After posting a 1-1 record in its season-opening weekend at Schneider Arena, the Providence College men's hockey team will hit the road beginning on Friday, October 24 with a game at UMass Lowell beginning at 7:30 p.m. The Friars will then travel to Worcester, Mass. to take on the Holy Cross Crusaders on Saturday, October 25. It will mark the first meeting between the two teams in Worcester since 1956.

FRIARS ON THE ROAD... Last season, the Friars posted a 6-9-2 record in road games, including two wins at Boston College. PC went 6-5-2 in conference road games, 0-4 in non-conference road games and 1-1 in neutral site games.

SERIES HISTORY VERSUS UMASS LOWELL... In 86 meetings between PC and UMass Lowell, the Friars lead 44-33-9. Last season, the Friars posted a 1-1-1 mark against the River Hawks with all three games going into overtime. The two teams played to a 2-2 overtime tie on November 16. Then, on January 11, the Friars posted a 4-3 win in overtime. The following afternoon, the River Hawks scored with 1.3 seconds left in the extra session to post a 3-2 victory.

SCOUTING UMASS LOWELL... The River Hawks (1-2-0) will play their Hockey East opener on Friday. Last weekend, UMass Lowell split two games at Michigan State, winning, 3-0, on October 16 and falling, 2-1, on October 17. In the win, Patrick Cey's goal in the third period was enough for the River Hawks, who outshot the Spartans, 30-16. In the loss, Kory Falite scored to give UML a 1-0 edge, but it was not enough as the Spartans battled back for the win. Carter Hutton stopped 34 shots in net for the River Hawks.

SERIES VERSUS HISTORY HOLY CROSS... The Friars are 6-1 all-time against Holy Cross. Last season, the Crusaders posted their first ever win over the Friars as they won, 6-4, at Schneider Arena on October 20. Peter Lorinser and Ryan Driscoll each had two goals, while Brodie Sheahan tallied three assists to lead the way for the Crusaders. For the Friars, Kyle Laughlin tallied two goals and one assist. Prior to last year's meeting, the two teams last played each other on November 27, 2004.

SCOUTING HOLY CROSS... Holy Cross (1-0-1) is coming off a tie and a win at Atlantic Hockey foe, Canisius last weekend. On October 17, Marty Adams scored Holy Cross' lone goal, while Adam Roy made 29 saves as the Crusaders skated to a 1-1 overtime deadlock against the Golden Griffins. The following night, Brodie Sheehan scored twice, while Jay Silvia tallied the game winner late in the third period as Holy Cross posted a 5-4 victory.

FRIARS AGAINST ATLANTIC HOCKEY OPPONENTS... Holy Cross will be the only Atlantic Hockey team that the Friars will play during the regular season. Last season, the Friars posted a 0-1 record against Atlantic Hockey opponents, falling 6-4 to Holy Cross. Prior to that, the Friars had not faced a Atlantic Hockey opponent since December 22, 2005 when they defeated Sacred Heart, 5-2, in the championship game of the Providence College Holiday Classic at Schneider Arena.

BERGLAND OFF TO QUICK START... Freshman Matt Bergland (Faribault, Minn.) recorded one goal and two assists in a 4-3 win over Bowling Green on October 18 at Schneider Arena. His power-play goal in the third period proved to be the game winner as the Friars captured their first win of the season. The last PC freshman to record three points in one game was Kyle MacKinnon (Walnut, Calif.) who tallied two goals and one assist in a 5-3 victory over Michigan State on December 29, 2007.

A WEEKEND OF FIRSTS... In addition to Matt Bergland recording his first career points (one goal, two assists) on October 18, classmate David Brown (Centennial, Colo.) recorded his first career assist. Freshman goaltender Justin Gates (Cranston, R.I.) made his first career start on October 17 and recorded 20 saves.

TAORMINA LOOKING TO CONTINUE TREND... Coming off his most successful season in a Friar uniform, senior defenseman Matt Taormina (Washington Township, Mich.) will look to continue the trend that made him one of the top scoring defensemen in the nation in 2007-08. Taormina, who combined for 18 points (six goals, 12 assists) in his first two seasons, finished second on the team last with a career-high nine goals and 18 assists for 27 points last season. In addition, he was named to the All-Hockey East Second Team and to the All-New England Team. The 27 points were the most by a Friar defenseman since 2004 when Stephen Wood had 29 points

en route to being named to the All-America Team. This season, Taormina has one goal and one assist as he scored PC's first goal of the season on October 18 against Bowling Green.

OCEAN STATE CONNECTION... The 2008-09 men's hockey team has a strong contingent of Rhode Islanders. In addition to seven players, Head Coach Tim Army (East Providence) and Assistant Coach David Berard (Coventry) also hail from the Ocean State. The Rhode Islanders on this season's team are: juniors David Cavanagh (Warwick), John Cavanagh (Warwick), and Matt Tommasiello (Cranston), sophomores Eric Baier (North Kingstown) and Austin Mayer (Providence), as well as freshmen Justin Gates (Cranston) and Shawn Tingley (North Kingstown).

FRIARS DRAFTED BY THE NHL... This season's PC team features three players who were selected in the NHL Entry Draft. Senior Pierce Norton (South Boston, Mass.) was a 2004 ninth-round pick, 285th overall by the Toronto Maple Leafs. Junior Mark Fayne (Sagamore Beach, Mass.) was chosen in the fifth round, 155th overall by the New Jersey Devils in the 2005 draft. Sophomore Joe Lavin (Shrewsbury, Mass.) was picked in the fifth round (126th overall) in the 2007 Draft.

HEAD COACH TIM ARMY... Tim Army is in his fourth season with the Friars. Army returned to his alma mater to take over the reigns of the PC hockey program on June 17, 2005 after spending three seasons with the Portland Pirates of the AHL. A 1985 graduate of the College and an East Providence native, Army became the 11th coach in the history of the program. He is the first PC alumnus to coach the team since his former coach Lou Lamoriello guided the Friars (1968-83). He also is the first former Hockey East player to be a head coach in the league. In his first season, Army led the team to a 17-16-3 overall record, including a 14-10-3 mark in Hockey East action. The 17 wins were the most by a Friar squad since 2002-03. In addition, the Friars, who were picked to finish eighth in the preseason coaches poll, recorded 14 conference victories and finished fifth in the league. The 14 Hockey East wins were one shy of tying a school record. During the 2007-08 campaign, the Friars recorded 14 wins and were ranked as high as 11th in the national polls. Among the 14 victories for the Friars, were two triumphs at Boston College, which went on to claim the national title. The Friars also posted an impressive win over defending national champion and fifth-ranked Michigan State at the Great Lakes Invitational at the Joe Louis Arena. In all, the Friars had 10 wins against ranked teams. Prior to coaching at Portland, Army spent nine seasons as an assistant coach in the NHL for two different teams. He worked for four seasons as an assistant for Friar great Ron Wilson with the Anaheim Mighty Ducks (1993-97) and five years under Wilson with the Washington Capitals (1997-02). While in Anaheim, Army was part of the 1996-97 team that earned the franchise's first ever playoff berth and advanced to the second round, where the Mighty Ducks fell to the eventual Stanley Cup Champion Detroit Red Wings. Army helped lead the Capitals to the 1998 Stanley Cup Finals, the team's only appearance in the finals.
