FRIARS OPEN SECOND HALF AGAINST UMASS LOWELL...

After a 31-day layoff, the Providence College hockey team will play four games in the next eight days beginning on Saturday, January 10 with a home contest against the UMass Lowell River Hawks. It will mark the third and final regular season meeting between the two Hockey East foes this season. The Friars will then hit the road for three straight games.

SERIES HISTORY VERSUS UMASS LOWELL... In 88 all-time

meetings between Providence College and UMass Lowell, the Friars lead 44-35-9. This season, the River Hawks have won the first two meetings, both played at Tsongas Arena in Lowell, Mass. UMass Lowell posted a 4-1 victory on October 24 and then defeated the Friars, 6-1, on November 21. Last season, the Friars posted a 1-1-1 mark against the River Hawks with all three games going into overtime. PC was 1-0-1 against the River Hawks at Schneider Arena in 2007-08.

SCOUTING UMASS LOWELL... The River Hawks are coming off a

pair of 2-1 losses on January 2-3 at the Shillelagh Tournament in Hoffman Estates, Ill. The River Hawks outshot their opponents in both games, including a 31-23 mark against Union on January 3, but were only able to manufacture one power-play goal in each game. Netminder Carter Hutton totaled 44 saves in the two games. Kory Falite leads the team in scoring with 16 points on 10 goals and six assists, while David Vallorani is second with 14 points on four goals and 10 assists. Nevin Hamilton and Hutton have seen a bulk of the action in goal for the River Hawks.

• Junior Chris Eppich recorded his first career goal on December 5 at Quinnipiac. In his next game on December 9, Eppich scored again to lead the Friars to a 4-3 win at Brown.

• Matt Bergland (Faribault, Minn.) has five multiple-point games in his first 16 career contests. He is tied for second among Hockey East rookies with 16 points (five goals, 11 assists).

• Bergland is in the midst of a three-game point streak in which he has recorded four points (two goals, two assists).

• Junior defenseman Mark Fayne (Sagamore Beach, Mass.) who recorded one point in his first 10 games, has four points (two goals, two assists) in the last five contests.

• The Friars have outshot their opponents in 10 of the 16 games this season, including a season-high 46 shots against Brown on December 9. Last season, PC outshot its opponents in 28 of 36 games.

• The Friars rank fourth in Hockey East, averaging 31.5 shots per game. In league games only, the Friars are fifth averaging 30.8 shots per contest.

• Freshman Bryce Anelosky and sophomore Joe Lavin left the PC hockey team after the first semester in December to play junior hockey.

TAORMINA CLIMBING THE CHART... Matt Taormina continues to climb PC's all-time scoring list among defensemen. Taormina, who currently has 56 career points (18 goals, 38 assists), ranks 21st all-time at PC. The last PC blueliner to reach the 50-point mark was Stephen Wood '04 who finished with 88 points (28 goals, 60 assists) and was named to the All-America Second Team in 2004. Defenseman Ron Wilson is PC's overall all-time leading scorer with 250 points (78 goals, 172 assists). Last season, Taormina finished with career-highs in goals (9), assists (18), and points (27). He was named to the All-Hockey East Second Team and to the All-New England Team. This season, Taormina is tied for fourth among Hockey East defensemen in scoring with 11 points on three goals and eight assists.

JOHN CAVANAGH AND MATT BERGLAND LEADING THE FRIARS IN GOALS... Co-captain John Cavanagh and linemate Matt Bergland lead the team with five goals each this season. For Cavanagh, the five goals are one short of tying his goal total from his first two seasons at PC. He also has five assists and is third on the team with 10 points.

BERGLAND OFF TO QUICK START... Matt Bergland continues to lead the team in scoring with 16 points (five goals, 11 assists) and is looking to become the first Friar freshman to lead the team in points since Rob Gaudreau did it during the 1988-89 season. That season, Gaudreau totaled 57 points on 28 goals and 29 assists. Bergland has four multiple-point games, including a three-point performance (one goal, two assists) in a win over Bowling Green on October 17 at Schneider Arena.

FRIAR FRESHMEN MAKING IMPACT... The PC freshman class has made an impact so far this season. Matt Bergland leads the team in scoring with 16 points (five goals, 11 assists), while defenseman Daniel New (White Plains, N.Y.) is second among rookies with three points (one goal, two assists). Andy Balysky (Randolph, N.J.) has one goal and one assist, and defenseman David Brown (Centennial, Colo.) has two assists. In addition, Robert Maloney has played in 13 games and has one goal, while goaltender Justin Gates has played in 13 games, including 12 starts. Shawn Tingley (North Kingstown, R.I.), who suffered an injury during the pre-season, made his collegiate debut on December 9 at Brown.

FRIAR DEFEAT BROWN TO RETAIN MAYOR'S CUP... In its last game, Providence College recorded a 4-3 win over Brown on December 9 in the 23rd Annual Mayor's Cup at Meehan Auditorium. The Friars moved to 13-8-2 overall in the Mayor's Cup and tied the all-time series against Brown at 43-43-2. It marked the second consecutive season that the Friars captured the Mayor's Cup and the first win at Meehan Auditorium since 2003. Pierce Norton (South Boston, Mass.), Chris Eppich (Surrey, B.C.), Matt Bergland (Faribault, Minn.) and Jordan Kremyr (Cloverdale, B.C.) each scored for the Friars, while Matt Taormina (Washington Township, Mich.) recorded three assists. Kremyr, who tallied the game winner, and Bergland also added one assist. The Friars finished with a 46-22 shot advantage, including a 19-9 edge in the third period. Sophomore Matt Germain (Rockland, Mass.) had two assists.

THIRD PERIOD SCORING... The Friars have done a bulk of their scoring in the third period this season. Of the 35 goals score by PC this season, 16 have come in the third period, including nine in the last six games. The Friars have scored six goals in the first period and 13 in the second.

FRIAR QUICK NOTES...

• Of the 35 PC goals scored by the Friars this season, 17 have been scored by freshmen and sophomores.

• Senior Matt Taormina and sophomore Matt Germain each matched their career-high in assists in the last game. Taormina had three assists and Germain had two helpers.

OCEAN STATE CONNECTION... The 2008-09 men's hockey team has a strong contingent of Rhode Islanders. In addition to seven players, Head Coach Tim Army (East Providence) and Assistant Coach David Berard (Coventry) also hail from the Ocean State. The Rhode Islanders on this season's team are: juniors David Cavanagh (Warwick), John Cavanagh (Warwick), and Matt Tommasiello (Cranston), sophomores Eric Baier (North Kingstown) and Austin Mayer (Providence), as well as freshmen Justin Gates (Cranston) and Shawn Tingley (North Kingstown).

FRIARS DRAFTED BY NHL TEAMS... This year's PC team features two players who were selected in the NHL Entry Draft. Senior Pierce Norton (South Boston, Mass.) was a 2004 ninth-round pick, 285th overall by the Toronto Maple Leafs. Junior Mark Fayne (Sagamore Beach, Mass.) was chosen in the fifth round, 155th overall by the New Jersey Devils in the 2005 draft.

HEAD COACH TIM ARMY... Tim Army is in his fourth season with the Friars. Army returned to his alma mater to take over the reigns of the PC hockey program on June 17, 2005 after spending three seasons with the Portland Pirates of the AHL. A 1985 graduate of the College and an East Providence native, Army became the 11th coach in the history of the program. He is the first PC alumnus to coach the team since his former coach Lou Lamoriello guided the Friars (1968-83). He also is the first former Hockey East player to be a head coach in the league. In his first season, Army led the team to a 17-16-3 overall record, including a 14-10-3 mark in Hockey East action. The 17 wins were the most by a Friar squad since 2002-03. In addition, the Friars, who were picked to finish eighth in the preseason coaches poll, recorded 14 conference victories and finished fifth in the league. The 14 Hockey East wins were one shy of tying a school record. During the 2007-08 campaign, the Friars recorded 14 wins and were ranked as high as 11th in the national polls. Among the 14 victories for the Friars, were two triumphs at Boston College, which went on to claim the national title. The Friars also posted an impressive win over defending national champion and fifth-ranked Michigan State at the Great Lakes Invitational at the Joe Louis Arena. In all, the Friars had 10 wins against ranked teams. Prior to coaching at Portland, Army spent nine seasons as an assistant coach in the NHL for two different teams. He worked for four seasons as an assistant for Friar great Ron Wilson with the Anaheim Mighty Ducks (1993-97) and five years under Wilson with the Washington Capitals (1997-02). While in Anaheim, Army was part of the 1996-97 team that earned the franchise's first ever playoff berth and advanced to the second round, where the Mighty Ducks fell to the eventual Stanley Cup Champion Detroit Red Wings. Army helped lead the Capitals to the 1998 Stanley Cup Finals, the team's only appearance in the finals.
