FRIARS ADVANCE TO CHAMPIONSHIP GAME OF KCRG-TV9 HAWKEYE CLASSIC... The Providence College women's basketball team defeated Portland, 68-61, in overtime on November 22 in the first round of the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Classic in Iowa City, Iowa. With the victory, the Friars advance to the championship game to face Iowa on November 23 at 3:30 p.m. (ET).

FRIARS MAKING SECOND APPEARANCE ALL-TIME AT HAWKEYE CLASSIC... The Providence women's basketball team is making its second appearance all-time at the Hawkeye Classic. The Friars also competed at the tournament during the 1986-87 season. On November 29, 1986, Providence fell to Tennessee, 86-70, in the first round. The Friars went on to beat Boston University, 74-50, in the consolation game the following day. It marks Providence's first appearance in the Hawkeye Classic championship game.

HANKINS NETS 22 POINTS IN FIRST-ROUND WIN VS. PORTLAND... The Friars got a 22-point effort from sophomore Mi-Khida Hankins (Baltimore, Md.) on November 22 against Portland in the first round of the Hawkeye Classic. Hankins' 22 points matched her career high, and marked the fifth time in her career she reached the 20-point plateau in a single game. She shot 7-13 from the field and 8-0 from the charity stripe. Hankins also grabbed a career-high nine rebounds and added four assists and one blocked shot.

10-10 SHOOTING FROM THE CHARITY STRIPE IN OVERTIME SEALS THE DEAL... The Friars sank 10 of 10 free throw attempts during overtime to defeat Portland, 68-61, on November 22. Senior Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) was 4-4 from the line in the extra session, while three other players on the roster were 2-2 from the line in OT. In regulation, the Friars hit 13 of 20 attempts from the line, including a dismal 9-16 performance in the second half.

THREE FRIARS PUT UP DOUBLE FIGURES VS. PORTLAND... Three Friars reached double figures in the point column in their 68-61 victory over Portland. It marks the most players in double figures for Providence through three games this season. Sophomore Mi-Khida Hankins (Baltimore, Md.) led the way with 22 points. Senior Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) added 16 points, while junior Emily Cournoyer (North Attleboro, Mass.) added 10 points.

PROVIDENCE POSTS LARGEST REBOUNDING MARGIN OF THE SEASON... The Friars grabbed a season-high 46 rebounds in their win over Portland on November 22, and out-rebounded the Pilots by six (46-40). It marked Providence's largest rebounding margin of the season. Providence has recorded 40+ rebounds in two of three games this season and owns a 2-0 record in those games.

THREE FRIARS AVERAGING DOUBLE FIGURES... Three members of the Providence women's basketball team are averaging double figures in the scoring column through three games this season. Sophomore Mi-Khida Hankins (Baltimore, Md.) leads the way with 15.0 points per game. Senior Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) is scoring 13.7 points per game, followed by junior Brittany Dorsey (Detroit, Mich.), who is tallying 10.5 points per game.

FRIARS DISH SEASON-HIGH 19 ASSISTS VS. PORTLAND... The Friars posted a season-high 19 assists in their victory over Portland on November 22. It marks the most assists in a game for Providence since also dishing 19 assists vs. St. John's on February 10, 2007 (2006-07 season).

FRIARS 46 REBOUNDS ARE MOST IN A SINGLE GAME SINCE 2006-07 SEASON... Providence grabbed a season-high 46 rebounds against Portland on November 22. It marks the most rebounds in a single game since pulling down 47 against St. John's on February 10, 2007.

DORSEY RETURNS FROM INJURY TO LEAD FRIAR OFFENSE AGAINST HARTFORD... Junior guard Brittany Dorsey (Detroit, Mich.) missed Providence's season opener against Brown on November 14 with an injury. She returned to the court in PC's game against Hartford to lead all scorers with 17 points on 5-10 shooting, including 2-4 from beyond the three-point arc. Dorsey also sank 5-8 free throws, and chipped in three rebounds and one assist. Dorsey managed her impressive line in just 21 minutes of play off the bench. In the two games she has played, Dorsey is averaging 10.5 points and 4.5 rebounds.

PUTTING IT ON THE LINE... The Friars connected on 23-30 free throws in a 68-61 overtime victory against Portland on November 22. It marked the second time this season the Friars have made 20-or-more free throws in a single game, and the Friars have earned victories in each of those games. Providence's 23 made free throws mark the most in a single game since hitting 24 against Louisville on January 3, 2007 (2006-07 season). On the young season, Providence is shooting 74.7-percent from the foul line (56-75).

FRIARS COLLECT 14 STEALS AGAINST BROWN... The Friars collected 14 steals against Brown on November 14, 2008. It marks the most steals for Providence in a single game since December 28, 2007 against New Hampshire, when the team also grabbed 14 steals. Sophomore Mi-Khida Hankins (Baltimore, Md.) matched her career high of four steals in the game. She was one of five Friars to collect two-or-more steals in the contest. A year ago, the Friars recorded double-digit steals in six games and compiled a 4-2 record in those games.

FRIARS ARE IN THE MIDST OF A SIX-GAME ROAD SWING... On November 18, the Friars started a six-game road swing when they played Hartford in West Hartford, Conn. After two games at the Hawkeye Classic on November 22-23, Providence remains on the road for contests against Vermont (11/26), Quinnipiac (11/30) and Massachusetts (12/3).

ROAD WEARY... The Friars will host just three home games during the months of November and December. Providence opened the season on November 14 against Brown at Alumni Hall/Mullaney Gymnasium in Providence, R.I. The Friars' only other home games during the two-month stretch are scheduled for December 6 against Harvard and December 31 against Duke.

WELCOME BACK... On November 14, the Friars regained the services of seniors Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) and Catherine Bove (Cincinnati, Ohio). Marandola, a 2007 All-BIG EAST Second-Team selection, missed all of last season with an injury. Marandola averaged 14.9 points, 6.2 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 1.8 steals during her first two seasons with the Friars. Bove played just three games last season, before sitting out the remainder of the season with an injury. In her two-year career with Providence she has averaged 8.4 points, 3.7 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.3 steals per game. Through three games on the 2008-09 schedule, Marandola is averaging 13.7 points, 3.7 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.7 steals per game. Bove is averaging 5.3 points, 3.3 boards, 2.0 assists and 1.3 steals per game.

MARANDOLA NEARING 1,000-POINT MILESTONE... Senior guard Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) enters Sunday's game against Iowa with 863 career points. She needs just 137 points to reach the 1,000-point milestone. Should Marandola eclipse 1,000 career points, she would become the 29th player all-time at Providence to achieve the feat. The last player to reach the milestone was Shauna Snyder '07. Snyder completed her four-year career at Providence with 1,043 points and ranks 23rd all-time in career scoring at PC. Marandola missed all of last season with an injury - and her point total covers 58 career games.

BLOCK PARTY... Providence opened the season with a season-high seven blocked shots against Brown. Providence owns 11 blocked shots through three games (3.7 bpg). During the 2007-08 season, the Friars registered 126 blocked shots, including seven or more blocked shots in six games. It marked the third highest total for blocked shots during a single-season in the program's 34-year history. This year Providence returns four of its top-five shot blockers in 2008-09, including junior Emily Cournoyer (North Attleboro, Mass.), who tallied a team-leading 39 blocked shots a year ago. Cournoyer's 39 rejections marked the third highest total for a sophomore in program history. Sophomore Mi-Khida Hankins (Baltimore, Md.) is leading the Friars in blocked shots this season with five (1.67 bpg).

MORE REJECTION... Providence has recorded 100+ blocked shots in each of the last two seasons. In 2006-07, the Friars recorded 117 blocks, and followed with 126 rejections in 2007-08. It marked the first time Providence has recorded 100+ blocked shots in back-to-back seasons since doing so during the 1988-89 (105) and 1989-90 (118) campaigns.

GLASS CLEANER... A year ago, Shantee Darrian (Trenton, N.J.) hauled in 241 rebounds. It marked the most rebounds in a single season by a Friar since Nadine Malcolm hauled in 254 boards during the 1995-96 campaign. Darrian has led the Friars in rebounding twice this season through three games, including a season-high nine rebounds in games vs. Brown (11/14) and Portland (11/22). In 54 career games with the Friars, Darrian has led the team in rebounding 41 times.

DARRIAN CLOSING IN ON 500 CAREER REBOUNDS... Senior Shantee Darrian (Trenton, N.J.) has played 54 career games for Providence and owns 488 rebounds for a career average of 9.0 rebounds per game. Darrian needs just 12 more rebounds to reach 500.

EVEN MORE BOARDS... In 32 BIG EAST Conference games, Shantee Darrian (Trenton, N.J.) has hauled in 177 boards for an average of 9.1 caroms per game. Darrian ranks 15th all-time in the BIG EAST in rebounding average during conference play (9.1 rpg). She is just one of five active players in the league who are ranked among the top-30 all-time in the BIG EAST record book in career rebounding average. Dana Wynne '97, of Seton Hall, leads the BIG EAST's all-time list in career rebounding average with 11.2 rebounds per game (1993-97).

HANKINS RETURNS AFTER SUCCESSFUL ROOKIE CAMPAIGN... Sophomore Mi-Khida Hankins (Baltimore, Md.) returns to the Friars for her second season on the hardwood in 2008-09. A year ago, she earned BIG EAST All-Freshman Team honors after averaging 10.4 points and 4.0 rebounds per game. She also added 38 assists and 34 steals. She was one of two Friars to start all 29 games last season, and led the team in scoring a team-best eight times. Hankins also led the Friars with four, 20+ point games. Through three games on the 2008-09 schedule, Hankins is averaging 15.0 points, 5.7 rebounds, 3.0 assists, 1.7 blocks and 1.0 steals per game.

START ME UP... The Friars return four starters from last year's squad, in addition to the return of Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) and Catherine Bove (Cincinnati, Ohio), who were sidelined with injuries in 2007-08. Seven members of this year's team have appeared in the starting line-up during their careers with the Friars.

Fourth Season
Alma Mater • Canisius '89*

Phil Seymore embarks on his fourth season as head coach of the Friar women's basketball team. Seymore was hired as the eighth coach in the program's 34-year history on April 7, 2005.

The program continues to progress under the direction of Seymore - and the Friars have high hopes of turning the corner in BIG EAST Conference play in 2008-09. Prior to his arrival, the Friars won just five games during a two-year period from 2003 through 2005, including an 0-32 record versus BIG EAST Conference opponents.

During Seymore's first season with the Friars, the team posted an 8-19 overall record and a 3-13 mark in the BIG EAST. It marked a 7.5 game improvement in the win column. In 2006-07, the Friars showed even greater signs of progress with a final record of 13-16 (3-13 BIG EAST). On January 3, 2007, Seymore led Providence to an impressive 106-94, double-overtime, victory over 13th-ranked Louisville during BIG EAST regular-season play. At the time, the Cardinals were one of five NCAA Division I programs who were undefeated.

The Friars' 13 victories on the year marked the most in a single season since the 2001-02 campaign, when PC finished the year at 13-15. Providence started the year with a 7-1 record, including victories in each of its first six games. It stands at PC's best start since 1990-91 when the team began the year with seven-straight victories.

Furthermore, Providence completed the non-conference portion of its schedule with a 10-3 record. It marked the first time since the 2002-03 season that PC had posted a winning record in non-conference play. It also marked the most non-conference victories in a single season since 1990-91.

A year ago (2007-08), the Friars posted a 12-17 overall record - giving Providence double-digit victories for the second-straight season under Seymore's guidance. The last time the program recorded double-digit wins in back-to-back seasons dates back to the 2000-01 and 2001-02 seasons. Additionally, Providence finished the non-conference portion of its schedule with 10 wins for the second-straight year.

Prior to his appointment as head coach, Seymore served as an assistant coach for the Friar men's basketball team, helping the squad earn NCAA Tournament berths in 2001 and 2004.

"Phil Seymore brings a wealth of experience and knowledge to our women's basketball program," Driscoll said. "He has enjoyed success as a student-athlete, a professional athlete and as a coach. He understands the mission of the College and is dedicated to rebuilding our program while providing a positive experience for our student-athletes."

Seymore came to Providence in 2000 after serving as an assistant coach at the University of Richmond for three seasons under Head Coach John Beilein. While at Richmond, he was responsible for the team's recruiting and the offensive and defensive development of guards and wing-men. He also prepared scouting reports of the opposing teams for the Spiders.

"Phil was one of my first full-time assistant coaches [at West Virginia]," Michigan Men's Basketball Head Coach John Beilein stated. "I knew in a short time that I wanted him to be my assistant forever. His attention to detail is impressive, but what is equally impressive is how he looks at the big picture -- life, basketball and recruiting. This is a great selection for Providence and the BIG EAST."

A native of Brooklyn, N.Y., and a graduate of Canisius College, Seymore began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Canisius in 1983 under his former coach Nick Macarchuk (a former PC assistant coach). After one season at Canisius, he went to Turner Carroll High School in Buffalo, N.Y. where he coached for four years, including two seasons as the head coach. His 1989-90 team at Turner won the State Catholic School Class C title and the 1988-89 squad captured the Manhattan Cup Championship. After leaving Turner Carroll High School in 1990, Seymore spent the next seven years as an assistant coach at Canisius. Five of those seven years were under Beilein.

Seymore began his collegiate playing career at Independence Junior College before transferring to Canisius. At Canisius, he averaged 16.8 points and 4.6 assists in two seasons as a point guard. Seymore was selected in the seventh round of the 1982 NBA draft by the New York Knicks. He played one season for Albany of the Continental Basketball Association where he earned 1983 All-Star honors. Seymore is a member of Canisius' Athletic Hall of Fame.

Seymore resides in Rumford, R.I., with his wife, Alicia, and his daughter, Amani.
