Providence was led offensively by sophomore guard Michal Epstein (Rehovot, Israel). RECAP: The Providence College women's basketball team was defeated by Miami, 77-64, in BIG EAST Conference action on February 22 in Coral Gables, Florida. The loss marked the fourth-straight for the Friars, who fall to 9-16 overall and 3-11 in the BIG EAST. Senior center Kacee Wheeler (Bakersfield, Calif.) led the Friars with 17 points.
