

BY THE NUMBERS... The Friars and Huskies have met 49 times in the 28-year history of the PC women's basketball program. Providence has never scored 100 points in a game vs. Connecticut. The Huskies have eclipsed the 100-point mark in games played vs. the Friars six times, including three of the last four games. The most points the Friars have scored against Connecticut is 97. PC achieved that mark on February 23, 1992 in a 97-72 victory in Providence, R.I. The largest point total recorded by the Huskies in a game vs. PC is 126. UConn achieved that mark on January 6, 1998 in a 126-48 victory in Storrs, Conn.

SCOUTING THE HUSKIES... No. 1-ranked Connecticut enters Saturday's game versus the Friars with a 27-0 overall record and a 14-0 mark in the BIG EAST Conference. The Huskies achieved a No. 1 ranking in the Associated Press Women's Basketball Poll and the ESPN/USA Today Women's Basketball Poll on February 3, 2002 after defeating then-No. 1 Duke, 77-65, in Durham, N.C. The Huskies have remained in the No. 1 spot in the polls since then. The Huskies also are in the midst of a Division I record 66-game win streak. In recent action on February 26, Connecticut defeated Georgetown, 97-57, in Washington, D.C. Ashley Battle and Diana Taurasi each scored a game-high 17 points. Barbara Turner added 16 points and a game-high seven rebounds, while Ann Strother finished the night with 13 points, five assists and two blocked shots. The Huskies shot 68.0 percent (34-50) from the field (72.0 percent in the second half), including 52.9 percent (9-17) from beyond the three-point arc for the game. Taurasi leads UConn through 27 games with an average of 16.5 points, 6.2 rebounds, 4.7 assists and 1.3 blocks per game. Strother is second on the team in scoring (10.9 ppg), followed by Barbara Turner (10.8 ppg) and Jessica Moore (10.0 ppg). Turner and Moore are tied for second on the team in rebounding, averaging 6.1 boards per game each. As a team, the Huskies average 75.7 points and 43.3 rebounds per game. UConn's opponents are averaging 52.2 points and 31.7 rebounds per game.

SCOUTING THE FRIARS... Providence College enters Saturday's BIG EAST Conference women's basketball game versus No. 1 Connecticut with an overall record of 9-16, and a 3-11 mark in the BIG EAST Conference. The Friars will be without sophomore guard Michal Epstein (Rehovot, Israel) for the remainder of the season, as she has been diagnosed with a stress fracture in her left foot. Epstein led the Friars through 25 games averaging 14.3 points and 2.6 rebounds per game. Senior guard Brooke Freeburg (Waterford, Pa.) is second on the team in scoring with an average of 9.2 points per game, followed by sophomore forward Jessica Simmonds (South Orange, N.J.) who is averaging 9.1 points and a team-leading 6.2 rebounds per game. Sophomore guard Keisha Blackwell (Baltimore, Md.) leads the Friars in steals with an average of 1.5 thefts per game. The Friars are in the midst of a four-game losing streak, which dates back to a 54-42 loss against Seton Hall on February 13 in Providence, R.I. In recent action on February 22, the Friars were defeated by Miami, 77-64, in Coral Gables, Fla. Kacee Wheeler led the Friars with 17 points. Simmonds posted her fourth double-double of the season with 16 points and a game-high 13 rebounds. PC has earned five of its nine victories on its home-court (Alumni Hall/Mullaney Gymnasium) this season. As a team, the Friars are averaging 61.4 points and 33.2 rebounds per game. PC's opponents are averaging 66.1 points and 34.0 rebounds per game.

IN RECENT ACTION... The Providence College women's basketball team was defeated by Miami, 77-64, in BIG EAST Conference action on Saturday, February 22 in Coral Gables, Florida. The loss marked the fourth-straight for the Friars, who fall to 9-16 overall and 3-11 in the BIG EAST. Senior center Kacee Wheeler (Bakersfield, Calif.) led the Friars with 17 points. Sophomore forward Jessica Simmonds (South Orange, N.J.) registered her fourth double-double of the season with 16 points and 13 rebounds. Simmonds' 13 rebounds tied a personal career high. The Hurricanes held a 37-28 lead at halftime, and were led by freshman sensation Tamara James, who scored 15 of her game-high 30 points in the first half. Miami led by as many as 16 points (35-19) with 4:39 remaining in the opening session. However, Providence rallied to cut lead to nine points at the halftime break (37-28), as it finished the half on a 9-2 scoring run. Senior guard Brooke Freeburg (Waterford, Pa.) led the Friars in the first period with eight points, followed by Wheeler who netted seven points. As a team, PC shot 35.7 percent (10-28) from the field in the half, including 75.0 percent (3-4) from beyond the three-point arc. The Friars also connected on five-of-seven attempts (71.4 percent) from the foul line. The Hurricanes shot 45.7 percent (16-35) from the field in the first half, despite shooting a dismal 23.1 percent (3-13) from three-point territory. Miami connected on two-of-two attempts (100 percent) from the foul line. In the second half, the Friars started play on a 19-12 run to get

within two points (49-47) with 11:52 on the game clock. The Hurricanes regrouped to push the lead back to 10 points (59-49) with 9:18 to play on a 10-2 run, and extended the run over the next 7:11 of the game to gain their largest lead of 17 points (74-57) with 3:07 remaining. Joining Wheeler and Simmonds in double figures was Freeburg, who finished the game with 13 points. Simmonds added a team-high four steals and game-high two blocked shots. Junior guard Kristin Quinn (Sewell, N.J.) left the game at the 11:52 mark after she converted on a lay-up and was fouled to get PC within three points. Quinn did not return to the court as she needed stitches on her mouth. Quinn finished the day with seven points, three steals, one block and one rebound. Sophomore guard Keisha Blackwell (Baltimore, Md.) replaced Quinn and hit the subsequent free-throw to cut Miami's lead to two (49-47).

HEAD COACH SUSAN YOW... Susan Yow is in the midst of her first season as head coach of the Providence College women's basketball team. Yow joined the Friar athletic department on June 21, 2002 as the seventh head women's basketball coach in PC history. Yow has compiled an overall record of 222-296 in her 19 seasons as a head coach before her arrival at PC. Prior to her arrival at Providence College, she was head coach at East Tennessee (1978-86), Drake (1986-90), Kansas State (1990-93) and UNC Wilmington (1993-97). Yow also served as an assistant coach in the Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) with the Cleveland Rockers (1997-99) and the Charlotte Sting (1999-01). While at Providence, Yow has compiled an overall record of 9-16 through 25 games on the 2002-03 schedule, including a 3-11 mark in the BIG EAST Conference. Yow's career coaching record currently stands at 231-312 overall and is in the midst of her 20th season as a head coach. Yow has coached 543 games in her career. Yow earned her first BIG EAST Conference win with the Friars against Pittsburgh (80-77) on January 11, 2003 in Pittsburgh, Pa.

A LOOK BACK AT THE 2001-02 FRIARS... The Friars posted a 13-15 overall record during the 2001-02 season, including a 7-9 mark in the BIG EAST. The Friars finished eighth in the league standings and advanced to the BIG EAST Tournament in Piscataway, N.J. The Friars were eliminated in the first round by No. 9 Seton Hall, 61-55, on March 2. PC compiled a record of 9-3 at home in Alumni Hall during the 2001-02 season. Two of those victories included an 80-70 win over eventual NCAA Tournament participant Syracuse, and a 67-61 win over Virginia Tech, who earned an invitation to the WNIT and was ranked 22nd in the nation at the time of competition. The Friars' 13 wins in 2001-02 marked the most victories by the PC women's basketball program since 1996-97 when the team finished the year with a 13-14 record.

PLAYERS TO WATCH

EPSTEIN TO MISS REMAINDER OF SEASON ... Sophomore guard Michal Epstein (Rehovot, Israel) will likely sit out the remainder of the 2002-03 season with a stress fracture in her left foot. Through 25 games, Epstein leads the Friars averaging 14.3 points and 2.6 assists per game. On December 22, she scored a game and career-high 25 points in a 63-55 win over Rhode Island in Kingston, R.I. She matched her career high with another 25 point performance versus Pittsburgh on January 11 in Pittsburgh, Pa. Earlier this season (2002-03), Epstein earned All-Tournament Team honors as the team tipped off the season at the Banknorth Classic on November 22-23 in Burlington, Vermont. Epstein averaged 12.5 points and 2.0 steals per game to earn the honor. During the 2001-02 season, Epstein averaged 8.2 points, 3.6 rebounds and 2.3 assists per game. This season, Epstein has led the team in scoring in 15 of PC's 25 games and has

scored 20 or more points in five games. Versus BIG EAST Conference opponents, Epstein has averaged 12.7 points, 3.1 rebounds and 2.7 assists per game.

WHEELER GETS BACK ON TRACK... Senior center/forward Kacey Wheeler (Bakersfield, Calif.) missed three games with a severe right ankle sprain, but returned to the line-up on February 19 versus Syracuse. In that game, she came off the bench to play just eight minutes and did not score or record a rebound. The following game versus Miami on February 22, Wheeler played 21 minutes, scored a game-high 17 points and added two rebounds and one assist. She has reached double-figures in scoring this season 10 times, including seven of the last 10 games she has played in. On January 11, Wheeler notched her first career double-double versus Pittsburgh with a career-high 17 points and career-high 11 rebounds. On January 15, Wheeler registered her second-consecutive double-double with a career-high 18 points and 11 rebounds. Wheeler is second on the team this season with two double-doubles. Versus BIG EAST opponents, Wheeler is averaging 9.6 points, 4.8 rebounds and 1.2 assists per game.

SIMMONDS ANSWERS THE CALL... Sophomore forward/center Jessica Simmonds (South Orange, N.J.) has stepped up her offensive production as of late. Simmonds has reached double figures in scoring in each of the Friars' last seven games, an average of 14.7 points per game in the seven game stretch. Simmonds has reached double figures in scoring a total of 12 times and in rebounding five times. Through 25 games, Simmonds leads the Friars in rebounding with an average of 6.2 boards per game and ranks third in scoring (9.1 ppg), second in steals (1.4 spg) and second in field-goal percentage (.467, 86-184). Simmonds leads the Friars with four double-doubles this season, and currently has a total of seven in her career. She has posted double-doubles versus St. Bonaventure on December 28 (12 points, 12 rebounds), Virginia Tech on February 1 (12 points, 10 rebounds), Seton Hall on February 13 (19 points, 10 rebounds) and Miami on February 22 (16 points, 13 rebounds). During the 2001-02 season, Simmonds earned BIG EAST All-Rookie Team honors as a freshman. In recent action versus Miami on February 22, Simmonds registered 16 points, a game-high 13 rebounds, four steals, two blocked shots and one assist. In BIG EAST Conference action, Simmonds is averaging 10.6 points, 6.5 rebounds, 1.5 steals and 1.2 assists per game. Through 25 games, Simmonds has led the Friars in rebounding 15 times and in scoring five times.

QUINN PROVES HER WORTH... Junior guard Kristin Quinn (Sewell, N.J.) is averaging 23.0 minutes per game through 25 games. In the last five games Quinn has averaged 34.8 minutes per game, and has played all 40 minutes in two of PC's last three games (and was on her way to a third-straight 40 minute game versus Miami had she not left the game to receive stitches in her mouth). Versus Notre Dame on February 16, she netted a team-high 15 points, pulled down five rebounds and dished out four assists. On February 22 versus Syracuse, Quinn scored a team-high 14 points and added five rebounds, one assists and one steal. In the Friars' most recent game versus Miami on February 22, Quinn recorded seven points, three steals, one rebound and one blocked shot before being taken to the hospital for stitches while cutting Miami's lead to two points on a lay-up and taking a hard foul with 10:52 remaining in the game. In the last five games, Quinn is has averaged 10.6 points, 4.0 rebounds and 2.3 assists per game. For the season, Quinn is averaging 5.5 points, 3.4 rebounds and 1.8 assists per game. Quinn also leads the team in free-throw percentage (89.8 percent, 44-49) and ranks second in three-point field-goal percentage (35.9 percent, 23-64).

FREEBURG RESURFACES ON OFFENSE... Senior guard Brooke Freeburg (Waterford, Pa.) is currently second among her teammates in scoring (9.2 ppg), fourth in rebounding (3.4 rpg) and third in assists (1.6

apg) and steals (1.1 spg) through 25 games. Freeburg has reached double figures in scoring 13 times this season, including each of the last three games. She posted career-highs in points (16) at Vermont on November 23 and assists (five) at home versus Brown on November 26. Freeburg also earned All-Tournament Team honors at the conclusion of the Banknorth Classic in Burlington, Vt. on November 22-23 after averaging 14.0 points, 2.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists in two games. During the 2001-02 season, Freeburg averaged 4.0 points, 2.3 rebounds and 0.85 assists per game. In the Friars' most recent game versus Miami on February 22, Freeburg recorded 13 points, four rebounds, two steals and one assist. Versus BIG EAST Conference opponents, Freeburg is averaging 9.3 points, 3.4 rebounds, 1.6 assists and 1.2 steals per game. In the Friars' last three games, Freeburg has averaged 11.7 points, 5.0 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game.

HEAD COACH SUSAN YOW

Providence College Assistant Vice President for Athletics Bob Driscoll announced the appointment of Susan Yow as head coach of the women's basketball team on Friday, June 21, 2002. Yow, the seventh women's basketball coach all-time at PC, replaced Jim Jabir who resigned in April to become an assistant women's basketball coach at the University of Colorado.

"Susan Yow brings experience, intensity and compassion to this position," Driscoll said. "She has coached at the highest levels and has a strong knowledge of women's basketball. We also were attracted to Susan because she has extensive experience coaching and recruiting in an academic setting. We believe she will be the person that can lead Providence College women's basketball in the highly competitive BIGEAST Conference."

Yow, the sister of longtime North Carolina State Head Coach Kay Yow and University of Maryland Athletic Director Deborah Yow, comes to Providence with 19 years of NCAA Division I head coaching experience (1978-97). She also spent four years as an assistant coach in the WNBA (1997-01). Yow's most recent collegiate coaching stint was at the University of North Carolina Wilmington. Yow coached at UNC Wilmington from 1993-97. Prior to UNC Wilmington, she was the head coach at Kansas State (1990-93), Drake University (1986-90) and East Tennessee State (1978-86).

In 1997, Yow began her career in the WNBA as an assistant coach for the Cleveland Rockers. Two years later in 1999, she was hired as an assistant coach with the Charlotte Sting. She served as an assistant with the Sting until 2001.

During the 2001-02 women's basketball season, Yow worked as a color analyst for radio broadcasts of the North Carolina State women's basketball games.

Yow also coached three different USA Basketball teams. In 1981, she was an assistant coach for the USA team which won a gold medal at the Olympic Sports Festival. In 1983, Yow served as a head coach for the US squad that won a gold medal at the Olympic Sports Festival. She helped guide the USA to a third gold medal in 1988 when she was an assistant coach for the US Olympic Team.

"I'm excited about the opportunity to coach at Providence College," Yow said. "The women's basketball program has an excellent tradition at Providence and I want to continue to help this program in reaching its full potential. I look forward to the challenges ahead, as we prepare to compete in one of the toughest conferences in the nation...the BIG EAST."

On July 11, Yow announced the hiring of three individuals who would comprise the remainder of her coaching staff. Susan Doran, Jack Easley and Gary Martinelli were named Yow's assistant coaches. Each coach has extensive experience in the collegiate coaching ranks, and brings a combined 49 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Providence College sidelines.

Yow, a native of Gibsonville, North Carolina, is a 1976 graduate of Elon College. In her final season at Elon, she captained the team and earned Kodak All-America honors. She played a final season of collegiate basketball at North Carolina State in 1976 as a graduate student. In her one season at NC State, Yow became the first Wolfpack women's basketball player ever to be named to the Kodak All-America Team. She led the team in scoring (19.4 ppg), rebounding (11.9 rpg), field goal percentage (.584) and free throw percentage (.832).

On Wednesday, September 25, 2002, Coach Yow was selected to the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) 50th Anniversary Women's Basketball Team. The 51-member team was voted on by a 27-member, blue-ribbon committee that was selected by the league's 50th Anniversary Committee. North Carolina led all league schools with 11 members on the Golden Anniversary team, while Yow's alma mater, North Carolina State, was second with nine honorees.

As a member of the Anniversary Team, Yow joins such players as Dawn Staley (Virginia '92), Alana Beard (Duke '02), Sylvia Crawley (North Carolina '94), Marion Jones (North Carolina '97), Chasity Melvin (NC State '98), Georgia Schweitzer (Duke '01) and Deanna Tate (Maryland '89). Yow's teammates on the 50th Anniversary Team all enjoyed stellar collegiate careers, and many are still playing professionally in the WNBA and overseas.
