FRIARS TO FACE OLD DOMINION IN NCAA TOURNAMENT...

The Providence College men's soccer team will play Old Dominion on Saturday, November 24 in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament. It will mark the first ever meeting between the two teams.

FRIARS EARN NCAA TOURNAMENT BERTH...

The Friars earned their school record third consecutive NCAA Tournament berth and fourth overall in school history. Last season, PC made its third NCAA Tournament appearance and was defeated by Hofstra, 2-0, on November 10. In 2005, the Friars defeated Hofstra, 1-0, in overtime on November 18 to earn their first ever NCAA Tournament win. Prior to 2005, PC had not made the NCAA Tournament since 1983 when they were defeated by UConn, 2-0. PC was one of 48 teams selected to participate in the NCAA Tournament and one of 26 squads to receive an at-large bid.

FRIAR QUICK NOTES...

- The Friars have earned three consecutive NCAA Tournament berth for the first time in school history. Overall, PC has played in the NCAA Tournament four times and have posted a 1-3 record.
- Providence College has secured its consecutive winning season for the first time since 1985-87.
- The Friars advanced to the BIG EAST Championship for the fifth time in the last six years, including three consecutive seasons.
- The Friars' 5-4-2 BIG EAST record marked their first ever back-to-back winning seasons in the league.
- Senior Ryan Maduro (Bristol, R.I.), who leads the team in scoring, was named to the All-BIG EAST First Team.
- The Friars have not played since November 7 when they were defeated 2-0 by Cincinnati in the BIG EAST Championship First Round.

SCOUTING OLD DOMINION...

The Monarchs enter the NCAA Tournament on four-game unbeaten streak (2-0-2), including a 2-1 win over VCU in the Colonial Athletic Association semifinals and a tie against Towson in the CAA finals on November 18. The Monarchs, who are making their sixth consecutive trip to the NCAA's, claimed their first CAA title since 1991 when they won a penalty shootout after a scoreless tie. Trevor Banks leads ODU in scoring with six goals and 15 points, while A.J. Kulp also has 15 points (four goals, seven assists). In goal, Evan Newton has played in 21 games and 10 shutouts. He has yielded just 14 goals in 21 matches. ODU is led by Head Coach Alan Dawson, who is in his 11th season and has more wins than any other Old Dominion coach.

WHAT'S NEXT... The winner of Saturday's match will face sixth seed Brown University on Wednesday, November 28 at 7:00 p.m. in Providence, R.I.

LAST TIME OUT... The Friars last played on November 7 and suffered a 2-0 loss at the hands of Cincinnati in the BIG EAST Championship First Round. The Friars, who were making their ninth all-time appearance in the BIG EAST Championship, created numerous scoring opportunities, but could not convert as Bearcats' goalkeeper Miguel Rosales finished with three saves.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN... The Friars will hit the road for their fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament game in the last three years. In 2005, the Friars played at Hofstra (1-0 win) in the first round and at North Carolina (2-0 loss) in the second round. Last season, the Friars returned to Hofstra for a first round game and were defeated 2-0. This season, the Friars have posted a 3-5-0 record on the road, including wins over DePaul (2-0 on 10/21) and No. 9 Boston College (1-0 on 10/16). Conversely, the Friars posted a 6-2-2 record on its home pitch this season.

MADURO LEADING THE WAY FOR THE FRIARS... Senior Ryan Maduro (Bristol, R.I.), who became only the second Friar to be named to the NSCAA All-America First Team in 2006, is enjoying a career year this season. He is tied for the team lead with a career best five goals, while his six assists is tops on the team. In addition, he finished with four goals and five assists in BIG EAST Conference matches, which was tops on the squad. Maduro also leads the team with four game-winning goals, including three in league play. He was named to the All-BIG EAST First Team on November 15 and is the only Friar ever to earn two First Team All-BIG EAST accolades.

AGAINST COMMON OPPONENTS... The Friars and the Monarchs played against one common opponent this season. On September 7, PC defeated Northeastern, 1-0, in Providence, while ODU blanked Northeastern, 2-0, on October 5. ODU and Northeastern are two of 12 teams that makeup the Colonial Athletic Association.

PROVIDENCE FRESHMEN MAKING IMPACT... The Friar freshmen have played a key role on the team this season. Michael Pereira (London, Ontario) has played in 15 games and has one assist. Matt Marcin (Wilmington, Del.) has played in all 18 matches and has three goals and one assist for seven points. He scored the game winner against Holy Cross (9/15) and tallied one goal in a 2-0 triumph at DePaul (9/21). Alex Redding (Newton, Mass.) has played in 16 games and has three goals and one assist

for seven points. He scored in a 2-0 win against Marquette (10/12) and tallied the lone goal of the match in a 1-0 upset victory at No. 13/9 Boston College. He also assisted on the game-winning goal in a 2-0 win at Pittsburgh (10/21) and scored the overtime game winner as the Friars defeated Seton Hall, 3-2, in overtime on October 24. Nick Cianci (West Hartford, Conn.) has played in 16 games and has one goal and three assists, including two assists in a 3-1 win over Syracuse on 9/28.

FRESHMAN CLASS RATED AMONG THE TOP IN THE NATION...

This season's freshman class is ranked 25th in the College Soccer News Top 40 Recruiting Classes. Head Coach Chaka Daley's group of eight rookies has already played a big part in the team's success this season. Four freshmen have seen significant playing time led by Matt Marcin (Wilmington, Del.) who has started all 18 matches. Michael Pereira (London, Ont.) has started 15 matches, while Alex Redding (Newton, Mass.) and Nick Cianci (West Hartford, Conn.) have each played in 16 games.

FRIARS VERSUS RANKED TEAMS...

Providence has posted a 1-5-1 record against ranked teams this season. The Friars posted a 1-0 win at No.13/9 Boston College on Tuesday, October 16 and tied No. 7/11 Notre Dame, 2-2, on October 28. The Friars have been defeated by No. 20/19 West Virginia (3-0 on 11/3), No. 1/1 Connecticut (3-0 on 10/10), No. 17/21 USF (3-1 on 9/23), No. 21/13 Harvard (2-1 on 9/9) and No. 22 Rhode Island (2-0 on 9/3). Last season, the Friars defeated two ranked teams (Brown and Cincinnati) and posted a 2-6 record versus ranked opponents.

KAHLE PROVIDING SCORING PUNCH FROM THE BACK...

Sophomore back Justin Kahle (Oceanport, N.J.) did not score a goal in his first 32 games at Providence, but has found the net in two of the last five games. Kahle scored his first career goal in a 2-0 victory at Pittsburgh on Sunday, October 21. In the Friars' next game on October 26, he scored again the help the Friars defeat Seton Hall, 3-2, in overtime. He ranks tied for third on the team in scoring with seven points (two goals, three assists). In addition, he is the top scoring defender on the Friar squad. Last season as a freshman, Kahle finished tied for the team lead with five assists, while playing in 19 of the 20 matches.

Chaka Daley, who has led the Providence College men's soccer team to three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time in school history, is in his eighth season at the helm of the Friar program. Daley was appointed the third head coach in the history

of the program just prior to the start of preseason on July 18, 2000.

In 2006, Daley led the Friars to another remarkable season. PC posted a 13-7 overall record, including a 7-4 mark in league play. The seven BIG EAST wins set a school record, while the 13 overall victories were one shy of a school mark (14 set in 1984). The Friars, who were ranked in the national polls for six consecutive weeks, earned a berth to the NCAA Tournament, which was their second consecutive and third overall. In addition, it was the team's second consecutive winning campaign, a feat that had not been accomplished since 1986-87.

On its way to the NCAA Tournament, Daley's team posted impressive results. PC defeated Rutgers for the first time in school history and recorded its first win over Brown since 1993. The Friars advanced to the BIG EAST Tournament, where they hosted Louisville in the first round. It marked the first time in school history that PC hosted a BIG EAST Tournament match. PC defeated Louisville, 2-0, setting up a quarterfinal match at 15th-ranked Cincinnati. The Friars defeated the Bearcats, 2-0, and advanced to the BIG EAST Semifinals for the third time in the last four seasons.

Daley also coached Ryan Maduro, who was selected to the NSCAA Division I All-America First Team, thus becoming the second Friar to be named to the All-America First Team in the 39-year history of the program. Daley also coached three players who earned All-BIG EAST honors, a first in the program's history.

In 2005, he guided his team to one of the most impressive seasons in the history of Friar soccer as the squad advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The Friars registered a 7-4-9 mark and recorded one of the most improved records in NCAA history. The Friars finished 9.5 games better than the 2004 season, which tied the team for the 10th best turnaround in NCAA history. The team started the season with a nine-game unbeaten streak (4-0-5), which was the longest by a PC team since the 1972 team was undefeated through 10 games.

Daley's team finished with a regular season record of 5-3-7, which included 3-3-4 mark in league play. He also led the Friars to their first win in the BIG EAST Tournament play since 1984 with a 2-1 victory at Cincinnati on November 2, 2005 in the First Round. Daley then led the Friars back to the BIG EAST Semifinals for the second time in three years as they earned a 2-2 tie at No. 21 Seton Hall and advanced when they won the shootout, 4-2. In the Semifinals, the Friars earned a 0-0 tie against 16th-ranked USF, but did not advance to the Finals as they were defeated in the penalty kick shootout, 3-2.

On November 14 it was announced that the Friars had been selected to participate in the 2005 NCAA Tournament. It marked the first time since 1983 and just the second time ever that the Friars advanced to the NCAA Tournament. Daley continued to lead the Friars to new heights as they earned their first NCAA Tournament win ever when they defeated 13th-ranked Hofstra, 1-0, in overtime in the First Round on November 18. The Friars magical season came to an end when they were defeated in the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament at No. 2 North Carolina, 2-0, on November 22.

In recognition of his strong coaching performance, Daley earned the NSCAA Division I New England Coach of the Year honors and was one of eight finalists for the NSCAA/Adidas National Coach of the Year accolades. He also saw two of his players earn All-BIG EAST honors. Sophomore Ryan Maduro was named to the Second Team and senior Eoin Lynch received Honorable Mention accolades.

In 2003, Daley led his team to one of its best finishes as the team placed seventh of 13 teams during the regular season and advanced to the BIG EAST Semifinals for the first time since 1987. In the opening game of the BIG EAST Tournament, the Friars posted a dramatic come-from-behind, 2-2, tie with 23rd-ranked Virginia Tech. The Friars then defeated the Hokies in a penalty kick shootout to advance to the league Semifinals where they lost, 1-0, to eventual BIG EAST Champions, Notre Dame.

Daley's 2002 squad posted a 7-11-0 overall record and a 5-5-0 mark in league play which was good for a seventh place tie in league standings and a spot in the BIG EAST Tournament for the first time since 1998. The five BIG EAST wins marked a personal-high for Daley. In addition, his senior midfielder Mauricio Solano earned All-BIG EAST Third Team honors.

Daley is a solid recruiter and has brought a steady flow of talented players to Providence College. Daley replaced former Friar mentor Brian Ainscough, who led the rebuilding effort at Providence for five seasons. Daley served as Ainscough's top assistant for four seasons. During his time as an assistant to Ainscough, Daley handled a variety of duties for the Friars, including assisting with the team's defense and overseeing a number of administrative duties.

A 1996 graduate of Providence, Daley brought solid credentials to the head coaching position. Besides being credited with helping turn around the Friar program as an assistant coach, Daley earned four varsity letters while playing for the black and white. He is one of the top players to ever play at Providence.

He began his playing career with the Friars as a defender. Daley played his second and third seasons at the forward position before being shifted to defense again as a senior by Ainscough. Throughout his career, Daley recorded nine goals and six assists in 69 games.

Daley, a native of Toronto, Ontario, played professional soccer after graduating from Providence. On June 14, 1999, he signed with the New England Revolution, becoming the first former-Friar to play in the MLS. Prior to signing with the Revolution, Daley played for the Revolution's A-League affiliate, the Boston Bulldogs. He also spent one season with the Rhode Island StingRays of the USL from 1996-97.

Daley and his wife, Heather, and son, Donovan, reside in East Providence, R.I.
