FRIARS TO HOST VERMONT AND NOTRE DAME... The Friars will look for their first Hockey East win of the season when they battle the Vermont Catamounts on Friday, November 7 at Schneider Arena. PC will then host No. 12 Notre Dame on Saturday, November 8.

SERIES HISTORY VS. VERMONT... In 35 all-time meetings between Vermont and Providence College, the Catamounts lead 18-15-2. Last season, the Friars posted a 2-1 record against the Catamounts, including a 4-3 overtime victory at Schneider Arena on November 9 as Jon Rheault scored the game winner with 14 seconds left in the extra session.

SERIES HISTORY VS. NOTRE DAME... Saturday's game will mark the third ever meeting between the two schools. On October 21, 2006, Notre Dame defeated PC, 6-1, at Schneider Arena. Prior to that contest, the only other meeting between the two teams was in 1999 when PC, which was then coached by Paul Pooley, defeated Notre Dame, 2-1, in the opening game of the Ice Breaker Tournament at Magness Arena in Denver, Colo.

FRIAR QUICK NOTES...

- The six goals that the Friars scored in a 6-4 win at Holy Cross were the most road goals scored by a PC team since last season when they lit the lamp six times (6-2) at Maine on November 9, 2007.
- Of the 16 PC goals this season, nine have been scored by freshmen and sophomores.
- Austin Mayer's goal against Holy Cross marked the team's first short-handed goal of the season. In 2007-08, the Friars finished tied for second nationally with nine short-handed goals.
- The Friars have scored three power-play goals this season and two have come with less than 10 seconds left in a period. John Cavanagh scored on the man advantage with one second left in the second period against Bowling Green. Daniel New also scored on the power play with seven seconds left in the first period against Holy Cross on October 25.
- Sophomore Paul Golden played his first career game for the Friars on October 25 and scored his first career goal.
- The Friars have outshot their opponents in three of the six games. Last season, PC outshot its opponents in 28 of 36 games and there were two games in which the shots were even.
- Junior co-captain John Cavanagh (Warwick, R.I.), who scored six goals in his first two years at PC, already has six goals this season.
- Freshman Matt Bergland (Faribault, Minn.) has three multiple-point games in his first three career contests.

BERGLAND OFF TO QUICK START... Freshman Matt Bergland (Faribault, Minn.) recorded one goal and two assists in a 4-3 win over Bowling Green on October 18 at Schneider Arena. His power-play goal in the third period proved to be the game winner as the Friars captured their first win of the season. The last PC freshman to record three points in one game was Kyle MacKinnon (Walnut, Calif.) who tallied two goals and one assist in a 5-3 victory over Michigan State on December 29, 2007. In addition, Bergland also totaled two assists in a win over Holy Cross on October 25 and two more assists against UMass on October 31. He leads the team in scoring with seven points (one goal, six assists) and is looking to become the first Friar freshman to lead the team in points since Rob Gaudreau did it during the 1998-99 season.

TAORMINA LOOKING TO CONTINUE TREND... Coming off his most successful season in a Friar uniform, senior defenseman Matt Taormina (Washington Township, Mich.) will look to continue the trend that made him one of the top scoring defensemen in the nation in 2007-08. Taormina, who combined for 18 points (six goals, 12 assists) in his first two seasons, finished second on the team last season with a career-high nine goals and 18 assists for 27 points last season. In addition, he was named to the All-Hockey East Second Team and to the All-New England Team. The 27 points were the most by a Friar defenseman since 2004 when Stephen Wood had 29 points en route to being named to the All-America Team. This season, Taormina has one goal and two assists for three points.

OCEAN STATE CONNECTION... The 2008-09 men's hockey team has a strong contingent of Rhode Islanders. In addition to seven players, Head Coach Tim Army (East Providence) and Assistant Coach David Berard (Coventry) also hail from the Ocean State. The Rhode Islanders on this season's team are: juniors David Cavanagh (Warwick), John Cavanagh (Warwick), and Matt Tommasiello (Cranston), sophomores Eric Baier (North Kingstown) and Austin Mayer (Providence), as well as freshmen Justin Gates (Cranston) and Shawn Tingley (North Kingstown).

FRIARS DRAFTED BY THE NHL... This season's PC team features three players who were selected in the NHL Entry Draft. Senior Pierce Norton (South Boston, Mass.) was a 2004 ninth-round pick, 285th overall by the Toronto Maple Leafs. Junior Mark Fayne (Sagamore Beach, Mass.) was chosen in the fifth round, 155th overall by the New Jersey Devils in the 2005 draft. Sophomore Joe Lavin (Shrewsbury, Mass.) was picked in the fifth round (126th overall) in the 2007 Draft Chicago Black Hawks.

SCOUTING VERMONT... The Catamounts (2-2-1, 0-2-0 Hockey East) split two games last weekend, falling to Boston University, 7-2, on November 1 and then defeating Dartmouth, 3-2, in overtime on November 2. Justin Millo scored the overtime game winner at the 2:12 mark to lead Vermont as it snapped a three-game unbeaten streak. Peter Lenex leads the team in scoring with three goals and six assists for nine points, while Colin Vock (one goal, four assists) and Dean Strong (five assists) are tied for second with five points each. In goal, Mike Spillane and Rob Madore have combined to post a 3.10 goals against average and a .884 save percentage.

SCOUTING NOTRE DAME... Notre Dame (4-3-0, 2-2-0 CCHA) is coming off a weekend sweep (3-2, 4-2) at Northern Michigan. The Fighting Irish used seven different scorers in the two games, while Jordan Pearce combined to make 43 saves. Ian Cole leads the team in scoring with seven points (three goals, four assists), while Billy Maday (three goals, three assists), Erik Kondra (two goals, four assists) and Kevin Deeth (one goal, five assists) are tied for second with six points each. Pearce has played in six of the seven games and has a 3-3-0 record, a 2.26 goals against average and a .902 save percentage.

FRIARS AGAINST CCHA OPPONENTS... Notre Dame will be the second Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) team that the Friars will play during the regular season. On October 18, the Friars earned a 4-3 victory over CCHA foe Bowling Green. Last season, the Friars posted a 1-1 record against CCHA squads as they lost to Michigan (6-0), but then defeated Michigan State (5-3) in the Great Lakes Invitational at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Mich.

FORMER FRIAR HEAD COACH RETURNS... Former PC head coach Paul Pooley, who currently serves as the Associate Head Coach at Notre Dame, returns to Schneider Arena for the second time on the opposing side. Pooley returned to Providence in 2006 as the Fighting Irish and the Friars squared off for the second time ever. Pooley ranks second among Friar coaches with 185 career wins. In 11 seasons (1994-2005), he led the Friars to a pair of trips to the NCAA Tournament and in his second season he guided PC to the 1996 Hockey East Tournament title.

HEAD COACH TIM ARMY... Tim Army is in his fourth season with the Friars. Army returned to his alma mater to take over the reigns of the PC hockey program on June 17, 2005 after spending three seasons with the Portland Pirates of the AHL. A 1985 graduate of the College and an East Providence native, Army became the 11th coach in the history of the program. He is the first PC alumnus to coach the team since his former coach Lou Lamoriello guided the Friars (1968-83). He also is the first former Hockey East player to be a head coach in the league. In his first season, Army led the team to a 17-16-3 overall record, including a 14-10-3 mark in Hockey East action. The 17 wins were the most by a Friar squad since 2002-03. In addition, the Friars, who were picked to finish eighth in the preseason coaches poll, recorded 14 conference victories and finished fifth in the league. The 14 Hockey East wins were one shy of tying a school record. During the 2007-08 campaign, the Friars recorded 14 wins and were ranked as high as 11th in the national polls. Among the 14 victories for the Friars, were two triumphs at Boston College, which went on to claim the national title. The Friars also posted an impressive win over defending national champion and fifth-ranked Michigan State at the Great Lakes Invitational at the Joe Louis Arena. In all, the Friars had 10 wins against ranked teams. Prior to coaching at Portland, Army spent nine seasons as an assistant coach in the NHL for two different teams. He worked for four seasons as an assistant for Friar great Ron Wilson with the Anaheim Mighty Ducks (1993-97) and five years under Wilson with the Washington Capitals (1997-02). While in Anaheim, Army was part of the 1996-97 team that earned the franchise's first ever playoff berth and advanced to the second round, where the Mighty Ducks fell to the eventual Stanley Cup Champion Detroit Red Wings. Army helped lead the Capitals to the 1998 Stanley Cup Finals, the team's only appearance in the finals.
