



**WHEN IT ALL BEGAN...** Providence and Villanova first met on January 24, 1981 in Villanova, Pa. The Wildcats opened the all-time series with a 69-59 win.

**WHAT HAPPENED LAST YEAR?...** Providence and Villanova met just one time last season in a game played on January 9, 2002 in Providence, R.I. The Friars defeated the Wildcats on that day, 62-49. Dani Trippany led the Friars to victory with a game-high 12 points and a team-high seven rebounds and two blocked shots. Jessica Simmonds added 10 points and four rebounds for the Friars. Nicole Druckenmiller scored 12 points to lead Villanova, while Courtney Mix added 10 points in the losing effort. Providence trailed by as many as eight points (15-7) in the first half of play with 14:19 on the clock. At one point in the first half, the Friars exploded on a 19-10 scoring run to take a 26-25 lead at halftime. PC outscored Villanova by 12 point (36-24) in the second half to take the 13 points victory.

**SUSAN YOW VS. VILLANOVA...** PC's first-year Head Coach Susan Yow faces Villanova for the first time in her 20 seasons as a head women's basketball coach in the collegiate ranks.

**SCOUTING THE WILDCATS...** Villanova enters Tuesday's game with a 21-5 overall record and a 11-4 mark in the BIG EAST Conference. The Wildcats are coming off of a 50-49 last-second loss to Rutgers in Villanova, Pa. on Saturday, March 1. Rutgers' Shalicia Hurns put back a teammates blocked shot to earn the one-point victory as time expired. Trish Juhline and Katie Davis each scored 15 points for 'Nova in the loss. Courtney Mix added a game-high six assists and recorded a team-high six rebounds. Juhline leads the Wildcats through 26 games with 17.8 points per game, and ranks second on the team in assists (114) and steals (43). Davis is second on the team in scoring with an average of 15.8 points per game. Mix leads Villanova in rebounding, assists and blocked shots averaging 7.1 rebounds, 5.0 assists and 1.08 blocks per game. She also ranks third among her teammates in scoring (9.0 ppg). As a team, the Wildcats average 63.4 points and 31.3 rebounds per game. 'Nova's opponents are averaging 53.2 points and 35.6 boards per game.

**SCOUTING THE FRIARS...** Providence College enters Tuesday's BIG EAST Conference women's basketball game versus #18/17 Villanova with an overall record of 9-17, and a 3-12 mark in the BIG EAST Conference. The Friars will be without sophomore guard Michal Epstein (Rehovot, Israel) for the second-straight game and likely the remainder of the season, as she has been diagnosed with a stress fracture in her left foot. Epstein led the Friars through 25 games averaging 14.3 points and 2.6 rebounds per game. Senior guard Brooke Freeburg (Waterford, Pa.) is currently second on the team in scoring with an average of 9.5 points per game, followed by sophomore forward Jessica Simmonds (South Orange, N.J.) who is averaging 9.3 points and a team-leading 6.1 rebounds per game. Sophomore guard Keisha Blackwell (Baltimore, Md.) and Simmonds are tied for the team lead in steals (38), averaging 1.5 thefts per game each. The Friars are in the midst of a five-game losing streak, which dates back to a 54-42 loss against Seton Hall on February 13 in Providence, R.I. In recent action on March 1, the Friars were defeated by No. 1-ranked Connecticut, 70-52, in Providence, R.I. The Friars were within one point (42-41) with just 9:58 remaining in the second half. The Huskies responded with a 28-11 scoring run to close out the game and earn the 18-point victory. PC's senior guard Brooke Freeburg (Waterford, Pa.) led all scorers with 17 points. Sophomore Jessica Simmonds (South Orange, N.J.) added 14 points. Sophomore Quiana Copeland (Mattapan, Mass.) tied UConn's Ann Strother with a game-high nine rebounds. Copeland added seven points and a game-high two blocked shots. PC has earned five of its nine victories on its home-court (Alumni Hall/Mullaney Gymnasium) this season. As a team, the Friars are averaging 61.0 points and 33.3 rebounds per game. PC's opponents are averaging 66.3 points and 34.0 rebounds per game.

**IN RECENT ACTION...** On March 1, the Friars were defeated, 70-52, by the No. 1-ranked Connecticut Huskies in Providence, R.I. Providence led by as many as six points in the first half and held its lead until the 7:57 mark, at which point UConn tied the game, 20-20. The Huskies finished the first half on a 12-2 run to make the halftime score, 32-22. In the second half, the Friars rallied to within one point (42-41) with just 9:58 remaining on the clock. The Huskies responded with a 28-11 scoring run to close out the game and earn the 18-point victory. PC's senior guard Brooke Freeburg (Waterford, Pa.) led all scorers with 17 points. Sophomore Jessica Simmonds (South Orange, N.J.) added 14 points. Sophomore Quiana Copeland (Mattapan, Mass.) tied UConn's Ann Strother with a game-high nine rebounds. Copeland added seven points and a game-high two blocked shots. Strother led the Huskies in

scoring with 13 points. Diana Taurasi finished the game with 12 points, followed by Jessica Moore and Maria Conlon with 10 points each. Providence will conclude the regular-season schedule with Villanova on Tuesday, March 4 in Villanova, Pa. (7:30 p.m.).

**HEAD COACH SUSAN YOW...** Susan Yow is in the midst of her first season as head coach of the Providence College women's basketball team. Yow joined the Friar athletic department on June 21, 2002 as the seventh head women's basketball coach in PC history. Yow has compiled an overall record of 222-296 in her 19 seasons as a head coach before her arrival at PC. Prior to her arrival at Providence College, she was head coach at East Tennessee (1978-86), Drake (1986-90), Kansas State (1990-93) and UNC Wilmington (1993-97). Yow also served as an assistant coach in the Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) with the Cleveland Rockers (1997-99) and the Charlotte Sting (1999-01). While at Providence, Yow has compiled an overall record of 9-17 through 26 games on the 2002-03 schedule, including a 3-12 mark in the BIG EAST Conference. Yow's career coaching record currently stands at 231-313 overall and is in the midst of her 20th season as a head coach. Yow has coached 544 games in her career. Yow earned her first BIG EAST Conference win with the Friars against Pittsburgh (80-77) on January 11, 2003 in Pittsburgh, Pa.

**A LOOK BACK AT THE 2001-02 FRIARS...** The Friars posted a 13-15 overall record during the 2001-02 season, including a 7-9 mark in the BIG EAST. The Friars finished eighth in the league standings and advanced to the BIG EAST Tournament in Piscataway, N.J. The Friars were eliminated in the first round by No. 9 Seton Hall, 61-55, on March 2. PC compiled a record of 9-3 at home in Alumni Hall during the 2001-02 season. Two of those victories included an 80-70 win over eventual NCAA Tournament participant Syracuse, and a 67-61 win over Virginia Tech, who earned an invitation to the WNIT and was ranked 22nd in the nation at the time of competition. The Friars' 13 wins in 2001-02 marked the most victories by the PC women's basketball program since 1996-97 when the team finished the year with a 13-14 record.

### PLAYERS TO WATCH

**EPSTEIN TO MISS REMAINDER OF SEASON ...** Sophomore guard Michal Epstein (Rehovot, Israel) will likely sit out the remainder of the 2002-03 season with a stress fracture in her left foot. Through 25 games, Epstein leads the Friars averaging 14.3 points and 2.6 assists per game. On December 22, she scored a game and career-high 25 points in a 63-55 win over Rhode Island in Kingston, R.I. She matched her career high with another 25 point performance versus Pittsburgh on January 11 in Pittsburgh, Pa. Earlier this season (2002-03), Epstein earned All-Tournament Team honors as the team tipped off the season at the Banknorth Classic on November 22-23 in Burlington, Vermont. Epstein averaged 12.5 points and 2.0 steals per game to earn the honor. During the 2001-02 season, Epstein averaged 8.2 points, 3.6 rebounds and 2.3 assists per game. This season, Epstein has led the team in scoring in 15 of PC's 25 games and has scored 20 or more points in five games. Versus BIG EAST Conference opponents, Epstein has averaged 12.7 points, 3.1 rebounds and 2.7 assists per game.

**SIMMONDS PLAYING HER GAME...** Sophomore forward/center Jessica Simmonds (South Orange, N.J.) has stepped up her offensive production as of late. Simmonds has reached double figures in scoring in each of the Friars' last eight games, an average of 14.6 points per game in the eight-game stretch. Simmonds has reached double figures in scoring a total of 13

times and in rebounding five times. Through 26 games, Simmonds leads the Friars in rebounding with an average of 6.1 boards per game and ranks third in scoring (9.3 ppg), is tied for first in steals (1.5 spg) and ranks second in field-goal percentage (.474, 91-192). Simmonds leads the Friars with four double-doubles this season, and currently has a total of seven in her career. She has posted double-doubles versus St. Bonaventure on December 28 (12 points, 12 rebounds), Virginia Tech on February 1 (12 points, 10 rebounds), Seton Hall on February 13 (19 points, 10 rebounds) and Miami on February 22 (16 points, 13 rebounds). During the 2001-02 season, Simmonds earned BIG EAST All-Rookie Team honors as a freshman. In recent action versus No. 1-ranked Connecticut, Simmonds registered 14 points, three rebounds, three assists and one steal. In BIG EAST Conference action, Simmonds is averaging 10.9 points, 6.3 rebounds, 1.5 steals and 1.3 assists per game. Through 26 games, Simmonds has led the Friars in rebounding 15 times and in scoring five times.

**FREEBURG RESURFACES ON OFFENSE...** Senior guard Brooke Freeburg (Waterford, Pa.) is currently second among her teammates in scoring (9.5 ppg), fourth in rebounding (3.5 rpg) and third in assists (1.5 apg) and steals (1.1 spg) through 26 games. Freeburg has reached double figures in scoring 14 times this season, including each of the last four games. She posted career-highs in points (17) vs. No. 1-ranked Connecticut on March 1 and assists (five) at home versus Brown on November 26. Freeburg also earned All-Tournament Team honors at the conclusion of the Banknorth Classic in Burlington, Vt. on November 22-23 after averaging 14.0 points, 2.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists in two games. During the 2001-02 season, Freeburg averaged 4.0 points, 2.3 rebounds and 0.85 assists per game. In the Friars' most recent game versus No. 1-ranked Connecticut on March 1, Freeburg recorded a game and career-high 17 points, and tallied four rebounds, one assist and one steal in 40 minutes of action. Versus BIG EAST Conference opponents, Freeburg is averaging 9.8 points, 3.5 rebounds, 1.6 assists and 1.2 steals per game. In the Friars' last four games, Freeburg has averaged 13.0 points, 4.8 rebounds and 1.8 assists per game.

**QUINN CONTINUES ON LATE SEASON SURGE...** Junior guard Kristin Quinn (Sewell, N.J.) is averaging 23.7 minutes per game through 26 games. In the last six games Quinn has averaged 35.7 minutes per game, and has played all 40 minutes in three of PC's last four games. Versus Notre Dame on February 16, she netted a team-high 15 points, pulled down five rebounds and dished out four assists. On February 22 versus Syracuse, Quinn scored a team-high 14 points and added five rebounds, one assist and one steal. On February 22 versus, Quinn recorded seven points, three steals, one rebound and one blocked shot before being taken to the hospital for stitches while cutting Miami's lead to two points on a lay-up and taking a hard foul with 10:52 remaining in the game. And in recent action, she played all 40 minutes versus No. 1-ranked Connecticut and recorded nine points, three rebounds and one assist. In the last six games, Quinn is has averaged 10.3 points, 4.0 rebounds and 2.3 assists per game. For the season, Quinn is averaging 5.5 points, 3.3 rebounds and 1.7 assists per game. Quinn also leads the team in free-throw percentage (90.2 percent, 46-51) and ranks second in three-point field-goal percentage (35.8 percent, 24-67).

**WHEELER CONTRIBUTING...** Senior center/forward Kacee Wheeler (Bakersfield, Calif.) is currently second on the team in rebounding (4.7 rpg) and fourth among her teammates in scoring (8.2), through 26 games. She has reached double-figures in scoring this season 10 times, including seven of the last 11 games she has played in. Wheeler missed three-straight games (2/8/03 - 2/16/03 vs. Pittsburgh, Seton Hall and Notre Dame) with a severe right ankle sprain. On January 11, Wheeler notched her first career double-double versus Pittsburgh with 17 points and career-high 11 rebounds. On January 15, Wheeler registered her second-consecutive double-double with

a career-high 18 points and 11 rebounds. On February 22, she matched her career-high in scoring (17) versus Miami. Wheeler is second on the team this season with two double-doubles. Versus BIG EAST opponents, Wheeler is averaging 8.8 points, 5.1 rebounds and 1.2 assists per game.

**COPELAND STEPPING UP ON THE BOARDS...** Sophomore forward Quiana Copeland (Mattapan, Mass.) currently ranks third among her teammates in rebounding with an average of 3.8 boards per game. In three of the last five games she has managed to pull down a career-high nine rebounds, including the Friars' most recent game versus No. 1-ranked Connecticut on March 1. In PC's last five games, Copeland is averaging 7.0 rebounds per game.

## **HEAD COACH SUSAN YOW**

---

Providence College Assistant Vice President for Athletics Bob Driscoll announced the appointment of Susan Yow as head coach of the women's basketball team on Friday, June 21, 2002. Yow, the seventh women's basketball coach all-time at PC, replaced Jim Jabir who resigned in April to become an assistant women's basketball coach at the University of Colorado.

"Susan Yow brings experience, intensity and compassion to this position," Driscoll said. "She has coached at the highest levels and has a strong knowledge of women's basketball. We also were attracted to Susan because she has extensive experience coaching and recruiting in an academic setting. We believe she will be the person that can lead Providence College women's basketball in the highly competitive BIGEAST Conference."

Yow, the sister of longtime North Carolina State Head Coach Kay Yow and University of Maryland Athletic Director Deborah Yow, comes to Providence with 19 years of NCAA Division I head coaching experience (1978-97). She also spent four years as an assistant coach in the WNBA (1997-01). Yow's most recent collegiate coaching stint was at the University of North Carolina Wilmington. Yow coached at UNC Wilmington from 1993-97. Prior to UNC Wilmington, she was the head coach at Kansas State (1990-93), Drake University (1986-90) and East Tennessee State (1978-86).

In 1997, Yow began her career in the WNBA as an assistant coach for the Cleveland Rockers. Two years later in 1999, she was hired as an assistant coach with the Charlotte Sting. She served as an assistant with the Sting until 2001.

During the 2001-02 women's basketball season, Yow worked as a color analyst for radio broadcasts of the North Carolina State women's basketball games.

Yow also coached three different USA Basketball teams. In 1981, she was an assistant coach for the USA team which won a gold medal at the Olympic Sports Festival. In 1983, Yow served as a head coach for the US squad that won a gold medal at the Olympic Sports Festival. She helped guide the USA to a third gold medal in 1988 when she was an assistant coach for the US Olympic Team.

"I'm excited about the opportunity to coach at Providence College," Yow said. "The women's basketball program has an excellent tradition at Providence and I want to continue to help this program in reaching its full potential. I look forward to the challenges ahead, as we prepare to compete in one of the toughest conferences in the nation...the BIG EAST."

On July 11, Yow announced the hiring of three individuals who would comprise the remainder of her coaching staff. Susan Doran, Jack Easley and Gary Martinelli were named Yow's assistant coaches. Each coach has extensive experience in the collegiate coaching ranks, and brings a combined 49 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Providence College sidelines.

Yow, a native of Gibsonville, North Carolina, is a 1976 graduate of Elon College. In her final season at Elon, she captained the team and earned Kodak All-America honors. She played a final season of collegiate basketball at North Carolina State in 1976 as a graduate student. In her one season at NC State, Yow became the first Wolfpack women's basketball player ever to be named to the Kodak All-America Team. She led the team in scoring (19.4 ppg), rebounding (11.9 rpg), field goal percentage (.584) and free throw percentage (.832).

On Wednesday, September 25, 2002, Coach Yow was selected to the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) 50th Anniversary Women's Basketball Team. The 51-member team was voted on by a 27-member, blue-ribbon committee that was selected by the league's 50th Anniversary Committee. North Carolina led all league schools with 11 members on the Golden Anniversary team, while Yow's alma mater, North Carolina State, was second with nine honorees.

As a member of the Anniversary Team, Yow joins such players as Dawn Staley (Virginia '92), Alana Beard (Duke '02), Sylvia Crawley (North Carolina '94), Marion Jones (North Carolina '97), Chasity Melvin (NC State '98), Georgia Schweitzer (Duke '01) and Deanna Tate (Maryland '89). Yow's teammates on the 50th Anniversary Team all enjoyed stellar collegiate careers, and many are still playing professionally in the WNBA and overseas.
