FRIARS TO HOST DARTMOUTH AND TRAVEL TO UNION... The Providence College men's hockey team will begin a string of four consecutive non-conference games to close out the first half of the 2008-09 season. The Friars will host 20th-ranked Dartmouth College on Friday, November 28 at Schneider Arena and then travel to Schenectady, N.Y. to take on Union College on Saturday, November 29 at Messa Rink.

FRIARS VERSUS ECAC TEAMS... The Friars will play four consecutive games against ECAC teams, beginning on Friday, November 28 against Dartmouth College at Schneider Arena and Saturday, November 29 versus Union College at Messa Rink. Last season, the Friars posted a 2-2 record against ECAC squads with home wins over Brown and Union. The Friars were defeated on the road by Clarkson and St. Lawrence.

SERIES HISTORY VERSUS DARTMOUTH... In 22 meetings between Providence College and Dartmouth, the Friars lead 14-8. It will mark the first meeting between the two teams since December 10, 1999 when the Friars posted a 2-0 win over the BIG Green at Schneider Arena. Dartmouth's last win over Providence was on December 11, 1998 when the BIG Green posted a 6-5 overtime triumph at Thompson Arena in Hanover, N.H.

SCOUTING DARTMOUTH... Dartmouth College (5-3-0) is coming off last weekend's split as it defeated Colgate, 1-0, on November 21, but was then beaten, 3-1, at Cornell on November 22. In the win at Colgate, Adam Estoclet scored early in the third period, while Jody O'Neill made 28 saves to lead the BIG Green to its fifth consecutive victory. O'Neill stopped 26 shots the following night at Cornell, but it was not enough as Dartmouth was defeated, 3-1, and thus ended its five-game winning streak. Doug Jones scored the lone goal for the BIG Green. Estoclet leads the team in scoring with 12 points (four goals, eight assists), while Joe Stejskal (six goals, two assists) and Jones (one goal, seven assists) are tied for second with eight points each. O'Neill has played in seven of the eight games and has posted a 5-2-0 record, a 2.00 goals against average, a .941 save percentage and one shutout.

RECAP OF LAST WEEKEND... The Friars a 0-2 record last week. On November 21, the Friars were defeated, 6-1, at UMass Lowell as senior defenseman Matt Taormina (Washington Township, Mich.) scored the lone goal for PC. The following night, the Friars were defeated at No. 13 New Hampshire, 4-3. PC led, 1-0, on a goal by junior John Cavanagh (Warwick, R.I.), but UNH scored the next four goals to take 4-1 lead after two periods. In the third period, PC cut the lead to 4-3 on goals by freshman Matt Bergland (Faribault, Minn.) and junior Mark Fayne (Sagamore Beach, Mass.). It marked Fayne's first goal of the season, and the third for Bergland, who was named the second star of the game. However, the Friars, who outshot the Wildcats, 18-3, in the third period, could not score the equalizer. Freshman goaltender Justin Gates (Cranston, R.I.) recorded with 26 saves. The Friars finished with a 35-30 shot advantage against the Wildcats. Taormina had with two assists.

SERIES HISTORY VERSUS UNION... Saturday night's game will mark the 10th all-time meeting between PC and Union with the Friars leading, 7-1-1. It will mark the first meeting at Messa Rink since November 20, 2001 when the Friars and the Dutchmen played to a 4-4 overtime tie. Last season, the Friars defeated the Dutchmen, 5-2, at Schneider Arena. PC is 4-0-1 in the last five meetings against Union. The Dutchmen's lone win in the series came on November 1, 1996 (2-0 at Achilles Rink).

FRIAR QUICK NOTES...

- Of the 25 PC goals scored by the Friars this season, 12 have been scored by freshmen and sophomores.
- Senior defenseman Matt Taormina's goal on November 14 against Maine marked his 50th career point.
- Austin Mayer's (Providence, R.I.) goal against Holy Cross marked the team's first short-handed goal of the season. In 2007-08, the Friars finished tied for second nationally with nine short-handed goals.
- The Friars have played five road games so far this season and have posted a 1-4 record, including a 6-4 win over Holy Cross. Last season, PC recorded a 6-9-2 mark away from Schneider Arena.
- The Friars have outshot their opponents in seven of the 12 games this season, including a season-high 37 shots against Maine on November 14. Last season, PC outshot its opponents in 28 of 36 games and there were two games in which the shots were even.
- Junior co-captain John Cavanagh, who scored six goals in his first two years at PC, already has four goals this season, which leads the team.
- Matt Bergland has four multiple-point games in his first 12 career contests. He leads all Hockey East rookies with 12 points (three goals, nine assists).

SCOUTING UNION... The Dutchmen (4-4-1) are coming off a pair of conference losses against Quinnipiac (6-3 on November 14) and No. 11 Princeton (4-1 on November 15). Jason Walters scored in each game for Union, while Corey Milan totalled 71 saves in net in the two games. Stephane Boileau leads the team in scoring with eight points (three goals, five assists), while Adam Presizniuk is second with seven points (four goals, three assists). Milan has played in all nine games for Union and has a 4-4-1 record, a 2.73 goals against average and a .911 save percentage.

TAORMINA CLIMBING THE CHART... Senior Matt Taormina continues to climb PC's all-time scoring list among defensemen. Taormina, who currently has 53 career points (18 goals, 35 assists) ranks 23rd all-time at PC. The last Friar defenseman to reach the 50-point mark was Stephen Wood '04 who finished with 88 points (28 goals, 60 assists) and was named to the All-America Second Team in 2004. Defenseman Ron Wilson is PC's overall all-time leading scorer with 250 points (78 goals, 172 assists). Last season, Taormina finished with career-high is goals (9) assists (18) and points (27). He was named to the All-Hockey East Second Team.

BERGLAND OFF TO QUICK START... Freshman Matt Bergland recorded one goal and two assists in a 4-3 win over Bowling Green on October 18 at Schneider Arena. The last PC freshman to record three points in one game was Kyle MacKinnon (Walnut, Calif.) who tallied two goals and one assist in a 5-3 victory over Michigan State on December 29, 2007. In addition, Bergland also totaled two assists against Holy Cross on October 25, against Massachusetts on October 31 and versus Vermont on November 7. He leads the team in scoring with 12 points (three goals, nine assists) and is looking to become the first Friar freshman to lead the team in points since Rob Gaudreau did it during the 1988-89 season. That season, Gaudreau totaled 57 points on 28 goals and 29 assists.

FRIAR FRESHMEN MAKING IMPACT... The Providence College freshman class has made an impact so far this season. Matt Bergland leads the team in scoring with 12 points (three goals, nine assists), while defenseman Daniel New (White Plains, N.Y.) is second among rookies with three points (one goal, two assists). Andy Balysky (Randolph, N.J.) has one goal and one assist, defenseman David Brown (Centennial, Colo.) has two assists and defenseman Bryce Aneloski (Pekin, Ill.) has played in all 12 games and has one assist. In addition, Rob Maloney (Eagan, Minn.) has played in nine games, while goaltender Justin Gates has played in 10 games. Shawn Tingley (North Kingstown, R.I.) suffered an injury during the pre-season and has yet to play in a game.

OCEAN STATE CONNECTION... The 2008-09 men's hockey team has a strong contingent of Rhode Islanders. In addition to seven players, Head Coach Tim Army (East Providence) and Assistant Coach David Berard (Coventry) also hail from the Ocean State. The Rhode Islanders on this season's team are: juniors David Cavanagh (Warwick), John Cavanagh (Warwick), and Matt Tommasiello (Cranston), sophomores Eric Baier (North Kingstown) and Austin Mayer (Providence), as well as freshmen Justin Gates (Cranston) and Shawn Tingley (North Kingstown).

FRIARS DRAFTED BY THE NHL... This season's PC team features three players who were selected in the NHL Entry Draft. Senior Pierce Norton (South Boston, Mass.) was a 2004 ninth-round pick, 285th overall by the Toronto Maple Leafs. Junior Mark Fayne (Sagamore Beach, Mass.) was chosen in the fifth round, 155th overall by the New Jersey Devils in the 2005 draft. Sophomore Joe Lavin (Shrewsbury, Mass.) was picked in the fifth round (126th overall) in the 2007 Draft Chicago Black Hawks.

HEAD COACH TIM ARMY... Tim Army is in his fourth season with the Friars. Army returned to his alma mater to take over the reigns of the PC hockey program on June 17, 2005 after spending three seasons with the Portland Pirates of the AHL. A 1985 graduate of the College and an East Providence native, Army became the 11th coach in the history of the program. He is the first PC alumnus to coach the team since his former coach Lou Lamoriello guided the Friars (1968-83). He also is the first former Hockey East player to be a head coach in the league. In his first season, Army led the team to a 17-16-3 overall record, including a 14-10-3 mark in Hockey East action. The 17 wins were the most by a Friar squad since 2002-03. In addition, the Friars, who were picked to finish eighth in the preseason coaches poll, recorded 14 conference victories and finished fifth in the league. The 14 Hockey East wins were one shy of tying a school record. During the 2007-08 campaign, the Friars recorded 14 wins and were ranked as high as 11th in the national polls. Among the 14 victories for the Friars, were two triumphs at Boston College, which went on to claim the national title. The Friars also posted an impressive win over defending national champion and fifth-ranked Michigan State at the Great Lakes Invitational at the Joe Louis Arena. In all, the Friars had 10 wins against ranked teams. Prior to coaching at Portland, Army spent nine seasons as an assistant coach in the NHL for two different teams. He worked for four seasons as an assistant for Friar great Ron Wilson with the Anaheim Mighty Ducks (1993-97) and five years under Wilson with the Washington Capitals (1997-02). While in Anaheim, Army was part of the 1996-97 team that earned the franchise's first ever playoff berth and advanced to the second round, where the Mighty Ducks fell to the eventual Stanley Cup Champion Detroit Red Wings. Army helped lead the Capitals to the 1998 Stanley Cup Finals, the team's only appearance in the finals.
