FRIARS TO HOST MAINE FOR TWO GAMES... The Providence College men's hockey team will look to return to the win column when it hosts the University of Maine on Friday, November 14 and Saturday, November 15 at Schneider Arena.

SERIES HISTORY VS. MAINE... In 96 meetings between the two teams, Maine leads 56-36-4, including a 22-19-2 edge in Providence. Last season, the Friars swept a two-game series in Orono, marking the first time since November 7-8, 1985 that PC won consecutive games at Maine's Alford Arena. The Friars completed the sweep on November 10 with a 1-0 win marking the team's second shutout win at Alford Arena. In the final meeting between the two teams last season, the Black Bears defeated the Friars, 4-0, at Schneider Arena on January 19.

SCOUTING MAINE... The Black Bears (4-3-0, 1-2-0) are coming off a 2-1 win over third-ranked Boston College on Sunday, November 9 at Alford Arena. Brian Flynn scored the game-winning goal with 1:34 remaining in the third period to lift Maine to its first Hockey East win of the season. Christopher Hahn scored the opening goal, a power-play tally, for the Black Bears, which at the time gave them a 1-0 lead. Scott Darling made 24 saves in goal for the Black Bears. Freshman Gustav Nyquist leads the team in scoring with seven points (two goals, five assists) while Hahn is second with five points on four goals and one assist. Darling has played in four of the seven games and boasts a 3-1-0 record, a 1.01 goals against average and a .957 save percentage.

FRIAR QUICK NOTES...

- Of the 19 PC goals scored by the Friars this season, 10 have been scored by freshmen and sophomores.
- Austin Mayer's goal against Holy Cross marked the team's first short-handed goal of the season. In 2007-08, the Friars finished tied for second nationally with nine short-handed goals.
- The Friars have scored five power-play goals this season and two have come with less than 10 seconds left in a period. John Cavanagh scored on the man advantage with one second left in the second period against Bowling Green. Daniel New also scored on the power play with seven seconds left in the first period against Holy Cross on October 25.
- The Friars have outshot their opponents in four of the eight games. Last season, PC outshot its opponents in 28 of 36 games and there were two games in which the shots were even.
- Junior co-captain John Cavanagh (Warwick, R.I.), who scored six goals in his first two years at PC, already has three goals this season.
- Freshman Matt Bergland (Faribault, Minn.) has four multiple-point games in his first eight career contests. He leads all Hockey East rookies with 10 points.
- Senior Pierce Norton (South Boston, Mass.) recorded his seventh career two-goal game on November 7 in a 2-2 overtime against Vermont.

BERGLAND OFF TO QUICK START... Freshman Matt Bergland (Faribault, Minn.) recorded one goal and two assists in a 4-3 win over Bowling Green on October 18 at Schneider Arena. His power-play goal in the third period proved to be the game winner as the Friars captured their first win of the season. The last PC freshman to record three points in one game was Kyle MacKinnon (Walnut, Calif.) who tallied two goals and one assist in a 5-3 victory over Michigan State on December 29, 2007. In addition, Bergland also totaled two assists against Holy Cross on October 25, against Massachusetts on October 31 and versus Vermont on November 7. He leads the team in scoring with 10 points (two goals, eight assists) and is looking to become the first Friar freshman to lead the team in points since Rob Gaudreau did it during the 1988-89 season. That season, Gaudreau totaled 57 points on 28 goals and 29 assists.

FRIAR FRESHMEN MAKING IMPACT... The Providence College freshman class has made an impact so far this season. Matt Bergland leads the team in scoring with 10 points (two goals, eight assists), while defenseman Daniel New (White Plains, N.Y.) is second among rookies with three points (one goal, two assists). Andy Balysky (Randolph, N.J.) has one goal and one assist, defenseman David Brown (Centennial, Colo.) has two assists and defenseman Bryce Aneloski (Pekin, Ill.) has played in all eight games and has one assist. In addition, Rob Maloney (Eagan, Minn.) has played in five games, while goaltender Justing Gates (Cranston, R.I.) has played in six games. Shawn Tingley (North Kingstown, R.I.) suffered an injury during the pre-season and has yet to play in a game.

OCEAN STATE CONNECTION... The 2008-09 men's hockey team has a strong contingent of Rhode Islanders. In addition to seven players, Head Coach Tim Army (East Providence) and Assistant Coach David Berard (Coventry) also hail from the Ocean State. The Rhode Islanders on this season's team are: juniors David Cavanagh (Warwick), John Cavanagh (Warwick), and Matt Tommasiello (Cranston), sophomores Eric Baier (North Kingstown) and Austin Mayer (Providence), as well as freshmen Justin Gates (Cranston) and Shawn Tingley (North Kingstown).

RECAP OF LAST WEEKEND... The Friars posted a 0-1-1 record last weekend, tying Vermont, 2-2, in overtime on November 7 and falling to No. 12 Notre Dame, 4-1, on November 8 at Schneider Arena. Against Vermont, the Catamounts scored a short-handed goal and a power-play goal in the second period to take a 2-0 lead. The Friars responded late in the period as senior Pierce Norton (South Boston, Mass.) scored a power-play goal to cut the lead to 2-1. In the third period, Norton scored again on the power play to even the score. The Friars finished with a 31-30 shot advantage, including a 2-0 edge in overtime. Freshman Matt Bergland (Faribault, Minn.) assisted on both goals, while classmate Justin Gates (Cranston, R.I.) recorded a career-high 28 saves.

The following night, the Friars were defeated by 12th-ranked Notre Dame, 4-1. The Fighting Irish took a 1-0 lead after one period and stretched their lead to 2-0 in the second period. Bergland scored his second goal of the season near the halfway mark of the third period to cut the lead to 2-1, but less than two minutes later, the Fighting Irish scored to regain their two-goal edge (3-1). Notre Dame added an empty-net goal to seal the win.

FRIARS DRAFTED BY THE NHL... This season's PC team features three players who were selected in the NHL Entry Draft. Senior Pierce Norton (South Boston, Mass.) was a 2004 ninth-round pick, 285th overall by the Toronto Maple Leafs. Junior Mark Fayne (Sagamore Beach, Mass.) was chosen in the fifth round, 155th overall by the New Jersey Devils in the 2005 draft. Sophomore Joe Lavin (Shrewsbury, Mass.) was picked in the fifth round (126th overall) in the 2007 Draft Chicago Black Hawks.

HEAD COACH TIM ARMY... Tim Army is in his fourth season with the Friars. Army returned to his alma mater to take over the reigns of the PC hockey program on June 17, 2005 after spending three seasons with the Portland Pirates of the AHL. A 1985 graduate of the College and an East Providence native, Army became the 11th coach in the history of the program. He is the first PC alumnus to coach the team since his former coach Lou Lamoriello guided the Friars (1968-83). He also is the first former Hockey East player to be a head coach in the league. In his first season, Army led the team to a 17-16-3 overall record, including a 14-10-3 mark in Hockey East action. The 17 wins were the most by a Friar squad since 2002-03. In addition, the Friars, who were picked to finish eighth in the preseason coaches poll, recorded 14 conference victories and finished fifth in the league. The 14 Hockey East wins were one shy of tying a school record. During the 2007-08 campaign, the Friars recorded 14 wins and were ranked as high as 11th in the national polls. Among the 14 victories for the Friars, were two triumphs at Boston College, which went on to claim the national title. The Friars also posted an impressive win over defending national champion and fifth-ranked Michigan State at the Great Lakes Invitational at the Joe Louis Arena. In all, the Friars had 10 wins against ranked teams. Prior to coaching at Portland, Army spent nine seasons as an assistant coach in the NHL for two different teams. He worked for four seasons as an assistant for Friar great Ron Wilson with the Anaheim Mighty Ducks (1993-97) and five years under Wilson with the Washington Capitals (1997-02). While in Anaheim, Army was part of the 1996-97 team that earned the franchise's first ever playoff berth and advanced to the second round, where the Mighty Ducks fell to the eventual Stanley Cup Champion Detroit Red Wings. Army helped lead the Capitals to the 1998 Stanley Cup Finals, the team's only appearance in the finals.
