### PROVIDENCE TO FACE CONNECTICUT

The Providence College men's soccer team will look to extend its unbeaten streak to four games when it travels to the University of Connecticut for a BIG EAST Conference match on Tuesday, October 6 at 7:00 p.m. at Morrone Stadium in Storrs, Conn.

### PROVIDENCE QUICK NOTES

- The Friars have posted a 2-0-1 record in their last three matches.
- PC's 3-0 victory over Pittsburgh on Saturday marked the best offensive output for the Friars this season. The Friars, who had not scored more than one goal in a game, scored twice in the first 14 minutes of the match against the Panthers.
- Sophomore Daniel Fabian (Southbury, Conn.) scored a career-high two goals against Pitt, while Andrew Sousa (Fall River, Mass.) scored the first goal of the match to lead the Friars.
- The win was the first road BIG EAST victory of the season for the Friars. Overall, Providence is 2-3 in road matches this season.
- PC goalkeeper Tim Murray (Haverhill, Mass.) has not allowed a goal in the last 376:16.
- Senior Tim Ritter (Weston, Mass.) leads the team in scoring with three goals, all of which have been game winners.
- Providence has a 3-0-1 record at home this season and has yet to allow a goal at Glax Field. Following the match at UConn, Providence will play five-consecutive home games.

### SERIES HISTORY VERSUS UCONN

In 34 all-time meetings against the Huskies, the Friars have a 4-28-2 record. Last season, the Friars posted a 1-0 win over the Huskies as Matt Marcin (Wilmington, Del.) scored the lone goal of the match. Prior to last season, Providence's previous victory over UConn was on September 10, 1997, a 2-1 overtime triumph in Providence. PC is seeking its first win in Storrs, Conn. since October 24, 1984. In 2005, the Huskies rallied to defeat the Friars, 3-2, in overtime at Morrone Stadium. Tim Ritter (Weston, Mass.) scored twice for the Friars, but it was not enough as PC suffered its first defeat of the season after going unbeaten in its first nine matches.

### SCOUTING UCONN

No. 22 UConn sits atop the BIG EAST Blue Division standings after defeating No. 13 Georgetown, 1-0, on Saturday, October 3 to claim its third-consecutive victory. Tony Cascio scored the lone goal of the match in the 56th minute to lead the Huskies, who outshot the Hoyas, 15-6. Cascio leads the team in scoring with three goals and two assists, while Alan Ponce is second with two goals and two assists. In goal, Josh Ford has played in all nine matches and has allowed just six goals. He also has a 0.63 goals against average and six shutouts.

### FRIARS ON THE ROAD

The Friars have posted a 2-3 record on the road this season, including a 1-2 mark in BIG EAST Conference road matches. The Friars opened the regular season with a 1-0 double overtime victory at Sacred Heart. Providence then was defeated in its next three road matches, including a 3-0 loss at No. 14 Boston University on September 7. PC then captured its first BIG EAST road win on Saturday, October 3 with a 3-0 triumph at Pittsburgh.

### RITTER MOVING UP THE PROVIDENCE SCORING CHART

Senior Tim Ritter (Weston, Mass.) has 17 goals and 14 assists for 49 career points at Providence College. The 49 points ranks ninth all-time at Providence behind former Friar All-American Ryan Maduro '09 who finished his career with 50 points (14 goals, 22 assists). This season, Ritter leads the Friars in scoring with three goals and six points.

### MURRAY RACKING UP THE SHUTOUTS

Providence goalkeeper Tim Murray (Haverhill, Mass.) has recorded six shutouts in nine games this season. He has allowed just six goals this season and has a 0.62 goals against average. In addition, Murray has 24 career shutouts, which is a Providence College record.

### FRIARS DEFEAT PITTSBURGH

Providence scored twice early in the first half and defeated Pittsburgh, 3-0, on Saturday, October 3 in a BIG EAST Conference match at Founders Field in Indianola, Pa. With the win, the Friars improved to 5-3-1 overall and 2-2-1 in the BIG EAST. The Friars needed only 4:31 to take a 1-0 lead as junior Andrew Sousa (Fall River, Mass.) scored his first goal of the season. Less than 10 minutes later, Providence added to its lead when sophomore Daniel Fabian (Southbury, Conn.) scored the first of his two goals on the afternoon in the 14th minute as junior Matt Marcini (Wilmington, Del.) assisted on the goal. Fabian sealed the win for the Friars in the 82nd minute when he scored from five yards out off a rebound. Senior Sean Bakhtiari (Hampstead, N.H.) assisted on the goal as he recorded his first career point. The three goals is the highest scoring output for the Friars since November 1, 2008 when they scored three times in a 3-0 victory over Pittsburgh at PC's Glay Field. Goalkeeper Tim Murray (Haverhill, Mass.) added to his shutout total as he made three saves to pick up his sixth clean sheet this season and the 24th of his career. Murray has not allowed a goal in the last 376:16.

### PROVIDENCE AGAINST RANKED TEAMS

The Friars have posted a 0-1-1 record against ranked teams this season. On September 7, the Friars were defeated at No. 14 Boston University, 3-0. The Friars also tied No. 18 St. John's on September 27. Last season, the Friars posted a 3-5 record against ranked teams, including a 1-0 victory against fourth-ranked Boston College.

### CONNECTICUT CONNECTION

Two members of the Providence College men's soccer team hail from the state of Connecticut. Nick Cianci (West Hartford) and Daniel Fabian (Southbury) have been key contributors for the Friars this season. Cianci has started all nine matches and has one goal and one assist. Last season, Cianci played in four matches and scored one goal before sustaining a season-ending injury. Fabian played in 12 matches last season and scored one goal. This season, Fabian has two goals, both coming in a 3-0 win at Pittsburgh on Saturday.

### BIG EAST WEEKLY HONORS

Three Friars have earned BIG EAST weekly honors this season. On September 7, Tim Ritter was named Offensive Player of the Week, while Tim Murray was named to the honor roll. Murray also was named to the honor roll on September 28. Most recently, Fabian was named to the honor roll on October 5.

• Head Coach • 10th Season • Providence College, 1996

**AS PROVIDENCE HEAD COACH**

- Chaka Daley is entering his 10th season as head coach of the Providence men's soccer program.
- Daley, who was appointed the third head coach in the history of the program just prior to the start of 2000 season, has led the Friars to the NCAA Tournament three times during the last four years.
- In 2008, Providence finished with a 9-7-3 overall record, advanced to the BIG EAST Quarterfinals, but fell just short of a fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament berth.
- The Friars posted victories over three ranked teams, including No. 10 Connecticut. It marked PC's first win over UConn since 1997. The Friars, who were ranked as high as 17th nationally, recorded their fourth-consecutive winning season for the first time since 1984-87.
- In 2007, the Friars finished with a 9-8-2 overall record and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the fourth time in school history.
- In addition, the Friars posted a 5-4-2 record in the BIG EAST. It marked the first time ever that the Friars enjoyed back-to-back winning seasons in the league. Among the big wins was a 1-0 result at Boston College, which was the top overall seed in the NCAA Tournament.
- In 2006, Daley led the Friars to another remarkable season. PC posted a 13-7 overall record, including a 7-4 mark in league play. The seven BIG EAST wins set a school record, while the 13 overall victories were one shy of a school mark (14 set in 1984). The Friars were ranked in the national polls for six-consecutive weeks.
- PC defeated Rutgers for the first time in school history and recorded its first win over Brown since 1993.
- The Friars advanced to the BIG EAST Tournament, where they hosted Louisville in the first round. PC defeated Louisville, 2-0, then posted a 2-0 win at Cincinnati in the quarterfinals and advanced to the BIG EAST Semifinals for the third time in four seasons.
- Daley also coached Ryan Maduro, who was selected to the NSCAA Division I All-America First Team, thus becoming the second Friar to be named to the All-America First Team in the 40-year history of the program. Daley also coached three players who earned All-BIG EAST honors, a first in the program's history.
- In 2005, he guided his team to one of the most impressive seasons in the history of Friar soccer as the squad advanced to the second round of the

NCAA Tournament. The Friars registered a 7-4-9 mark and recorded one of the most improved records in NCAA history. The Friars finished 9.5 games better than the 2004 season, which tied the team for the 10th best turnaround in NCAA history. The team started the season with a nine-game unbeaten streak (4-0-5), which was the longest by a PC team since the 1972 team was undefeated through 10 games.

- Daley's team finished with a regular season record of 5-3-7, which included 3-3-4 mark in league play. He also led the Friars to their first win in BIG EAST Tournament play since 1984 with a 2-1 victory at Cincinnati on November 2, 2005 in the First Round. Daley then led the Friars back to the BIG EAST Semifinals for the second time in three years as they earned a 2-2 tie at No. 21 Seton Hall and advanced when they won the penalty kick shootout, 4-2. In the semifinals, the PC earned a 0-0 tie against 16th-ranked USF, but were defeated in the penalty kick shootout, 3-2.
- On November 14, it was announced that the Friars had been selected to participate in the 2005 NCAA Tournament. It marked the first time since 1983 and just the second time ever that the Friars advanced to the NCAA Tournament. Daley continued to lead the Friars to new heights as they earned their first NCAA Tournament win ever when they defeated 13th-ranked Hofstra, 1-0, in overtime in the First Round on November 18. The Friars magical season came to an end when they were defeated in the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament at No. 2 North Carolina, 2-0, on November 22.
- In recognition of his strong coaching performance, Daley earned the NSCAA Division I New England Coach of the Year honors and was one of eight finalists for the NSCAA/Adidas National Coach of the Year accolades.
- In 2003, Daley led his team to one of its best finishes as the team placed seventh of 13 teams during the regular season and advanced to the BIG EAST Semifinals for the first time since 1987. In the opening game of the BIG EAST Tournament, the Friars posted a dramatic come-from-behind, 2-2, tie with 23rd-ranked Virginia Tech. The Friars then defeated the Hokies in a penalty kick shootout to advance to the league Semifinals where they lost, 1-0, to eventual BIG EAST Champions, Notre Dame.
- Daley's 2002 squad posted a 7-11-0 overall record and a 5-5-0 mark in league play which was good for a seventh place tie in the league standings and a spot in the BIG EAST Tournament for the first time since 1998. The five BIG EAST wins marked a personal-high for Daley.

**AS PROVIDENCE ASSISTANT COACH**

- Daley replaced former Friar Head Coach Brian Ainscough, who led the rebuilding effort at Providence for five seasons. Daley served as Ainscough's top assistant for four seasons. During his time as an assistant to Ainscough, Daley handled a variety of duties for the Friars, including assisting with the team's defense and overseeing a number of administrative duties.
- A 1996 graduate of Providence, Daley brought solid credentials to the head coaching position. Besides being credited with helping turn around the Friar program as an assistant coach, Daley earned four varsity letters while playing for the black and white. He is one of the top players to ever play at Providence.

**AS PROVIDENCE STUDENT-ATHLETE**

- He began his playing career with the Friars as a defender. Daley played his second and third seasons at the forward position before being shifted to defense again as a senior by Ainscough. Throughout his career, Daley recorded nine goals and six assists in 69 games.

**PROFESSIONAL PLAYING EXPERIENCE**

- Daley, a native of Toronto, Ontario, played professional soccer after graduating from Providence.
- On June 14, 1999, he signed with the New England Revolution, becoming the first former-Friar to play in the MLS. Prior to signing with the Revolution, Daley played for the Revolution's A-League affiliate, the Boston Bulldogs.
- He also spent one season with the Rhode Island Stingrays of the USL from 1996-97.
