WHO, WHEN, WHERE... The Providence College women's basketball team will face Seton Hall, in the first round of the 2002 BIG EAST Conference Women's Basketball Championship on Saturday, March 2 at 2:00 p.m. The game is scheduled to be played at the Louis Brown Athletic Center, in Piscataway, New Jersey. Providence is the No. 8 seed in the 12-team tournament. Seton Hall is the No. 9 seed in the tournament.

PROVIDENCE VERSUS SETON HALL... The Friars and Pirates will meet for the 39th time in the 27-year history of the Providence College women's basketball program. PC leads the all-time series versus the Pirates, 22-16. The two teams met earlier this season on January 26, in South Orange, N.J. The Pirates took a 64-54 victory on that day. Providence's last win over Seton Hall was on March 3, 2001, in the first round of the BIG EAST Conference Tournament, at Storrs, Conn. PC defeated the Pirates, 72-61, to advance to the quarterfinal game versus Rutgers.

HEAD COACH JIM JABIR VERSUS SETON HALL... Providence Head Coach Jim Jabir is 4-4 all-time versus Seton Hall. Jabir is currently in his 16th season as a head coach. Jabir is in the midst of his sixth season at Providence. Jabir has a current career record of 220-222 overall. He is 62-101 at Providence.

ALL-TIME RECORDS... The Friars and Pirates have met 38 times in the 27-year history of the PC women's basketball program. PC leads the all-time series, 22-16. The Friars are 12-3 versus Pirates when playing at Alumni Hall in Providence, R.I.; 8-10 when playing at Seton Hall; 2-3 when playing on a neutral court.

PROVIDENCE AND SETON HALL IN THE BIG EAST TOURNAMENT... The Friars and Pirates have met twice in the BIG EAST Tournament. The series record is tied, 1-1, during tournament play. On March 3, 1996, Seton Hall defeated Providence, 69-67,

in the first round at Storrs, Connecticut. Last season, Providence defeated Seton Hall, 72-61, in the first round at Storrs, Conn., on March 3, 2001.

SCOUTING THE PIRATES... The Seton Hall women's basketball team enters the 2002 BIG EAST Women's Basketball Championship Tournament as the No. 9 seed. The Pirates finished the regular-season schedule with a 14-13 overall record, and a 6-10 mark in BIG EAST play. On February 26, Seton Hall defeated Georgetown, 73-64, in South Orange, N.J. Susan Murray led four Pirates in double figures with 15 points, and added a game-high 10 rebounds. Cecilia Lindqvist recorded 14 points, Charlene Thomas scored 13 and Naimah Smith rounded out the double-digit scorers with 11. Overall, the Pirates are led offensively by Lindqvist, who is averaging 12.5 points per game. Thomas is second on the team in scoring and first among her teammates in rebounding, averaging 11.5 points and 6.7 rebounds per game. Murray is averaging 9.3 points through 27 games, and is averaging 5.8 boards per game.

THE FRIARS LAST TIME OUT... The Providence College women's basketball team finished the regular season with a, 91-77, victory over Pittsburgh in BIG EAST Conference play, on February 26 in Providence, R.I. Freshman Jessica Simmonds (South Orange, N.J.) led five Friars in double-figures with a career-high 19 points. Sophomore Kristin Quinn (Sewell, N.J.) registered a season-high 17 points and nine rebounds. Graduate student Dani Trippany (Massena, N.Y.) and sophomore Ryann Kilgore (Belleville, Mich.) netted 15 points each. Trippany also pulled down eight rebounds and matched a career high, with a game-high three steals. Senior Catrina Hawley-Stewart (West Haven, Conn.) contributed 10 points. With the win, the Friars improved to 13-14 overall, and solidified an eighth-place finish in the BIG EAST with a 7-9 conference mark. PC's 13 wins match a single-season best under the direction of head coach Jim Jabir. Jabir posted a 13-14 record in his first season with the Friars during the 1996-97 season.

FRIARS REACH 13 WINS... On February 26, the Providence College women's basketball team defeated Pittsburgh, 91-77, in Providence, R.I. to earn their 13th win of the 2001-02 season. With the win, the Friars improve to 13-14 overall and 7-9 in the BIG EAST Conference. The Friars have not won more than 13 games under the direction of head coach Jim Jabir. In Jabir's first season at Providence (1996-97), the Friars finished the season with a 13-14 record.

ALL-TIME RECORD IN THE BIG EAST TOURNAMENT... The Friars are 19-18 overall in BIG EAST Conference Tournament games, for a winning percentage of .514.

HISTORY LESSON... The Providence College women's basketball team has won three regular-season BIG EAST Championships and one regular season divisional title as part of the BIG EAST 7. During the 1982-83 season, Providence shared the regular-season title with St. John's. In 1985-86, the Friars won the regular-season title outright, and during the 1989-90 season, Providence shared the title with Connecticut. During the 1995-96 season, PC shared the BIG EAST 7 regular-season divisional title with Miami, Syracuse and Seton Hall. The Friars have one BIG EAST Tournament Championship to their credit, as the team took the title in 1990. At the conclusion of the 1990 BIG EAST Championship, Andrea Mangum ('90) was named the Tournament's Most Valuable Player. Mangum is the only PC player to win MVP honors in the history of the tournament.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE... The Friars finished the regular season with a 13-14 overall record, and a 7-9 mark in the BIG EAST Conference. PC finished the year with a 9-3 mark on their home court (Alumni Hall), in Providence, R.I. In games played on the road, the Friars finished 4-10, and on a neutral court PC posted a 0-1 record.

2001-2002 PROVIDENCE COLLEGE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

VERSUS RANKED TEAMS... The Friars have played three ranked teams this season and posted a record of 1-3. On February 13, the Friars defeated #22 Virginia Tech, 67-61, in Providence, R.I. The win marked the first victory over a ranked opponent for the Friars under the six-year direction of head coach Jim Jabir. PC lost to #25 Boston College on January 15 in Chestnut Hill, Mass. On February 3, the Friars fell to #1-ranked Connecticut, 85-61, in Providence, R.I. On February 20, PC dropped its second game of the year to UConn, 106-41, in Storrs, Conn.

OVERALL STATISTICAL LEADERS... The Providence College women's basketball team enters its 28th game of the season with a 13-14 overall record, and a 7-9 mark in BIG EAST action. Graduate student Dani Trippany (Massena, N.Y.) ranks first among her teammates in scoring (10.9 ppg), field-goal percentage (.441, 101-229), three-point field-goal percentage (.438, 21-48) and free-throw percentage (.805, 70-87). Trippany ranks second in rebounding (6.4 rpg) and blocked shots (0.93 bpg). Senior guard Chrissy Vozab (Amenia, N.Y.) leads the Friars with 2.3 assists per game and minutes played (28.6 mpg). Freshman Jessica Simmonds (South Orange, N.J.) leads Providence in rebounds (6.5 rpg), steals (1.4 spg) and blocked shots (1.3 bpg).

STATISTICAL LEADERS IN BIG EAST PLAY... The Friars finished the regular season with a 7-9 record in BIG EAST Conference action. Grad student Dani Trippany (Massena, N.Y.) leads the Friars versus conference opponents, averaging 11.6 points and is second among her teammates, averaging 6.7 rebounds per game. She also leads the team in three-point field goal percentage (.471, 16-34) and free-throw percentage (.865, 45-52). Freshmen Michal Epstein (Rehovot, Israel) is second among her Friar teammates in scoring versus conference opponents, averaging 9.3 points per game. Fresh-

SEVERAL NOTES ON THE PLAYERS TO WATCH

THE STREAK ENDS... Senior guard Chrissy Vozab (Amenia, N.Y.) was not in the Providence College starting line-up for the first time in her four-year career, as the Friars tipped off against Montana in the first round of the Lady Griz Holiday Classic, in Missoula, Montana on December 28. Since missing her first start versus Montana, Vozab has missed five other starts. Vozab re-appeared in the starting line-up versus St. John's on February 6, and has remained there in the Friars' last five games. Vozab missed her first career game, versus Boston College, on January 15. To date, Vozab has played in 108 of 109 games during her career, and has started in 102 of the 108 games she has played in. Since returning to the starting line-up, Vozab has averaged 29.1 minutes per game over the last seven games.

SIMMONDS EARNS BIG EAST CO-ROOKIE OF THE WEEK HONORS... Freshman forward/center Jessica Simmonds (South Orange, N.J.) earned BIG EAST Co-Rookie of the Week honors in women's basketball, for the week ending January 10. The announcement was made by the BIG EAST Conference on Monday, February 11, 2002. Simmonds helped the Friars to a 2-0 record, with wins over St. John's (62-51) and Syracuse (80-70). On February 6 versus St. John's, Simmonds registered the first double-double of her collegiate career with 10 points and 10 rebounds. She also recorded three blocks and three steals in that game. On February 9 versus Syracuse, Simmonds registered her second double-double (and second of her career), with 12 points and a career-high 13 rebounds, to go along with two steals and one blocked shot. On the week, Simmonds averaged 11 points, 11.5 rebounds, 2.5 steals and 2.0 blocks per game. Currently, Simmonds is third on the team in scoring (8.1 ppg), and first in rebounding (6.5 rpg), steals (1.5 spg) and blocks. (1.3 bpg).

VOZAB MOVES TO NINTH ALL-TIME IN CAREER ASSISTS... Senior guard Chrissy Vozab (Amenia, N.Y.) currently ranks ninth all-time at Providence in career assists, with 338. This season, Vozab passed Mary Ann McCoy ('80), who finished her career at PC with 324 handouts. Vozab moved into the ninth spot with four assists in a,

VOZAB INCHING CLOSER TO THE 1,000 POINT PLATEAU... Senior guard Chrissy Vozab (Amenia, N.Y.) needs 88 points, to reach 1,000 career points as a member of the Providence College women's basketball team. Prior to the start of the 2001-02 season, Vozab recorded 724 career points in three seasons with the Friars. This season, Vozab has registered 188 points, to bring her career total to 912. Vozab is currently ranked fourth among her active teammates in scoring (2001-02), averaging 7.2 points per game.

TRIPPANY SETS PERSONAL BEST MARK FOR REBOUNDING IN A SINGLE SEASON... Grad student Dani Trippany (Massena, N.Y.) has pulled down 172 rebounds this season, through 27 games, marking a personal single-season career best. During the 2000-01 season, Trippany recorded a single-season-best 98 boards. Trippany pulled down her 99th board of the 2001-02 season, in a 81-52 loss to Syracuse, on January 12. Trippany currently has 432 rebounds in her career at PC. She recorded her 400th career rebound in a, 67-61, victory over #22 Virginia Tech on January 13, in Providence, R.I.

SEEING DOUBLE... Graduate student Dani Trippany (Massena, N.Y.) and freshman Jessica Simmonds (South Orange, N.J.) are the only Friars on the 2001-02 roster to have registered double-doubles this season. Trippany and Simmonds each have three double-doubles to their credit this season. Trippany had not recorded a double-double in any of the four previous seasons with the Friars. Trippany's first collegiate double-double was recorded on November 27 versus Rhode Island (13 pts, 13 rebs). She also earned double-doubles versus Idaho (12 points, 10 rebounds) and Georgetown (10 pts, 10 rebs). Simmonds' three double-doubles came in games versus St. John's (10 pts, 10 rebs) and Syracuse (12 pts, 13 rebs) and Miami (13 pts, 10 rebs). She is one of nine players in the BIG EAST Conference to register three or more double-doubles versus conference opponents.

ROSTER CHANGES... The Friars began the 2001-02 season with a 16-player roster. To date, sophomore Jenese Wilcox (Port Chester, N.Y.) and junior Andrea Horvath (Sopron, Hungary) are no longer active, sinking the roster total to 14. Wilcox, who played in 13 games with three appearances in the starting line-up, is currently academically ineligible. Horvath appeared in six games for the Friars this season. She is eligible to practice, however, she will not appear in uniform until further notice, pending an NCAA review on her playing status in native country of Hungary.

2001-2002 PROVIDENCE COLLEGE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

HEAD COACH JIM JABIR

Jim Jabir enters his sixth season leading the Providence College women's basketball program. This season he has the players to start making a mark in the BIG EAST Conference. The Friars made a big stride last winter, defeating Seton Hall University, 72-61, in the first round of the 2001 BIG EAST Conference Tournament and advancing to the quarterfinal round for the first time under Jabir.

Known for his ability to attract high-caliber student-athletes, Jabir has two of the top sophomores returning in sophomore point guard Kristin Quinn and sophomore post-player Jenese Wilcox. Added to the two super-sophs is a quality recruiting class of athletes who figure to make immediate impact on the court this season.

After a 2-3 start last season, Jabir engineered five-straight non-conference victories to enter the conference season. The growth of two rookies in the starting lineup and some near-upsets of nationally ranked Rutgers, Notre Dame and Virginia Tech led to a pair of victories in the squad's last three contests and a final 11-17 overall record.

Jabir owns a career record of 207-208 in 15 years as a Division I head coach. The personable and well-liked Jabir is dedicated to the program and to its resurgence in the BIG EAST.

Providence College welcomed Jabir into the Friar family on May 21, 1996 as he was named the sixth head coach in the 22-year history of the program.

In 15 seasons as a collegiate head coach, eight of his teams have posted winning records. In the last five seasons, the Friars have taken important steps toward rebuilding, and are now poised to advance in the BIG EAST standings. In 1996-97, the Friars posted a 13-13 regular season record and lost to Villanova in the first round of the BIG EAST Championship. The following season, PC went 10-17 and exited the BIG EAST Tournament in the first round at the hands of Boston College. Injuries played a role in the win-loss ratio during the 1998-99 season as the Friars found themselves at a 5-22 overall record when the BIG EAST Tournament ended with a 69-68 loss to Villanova. In 1999-2000, PC was still plagued with injuries but doubled their win total from the previous year with a 10-17 overall mark.

Prior to coming to Providence, Jabir spent six years at Marquette, where he became the most successful coach in the history of the program and elevated the Golden Eagles into the national spotlight.

Under his high-powered offense, Jabir established a program that earned respect from people in Milwaukee, in the nation and in the ranks of women's basketball.

After posting a 7-20 record during his inaugural year (1990-91) with the Golden Eagles, Jabir guided his team to four consecutive winning seasons, two 20-plus winning seasons and three straight post-season appearances, including back-to-back bids to the NCAA Tournament.

In 1994-95, Marquette won the Great Midwest Conference Tournament, the first tournament championship in school history. This followed the 1993-94 season in which Jabir compiled a program-best 22-7 overall record and its first trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Just four years after Jabir's arrival at Marquette, the program made its way onto the national scene as it earned its first-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament. Seeded 14th, Marquette was four points shy of pulling off an upset over No. 5 Colorado. The Lady Buffs needed three last-second free throws to earn the 77-74 victory.

In 1994-95 Marquette received a No. 10 seed and the chance to play No. 7 seed North Carolina State on a neutral court at Penn State. Despite a grand effort, MU fell to the Wolfpack, 77-62.

Jabir matriculated to Marquette from Siena College, where he served as the head coach of the Lady Saints for three seasons (1987-90) and compiled a 50-20 overall record. Jabir's teams posted three consecutive winning seasons and his 1989-90 team was a semifinalist in the

Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) post-season tournament.

Prior to his stint at Siena, Jabir was the head coach at Buffalo State during the 1986-87 season at the young age of 24. He led that team to a 14-11 record. Jabir guided the Bengals to the State University of New York Athletic Conference (SUNYAC) championship and an appearance in the NCAA Division III South Regional Tournament.

The Brooklyn, N.Y. native began his coaching career as an assistant at Nazareth College (1984-85) and at Buffalo State (1985-86). Jabir was instrumental in leading the Bengals to a 23-3 slate, the SUNYAC title, a 22-game winning streak, an NCAA regional tournament appearance and a national ranking (#3) during the 1985-86 season.
