAST WITH 22 GOALS... Peter Fregoe (Massena, N.Y.) recorded his 22nd goal of the season on February 28 versus UMass Lowell at Schneider Arena. He leads Hockey East in goals and ranks sixth in the league in scoring with 42 points. He also is the third Friar leading scorer with 42 points. overtime on March 28 in the NCAA Tournament. Providence's two consecutive overtime wins over UMass Lowell (6-5 on October 25) and Massachusetts (2-1 on November 1) marked the first time since the 1992-93 season that the Friars won back-to-back overtime games. During the 1992-93 season, PC won two consecutive overtime games, defeating Clarkson (4-3 on November 29, 1992) and RPI (5-4 on December 30, 1992) to capture the RPI Tournament. The Friars' overtime wins over UMass Lowell and UMass this season marked the first time in school history that the team posted two consecutive Hockey East overtime wins. The 1992-93 season also was the last time the Friars won three overtime games.

FRIAR TRIO CLIMBS THE SCORING LIST... The Providence trio of Devin Rask (Parkside, Sask.), Peter Fregoe (Massena, N.Y.), and Jon DiSalvatore (S. Windsor, Conn.) continues to climb the all-time Friar hockey scoring list. Rask (63 goals, 87 assists) is 14th with 150 points, Fregoe (67 goals, 79 assists) is 17th with 145 career points, while DiSalvatore (57 goals, 81 assists) is 20th with 138 points. This season, DiSalvatore leads the team in scoring with 44 points, while Rask has 43 points and Fregoe has 42 points.

SHORT-HANDED GOALS...The Friars are tied with Boston College for second in Hockey East with six short-handed goals. Maine leads the league with eight short-handed tallies. Senior Jon DiSalvatore (S. Windsor, Conn.) and freshman Torry Gajda (Westfield, Mass.) lead the team with two short-handed goals each, while junior Peter Zingoni (Newtown, Conn.) and graduate student Peter Fregoe (Massena, N.Y.) have one each. Prior to giving up a short-handed goal versus the Terriers on February 22, the Friars had not allowed a short-handed goal since February 23, 2002 against Boston University, a span of 36 games.

DISALVATORE ANNOUNCED AS FINALIST FOR WALTER BROWN AWARD... For the second consecutive season, Friar co-captain Jon DiSalvatore (S. Windsor, Conn.) was named one of the 12 finalists for the Walter Brown Award, given annually to the best American-born college hockey player in New England. Four Providence College men's hockey players have earned the Walter Brown Award in the 51-year

history of the award, with the last being Mike Omicioli (West Warwick, R.I.), who shared the honor with Boston College's Mike Mottau in 1999. Prior to Mike Omicioli, current Friar Volunteer Assistant Coach Rob Gaudreau won the award in 1992. In addition, Tim Army, Head Coach of the AHL's Portland Pirates won the award in 1985 and Ron Wilson, Head Coach of the NHL's San Jose Sharks, was the first Friar to win the award when he was honored in 1975. DiSalvatore joins New Hampshire's Mike Ayers, Merrimack's Joe Exter, Boston College's Ben Eaves, Maine's Jimmy Howard, UMass' Greg Mauldin and Northeastern's Mike Ryan, who were all chosen as finalists for the Walter Brown Award from Hockey East. The other finalists include Dartmouth's Trevor Byrne, Holy Cross' Brandon Doria, Yale's Chris Higgins, Harvard's Tim Pettit and Noah Welch.

BOBBY GOEPFERT SHINES AT WORLD JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP... Freshman goaltender Bobby Goepfert (Kings Park, N.Y.) led the U.S. National Junior Team to a fourth-place finish at the 2003 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship. The fourth-place finish was the best for the U.S. since 2000. Goepfert's performance is among one of the best by a U.S. netminder at the World Junior Championship. He played in seven games (five starts) and registered a 4-1 record, a 1.77 goals against average and a .937 save percentage. His .937 save percentage is the second best in U.S. history at the World Junior Championship, behind Jim Carey who recorded a .975 save percentage in 1993. In addition, the 1.77 goals against average is the third best in U.S. history, behind Rick DiPietro (1.30 in 2001) and Jean Marc Pelletier (1.66 in 1998). After the 3-2 loss in the bronze medal game against Finland, the IIHF named Goepfert along with North Dakota's Zach Parise and Yale's Chris Higgins the three stars of the tournament for the U.S. Goepfert has played in 13 games for the Friars this season and has a 6-6-1 record. He is in the top 10 nationally with a .924 save percentage and a 2.39 goals against average.

THE CENTURY LINE... The Friars' trio of Devin Rask (Parkside, Sask.), Peter Fregoe (Massena, N.Y.) and Jon DiSalvatore (S. Windsor, Conn.) has combined to record 434 points in their careers at Providence. They have combined to tally 12 points or more in a game twice this season, including a 13-point performance in a 6-5 overtime win over UMass Lowell on October 25. Each forward has over 100 career points, led by Rask with 150 points. Fregoe has 146 points and DiSalvatore has 138 points. The last Friar line in which all three players had over 100 career points was Rick Bennett '90, Mike Boback '92 and Rob Gaudreau '92. Bennett and Gaudreau are currently assistant coaches with the Friars. Gaudreau finished his career with 211 points, Boback finished with 201 points and Bennett had 134 points. Last season, Rask and Fregoe reached the century mark in points on February 8 in a 3-3 tie against UMass Lowell at Schneider Arena. Rask recorded an assist in the first period to become the 45th player in PC hockey history to reach the 100-point mark. Fregoe became the 46th player with a third period assist. This sea-

son, DiSalvatore joined the century club with a goal against Iona on October 12 at Schneider Arena.

HAT TRICKS... Graduate student Peter Fregoe has posted two hat tricks this season. He is the first PC player to have two hat tricks in a season since Brady Kramer recorded two in 1994-95 (one in the regular season and one in the Hockey East Playoffs). Fregoe is the first player to have two hat tricks in the regular season since Brian Ridolfi had two in 1992-93 (in fact Ridolfi had two hat tricks in a three-game span - 1/22/93 three goals vs. Merrimack and 1/27/93 vs. New Hampshire). Fregoe recorded hat tricks against Union (10/11) and UMass Lowell (10/25). Senior Devin Rask (Parkside, Sask.) scored four goals to lead the Friars to an 8-1 win over Princeton on November 3. Rask became the first PC player to score four goals in a game since senior Jon DiSalvatore (S. Windsor, Conn.) scored four goals on November 10, 2001 at Northeastern. Prior to DiSalvatore, the last PC player to score four goals in a game was Dennis Burke, who did it on December 10, 1995 against Northeastern. In addition, junior Peter Zingoni (Newtown, Conn.) recorded his first career hat trick on October 12 versus Iona.

HEAD COACH PAUL POOLEY... Pooley is the 10th coach in the history of Providence College Hockey. Since 1994, Pooley has compiled a 157-150-28 record and brought the Friars to three HOCKEY EAST Finals and two NCAA Tournament appearances. In 2000-01, Pooley was named HOCKEY EAST Coach of the Year after leading the Friars to their highest finish ever in league play (tied for second) with a 13-8-3 record. Pooley also was named New England Hockey Writers' Coach of the Year. In 1994-95, Pooley became the first head coach to bring a team to the HOCKEY EAST Championship in his inaugural season behind the bench. In 1995-96 he guided the Friars to their second HOCKEY EAST title and first since 1985. Pooley also led the team to its eighth appearance in the NCAA Tournament. He came to Providence after spending three years as an assistant coach at Lake Superior State University (1991-94). Pooley is only the third head coach in Providence College history to have 150 or more wins and ranks second all-time in victories (156) at the College. With his 152nd win on February 1 versus UMass, Pooley surpassed Mike McShane (1985-94) who has 151 wins, while legendary coach Lou Lamoriello (1968-1983) is first with 248 wins.

Mike Logan and Jim Gorman will be broadcasting the live action on Friday, February 28 when the Friars host Boston University in a best of three Hockey East quarterfinal series. In order to hear the games, fans will need to download Real-One Player (www.realone.com) and they will need to subscribe to the College Sports Pass. The cost of the subscription is \$6.95 per month.

COYOTE CONNECTION... Eight members of the 2002-03 Providence College men's hockey team played junior hockey for the New England Coyotes of the Eastern Junior Hockey League in Enfield, Conn. Jon DiSalvatore (S. Windsor, Conn.), Peter Zingoni (Newtown, Conn.), Chris Chaput (Pawtucket, R.I.), Eric Lundberg (Vernon, Conn.), Jeff Mason (Easthampton, Mass.), Torry Gajda (Westfield, Mass.), Bryan Horan (Unionville, Conn.) and James Pemberton (Cumberland, R.I.) all played for the Coyotes under Head Coach Gary Dineen. DiSalvatore, who played for the Coyotes from 1996-99, was named EJHL Most Valuable Player in 1998-99. Zingoni was a two-time EJHL All-Star, who recorded 79 points in 1999-00. Despite playing only one year with the Coyotes, Chaput recorded 104 points (49 goals, 55 assists) in 2000-01. Lundberg played two years (1999-01) for the Coyotes and was named the team's Defenseman of the Year twice. Mason was named the team's MVP in 2000-01. Gajda was named Coyote of the Year in 2002, while Horan was named Coyote Rookie of the Year in 2000. Pemberton played one year for the Coyotes and was the top scoring defenseman in 2001-02 with 35 points (17 goals, 18 assists).
