FRIARS SET TO FACE HARTFORD...The Providence College women's basketball team will play Hartford in non-conference action on Tuesday, November 18 in West Hartford, Conn. The will be played at Chase Arena at Reich Family Pavilion at 7:00 p.m.

COVERAGE...Hartford will provide live stats during the game, free of charge by visiting www.hartfordhawks.com and navigating to the women's basketball schedule page. Additionally, live audio and video will be available via the Hawk's athletic website.

ALL-TIME SERIES...The Friars and Hawks have met twice during the history of the two women's basketball programs. The all-time series is currently tied, 1-1. The Friars won the first meeting between the two programs, 95-57, on December 1, 1990 in Providence, R.I. A year ago, the programs tipped-off on November 13, 2007 in Providence, R.I., where Hartford earned a 77-60 victory. Tuesday's meeting between Providence and Hartford will be the first between the two teams in West Hartford, Conn.

FRIARS IMPROVE TO 25-10 IN SEASON OPENERS...The Providence College women's basketball team opened the season with a 62-39 victory over Brown on November 14. The Friars improve to 25-10 all-time in season openers, as the program resumes play in its 35th year.

FRIARS BEGIN SIX-GAME ROAD STRETCH...The Friars begin a six-game road stretch on November 18 against Hartford in West Hartford, Conn. It marks the longest stretch of consecutive games on the road during the 2008-09 season. On November 22-23, the Friars will take part in the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Classic in Iowa City, Iowa. Providence's first opponent on November 22 will be Portland, and will follow with a match-up against Iowa or Boston University on November 23. After returning from Iowa City, the Friars will head to Vermont (November 26), Quinnipiac (November 30) and Massachusetts (December 3). Providence finally returns to the friendly confines of Alumni Hall on December 6 when it faces Hartford at 2:00 p.m.

HANKINS AND MARANDOLA SPARK OFFENSE IN SEASON OPENER VS. BROWN... The Friars opened the 2008-09 season with a 62-39 victory over Brown on November 14 at Alumni Hall/Mullaney Gymnasium in Providence, R.I. Sophomore Mi-Khida Hankins (Baltimore, Md.) and senior Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) combined to score 34 of the Friars' 62 points. Hankins led the charge with 18 points on 5-11 shooting (.455), while Marandola chipped in 16 points on 6-13 shooting (.462).

GETTING IT DONE AT THE LINE... The Friars sank 20-of-28 free throws against Brown on November 14. Providence's 20 made free throws mark the most in a single game since hitting 24 against Louisville on January 3, 2007 (2006-07 season).

FRIARS COLLECT 14 STEALS AGAINST BROWN... The Friars collected 14 steals against Brown on November 14, 2008. It marks the most steals for Providence in a single game since December 28, 2007 against New Hampshire, when the team also grabbed 14 steals. Sophomore Mi-Khida Hankins (Baltimore, Md.) matched her career high of four steals in the game. She was one of five Friars to collect two-or-more steals in the contest. A year ago, the Friars recorded double-digit steals in six games and compiled a 4-2 record in those games.

ROAD WEARY... The Friars will host just three home games during the months of November and December. Providence opened the season on November 14 against Brown at Alumni Hall/Mullaney Gymnasium in Providence, R.I. The Friars' only other home games during the two-month stretch are scheduled for December 6 against Harvard and December 31 against Duke.

WELCOME BACK... On November 14, the Friars regained the services of seniors Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) and Catherine Bove (Cincinnati, Ohio). Marandola, a 2007 All-BIG EAST Second-Team selection, missed all of last season with an injury. Marandola averaged 14.9 points, 6.2 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 1.8 steals during her first two seasons with the Friars. Bove played just three games last season, before sitting out the remainder of the season with an injury. In her two-year career with Providence she has averaged 8.4 points, 3.7 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.3 steals per game. In their returns to the court against Brown, Marandola tallied 16 points, five rebounds, four steals, two assists and two blocked shots. Bove recorded five points, two rebounds, two steals and one assist.

MARANDOLA NEARING 1,000-POINT MILESTONE... Senior guard Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) enters Tuesday's game against Hartford with 838 career points. She needs just 162 points to reach the 1,000-point milestone. Should Marandola eclipse 1,000 career points, she would become the 29th player all-time at Providence to achieve the feat. The last player to reach the milestone was Shauna Snyder '07. Snyder completed her four-year career at Providence with 1,043 points and ranks 23rd all-time in career scoring at PC.

BLOCK PARTY... Providence opened the season on November 14 with seven blocked shots in its victory over Brown (62-39). During the 2007-08 season, the Friars registered 126 blocked shots, including seven or more blocked shots in six games. It marked the third highest total for blocked shots during a single-season in the program's 34-year history. This year Providence returns four of its top-five shot blockers in 2008-09, including junior Emily Cournoyer (North Attleboro, Mass.), who tallied a team-leading 39 blocked shots a year ago. Cournoyer's 39 rejections marked the third highest total for a sophomore in program history. In the Friars' recent game against Brown, five different players recorded at least one blocked shot. Junior Jessica Clark (Bronx, N.Y.) and senior Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) each recorded two blocks to lead the team.

MORE REJECTION... Providence has recorded 100+ blocked shots in each of the last two seasons. In 2006-07, the Friars recorded 117 blocks, and followed with 126 rejections in 2007-08. It marked the first time Providence has recorded 100+ blocked shots in back-to-back seasons since doing so during the 1988-89 (105) and 1989-90 (118) campaigns.

GLASS CLEANER... A year ago, Shantee Darrian (Trenton, N.J.) hauled in 241 rebounds. It marked the most rebounds in a single season by a Friar since Nadine Malcolm hauled in 254 boards during the 1995-96 campaign. Darrian certainly started the 2008-09 season off on a good note with a game-high nine rebounds on November 14. In 52 career games with the Friars, Darrian has led the team in rebounding 40 times.

DARRIAN CLOSING IN ON 500 CAREER REBOUNDS... Senior Shantee Darrian (Trenton, N.J.) has played 52 career games for Providence and owns 466 rebounds for a career average of 9.0 rebounds per game. Darrian needs just 34 more rebounds to reach 500.

EVEN MORE BOARDS... In 32 BIG EAST Conference games, Shantee Darrian (Trenton, N.J.) has hauled in 177 boards for an average of 9.1 caroms per game. Darrian ranks 15th all-time in the BIG EAST in rebounding average during conference play (9.1 rpg). She is just one of five active players in the league who are ranked among the top-30 all-time in the BIG EAST record book in career rebounding average. Dana Wynne '97, of Seton Hall, leads the BIG EAST's all-time list in career rebounding average with 11.2 rebounds per game (1993-97).

50/50... Junior Emily Cournoyer (North Attleboro, Mass.) has led the Friars in field-goal percentage during each of her first two seasons with the team. As a freshman in 2006-07, Cournoyer posted a 0.540 field-goal percentage on 67-124 shooting from the floor. Last season, Cournoyer shot better than 50-percent for the second-straight year (0.508), having connected on 93-of-183 attempts from the field.

HANKINS RETURNS AFTER SUCCESSFUL ROOKIE CAMPAIGN... Sophomore Mi-Khida Hankins (Baltimore, Md.) returns to the Friars for her second season on the hardwood in 2008-09. A year ago, she earned BIG EAST All-Freshman Team honors after averaging 10.4 points and 4.0 rebounds per game. She also added 38 assists and 34 steals. She was one of two Friars to start all 29 games last season, and led the team in scoring a team-best eight times. Hankins also led the Friars with four, 20+ point games. Hankins started the 2008-09 season with 18 points, four rebounds, four assists, two steals and one blocked shot against Brown.

START ME UP... The Friars return four starters from last year's squad, in addition to the return of Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) and Catherine Bove (Cincinnati, Ohio), who were sidelined with injuries in 2007-08. Seven members of this year's team have appeared in the starting line-up during their careers with the Friars.

FRIARS PICKED TO FINISH 16TH IN BIG EAST PRESEASON COACHES' POLL... The Providence College women's basketball team was picked to finish 16th in the BIG EAST Preseason Coaches' Poll. The poll was released on October 23 at the league's annual media day, held at ESPN Zone in New York, N.Y. Last season, the injury-plagued Friars completed the BIG EAST schedule with a 2-14 record (16th place). Connecticut topped the 2008-09 preseason poll with 224 points and 14 of 16 first-place votes.

Fourth Season

Phil Seymore embarks on his fourth season as head coach of the Friar women's basketball team. Seymore was hired as the eighth coach in the program's 34-year history on April 7, 2005.

The program continues to progress under the direction of Seymore - and the Friars have high hopes of turning the corner in BIG EAST Conference play in 2008-09. Prior to his arrival, the Friars won just five games during a two-year period from 2003 through 2005, including an 0-32 record versus BIG EAST Conference opponents.

During Seymore's first season with the Friars, the team posted an 8-19 overall record and a 3-13 mark in the BIG EAST. It marked a 7.5 game improvement in the win column. In 2006-07, the Friars showed even greater signs of progress with a final record of 13-16 (3-13 BIG EAST). On January 3, 2007, Seymore led Providence to an impressive 106-94, double-overtime, victory over 13th-ranked Louisville during BIG EAST regular-season play. At the time, the Cardinals were one of five NCAA Division I programs who were undefeated.

The Friars' 13 victories on the year marked the most in a single season since the 2001-02 campaign, when PC finished the year at 13-15. Providence started the year with a 7-1 record, including victories in each of its first six games. It stands at PC's best start since 1990-91 when the team began the year with seven-straight victories.

Furthermore, Providence completed the non-conference portion of its schedule with a 10-3 record. It marked the first time since the 2002-03 season that PC had posted a winning record in non-conference play. It also marked the most non-conference victories in a single season since 1990-91.

A year ago (2007-08), the Friars posted a 12-17 overall record - giving Providence double-digit victories for the second-straight season under Seymore's guidance. The last time the program recorded double-digit wins in back-to-back seasons dates back to the 2000-01 and 2001-02 seasons. Additionally, Providence finished the non-conference portion of its schedule with 10 wins for the second-straight year.

Prior to his appointment as head coach, Seymore served as an assistant coach for the Friar men's basketball team, helping the squad earn NCAA Tournament berths in 2001 and 2004.

"Phil Seymore brings a wealth of experience and knowledge to our women's basketball program," Driscoll said. "He has enjoyed success as a student-athlete, a professional athlete and as a coach. He understands the mission of the College and is dedicated to rebuilding our program while providing a positive experience for our student-athletes."

Seymore came to Providence in 2000 after serving as an assistant coach at the University of Richmond for three seasons under Head Coach John Beilein. While at Richmond, he was responsible for the team's recruiting and the offensive and defensive development of guards and wing-men. He also prepared scouting reports of the opposing teams for the Spiders.

"Phil was one of my first full-time assistant coaches [at West Virginia]," Michigan Men's Basketball Head Coach John Beilein stated. "I knew in a short time that I wanted him to be my assistant forever. His attention to detail is impressive, but what is equally impressive is how he looks at the big picture -- life, basketball and recruiting. This is a great selection for Providence and the BIG EAST."

A native of Brooklyn, N.Y., and a graduate of Canisius College, Seymore began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Canisius in 1983 under his former coach Nick Macarchuk (a former PC assistant coach). After one season at Canisius, he went to Turner Carroll High School in Buffalo, N.Y. where he coached for four years, including two seasons as the head coach. His 1989-90 team at Turner won the State Catholic School Class C title and the 1988-89 squad captured the Manhattan Cup Championship. After leaving Turner Carroll High School in 1990, Seymore spent the next seven years as an assistant coach at Canisius. Five of those seven years were under Beilein.

Seymore began his collegiate playing career at Independence Junior College before transferring to Canisius. At Canisius, he averaged 16.8 points and 4.6 assists in two seasons as a point guard. Seymore was selected in the seventh round of the 1982 NBA draft by the New York Knicks. He played one season for Albany of the Continental Basketball Association where he earned 1983 All-Star honors. Seymore is a member of Canisius' Athletic Hall of Fame.

Seymore resides in Rumford, R.I., with his wife, Alicia, and his daughter, Amani.

Recap: The Providence College women's basketball team defeated Brown, 62-39, in non-conference action on November 14 at Alumni Hall/Mullaney Gymnasium in Providence, R.I. The game marked the season opener for both teams. Sophomore Mi-Khida Hankins (Baltimore, Md.) and senior Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) combined for 34 points to lead the Friar offense. Hankins posted 18 points, four assists, four rebounds, two steals and one blocked shot in 32 minutes of action. Marandola returned to the hardwoods for her first game action since the 2006-07 season and recorded 16 points, five rebounds, four steals, two assists and two blocked shots. She played all but two minutes in the game. Senior Shantee Darrian (Trenton, N.J.) was one point and one rebound shy of a double-double, after finishing the night with nine points and nine rebounds. The Friars started the game off slowly, shooting just 7-25 (.280) from the field in the first half, and went to the locker room with a 25-12 lead at halftime. Providence shot 50-percent (13-26) from the floor in the second half and outscored Brown, 37-27, in the final 20 minutes en route to the 62-39 victory. Karly Grace led the Bears with nine points and two steals. Sarah Delk pulled down a team-high six rebounds. Courtney Lee dished out a team-high three assists.
