HOME GAMES IN BOLD CAPS

TONIGHT'S GAME... Tonight's contest will be the Friars' 31st game of the season and their 21st conference match.

NEXT FOR THE FRIARS... The Friars will host UMass-Lowell on February 23 for a 7:00 p.m. game.

THE PROVIDENCE/UMASS-LOWELL SERIES... Thursday's game will be the 64th meeting between the two schools. Providence leads the all-time series 31-26-6. The two teams first met on January 27, 1982 with Providence defeating UMass-Lowell, 5-3, at Schneider Arena. PC's last win against the River Hawks was a 2-1 victory on February 26, 2000 at Schneider Arena. The Friars' last loss to UMass-Lowell was a 7-2 defeat at Schneider Arena on January 28, 2000. In their last meeting the two teams skated to a 3-3 tie on January 27, 2001 at Tsongas Arena.

AT TSONGAS ARENA... PC has registered a 3-0-1 mark against UMass-Lowell at Tsongas. In PC's first three games at Tsongas Arena, the Friars earned two 5-2 wins against the River Hawks on January 17, 1999 and February 5, 1999 and a 5-3 win on February 25, 2000. In their most recent meeting, the Friars and River Hawks skated to a 3-3 tie on January 27, 2001.

THIS SEASON VS. UMASS-LOWELL... The Friars skated to a 3-3 tie at UMass-Lowell on January 27. Drew Omicioli paced the Friars' offense with one goal and two assists. Peter Zingoni recorded his first collegiate goal and dished out one assist. Senior Heath Gordon tallied the game-tying goal. Boyd Ballard stopped 31 shots for the Friars.

PC RANKED IN THE NATION... The Friars enter this weekend ranked eighth in the nation, according the USA TODAY/American Hockey Magazine poll and ninth the USCHO.com poll released on Monday, February 19. This marks the 16th consecutive week the Friars have been ranked among the top-15 in the country.

FREGOE RECORDS HAT TRICK... Peter Fregoe tallied five points, including his second hat trick of the season, as the Friars took three of four points from Boston University on February 16-17. On February 16, Fregoe assisted on Devin Rask's 17th goal of the season in PC's 4-3 victory. On February 17, he notched three power-play goals and added one assist as the Terrier and Friars skated to a 5-5 tie. Fregoe has recorded seven multiple-point games this season and 16 in his career. This season, Fregoe has recorded 13 goals and 15 assists in 30 games. Fregoe's hat trick marked the first time a Friar has tallied two hat tricks in one season since Brady Kramer notched two during the 1994-95 season.

FRIARS CAPTURE THREE POINTS...The Friars' record stands at 17-8-5 and 11-6-3 in HOCKEY EAST play after a 4-3 win over Boston University on February 16 at Schneider Arena and a 5-5 tie at Walter Brown Arena on February 17. On February 16, the Friars defeated Boston University, 4-3, at Schneider Arena. J.J Picinic tallied the game's first goal at the 2:57 mark of the first period. The Terriers tied the game on Pat Aufiero's power-play goal at 14:32. Doug Wright and Devin Rask tallied consecutive goals for PC, just 24 seconds apart to give the Friars a 3-1 lead. The Terriers fought back, but Shawn Weiman's slap shot from the point with 16:29 proved to be the game-winner for the Friars. Nolan Schaefer stopped 25 shots in the victory. On February 17, Peter Fregoe paced the Friars with his second hat trick of the season while Jay Leach added three assists as the Friars and the Terriers skated to a 5-5 tie. Freshman Regan Kelly and senior J.J. Picinic notched one goal each for PC. The Friars tallied four power-play goals in the contest. Schaefer recorded 30 saves in the tie. It marked the first time the Friars have recorded four power-play goals since their 5-1 win over Lake Superior on October 21, 2000.

RASK LEADS THE OFFENSE... Sophomore Devin Rask recorded two points in PC's 4-3 win versus Boston University on February 16. Rask tallied one goal and one assist in the victory. On February 17, Rask added one assist in a 5-5 tie versus Boston University at Walter Brown Arena. On February 10, Rask tallied the Friars' lone goal in a 3-1 loss at New Hampshire. On February 3, versus Merrimack, Rask notched the game's only goal with 2:10 remaining in the contest. The sophomore centerman tallied one goal and one assist in the Friars' victory over Northeastern on February 2. Rask has registered 10 multiple-point games this season and 14 in his career. This season, Rask has recorded 40 points (17 goals, 23 assists) in 29 games. On January 12, Rask notched one goal and three assists in a 6-2 win against Iona. On January 7, Rask tallied two goals and one assist in the squad's 8-5 win at UMass-Amherst. On January 6, Rask dished out three assists in PC's 4-0 win versus UMass-Amherst. Versus Ferris State, Rask tallied two goals and one assist in the Friars' 4-2 win on December 29. On December 2, Rask dished out four assists in PC's 7-3 win at Merrimack. On November 3, he registered his first career hat trick in PC's 5-3 win over Maine. On October 20, the sophomore center assisted on the game-winning goal in the squad's 5-0 win over Miami. On October 21, Rask recorded two goals and one assist versus Lake Superior. Rask scored both of his goals on the power play. On October 28 versus BU, Rask tallied his third goal of the season to tie the game at 3-3 with 1:33 remaining. Versus Union on October 29, Rask recorded three assists.

SCHAEFER BETWEEN THE PIPES.... Nolan Schaefer posted 1-0-1 record in two game versus Boston University on February 16-17. On February 16, Schaefer stopped 25 shots in a 4-3 win over Boston University at Schneider Arena. On February 17, the sophomore netminder stopped 30 shots in a 5-5 tie at Walter Brown Arena. On February 9, Schaefer recorded 28 saves in the Friars' 5-3 upset victory over Boston College. On February 3, Schaefer recorded his third shutout of the season, 1-0, versus Merrimack. Schaefer is now tied with former Friar Mario Proulx for the most shutouts in one season by a PC goaltender. For his efforts, he was named HOCKEY EAST Co-Defensive Player of the Week on February 5, along with teammate Boyd Ballard. For the season, he has posted a 11-5-2 record with a 2.18 goals against average and a .927 save percentage. On January 6-7, Schaefer allowed just one goal in 104 minutes of play during the Friars' weekend sweep of UMass-Amherst while posting a 0.58 goals against average and a .976 save percentage in the two games. On January 6, Schaefer recorded 23 saves as he registered his second career shutout in the team's 4-0 win at Schneider Arena. On January 7, Schaefer entered the game midway through the first period with the Friars trailing 4-0 and allowed just one goal as the squad registered an 8-5 come-from-behind win at the Mullins Center. For his efforts, Schaefer was named HOCKEY EAST Defensive Player of the Week on January 8. On November 24, Schaefer recorded 37 saves in PC's 1-1 tie versus Colorado College. On November 17, Schaefer earned his fifth win of the season with a 28-save performance in PC's 3-1 win over Northeastern. On November 10, the sophomore netminder faced 37 Wildcat shots, allowing just one goal against UNH. He also recorded his first career shutout, 8-0, versus Union on October 29. On November 30, Schaefer earned ITECH Goaltender of the Month honors. Schaefer posted a 3-1-1 record in November, with all five of his starts coming against nationally-ranked opponents.

WEIMAN NETS GAME-WINNER...On February 16, sophomore defenseman Shawn Weiman recorded his first career game-winning goal in the Friars' 4-3 win over Boston University at Schneider Arena. Weiman also added an assist in the victory. It marked Weiman's first career multiple-point game. This season, Weiman has recorded two goals and five assists in 16 games for the Friars.

KELLY CONTINUES PRODUCTION...Regan Kelly tallied one goal and two assists in the Friars' 5-5 tie at Walter Brown Arena on February 17. Kelly tallied two goals in the Friars' 4-3 win at Northeastern on February 2. It was Kelly's first career multiple-goal game. For his efforts, he was named HOCKEY EAST Rookie of the Week on February 5. This season, Kelly has recorded four goals and 16 assists in 26 games.

PC SPLITS WEEKEND SERIES WITH BC AND UNH...The Friars earned a win over No. 1 ranked Boston College (5-3) on February 9 and a loss at No. 9 New Hampshire (3-1) on February 10. On February 9, the Friars defeated top-ranked Boston College, 5-3, at Schneider Arena. The win marked the Friars' first victory over a top-ranked team since the squad defeated Boston University, 5-4, in the HOCKEY EAST Semifinals on March 3, 1996 at the FleetCenter. Versus Boston College, junior Peter Fregoe paced the Friars' offense, tallying two goals while Doug Wright added one goal and two assists. Senior Heath Gordon recorded his second-career three-point night as he dished out three assists. Shawn Weiman and Cody Loughlean each added a goal for PC. Nolan Schaefer stopped 28 shots for his 10th win of the season. On February 10 against UNH, Devin Rask tallied the game's first goal and gave the Friars a 1-0 lead after the opening 20 minutes of play. However, the Wildcats responded with three, second-period goals in their 3-1 victory. The Friars were out shot by a 30-16 margin. Boyd Ballard recorded 27 saves for PC.

LIBBY SHINES AT THE BLUE LINE... Senior Matt Libby recorded one assist in the Friars' 4-3 win over Boston University on February 16. Libby notched one goal in PC's 4-2 loss against Boston College on January 20. The Friars' captain tallied two goals in the Friars' 8-5 win over UMass-Amherst on January 7. Libby assisted on one goal in the squad's 4-0 win over UMass-Amherst on January 6. Libby registered two goals and two assists in two games at the 2000 Denver Cup on December 29-30. For his efforts, Libby was named HOCKEY EAST Defensive Player of the Week on January 2. In two games versus Merrimack, Libby backboned the Friars' penalty-killing unit that was 16-17 in man-down situations, including a perfect 10-10 in PC's 7-3 win over Merrimack on December 2. Libby also led the Friars offensively, tallying two goals and two assists on December 2. On December 1, Libby assisted on the Friars' lone goal in a 4-1 loss to the Warriors. Libby is the Friars' second leading scorer with 28 points (10 goals and 18 assists). The Friars' captain has recorded at least one point in 20 of the 30 games he has played and is the highest scoring defenseman in HOCKEY EAST play. Entering this season, Libby had recorded three goals and 13 assists in 110 games and had registered just one multiple-point game.

LEACH BREAKS RECORD...On February 10, senior Jay Leach became the Providence College all-time leader in penalty minutes. In 131 career games, Leach has been assessed 110 penalties, totaling 266 penalty minutes. Leach broke former Friar Shawn Whitham's record of 264 penalty minutes. This season, Leach has recorded three goals and 17 assists in 30 games.

WRIGHT BREAKS-OUT...Sophomore Doug Wright missed 10 games this season due to a broken hand suffered versus Maine on November 3. On February 9, the sophomore centerman recorded his first career multiple-point game in the squad's 5-3 win over Boston College and earned the ITECH No. 1 star. Wright tallied one goal and two assists in the victory. On February 16, Wright notched his third goal of the season in the Friars' 4-3 win over Boston University. This season, he has recorded three goals and eight assists in 20 games for the Friars.

BALLARD IN NET...On February 10, Boyd Ballard stopped 27 shots in a 3-1 loss at New Hampshire. On February 3, he stopped career-high 43 shots in the Friars' 4-3 win at Northeastern and was named HOCKEY EAST Co-Defensive Player of the Week along with teammate Nolan Schaefer. On January 27, Ballard stopped 31 shots in the Friars 3-3 tie at UMass-Lowell. On January 12, Ballard stopped 14 shots in the Friars' 2-1 win over Holy Cross. On December 29, Ballard stopped 29 shots in PC's 4-2 win over Ferris State. On December 2, Boyd Ballard recorded 29 saves in the Friars' 7-3 victory at Merrimack. This season, Ballard has appeared in 13 games, posting a 6-3-3 record with a 2.81 goals against average and a .907 save percentage. On October 20, Ballard stopped 30 shots in PC's 5-0 win over Miami. PC's 5-0 win versus Miami was Ballard's fourth career shutout, ranking him second all-time in shutouts at Providence College. On November 20, Ballard paced the Friars to a 4-2 win over then 10th-ranked Northeastern.

BALLARD'S CAREER...Senior goaltender Boyd Ballard has appeared in 94 career games for the Friars and ranks fourth all-time at Providence in games played by a goaltender, one game behind former Friar Bill Milner '79. In Ballard's 94 games he has recorded 2,428 saves placing him fifth all-time in saves at PC.

PC SIGNS FOUR RECRUITS...The PC men's hockey team has four recruits committed for the 2001-02 season. Derek Allan is a 6-foot-1-inch, 190-pound, forward from Davidson, Saskatchewan. Allan plays for the Nipawin Hawks of the SJHL. Chris Chaput is a 5-foot-10-inch, 180-pound, forward from Pawtucket, R.I. Chaput is a former Mount St. Charles standout and is currently playing for the New England Coyotes of the EJHL. Eric Lundberg is a 6-foot-2-inch, 195 pound, defenseman from Vernon, Conn. Lundberg is playing for the New England Coyotes of the EJHL. Jeff Mason a 5-foot-11-inch, 180 pound, defenseman from Easthampton, Mass. Mason is also playing for the Coyotes.

HEAD COACH PAUL POOLEY... Is the 10th coach in the history of Providence College Hockey. Since 1994, Pooley has compiled an 120-113-21 record and brought the Friars to two HOCKEY EAST Finals and one NCAA Tournament appearance. In 1994-95, Pooley became the first head coach to bring a team to the HOCKEY EAST Championship Game in his inaugural season behind the bench. In 1995-96 he guide the Friars to their second HOCKEY EAST title and first since 1985. Pooley also led the team to its eighth appearance in the NCAA Tournament. He came to PC after spending three years as an assistant coach at Lake Superior State University (1991-94). Pooley began his coaching career at his alma-mater, Ohio State, where he served as an assistant to Jerry Welsh from 1988-91.

DRAFTEES... Last June, PC had five players selected in the 2000 NHL Entry Draft. Providence had more players drafted than any other school in HOCKEY EAST and only the University of Minnesota (nine players) had more collegians selected in this year's draft. Sophomore right wing Jon DiSalvatore was selected in the fourth round (104th pick) by the San Jose Sharks and sophomore goaltender Nolan Schaefer was selected in the fifth round (166th overall) by the San Jose Sharks. Freshman Peter Zingoni, Jason Platt and Regan Kelly were all selected in the eighth round. Zingoni (231st pick) by the Columbus Blue Jack-ets, Platt (247th pick) by the Edmonton Oilers and Kelly (259th pick) by the Philadelphia Flyers. PC now has seven players on its roster drafted by NHL teams.

DISALVATORE COMPETES FOR US JUNIOR NATIONAL TEAM... Sophomore right wing Jon DiSalvatore was named to the US Junior National Team on December 5. The U.S. National Junior Team placed fifth at the 2001 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship on December 26, 2000 - January 5, 2001 in Moscow and other cities in Russia. The tournament featured the world's top players under 20 years old. DiSalvatore was the first Friar to compete for the U.S. National Junior Team since defenseman Jay Leach played for the 1998 squad in Helsinki, Finland. DiSalvatore's six goals tied him for the team lead with Minnesota's Jeff Taffe and his nine points also tied him for the team lead with Michigan's Andy Hilbert. He was the tied for second in the tournament in goals scored and total points. This season, DiSalvatore has tallied seven goals and 15 assists in 26 games. He has registered seven multiple-point games and one multiple-goal contest. In his two seasons at Providence, he has recorded 15 multiple-point games. He added two assists in PC's 3-1 win over Northeastern on November 17. On December 2, he notched one goal and two assists in PC's 7-3 win over Merrimack. DiSalvatore was the Friars' fourth leading scorer last season, notching 15 goals and 12 assists in 38 games. DiSalvatore also led the team in plus/minus rating of nine during the 1999-00 season.
