**FRIARS OPEN 2008-09 SEASON WITH TWO HOME GAMES...** The Providence College men's hockey team will open the season on Friday, October 17 against Northeastern at Schneider Arena. It will mark the first time since 1997 that the season opener also will be the Hockey East opener for the Friars. That season, PC played Northeastern as well and the Huskies prevailed, 2-0, at Schneider Arena. On Saturday, October 18, the Friars will host Bowling Green State University in a non-conference contest.

**FRIARS IN SEASON OPENERS...** Providence College is 34-22-1 all-time in season openers. Last season, the Friars opened the season on the road against 12th-ranked St. Lawrence and suffered a 4-1 defeat in Canton, N.Y. The Friars are seeking their first season-opening win since 2004 when they defeated Clarkson, 4-2, at Schneider Arena.

**FRIARS IN HOCKEY EAST OPENERS...** The Friars are 12-10-2 all-time in Hockey East openers. Last season, the Friars opened the league schedule with a 3-2 overtime loss at Northeastern. The Friars are 0-2-0 all-time against Northeastern in Hockey East openers. The only other time that Providence played Northeastern in the league opening game was on October 24, 1997.

**FRIARS IN HOME OPENERS...** Providence College is 34-23 all-time in home openers. Last season, the Friars opened their home schedule with a 6-4 loss against Holy Cross on October 20 at Schneider Arena. The Friars are seeking their first home opening win since 2005 when they defeated UMass Lowell, 3-0.

**SERIES HISTORY VERSUS NORTHEASTERN...** In 131 all-time meetings between Northeastern University and Providence College, the Friars lead, 75-44-12. PC is 37-18-6 all-time in Providence, 35-25-6 at Northeastern, and 3-1-0 in neutral sites. Last season, the Huskies posted a 3-2 overtime win in the first meeting between the two teams on October 19 at Matthews Arena. On January 25, the Friars scored three power-play goals and added one short-handed tally en route to a 5-1 win over the Huskies at Matthews Arena marking their first win at Northeastern since November 15, 2005. The following night, the Friars rallied from a 2-0 deficit to defeat the Huskies, 5-2, at Schneider Arena to take the season series, 2-0.

**SCOUTING NORTHEASTERN...** The Huskies opened their season last weekend at the Kendall Hockey Classic in Alaska. Northeastern tied Alaska, 2-2, on Friday, October 10 and then defeated Alaska-Anchorage on Saturday, October 11. Ryan Ginand led the way on Saturday as he scored two goals, including the game winner. Dennis McCauley scored one goal in each game over the weekend. Brad Thiessen played both games in net and combined to make 50 saves in 54 shots.

**SERIES HISTORY VERSUS BOWLING GREEN...** Saturday's game will mark the ninth all-time meeting between Bowling Green and Providence College with the Falcons leading, 5-3. In their last meeting, the Falcons defeated the Friars, 4-2, at Schneider Arena on October 20, 2006. Tomas Petruska's goal early in the third period proved to be the game winner. For the Friars, Nick Mazzolini (Anchorage, Alaska) finished with one goal and one assist. Prior to that game, the two teams last played each other on December 30, 2004 in the consolation game of the Ledyard National Bank Tournament hosted by Dartmouth College. PC defeated BGSU, 3-2.

**SCOUTING BOWLING GREEN...** Bowling Green opened the season with a pair of home games last weekend. On Friday, October 10, the Falcons rallied from a 2-0 first period deficit to defeat RIT, 4-2. Brandon Svendsen and Kai Kantola scored two goals each, while Dan Sexton added three assists. The following night, BGSU skated to a 3-3 overtime tie against Niagara. The Falcons trailed, 3-1, after one period, but scored one goal in each of the last two periods to force overtime. David Solway's goal with less than five minutes remaining in the third period sent the game into the extra session.

**FRIARS AGAINST CCHA OPPONENTS...** Bowling Green will be the only Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) team that the Friars will play during the regular season. Last season, the Friars posted a 1-1 record against CCHA squads as they lost to Michigan (6-0), but then defeated Michigan State (5-3) in the Great Lakes Invitational at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Mich.

**TAORMINA LOOKING TO CONTINUE TREND...** Coming off his most successful season in a Friar uniform, senior defenseman Matt Taormina (Washington Township, Mich.) will look to continue the trend that made him one of the top scoring defensemen in the nation in 2007-08. Taormina, who combined for 18 points (six goals, 12 assists) in his first two seasons,

finished second on the team last with a career-high nine goals and 18 assists for 27 points last season. In addition, he was named to the All-Hockey East Second Team and to the All-New England Team. The 27 points were the most by a Friar defenseman since 2004 when Stephen Wood had 29 points en route to being named to the All-America Team.

**OCEAN STATE CONNECTION...** The 2008-09 men's hockey team has a strong contingent of Rhode Islanders. In addition to seven players, Head Coach Tim Army (East Providence) and Assistant Coach David Berard (Coventry) also hail from the Ocean State. The Rhode Islanders on this season's team are: juniors David Cavanagh (Warwick), John Cavanagh (Warwick), and Matt Tommasiello (Cranston), sophomores Eric Baier (North Kingstown) and Austin Mayer (Providence), as well as freshmen Justin Gates (Cranston) and Shawn Tingley (North Kingstown).

**FRIARS DRAFTED BY THE NHL...** This season's PC team features three players who were selected in the NHL Entry Draft. Senior Pierce Norton (South Boston, Mass.) was a 2004 ninth-round pick, 285th overall by the Toronto Maple Leafs. Junior Mark Fayne (Sagamore Beach, Mass.) was chosen in the fifth round, 155th overall by the New Jersey Devils in the 2005 draft. Sophomore Joe Lavin (Shrewsbury, Mass.) was picked in the fifth round (126th overall) in the 2007 Draft.

**HEAD COACH TIM ARMY...** Tim Army is in his fourth season with the Friars. Army returned to his alma mater to take over the reigns of the PC hockey program on June 17, 2005 after spending three seasons with the Portland Pirates of the AHL. A 1985 graduate of the College and an East Providence native, Army became the 11th coach in the history of the program. He is the first PC alumnus to coach the team since his former coach Lou Lamoriello guided the Friars (1968-83). He also is the first former Hockey East player to be a head coach in the league. In his first season, Army led the team to a 17-16-3 overall record, including a 14-10-3 mark in Hockey East action. The 17 wins were the most by a Friar squad since 2002-03. In addition, the Friars, who were picked to finish eighth in the preseason coaches poll, recorded 14 conference victories and finished fifth in the league. The 14 Hockey East wins were one shy of tying a school record. During the 2007-08 campaign, the Friars recorded 14 wins and were ranked as high as 11th in the national polls. Among the 14 victories for the Friars, were two triumphs at Boston College, which went on to claim the national title. The Friars also posted an impressive win over defending national champion and fifth-ranked Michigan State at the Great Lakes Invitational at the Joe Louis Arena. In all, the Friars had 10 wins against ranked teams. Prior to coaching at Portland, Army spent nine seasons as an assistant coach in the NHL for two different teams. He worked for four seasons as an assistant for Friar great Ron Wilson with the Anaheim Mighty Ducks (1993-97) and five years under Wilson with the Washington Capitals (1997-02). While in Anaheim, Army was part of the 1996-97 team that earned the franchise's first ever playoff berth and advanced to the second round, where the Mighty Ducks fell to the eventual Stanley Cup Champion Detroit Red Wings. Army helped lead the Capitals to the 1998 Stanley Cup Finals, the team's only appearance in the finals.
