## PROVIDENCE HOSTS MANHATTAN LEADING INTO HOLIDAY BREAK...

The Providence College women's basketball team will host Manhattan College in a non-conference game on Tuesday, November 20 at 7:00 p.m. The game will be held at Alumni Hall/Mullaney Gymnasium in Providence, R.I.

**FRIARS ALL-TIME VS. MANHATTAN...** The Friars and Jaspers have met three times in the history of the two women's basketball programs. Providence owns a 3-0 record vs. Manhattan in the all-time series.

**WHAT HAPPENED IN THE MOST RECENT MEETING...** Providence and Manhattan last met on November 10, 2006 in Riverdale, N.Y. The Friars came away with a 52-46 victory. Providence was led by Shauna Snyder (Albuquerque, N.M.) and Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) who had 14 and 12 points, respectively. Joann Nwafili was the lone Jasper in double figures with 14 points. The Friars out-rebounded Manhattan, 46-40, led by Danielle Howards' 11 boards. Kelly Regan grabbed nine rebounds for Manhattan.

**FRIARS SECURE COME-BACK WIN OVER IONA...** In Providence's most recent game this season, the team recorded a 73-64 victory over Iona in Providence, R.I. The Friars overcame a seven-point halftime deficit by outscoring the Gaels 47-31 in the second half. Sophomore Kendria Holmes (Charlotte, N.C.) scored all 17 of her points in the second half, and sophomore Emily Cournoyer (North Attleboro, Mass.) chipped in 10 of her 14 points in the decisive second half. Providence forced Iona into 39 turnovers and collected 14 steals in the process.

**LARGEST HALFTIME DEFICIT OVERCOME BY FRIARS SINCE 2002...** The Friars recently overcame a seven-point halftime deficit (33-26) to defeat Iona, 73-64. It marks the largest halftime deficit overcome by the Friars en route to a victory since November 22, 2002. On that day, the Friars trailed Navy by nine points (37-28) at halftime and rallied to defeat the Mids, 70-62, in Burlington, Vt.

**PROVIDENCE FINISHES HOMESTAND WITH JASPERS...** The Friars finish a three-game homestand on November 20th when it hosts Manhattan College at 7:00 p.m. at Alumni Hall/Mullaney Gymnasium. The Friars are currently 1-1 this season at Alumni Hall, and 2-1 overall.

# PROVIDENCE COLLEGE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL • GAME NOTES

**FRIARS ARE 2-0 WHEN SCORING 70+ POINTS...** The Providence women's basketball team is 2-0 this season when it scores 70+ points in a game. The Friars opened the season with a 79-45 victory over Brown on November 9. PC's second win of the year came against Iona on November 17. The Friars defeated the Gaels, 73-64, in that game. Providence's only loss of the season came against Hartford (77-60) on November 13.

**HIGHS AND LOWS...** The Friars recently put together a victory in the strangest of ways when it defeated Iona, 73-64, on November 17. PC started the game with a season-low 26 points in the first half, and followed with a season-high 47 points in the second half to take the win.

**HOME SWEET HOME...** The Friars have posted an all-time mark of 259-140 (.647) at Alumni Hall/Mullaney Gymnasium in Providence, R.I. This season the Friars are 1-1 at home. On November 20, the Friars will host their 400th game all-time at Alumni Hall when they take on Manhattan at 7:00 p.m.

**FRIARS IMPROVE TO 24-10 ALL-TIME IN SEASON OPENERS...** The Providence women's basketball program improved to 24-10 all-time in season openers with its victory over Brown to start the year on November 9.

**FRIARS' 34-POINT VICTORY OVER BROWN MARKS LARGEST MARGIN OF VICTORY IN PHIL SEYMORE ERA...** The Providence women's basketball team defeated Brown, 79-45, on November 9 at the Pizzitola Sports Center in Providence, R.I. The 34-point win is the Friars' largest margin of victory under the direction of third-year Head Coach Phil Seymore. Prior to PC's 34-point win over Brown, the Friars' previous high for margin of victory was 26 points. The Friars hit that mark twice during the 2006-07 season in wins over St. Francis (N.Y.) (72-46 on 11/21/06) and New Hampshire (79-53 on 11/28/06).

**FRIARS WIN OVER BROWN MARKS LARGEST MARGIN OF VICTORY SINCE 1997...** The Friars 34-point victory over Brown on November 9, marks the largest margin of victory for the Friars since defeating Puerto Rico, 88-45, on November 28, 1997 at the San Juan Shootout in San Juan, Puerto Rico.

**DISHING IT OUT...** Sophomore Kendria Holmes (Charlotte, N.C.) led the team in assists a year ago as a freshman with 103 handouts for an average of 3.7 assists per game. Through three games on the 2007-08 schedule, Holmes leads the team once again in assists with 14 (4.7 apg). She posted a season-high five assists in PC's, 77-60, loss to Hartford on November 13 and in PC's 73-64 victory over Iona on November 17.

**GET OUT OF HERE...** Sophomore Emily Cournoyer (North Attleboro, Mass.) leads the team in blocked shots this season with six (2.0 bpg). On November 9, Cournoyer rejected a career-high four shots against Brown. As a freshman a year ago, Cournoyer posted the third highest total for blocked shots by a PC freshman in the 33-year history of the program.

**MORE REJECTION...** Providence returns its top four shot-blockers from a season ago in Aga Lorenc (33), Emily Cournoyer (26), Jessica Clark (17) and Danielle Howard (11). Through three games, the Friars have recorded 18 blocked shots for an average of 6.0 blocked shots per game. PC has rejected a season-high eight shots in two games this season against Brown (11/9/07) and Iona (11/17/07). PC's eight blocks this season are the most since the team swatted eight shots against Pittsburgh on February 3, 2007.

**HOME GROWN...** The Friars feature two players from Rhode Island on their roster this season. Junior Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) returns for her third season with the program, while Trinity Hull (Cranston, R.I.) joins the club as a rookie. Hull played scholastically for Cranston High School East.

**MAKING STRIDES...** Third-year Head Coach Phil Seymore has helped the program increase its win total in each of his two seasons on the sidelines since taking over the program in 2005. Seymore inherited a team that posted a 1-27 record prior to his hire. In his first season with the team in 2005-06, the Friars made a 7.5 game improvement in the win column with an 8-19 record. Last season, the improvements continued as the team completed the year

**FRIARS PICKED TO FINISH 15th IN THE BIG EAST PRESEASON COACHES' POLL...** The Friars were picked to finish 15th in the BIG EAST Conference Preseason Coaches' Poll, released on October 25 at ESPN Zone in New York City, N.Y. The Friars recorded 36 points in the poll. Connecticut topped the poll with 225 points and 15 first-place votes. Rutgers received the remaining first-place vote and registered 211 points. Georgetown sits below Providence with 20 points.

**MARANDOLA COMPLETED SOPHOMORE SEASON WITH 485 POINTS...** Junior Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.) scored 485 points last season for the Friars. It marks the third highest scoring total for a sophomore in Providence women's basketball history.

**MARANDOLA NEARS 1,000-POINT MARK...** After two seasons with the Friars, Chelsea Marandola (Johnston, R.I.)

has recorded a total of 822 points in 55 games for a career scoring average of 14.9 points per game. Entering the 2007-08 campaign, Marandola needs just 178 points to become the 29th player all-time to reach 1,000 career points. Marandola has yet to see action during the 2007-08 season.

**NEW HEIGHTS...** Senior center Aga Lorenc (Lubycza, Poland) is the tallest player to ever play women's basketball at Providence College. She is flanked by six other players on the roster, who are over 6-feet tall, marking the most players over six feet on the roster in a single-season all-time.

**WHAT'S COMING UP NEXT...** The Friars head out on the road for a two-game swing in Miami, Fla. on November 23 and November 25. On Friday, November 23, Providence will take on Florida International in the first game of the Florida International Thanksgiving Classic. On Sunday, November 25, the Friars will face either Illinois or South Carolina in the consolation game (Noon) or championship game (2:00 p.m.).

**SMILE FOR THE CAMERA...** The Friars have five television games on the schedule in 2007-08. On December 20, PC will take on Michigan State at Noon on Cox Sports. On January 5, the Friars will take on Marquette and the game will be featured on BIG EAST TV (BETV) and Cox Sports at 2:00 p.m. On February 2, the Friars take on Connecticut on Cox Sports at 7:00 p.m. The Friars make an appearance on CSTV when they take on Villanova on February 12 at 8:00 p.m. The final regular-season televised game will be on February 19 against Syracuse at 7:00 p.m., when the Friars and Orange will be featured on Cox Sports.

## HEAD COACH • Third Season PHIL SEYMORE

Phil Seymore embarks on his third season as head coach of the Friar women's basketball team. Seymore was hired as the eighth coach in the program's 33-year history on April 7, 2005.

The program has made tremendous strides during Seymore's two-year tenure on the sidelines. Prior to his arrival, the Friars won just five games during a two-year period from 2003 through 2005, including an 0-32 record versus BIG EAST Conference opponents.

During Seymore's first season with the Friars, the team posted an 8-19 overall record and a 3-13 mark in the BIG EAST. It marked a 7.5 game improvement in the win column. Last season in 2006-07, the Friars showed even greater signs of progress with a final record of 13-16 (3-13 BIG EAST). On January 3, 2007, Seymore led Providence to an impressive 106-94, double-overtime, victory over 13th-ranked Louisville during BIG EAST regular-season play. At the time, the Cardinals were one of five NCAA Division I women's

basketball programs who were undefeated.

The Friars' 13 victories on the year marked the most in a single season since the 2001-02 campaign, when PC finished the year at 13-15. Providence started the year with a 7-1 record, including victories in each of its first six games. It stands at PC's best start since 1990-91 when the team began the year with seven-straight victories.

Furthermore, Providence completed the non-conference portion of its schedule with a 10-3 record. It marked the first time since the 2002-03 season that PC had posted a winning record in non-conference play. It also marked the most non-conference victories in a single season since 1990-91.

Prior to his appointment as head coach, Seymore served as an assistant coach for the Friar men's basketball team, helping the squad earn NCAA Tournament berths in 2001 and 2004.

"Phil Seymore brings a wealth of experience and knowledge to our women's basketball program," Driscoll said. "He has enjoyed success as a student-athlete, a professional athlete and as a coach. He understands the mission of the College and is dedicated to rebuilding our program while providing a positive experience for our student-athletes."

"Phil has an outstanding basketball mind," Providence College Men's Basketball Head Coach Tim Welsh said. "He has been a valuable part our program over the last five years. We will miss him on our staff. I believe he will be a tremendous head coach and that this is a great hire for the College."

Seymore came to Providence in 2000 after serving as an assistant coach at the University of Richmond for three seasons under Head Coach John Beilein. While at Richmond, he was responsible for the team's recruiting and the offensive and defensive development of guards and wingmen. He also prepared scouting reports of the opposing teams for the Spiders.

"Phil was one of my first full-time assistant coaches," West Virginia Men's Basketball Head Coach John Beilein stated. "I knew in a short time that I wanted him to be my assistant forever. His attention to detail is impressive, but what is equally impressive is how he looks at the big picture -- life, basketball and recruiting. This is a great selection for Providence and the BIG EAST."

A native of Brooklyn, N.Y., and a graduate of Canisius College, Seymore began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Canisius in 1983 under his former coach Nick Macarchuk (a former PC assistant coach). After one season at Canisius, he went to Turner Carroll High School in Buffalo, N.Y. where he coached for four years, including two seasons as the head coach. His 1989-90 team at Turner won the State Catholic School Class C title and the 1988-89 squad captured the Manhattan Cup Championship. After leaving Turner Carroll High School in 1990, Seymore spent the next seven years as an assistant coach at Canisius. Five of those seven years were under Beilein.

Seymore began his collegiate playing career at Independence Junior College before transferring to Canisius. At Canisius, he averaged 16.8 points and 4.6 assists in two seasons as a point guard. Seymore was selected in the seventh round of the 1982 NBA draft by the New York Knicks. He played one season for Albany of the Continental Basketball Association where he earned 1983 All-Star honors. Seymore is a member of Canisius' Athletic Hall of Fame.

Seymore resides in Rumford, R.I., with his wife, Alicia, and his daughter, Amani.
