FRIARS TRAVEL TO UC SANTA BARBARA FOR SECOND ROUND MATCH

After a 1-0 victory over Dartmouth on Thursday in the NCAA Championship First Round, Providence will travel to face UC Santa Barbara on Sunday, November 20 in the second round. Game time is set for 8:00 p.m. EST. It will mark the first ever meeting between the two schools.

FRIARS EARN NCAA TOURNAMENT AT-LARGE BID

Providence earned its sixth overall NCAA Tournament berth and the fifth in the last seven seasons under Head Coach Chaka Daley. In 2010, the Friars hosted their first ever NCAA Tournament match at Glay Field and defeated Saint Peter's, 6-2, on November 18. With the win, Providence advanced to the second round for the second time in school history. The Friars also earned NCAA Tournament berths in 2005, 2006 and 2007. Prior to 2005, PC had not made the NCAA Tournament since 1983.

PROVIDENCE HISTORY IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Friars have a 3-5 all-time record in six NCAA Tournament appearances, including Thursday's win over Dartmouth. Providence posted its first ever NCAA Tournament win in 2005 (1-0 in overtime at Hofstra). Last season, the Friars defeated Saint Peter's, 6-2, in the First Round, before falling, 2-1, at Ohio State.

WHAT'S NEXT

The winner of Sunday's match will face the winner of the Creighton/Northern Illinois game on Sunday, November 27.

FRIAR QUICK NOTES

- Providence is in the midst of its seventh consecutive winning season, a feat that has not been accomplished since 1981-87.
- The Friars closed out the regular season by winning four of their last five matches, including three straight BIG EAST road victories.
- Three of the five Friar BIG EAST wins were away from home.
- Of the 26 goals scored by the Friars this season, 14 have come in the second half and one in overtime.
- Providence has played against three teams (Creighton, UConn, USF) ranked in the top five of the RPI rankings.
- Marcos Ugarte (Providence, R.I.) is tied for the team lead with 15 points (six goals, three assists). He can become the first Friar freshman to lead the team in scoring since Jonathan Medcalf (14 points on seven goals) in 2006.

RECAP OF FIRST ROUND MATCH VERSUS DARTMOUTH

Senior John Raley (St. Inigoes, Md.) scored the lone goal of the match early in the first half to lead Providence past Dartmouth, 1-0, Thursday afternoon at Glay Field. It marked the second consecutive season that Providence hosted and won an NCAA Tournament match. Raley scored his second goal of the season in the 11th minute to account for the lone goal of the match. Junior Marc Cintron (Piscataway, N.J.) played a cross from the right flank to sophomore Greg Davis (Jamaica, N.Y.), who tried to head the ball toward goal. However, Davis' header deflected backwards to Raley, who volleyed a low left-footed shot from 15 yards out into the right corner. Senior goalkeeper Jhojan Obando (Kissimmee, Fla.) finished with two saves as he earned his career-high seventh shutout of the season.

SCOUTING UC SANTA BARBARA

UC Santa Barbara, which earned a first round bye as the No. 15 seed, has not played since Saturday, November 12 when it was defeated at UC Irvine, 3-2, in the Big West Tournament Championship match. Prior to that loss, UCSB had won five consecutive games. The Gauchos, who have made 10 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, are led by seniors Luis Silva and James Kiffe, who were named the Big West Conference's Midfielder and Defender of the Year, respectively. Silva has 16 goals and nine assists for 41 points to lead the team, while Kiffe is fifth with 10 points (2 g, 6 a). In goal, Andre Grandt has played in all 21 matches and has a 1.33 goals against average to go along with eight shutouts.

AGAINST COMMON OPPONENTS

Providence and UC Santa Barbara have had one common opponent this season. The Friars defeated West Virginia, 2-1, on October 21 in Morgantown, W.Va. The Gauchos recorded a 2-0 home victory over the Mountaineers on September 9.

FRIARS ON THE ROAD

Providence has a 5-4-1 road record, including a 3-1-1 mark in conference matches away from home. The Friars won three consecutive BIG EAST road games to finish the regular season, including a 2-1 triumph at No. 19 Georgetown on October 29 in the regular season finale.

SEVEN BIG EAST TEAMS EARN NCAA TOURNAMENT BERTHS

The BIG EAST Conference has seven teams in the NCAA Tournament, the most of any conference. St. John's earned the automatic berth. In addition, Connecticut, USF, Louisville, Providence, West Virginia and Rutgers earned at-large bids. The BIG EAST had four teams selected in the top 16: No. 3 seed Connecticut, No. 7 seed USF, No. 9 seed St. John's and No. 12 seed Louisville. The ACC has six teams in the field, while the Colonial Athletic Association and Conference USA each placed four teams in the field. The Atlantic 10, Big South, Big Ten, Big West, Ivy, Mid-American, Missouri Valley, Mountain Pacific and Southern conferences all have two teams in the tournament.

TWO FRIARS EARN BIG EAST HONORS

Junior Marc Cintron (Piscataway, N.J.) was named to the All-BIG EAST Third Team and freshman Marcos Ugarte (Providence, R.I.) earned All-BIG EAST Rookie Team honors on November 10. It marked the first time that Cintron earned an All-BIG EAST honor, while Ugarte became the first Friar to be named to the All-Rookie Team since Kempes Corbally in 1998. In nine BIG EAST Conference games, Cintron finished third on the team in scoring with nine points on three goals and three assists. Ugarte led the Friars in scoring with 15 points, all of which were in league matches. His six goals ranked tied for second in league games, while his 15 points were the third highest mark. Ugarte also led the Friars with three game-winning goals, including a two-goal performance versus Cincinnati on September 24.

FRESHMAN CLASS MAKING IMPACT

The Friar freshman class has made a strong impact on this season's team. Four rookies are regular starters, including Marcos Ugarte who is tied for the team lead in scoring with 15 points and six goals. In addition, Jimmy Petrucci (Brentwood, N.H.) has one goal and three assists for five points. Brandon Adler (Montville, N.J.) has started every match at center back, Fazal Nabi (Portland, Maine) has started 15 games at midfield and Thomas Ballenthin (Lexington, Mass.) has 15 starts at left back.

OBANDO LEADING THE WAY IN GOAL

Providence senior goalkeeper Jhojan Obando (Kissimmee, Fla.) has started all 19 matches and has a 1.23 goals against average and seven shutouts. His seven shutouts ranks tied for sixth in the BIG EAST. The

co-captain had a stretch this season in which he recorded four consecutive clean sheets. In addition, he had a streak in which he didn't allow a goal in a span of 429:01. He was named BIG EAST Goalkeeper of the Week on September 5 and was named to the Soccer America Team of the Week on September 7.

NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE

Providence finished its regular season non-conference schedule with a 5-3-0 record. The non-conference schedule featured two ranked opponents (No. 3 Creighton and No. 11 Brown).

CINTRON NOTCHES CAREER HIGH

Junior Marc Cintron scored a career-high two goals to lead Providence past West Virginia, 2-1, on October 21 in a match that aired live on Fox Soccer Channel. Cintron, who missed the first five games, has three goals and two assists over the last seven games. He ranks third on the team with 10 points on a career-high three goals and four assists. Last season, Cintron finished second on the team in scoring with 14 points (two goals and 10 assists).

BIG EAST LEADERS

In nine BIG EAST Conference matches, Providence finished tied for second in the league with 17 goals, tied for first with 18 assists and tied for second with 52 points. All 15 of Marcos Ugarte's points (six goals, three assists) were in conference play. Sophomore Greg Davis (Jamaica, N.Y.) had five goals and two assists for 12 points in league action. Ugarte was third in league games with 15 points and tied for second with six goals. Davis finished tied for fifth in points and tied for fifth in goals scored.

BIG EAST WEEKLY HONORS

Four Providence players have earned BIG EAST Weekly honors this season. Jhojan Obando was named Goalkeeper of the Week (9/5), while Marcos Ugarte and sophomore Wilder Arboleda (Pawtucket, R.I.) have each earned BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Week honors. Ugarte earned the honor on September 26, while Arboleda's accolade came on September 12. Most recently, Marc Cintron also was tabbed as BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Week on October 24.

FRIARS SCORE SIX TIMES

The six goals scored by the Friars on October 15 in a 6-1 win over Seton Hall were the most by a Providence team since last season's squad scored six times in the NCAA Championship First Round (a 6-2 victory over Saint Peter's). In addition, it is the most goals by Providence in a regular season game since 1987.

DAVIS SCORES HAT TRICK

Greg Davis recorded his first career hat trick on October 15 against Seton Hall. Davis is the first Friar to score three goals in a match since Eoin Lynch did it on September 2, 2005 as Providence defeated Maine, 4-1.

FRIARS AT HOME

Providence has a 6-3 record at home this season and has outscored opponents, 16-8, at Glay Field. The Friars had a stretch (Sep. 2 - Sep. 24) when they recorded four consecutive home shutout wins.

PROVIDENCE IN THE POLLS

The Friars have been ranked in three national polls this season. Providence spent five consecutive weeks (9/6 - 10/11) in the College Soccer News national poll. The Friars also were ranked 25th in the Soccer America poll on 9/14. On November 1, Providence was No. 25 in the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) poll and No. 23 in the Soccer America Poll. It marked the first time since November 16, 2010 that Providence had been ranked in the NSCAA poll.

FRIARS AGAINST RANKED TEAMS

The Friars have played against six nationally ranked teams this season, including two squads in the top three. Five of the six games against ranked teams have been on the road. Providence is 2-3-1 against ranked opponents. PC posted a home win over No. 11 Brown, before being defeated on the road against No. 3 Creighton. On October 1, the Friars also tied No. 13 USF, 1-1, in double overtime in Tampa, Fla. Providence then dropped a close match at No. 1 UConn, 2-1, on October 12. On October 29, the Friars won at No. 19 Georgetown, 2-1. Most recently, No. 15 Louisville defeated Providence, 5-0, on November 3.

Chaka Daley, who is entering his 12th season as the head coach of the Providence College men's soccer program, continues to build the Friars into a perennial BIG EAST and national power.

Daley, who was appointed the third head coach in the history of the program on July 18, 2000, has led the Friars to the NCAA Tournament four times in the last six years. In addition, over the six-year span, Providence has reached the BIG EAST Championship semifinals four times, including a trip to the championship match in 2010.

Daley's 2010 team made an impressive run towards the latter half of the season and enjoyed one of the most successful campaigns in school history. The Friars reeled off seven consecutive wins and were unbeaten in 10 matches (8-0-2) for the first time since 1984. Providence earned a berth in the BIG EAST Tournament and notched road victories at Villanova and at No. 1 seed Georgetown to advance to the semifinals. In the semis, the Friars defeated Cincinnati and earned a spot in the championship match for the second time in school history. The Friars tied the No. 1 ranked team in the nation, Louisville, 1-1, in double overtime, however, the Cardinals claimed the title with a 3-2 shootout win.

Providence received an at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament and hosted an NCAA game at Glay Field for the first time in school history. The Friars defeated Saint Peter's, 6-2, to earn their second ever trip to the second round. However, the Friars were defeated, 2-1, at Ohio State and ended the season with a 13-6-3 mark. The 13 wins fell just one short of equalling a school record for most wins (14). The Friars, who finished with an RPI ranking of 19, tallied 33 goals, the most scored in one season since 1985. In addition, Daley coached Matt Marcin, who was named to the All-BIG EAST First Team and to the NSCAA All-Northeast Region First Team. The Friars also had two players chosen in the MLS Draft. Marcin was chosen by the Philadelphia Union, while Andrew Sousa was picked by the New England Revolution.

In 2009, Providence enjoyed a successful season as it registered a 10-7-3 record and posted its fifth consecutive winning season for the first time since 1983-87. Providence recorded three consecutive victories to complete the regular season and earned a spot in the BIG EAST Championship. Providence then posted road wins at Villanova and at No. 8 Connecticut. It marked Providence's first win at UConn since 1984. In addition, the win was the fifth consecutive triumph and it also marked the first time since 1984 that the Friars won five straight games.

In 2008, Providence finished with a 9-7-3 overall record, advanced to the BIG EAST Quarterfinals, but fell just short of a fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament berth. The Friars posted victories over three ranked teams, including No. 10 Connecticut. It marked PC's first win over UConn since 1997. The Friars, who were ranked as high as 17th nationally, recorded their fourth-consecutive winning season.

In 2007, the Friars posted a 9-8-2 overall record and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the fourth time in school history. In addition, the Friars notched a 5-4-2 mark in the BIG EAST. It marked the first time ever that the Friars enjoyed back-to-back winning seasons in the league. Among the big wins was a 1-0 result at Boston College, which was the No. 1 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament.

In 2006, Daley led the Friars to another remarkable season. PC posted a 13-7 overall record, including a 7-4 mark in league play. The seven BIG EAST wins set a school record, while the 13 overall victories were one shy of a school mark (14 set in 1984). The Friars, who were ranked in the national polls for six-consecutive weeks, earned a berth to the NCAA Tournament, which was their second consecutive and third overall.

On its way to the NCAA Tournament, Daley's team posted impressive results. Providence defeated Rutgers for the first time in school history and recorded its first win over Brown since 1993. The Friars advanced to the BIG EAST Tournament, where they hosted Louisville in the first round. It marked the first time in school history that Providence hosted a BIG EAST Tournament match. Providence defeated Louisville, 2-0, setting up a quarterfinal match at 15th-ranked Cincinnati. The Friars blanked the Bearcats, 2-0, and advanced to the BIG EAST Semifinals for the third time in four seasons.

Daley also coached Ryan Maduro, who was selected to the NSCAA Division I All-America First Team, thus becoming the second Friar to be named to the All-America First Team in the 40-year history of the program. Daley also coached three players who earned All-BIG EAST honors, a first in the program's history.

In 2005, he guided his team to one of the most impressive seasons in the history of Friar soccer as the squad advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The Friars registered a 7-4-9 mark and recorded one of the most improved records in NCAA history. The Friars finished 9.5 games better than the 2004 season, which tied the team for the 10th best turnaround in NCAA history. The team started the season with a nine-game unbeaten streak (4-0-5), which was the longest by a Friar team since the 1984 team was undefeated through 10 games.

Daley's team finished with a regular season record of 5-3-7, which included 3-3-4 mark in league play. He also led the Friars to their first win in BIG EAST Tournament play since 1984 with a 2-1 victory at Cincinnati on November 2, 2005 in the First Round. Daley then led the Friars back to the BIG EAST Semifinals for the second time in three years as they earned a 2-2 tie at No. 21 Seton Hall and advanced when they won the penalty kick shootout, 4-2. In the semifinals, the Friars earned a 0-0 tie against 16th-ranked USF, but did not advance to the Finals as they were defeated in the penalty kick shootout, 3-2.

On November 14, it was announced that the Friars had been selected to participate in the 2005 NCAA Tournament. It marked

the first time since 1983 and just the second time ever that the Friars advanced to the NCAA Tournament. Daley continued to lead the Friars to new heights as they earned their first NCAA Tournament win ever when they defeated 13th-ranked Hofstra, 1-0, in overtime in the First Round on November 18. The Friars magical season came to an end when they were defeated in the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament at No. 2 North Carolina, 2-0, on November 22.

In recognition of his strong coaching performance, Daley earned NSCAA Division I New England Coach of the Year honors and was one of eight finalists for the NSCAA/Adidas National Coach of the Year accolades. He also saw two of his players earn All-BIG EAST honors. Sophomore Ryan Maduro was named to the Second Team and senior Eoin Lynch received Honorable Mention accolades.

In 2003, Daley led his team to the BIG EAST Semifinals for the first time since 1987 where they lost, 1-0, to eventual BIG EAST Champions, Notre Dame.

Daley's 2002 squad posted a 5-5-0 mark in league play and a spot in the BIG EAST Tournament for the first time since 1998. The five BIG EAST wins marked a personal-high for Daley at the time. In addition, his senior midfielder Mauricio Solano earned All-BIG EAST Third Team honors.

Daley is a solid recruiter and has brought a steady flow of talented players to Providence College. Daley replaced former Friar Head Coach Brian Ainscough, who led the rebuilding effort at Providence for five seasons. Daley served as Ainscough's top assistant for four seasons. During his time as an assistant to Ainscough, Daley handled a variety of duties for the Friars, including assisting with the team's defense and overseeing a number of administrative duties.

A 1996 graduate of Providence, Daley brought solid credentials to the head coaching position. Besides being credited with helping turn around the Friar program as an assistant coach, Daley earned four varsity letters while playing for the black and white. He is one of the top players to ever play at Providence.

He began his playing career with the Friars as a defender. Daley played his second and third seasons at the forward position before being shifted to defense again as a senior by Ainscough. Throughout his career, Daley recorded nine goals and six assists in 69 games.

Daley, a native of Toronto, Ontario, played professional soccer after graduating from Providence. On June 14, 1999, he signed with the New England Revolution, becoming the first former-Friar to play in the MLS. Prior to signing with the Revolution, Daley played for the Revolution's A-League affiliate, the Boston Bulldogs. He also spent one season with the Rhode Island Stingrays of the USL from 1996-97.

Daley, his wife, Heather, son, Donovan, and daughter, Savannah reside in East Providence, R.I.
