WHO, WHEN, WHERE... The Providence College men's lacrosse team has earned the right to participate in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) Championship at Marist College in Poughkeepsie, N.Y. on May 2-4. The Friars enter the four-team tournament as the No. 2 seed and will face No. 3 seed St. Joseph's (Pa.) on Friday, May 2 at 7:30 p.m.

THAT'S A WRAP... The Friars concluded their regular-season schedule Saturday, April 26 with a 9-3 victory over St. Joseph's in Providence, R.I. The win helped PC capture a first-place tie in the regular-season MAAC standings and the No. 2 seed in the MAAC Championship Tournament. PC's finish in the MAAC is the highest since joining the Conference in 1996. Joining Providence in first place is Mount St. Mary's, who earned the regular-season MAAC Title by virtue of a head-to-head victory (14-11) over the Friars on April 14. The Friars enter the MAAC Championship Tournament with a 7-8 overall record and a 7-1 mark in the MAAC.

FRIARS ALL-TIME IN MAAC TOURNAMENT ACTION... The Friars are making their third-straight trip to the MAAC Championship Tournament under Head Coach Chris Burdick. The Friars hold a 0-2 record in MAAC Tournament games, as they have been eliminated in the semifinals of the tournament in each of the previous two seasons. In 2001, PC was ousted by Quinnipiac, 13-2. In 2002, the Friars fell to Mount St. Mary's, 7-6, in overtime.

PROVIDENCE ALL-TIME VERSUS ST. JOSEPH'S... Providence and St. Joseph's have met seven times in the 24-year history of the Friar men's lacrosse program, and eight year

affiliation with the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC). The Hawks lead the all-time series versus Providence, 4-3. The Friars, however, have won each of the last three meetings, including a 9-3 victory in the most recent game on April 26. The last time St. Joseph's defeated Providence was during the 2000 season. The Hawks earned a 15-9 victory that year in Philadelphia, Pa.

HEAD COACH CHRIS BURDICK ALL-TIME VERSUS ST. JOSEPH'S... Providence College Head Coach Chris Burdick owns a 3-2 all-time record in games played against St. Joseph's.

SCOUTING THE FRIARS... Providence College enters Friday's MAAC semifinal game versus St. Joseph's with a 7-8 overall record and a 7-1 mark in the MAAC. The Friars finished the regular season in a first-place tie with Mount St. Mary's in the MAAC standings, and earned the No. 2 seed in the MAAC Championship Tournament. Mount St. Mary's claimed the No. 1 seed and regular-season title by virtue of a head-to-head win (14-11) over the Friars on April 14. Sophomore John Hollister (Longmeadow, Mass.) leads Providence with 25 points on 13 goals and 12 assists. Senior Jon Meehan (Peabody, Mass.) is second on the team in scoring with 22 points on a team-leading 15 goals and seven assists. Junior David Krasnica (Mendham, N.J.) and senior Skip Dunphy (Manhasset, N.Y.) also have scored 20 points or more this season for the Friar offense. Krasnica has nine goals and 12 assists for 21 points, while Dunphy has scored 10 goals and registered 10 assists for 20 points. Sophomore Andrew McMinn (Pittsburgh, Pa.) has played 832 minutes in goal for PC. He currently leads all MAAC goaltenders with a 6.56 goals against average and a .630 save percentage. McMinn has been sensational versus MAAC opponents, allowing just 40 goals and recording 80 saves in eight games for a 4.99 goals against average and a .667 save percentage. Providence recently defeated St. Joseph's, 9-3, on April 26 in Providence, R.I. to close out the 2003 regular-season schedule.

HEAD COACH CHRIS BURDICK... Chris Burdick is in the midst of his fifth season as head coach of the Providence College men's lacrosse team. During his tenure, the Friars have established themselves as a dominant force in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC). The Friars are making their third-straight trip to the MAAC Championship Tournament under Burdick. In each of his five seasons at the helm, PC has increased its winning percentage in MAAC play. During 2003, PC earned its highest finish in the MAAC standings (tied for first) in the program's eight-year affiliation with the league. Burdick began his coaching career at Providence in 1999. The Friars finished 2-6 (.250) in league play (5-10 overall). In 2000, Providence finished 5-10 overall and 4-5 (.444) in the MAAC. In 2001, the Friars made their first appearance in the MAAC Championship Tournament with a 5-4 (.556) league record (7-9 overall). Last year, the Friars returned to the MAAC Tournament as the No. 2 seed after compiling a 5-2 mark in league play and a 9-7 overall record. The 2002 campaign marked PC's first winning season since 1988. This season, Providence enters the tournament with a 7-1 (.875) mark in the MAAC (7-8 overall). The Friars' seven wins in conference play are the most ever for PC in the MAAC. Burdick's all-time coaching record currently stands at 33-44 overall and 23-18 in the MAAC.

SEVEN CONFERENCE WINS ARE TOPS... PC's seven victories in Conference action during the 2003 season are the most ever by any Friar team in the eight-year affiliation with the MAAC.

THE FRIARS VERSUS THE REST OF THE TOURNAMENT FIELD... In 2003, Providence's only loss in Conference play was to No. 1 seed Mount St. Mary's, 14-11, on April 14 in Providence, R.I. The Friars defeated No. 4 seed Canisius, 5-4, in overtime on March 31 in Providence, R.I. Providence enters the MAAC Tournament with a 2-1 record versus this year's participants.

FRIARS RANKED NATIONALLY IN SCORING DEFENSE... The Providence College men's lacrosse team is ranked fourth among all NCAA Division I institutions in scoring defense (6.87). In 15 games, PC has allowed just 103 goals (6.87 goals against per game). Vermont leads the nation in scoring defense allowing just 5.85 goals per game in 13 contests (76 total goals).

PLAYERS TO WATCH

HOLLISTER LEADS FRIARS IN SCORING... Sophomore, first-year player, John Hollister (Longmeadow, Mass.) leads the Friars in scoring with 25 points, is tied for the team lead in assists (12) and is tied for second in goals scored (12). He has recorded 35 groundballs, which is currently fourth-best on the team. Prior to his arrival at Providence College, Hollister was a three-year letterwinner and senior captain on the lacrosse team at Longmeadow High School. He was a First-Team All-Western Massachusetts selection in his final two seasons at Longmeadow, and earned All-America honors as a senior.

DUNPHY LEAVES HIS MARK AS ONE OF THE PROGRAM'S MOST PROLIFIC SCORERS... Senior midfielder Skip Dunphy (Manhasset, N.Y.) missed six games during the 2003 season with fractured shoulder blade, but managed to finish the regular season ranked fourth on the team in scoring. Dunphy tallied 10 goals and 10 assists for 20 points. In his four-year career at Providence, Dunphy has amassed 63 goals and 50 assists for a total of 113 career points. His 63 goals and 50 assists rank him 15th and 10th (tied), respectively, all-time at Providence, while his 113 points move him into 11th all-time in career scoring. Dunphy's latest move in the rankings among all-time scoring leaders helped him to pass the Friar's current Volunteer Assistant Coach, Kyle Ojakian. Ojakian is a 2002 graduate, who had recorded 110 career points for the Friars before joining the PC staff in 2003. Dunphy became the 17th player in program history to reach the 100-point plateau.

McMINN RANKED NATIONALLY IN GOALKEEPING STATS... Sophomore goaltender Andrew McMinn (Pittsburgh, Pa.) finished the regular season with a 7-6 overall record and a 7-1 mark in the MAAC. He topped the MAAC in save percentage (.630) and goals against average (6.86). He was sensational versus MAAC opponents, allowing just 40 goals and recording 80 saves in eight games for a 4.99 goals against average and a .667 save percentage. According to the latest NCAA Division I statistical release distributed on April 29, 2003, McMinn ranks fourth among all Division I goaltenders in goals against average and fifth in save percentage.

FACE VALUE... Sophomore midfielder Mark Rotella (Smithtown, N.Y.) is the Friars' primary face-off man for the second-straight season. In 2003, Rotella has won 77 of 162 face-off opportunities and holds a .475 face-off percentage. As a freshman in 2002, he won 137 out of 250 opportunities for a .548 face-off percentage. Rotella's career face-off percentage currently stands at .519. Rotella also recorded the first point of his career with an assist versus Manhattan on April 16.

O'RORKE LEADS THE DEFENSE... Junior long-stick defender Brian O'Rorke (Montclair, N.J.) entered the 2003 men's lacrosse season with several preseason honors. He was named *Face-Off Magazine* Preseason Conference Player to Watch and Honorable Mention All-American. In 2001, O'Rorke was named MAAC Rookie of the Year and in 2002 he earned All-MAAC First-Team honors and was tabbed Co-Defensive Player of the Year. Standing at 6-3 and weighing a solid 240 pounds, he is a dominant force in the Friars' defensive unit. Known as the teams "best take-away man", he has recorded 33 groundballs in 12 games during the 2003 season. In his three-years with the Friars he has a current total of 118 groundballs in his career.

MEEHAN HAS SOLID SENIOR CAMPAIGN... Senior attack Jon Meehan (Peabody, Mass.) is currently ranked second on the team in scoring with 22 points on 15 goals and seven assists. He leads the team in shots

attempted with 57. In his four-year career he has amassed 66 points on 45 goals and 21 assists. In 2001, Meehan was selected to the MAAC Championship All-Tournament Team.

KRASNICA FINISHES STRONG IN REGULAR SEASON... Junior David Krasnica (Mendham, N.J.) finishes the regular season third on the team in scoring with 21 points on nine goals and 12 assists. In the Friars' regular-season finale versus St. Joseph's, Krasnica lit up the Hawks for a single-game career high of five points on two goals and three assists. For his efforts, he earned MAAC Offensive Player of the Week honors on April 28. Krasnica marks the only Offensive Player of the Week honoree from Providence during the 2003 season. Krasnica is in the midst of his second season with the Friars and has recorded 15 goals, 18 assists and 33 points in his career.
